



Re: Death of Richard Hardwick

Dear Mr. Stine:

I represent [REDACTED] the wife of Richard Hardwick, deceased. As you know, Mr. Hardwick was shot and killed by Ventura County Sheriff Braga on January 27, 1983 at State Highway 23 near Olson Road.

On February 1, 1983, I met with Lt. McKinley of the Sheriff's Department to discuss the circumstances surrounding the death. Although you authorized said meeting, I understand that you advised the Sheriff's Department not to provide copies of any of its reports to me at this time.

I have related the version of the incident given by Lt. McKinley to [REDACTED]. If that version is accurate, it would seem that the County is secure in its belief that the involved officer was forced to discharge his weapon.

I am sure that you can understand that I would be remiss in my duties if I were to rely solely upon the hearsay statements of Lt. McKinley. I have advised my client that she is entitled to all of the Sheriff's Department's reports and memoranda that relate to the subject incident. By obtaining those reports, and personally speaking to some of the witnesses, we can confirm that the Sheriff Department's version is an accurate one.

It is certainly not my wish to file a lawsuit simply to obtain copies of the referred-to writings. However, if the County does not wish to provide us copies voluntarily, I can only assume that something in those reports exposes the County to liability. As an attorney, it is much easier for me to refuse to take a case than it is to dismiss a lawsuit. Under the latter circumstances, I would have to be absolutely sure that no liability exists.

This letter is written in the hope that the County will provide all of its investigative reports without the necessity of


This will acknowledge receipt of your letter dated February 10, 1983, and addressed to Robert Stine of this office.

REPORT ON THE SHOOTING OF RICHARD HARDWICK

LEGAL CONCLUSION

The District Attorney has reviewed the January 27, 1983 officer-involved shooting that resulted in the death of Richard Hardwick.

After review of the statements of all percipient witnesses and an evaluation of the circumstances surrounding the incident, the District Attorney has concluded that Officer Braga acted in self-defense and the shooting was justified.

Chronology

FACTUAL SUMMARY

At 8:25 p.m. on January 27, 1983, Richard Hardwick, a 38-year-old, 5'10", 180 lb. civilian, was seen by several citizens walking southbound on Highway 23 in the City of Thousand Oaks. He was walking very close to the roadway.

Several motorists observed him to be behaving irrationally. He was threatening vehicles with a club, shouting and wandering toward the oncoming traffic.

Several citizens* including [REDACTED] reported those observations to the East Valley Sheriff's Office.

In response to the citizens' report of this unusual behavior, a police officer left the East Valley Station to investigate at 8:31 p.m. About the same time, Officer Braga of the Sheriff's Department who was returning to the Sheriff's Substation in the East Valley saw Mr. Hardwick and observed the peculiar behavior himself.

At 8:30 p.m., Officer Braga radioed the dispatcher to expedite assistance as he was about to stop and approach Mr. Hardwick.

After arranging for a backup Sheriff's unit, Officer Braga made a U-turn with his police unit in order to approach Mr. Hardwick. As he parked his black & white unit, he was joined by backup officer Therrien of the East Valley Sheriff's Department who parked in the median strip (see diagram attached). Officer Braga parked with his headlights toward Mr. Hardwick, and got out of his unit and walked toward Mr. Hardwick.

As Officer Braga approached Mr. Hardwick, Mr. Hardwick began advancing toward him waving a stick in the air, growling and making strange noises. Braga said, "Police, stop, put your stick down."

Officer Therrien got out of his car and observed as Officer Braga commanded Mr. Hardwick to drop the stick. Mr. Hardwick ignored the command. Officer Braga walked backwards and stopped behind the open police car door on the driver's side. Officer Therrien then commanded Mr. Hardwick to "stop, drop the stick."

Officer Braga, who had taken out his police baton, yelled, "Police officers, drop your weapon," and continued to back up. Mr. Hardwick, who was walking toward Officer Braga at a faster pace, yelled, "Fuck you." When Officer Braga had first confronted Mr. Hardwick there was a distance of about 50 feet between Mr. Hardwick and the unit.

At a distance of about 35 feet, Mr. Hardwick reached into the left side of his coat toward his waistband, as if he were reaching for a gun. Mr. Hardwick continued to advance toward Officer Braga. Officer Braga laid his baton down behind the patrol car door and retreated to the rear of his police unit.

As the officer moved to the rear of the unit, the only light remaining was from the flashing overhead lights which created a "strobe" effect. At that time, Officer Braga yelled, "Police, freeze. Take your hand out of your coat. Police, freeze. Expose your hands. Freeze!"

Officer Braga continued to command Mr. Hardwick to stop while drawing his police-issue revolver and retreating. As Mr. Hardwick neared Officer Braga, he lunged at the officer with his hands still in the jacket.

As he lunged, Mr. Hardwick pulled out what appeared to be a weapon from beneath his coat. He raised his hand with an object in it (later determined to be a hammer handle), and lowered it as one would with a handgun.

Officer Braga lost his balance, fell backward and unholstered his gun as he fell to the ground. He fired three shots. Two of those rounds hit Mr. Hardwick, and one missed. One of the rounds that struck Mr. Hardwick ruptured the aorta and was ultimately fatal.

Officers Therrien and Braga began life-saving efforts and restored a heart beat to the then unconscious victim. After he was taken to the hospital, Mr. Hardwick continued to swear and yell obscenities until he expired.

The entire incident took two minutes and 45 seconds from the time Officer Braga observed Mr. Hardwick until the fatal shots were fired. The entire incident was witnessed by [REDACTED] and by a man who had been arrested for a traffic warrant and was handcuffed in the rear of the police unit.

[REDACTED] and the arrestee gave the same account of the incident as was given by Officer Braga and Officer Therrien. A quotation from the arrestee summarizes his opinion of the conduct of Officer Braga.

"What gets me is the officers are expected to be able to have split-second reaction and thoughts, but as far as I'm concerned he had no choice. He was, first off, he was in the interest of protecting the community, but the last thing that happened was he was protecting his own life. That guy was big enough, the guy was bigger than the officer and with a big club in his hand and what are you going to do at that point in time, you don't know what else the guy's got."

OBSERVATIONS OF [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] were driving northbound on Highway 23 near Olsen Road when they saw a white male walking southbound on 23 on the edge of the road. The man was walking rapidly and according to the witnesses, "looked crazy." He was carrying a stick or club and [REDACTED] drove on and told [REDACTED] that he "wouldn't want to be the poor cop who stops that guy."

OBSERVATIONS OF [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] stated she was driving northbound on Highway 23 near Olsen Road when she saw a man carrying a stick, yelling at passing cars. She also saw a man in a pickup truck stop for a few seconds, then drive on. She drove on and later, when interviewed, stated the man appeared angry. She specified the time of her observations as about 8:25 p.m., January 27, 1983.

OBSERVATIONS OF [REDACTED]

On January 27, 1983 at about 8:25 p.m., [REDACTED] and his girlfriend were driving back to Simi Valley northbound on 23. They saw the suspect walking southbound on the northbound shoulder of the freeway, waving a stick at every car that went by. He did the same thing as they drove by. He was screaming and yelling and swinging the stick. [REDACTED] said that even with the windows rolled up in his car and the radio turned on, the screaming was so loud that they could still hear him. They decided the behavior was so odd that they should notify the police. They got off the freeway at Olsen Road and drove to the East Valley Sheriff's Station.

At the East Valley station they told a deputy about the subject on the freeway and the deputy said he would check it out, got in his unit and left. [REDACTED] decided he wanted to see what was going to happen, so he drove down the driveway from East Valley westbound on Olsen Road. Once they got near the scene, they saw a large number of police cars and they saw someone lying on the ground. They then left.

OBSERVATIONS OF OFFICER ROPER

On January 27, 1983 at about 8 p.m., Officer Roper saw Mr. Hardwick walking westbound on Olsen Road. When high beams were placed on him he raised both arms to about shoulder level. He appeared to have something in his hands and it was hard to tell what the objects were. The object in his right hand appeared to be a thick rounded piece of wood about a foot long. Mr. Hardwick turned his head, facing away from the roadway. Officer Roper felt that turning the headlights on him caused the behavior of Hardwick and he drove on.

OBSERVATIONS OF [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was getting off the 23 Freeway at Olsen Road. When he was about halfway down the offramp, he saw a subject swinging a stick or a board at passing cars. The subject was cursing and screaming. [REDACTED] avoided hitting the subject. He then drove to the East Valley station and reported to the dispatcher what he had seen. As he left, he got on the freeway going southbound and pulled over to the center divider.

He parked and walked toward where officers were standing with the subject he had seen before. He heard an officer ordering the subject to stop. He saw the subject stop for a minute and then heard the subject screaming and saw him attack the officer. He said he saw the subject chasing the officer and again heard the officer order the subject to stop. He said the subject was right on top of the officer when he heard a shot. He felt he ought to get out of the way. He also felt the officer was in danger of being hurt.

STATEMENT OF OFFICER BRAGA

On January 27, 1983 at about 8 p.m., I stopped a white Audi eastbound Highway 101 near Lynn Road for going over the maximum speed limit (a violation of section 22348(a) of the Vehicle Code) and I discovered an outstanding traffic warrant on the driver.

I advised [REDACTED] (the driver of the vehicle) of the warrant and was transporting him in the backseat of my unit to East Valley Sheriff's Office for processing.

I was northbound on Highway 23 at about 8:30 p.m. in the No. 2 lane approaching Olsen Road when I saw a male subject walking southbound on the east shoulder of the freeway.

The subject had what appeared to be a baton or a stick in his right hand. He would "attack" the northbound vehicles with the weapon as they drove past him. He put both of his hands and the weapon in the air and growled as if he were a wild man.

At approximately 2030 hours I made a U-turn in the center divider prior (sic) to Olsen Road and remained in the center divider following the subject approximately 20-40 yards. The subject continued to walk southbound on the northbound shoulder lane exhibiting a bizarre behavior.

I requested backup units and CHP to my location via radio. I advised the dispatcher to have all units expedite.

Approximately one to two minutes later, Deputy William Therrien arrived. I attracted his attention to the subject by the use of my spotlight.

Deputy Therrien stopped his unit northbound on Highway 23 in the median divider.

I continued southbound on the median divider passing Deputy Therrien's unit.

I made a U-turn on Highway 23, activated my revolving lights and bright headlights, stopping my unit on the northbound shoulder of the freeway directly across from Deputy Therrien's unit, which was parked northbound on the center divider.

I activated my spotlight and pointed it at the suspect, who was approximately 27 yards to the front of my unit.

I got out of my patrol car, leaving the driver's door open. I walked toward the left front fender of my unit and yelled to the subject, "Police, stop, put your stick down."

The subject continued walking toward me, waving his arms and stick in the air as he continued to "growl" like a bear.

I drew my baton and again yelled, "Police officer, drop your weapon."

The subject continued to advance toward me, yelling, "Fuck you."

When the subject got approximately 12 yards from me, he stopped for a second and with his right hand reached in the left side of his coat toward his waistband as if he were reaching for a gun.

The subject began running toward me, yelling obscenities and growling. He kept his right hand hidden under the left side of his coat while he waved his left hand in the air.

I immediately backtracked, drawing my on-duty weapon, a .45 caliber semi automatic, and taking cover behind the driver's door of my unit.

I yelled, "Police, freeze, take your hand out of your coat; police, freeze, expose your hands; freeze!"

The subject continued to advance, yelling, "Fuck you" and growling as he approached the front of my unit. His right hand remained hidden under the left portion of his coat.

I got up from a squatting position and began running backward toward the back of my unit, yelling, "Stop, stop, police, stop."

At the rear of my unit, the suspect removed an object from his left waistband with his right hand, raising it toward the right side of his head, and brought the weapon downward as if he was going to shoot me.

I immediately dropped to the ground while discharging three rounds at the subject.

Prior to discharging the rounds, the subject lunged at me from three to five feet away.

In my mind I felt positive the subject was going to kill me.

The subject fell on the dirt shoulder to the right side of me. I immediately got up.

Deputy Therrien rolled the subject on his back, where he continued to growl like a wild animal and shake his arms in a raging manner.

OBSERVATIONS OF [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] had been arrested by Deputy Braga on January 27, 1983 at 8: 23 p.m. and was handcuffed and witnessed the incident from the backseat of the patrol car. His statement is as follows:

"I caught a glimpse of the guy but the officer's eyes are sharp because he had said, 'Did you see that guy, he had a club.' So he did a U-turn and was driving in the center island of the freeway and drove along the divider with his light on the guy and I could see it looked like the guy was spaced. There was no question about it, he was walking along with clubs in both hands at the time. Originally the club in the right hand was a big club, I mean it wasn't a small one. It was a good-size one. It was as big as your billy club or whatever you call those nightsticks you carry and probably bigger around, but he was rather nicely dressed, I mean the guy had on a sportcoat, looked like it was corduroy. He was probably over 200 lbs. and probably over six feet, a big guy. The next thing that would happen was that he would go along and just yell at the world and shake his fists. So about that time the officer called for a backup and then shortly after that you could see the guy was endangering himself and somebody else because you couldn't tell whether he was gonna head out into the freeway because he was walking opposing traffic -- or wherever he was just gonna hit somebody. Finally the officer got out with his nightstick first and the guy stopped and he told him to stop and drop his clubs and the next

thing the guy did he just stuck his hand inside his coat like that and the officer dropped back and pulled his revolver, cocked it and told him to take his hand out of his coat. What happened after that happened awful fast. He stood there for just a moment, then he started this yell-type growl type thing then he raced at the officer with a club in his hand I did not see. The thing happened very quickly . . .

I know my first response when I saw him coming at me at the car was here I am with handcuffs on, what am I going to do to protect myself if he comes in this car after me. He chased the officer back to the back of his car and the officer shot him.

I'm no judge of anything but as far as I'm concerned, I put myself in the position of that officer. This was a big man coming at me with a club and it was me or him at that point.

He had an object in his hand when he went around the car. Now I can't guarantee that was not a gun rather than a club. He had the club raised up to strike the officer.

I don't drink and I don't smoke, I don't take drugs, but if I had to guess and I'm the worst guesser in the world, I would guess he had to be on drugs. I've never seen anybody quite that spaced out before.

Just yelling and gorilla tactics and screaming and yelling and made no sense at all."

██████████ was asked whether when Mr. Hardwick was facing the officer with his hand in his coat, did he obey the officer at any time. ██████████ said, "No, because when he had his hand in his coat then, when he removed his hand from the coat he removed it running like that. He was running at the officer at the time."

██████████ added the officer started backing up as fast as he could.

"As far as I'm concerned the officer did his duty as best he possibly could. You've got to realize at the time I'm arrested I'm mad, right. I'm mad, I'm pissed off that I'm arrested. Naturally I'm mad at the officer because he's the guy that got me, right. Guilty or not, I'm listening to him, we talked going up the road and he was telling me what's going on, because he checked out my record and said well you've got a traffic violation, they've got a warrant for your arrest, it's going to cost you 150 bucks close to that. The officer said and I'll even bring you back to the car. We talked about speed tickets. I immediately realized this guy was an unusual officer. The guy had some compassion. He wasn't an asshole by any means and from the way he handled himself from that time forward and throughout the entire process of handcuffing that individual, he did so as a person very concerned. The first thing he came and said after the shot was over was he came back and said, 'See what happens, shit.' The guy really felt bad about what he'd done."

What gets me is the officers are expected to be able to have split-second reaction and thoughts, but as far as I'm concerned he had no choice. He was, first off, he was in the interest of protecting the community, but her last thing that happened was he was protecting his own life. That guy was big enough, the guy was bigger than the officer and with a big club in his hand and what are you going to do at that point in time, you don't know what else the guy's got.

STATEMENT OF OFFICER THERRIEN

Officer Therrien was the backup officer and made the following statement.

I could see a patrol unit in the center divider with its headlights and the driver's side spotlight on facing southbound. Thinking the subject was in front of that unit I pulled over into the center divider. Deputy Braga immediately flashed his spotlight over the shoulder on the freeway pointing to the suspect. My unit was approximately 50 feet from the subject. I exited my unit and started to cross the freeway. A vehicle drove past in the lane and the subject took a swipe at the vehicle with a three-foot club in his left hand. The subject was standing approximately one foot from the fog line. I told the subject to hold it right there. Deputy Braga drove from the center divider to the shoulder of the freeway, parking his patrol unit directly in front of the subject. Deputy Braga turned his overhead revolving lights on. Braga exited his unit and walked toward the front of the unit, telling the subject to freeze, police.

The subject at this time had stepped back to the dirt portion of the freeway approximately 70 feet from the right headlight of the unit. The subject stated, come on out, fucker, swinging the object in his left hand and waving his right hand toward Deputy Braga. The subject was yelling and growling, gritting his teeth and acting very enraged. Deputy Braga was repeatedly telling the

subject, freeze, police, the subject acted like he was going to take a step toward Braga and at that time Braga pulled his baton from the ring.

The subject was yelling something at Braga but I couldn't hear what he was saying.

The subject abruptly stuck his right hand under his jacket, concealing his hand. Braga then stepped back, telling the subject, put your hands in the air. When the subject didn't comply with orders we both drew our service weapons at the subject.

Braga set his baton down and took cover behind the driver's door of his unit. I stepped back and took cover behind my trunk of the unit.

I was yelling at the subject, put your hands in the air, raise your hands. The subject was still yelling and growling toward us. The subject then started running toward the left front of Deputy Braga's unit with his right hand still concealed. When he reached the front of the unit Deputy Braga was stepping backwards telling the subject to stop. The subject had just passed the driver's door and pulled from underneath his jacket an object in his right hand.

The subject raised his right hand by his head and then leaped towards Braga pointing the object at Braga.

The subject was less than four feet away when he lunged toward Braga. Deputy Braga was falling backwards when he discharged three rounds from his weapon. Braga fell to the ground and the subject fell falling face forward.

The shooting occurred in the rear of Braga's unit.

I was standing between the No. 1 and 2 lanes of the 23 freeway. I walked over and said to Braga, "Let's cuff him up." The subject was still moving and growling. I then handcuffed him.

A passerby stating he was a paramedic assisted me with CPR. The civilian was giving breathing while I did the chest compressions. We executed the CPR approximately three minutes, reviving the subject at that time.

At the hospital Dr. [REDACTED] told me that the subject's last words were "get fucked" or "fuck you."

In the search of the subject's property a pair of toy vampire teeth were found in the lower pocket of his shirt.

- 10:05 - Deputy District Attorney Dobroth phones Officer McDaniel at East Valley Sheriff's Station and informs him that a deputy district attorney will remain available for assistance during the rest of the evening.

Dear Mr. Stine:

I represent [REDACTED] the wife of Richard Hardwick, deceased. As you know, Mr. Hardwick was shot and killed by Ventura County Sheriff Braga on January 27, 1983 at State Highway 23 near Olson Road.

On February 1, 1983, I met with Lt. McKinley of the Sheriff's Department to discuss the circumstances surrounding the death. Although you authorized said meeting, I understand that you advised the Sheriff's Department not to provide copies of any of its reports to me at this time.

I have related the version of the incident given by Lt. McKinley to [REDACTED]. If that version is accurate, it would seem that the County is secure in its belief that the involved officer was forced to discharge his weapon.

I am sure that you can understand that I would be remiss in my duties if I were to rely solely upon the hearsay statements of Lt. McKinley. I have advised my client that she is entitled to all of the Sheriff's Department's reports and memoranda that relate to the subject incident. By obtaining those reports, and personally speaking to some of the witnesses, we can confirm that the Sheriff Department's version is an accurate one.

It is certainly not my wish to file a lawsuit simply to obtain copies of the referred-to writings. However, if the County does not wish to provide us copies voluntarily, I can only assume that something in those reports exposes the County to liability. As an attorney, it is much easier for me to refuse to take a case than it is to dismiss a lawsuit. Under the latter circumstances, I would have to be absolutely sure that no liability exists.

This letter is written in the hope that the County will provide all of its investigative reports without the necessity of


formal legal proceedings. If you wish to discuss this request further, please call me. I would appreciate your informing me of your final decision within the next 10 days.



REPORT ON THE SHOOTING OF RICHARD HARDWICK

LEGAL CONCLUSION

The District Attorney has reviewed the January 27, 1983 officer-involved shooting that resulted in the death of Richard Hardwick.

After review of the statements of all percipient witnesses and an evaluation of the circumstances surrounding the incident, the District Attorney has concluded that Officer Braga acted in self-defense and the shooting was justified.

Chronology

FACTUAL SUMMARY

At 8:25 p.m. on January 27, 1983, Richard Hardwick, a [REDACTED] civilian, was seen by several citizens walking southbound on Highway 23 in the City of Thousand Oaks. He was walking very close to the roadway.

Several motorists observed him to be behaving irrationally. He was threatening vehicles with a club, shouting and wandering toward the oncoming traffic.

Several citizens* including [REDACTED] reported those observations to the East Valley Sheriff's Office.

In response to the citizens' report of this unusual behavior, a police officer left the East Valley Station to investigate at 8:31 p.m. About the same time, Officer Braga of the Sheriff's Department who was returning to the Sheriff's Substation in the East Valley saw Mr. Hardwick and observed the peculiar behavior himself.

At 8:30 p.m., Officer Braga radioed the dispatcher to expedite assistance as he was about to stop and approach Mr. Hardwick.

* See summary of witness statements for details.

After arranging for a backup Sheriff's unit, Officer Braga made a U-turn with his police unit in order to approach Mr. Hardwick. As he parked his black & white unit, he was joined by backup officer Therrien of the East Valley Sheriff's Department who parked in the median strip (see diagram attached). Officer Braga parked with his headlights toward Mr. Hardwick, and got out of his unit and walked toward Mr. Hardwick.

As Officer Braga approached Mr. Hardwick, Mr. Hardwick began advancing toward him waving a stick in the air, growling and making strange noises. Braga said, "Police, stop, put your stick down."

Officer Therrien got out of his car and observed as Officer Braga commanded Mr. Hardwick to drop the stick. Mr. Hardwick ignored the command. Officer Braga walked backwards and stopped behind the open police car door on the driver's side. Officer Therrien then commanded Mr. Hardwick to "stop, drop the stick."

Officer Braga, who had taken out his police baton, yelled, "Police officers, drop your weapon," and continued to back up. Mr. Hardwick, who was walking toward Officer Braga at a faster pace, yelled, "Fuck you." When Officer Braga had first confronted Mr. Hardwick there was a distance of about 50 feet between Mr. Hardwick and the unit.

At a distance of about 35 feet, Mr. Hardwick reached into the left side of his coat toward his waistband, as if he were reaching for a gun. Mr. Hardwick continued to advance toward Officer Braga. Officer Braga laid his baton down behind the patrol car door and retreated to the rear of his police unit.

As the officer moved to the rear of the unit, the only light remaining was from the flashing overhead lights which created a "strobe" effect. At that time, Officer Braga yelled, "Police, freeze. Take your hand out of your coat. Police, freeze. Expose your hands. Freeze!"

Officer Braga continued to command Mr. Hardwick to stop while drawing his police-issue revolver and retreating. As Mr. Hardwick neared Officer Braga, he lunged at the officer with his hands still in the jacket.

As he lunged, Mr. Hardwick pulled out what appeared to be a weapon from beneath his coat. He raised his hand with an object in it (later determined to be a hammer handle), and lowered it as one would with a handgun.

Officer Braga lost his balance, fell backward and unholstered his gun as he fell to the ground. He fired three shots. Two of those rounds hit Mr. Hardwick, and one missed. One of the rounds that struck Mr. Hardwick ruptured the aorta and was ultimately fatal.

Officers Therrien and Braga began life-saving efforts and restored a heart beat to the then unconscious victim. After he was taken to the hospital, Mr. Hardwick continued to swear and yell obscenities until he expired.

The entire incident took two minutes and 45 seconds from the time Officer Braga observed Mr. Hardwick until the fatal shots were fired. The entire incident was witnessed by [REDACTED] and by a man who had been arrested for a traffic warrant and was handcuffed in the rear of the police unit.

[REDACTED] and the arrestee gave the same account of the incident as was given by Officer Braga and Officer Therrien. A quotation from the arrestee summarizes his opinion of the conduct of Officer Braga.

"What gets me is the officers are expected to be able to have split-second reaction and thoughts, but as far as I'm concerned he had no choice. He was, first off, he was in the interest of protecting the community, but the last thing that happened was he was protecting his own life. That guy was big enough, the guy was bigger than the officer and with a big club in his hand and what are you going to do at that point in time, you don't know what else the guy's got."

OBSERVATIONS OF [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] and a [REDACTED] were driving northbound on Highway 23 near Olsen Road when they saw a white male walking southbound on 23 on the edge of the road. The man was walking rapidly and according to the witnesses, "looked crazy." He was carrying a stick or club and [REDACTED] drove on and told [REDACTED] that he "wouldn't want to be the poor cop who stops that guy."

OBSERVATIONS OF [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] stated she was driving northbound on Highway 23 near Olsen Road when she saw a man carrying a stick, yelling at passing cars. She also saw a man in a pickup truck stop for a few seconds, then drive on. She drove on and later, when interviewed, stated the man appeared angry. She specified the time of her observations as about 8:25 p.m., January 27, 1983.

OBSERVATIONS OF [REDACTED]

On January 27, 1983 at about 8:25 p.m., [REDACTED] and his girlfriend were driving back to Simi Valley northbound on 23. They saw the suspect walking southbound on the northbound shoulder of the freeway, waving a stick at every car that went by. He did the same thing as they drove by. He was screaming and yelling and swinging the stick. [REDACTED] said that even with the windows rolled up in his car and the radio turned on, the screaming was so loud that they could still hear him. They decided the behavior was so odd that they should notify the police. They got off the freeway at Olsen Road and drove to the East Valley Sheriff's Station.

At the East Valley station they told a deputy about the subject on the freeway and the deputy said he would check it out, got in his unit and left. [REDACTED] decided he wanted to see what was going to happen, so he drove down the driveway from East Valley westbound on Olsen Road. Once they got near the scene, they saw a large number of police cars and they saw someone lying on the ground. They then left.

OBSERVATIONS OF OFFICER ROPER

On January 27, 1983 at about 8 p.m., Officer Roper saw Mr. Hardwick walking westbound on Olsen Road. When high beams were placed on him he raised both arms to about shoulder level. He appeared to have something in his hands and it was hard to tell what the objects were. The object in his right hand appeared to be a thick rounded piece of wood about a foot long. Mr. Hardwick turned his head, facing away from the roadway. Officer Roper felt that turning the headlights on him caused the behavior of Hardwick and he drove on.

OBSERVATIONS OF [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was getting off the 23 Freeway at Olsen Road. When he was about halfway down the offramp, he saw a subject swinging a stick or a board at passing cars. The subject was cursing and screaming. [REDACTED] avoided hitting the subject. He then drove to the East Valley station and reported to the dispatcher what he had seen. As he left, he got on the freeway going southbound and pulled over to the center divider.

He parked and walked toward where officers were standing with the subject he had seen before. He heard an officer ordering the subject to stop. He saw the subject stop for a minute and then heard the subject screaming and saw him attack the officer. He said he saw the subject chasing the officer and again heard the officer order the subject to stop. He said the subject was right on top of the officer when he heard a shot. He felt he ought to get out of the way. He also felt the officer was in danger of being hurt. .

STATEMENT OF OFFICER BRAGA

On January 27, 1983 at about 8 p.m., I stopped a white Audi eastbound Highway 101 near Lynn Road for going over the maximum speed limit (a violation of section 22348(a) of the Vehicle Code) and I discovered an outstanding traffic warrant on the driver.

I advised [REDACTED] (the driver of the vehicle) of the warrant and was transporting him in the backseat of my unit to East Valley Sheriff's Office for processing.

I was northbound on Highway 23 at about 8:30 p.m. in the No. 2 lane approaching Olsen Road when I saw a male subject walking southbound on the east shoulder of the freeway.

The subject had what appeared to be a baton or a stick in his right hand. He would "attack" the northbound vehicles with the weapon as they drove past him. He put both of his hands and the weapon in the air and growled as if he were a wild man.

At approximately 2030 hours I made a U-turn in the center divider prior (sic) to Olsen Road and remained in the center divider following the subject approximately 20-40 yards. The subject continued to walk southbound on the northbound shoulder lane exhibiting a bizarre behavior.

I requested backup units and CHP to my location via radio. I advised the dispatcher to have all units expedite.

Approximately one to two minutes later, Deputy William Therrien arrived. I attracted his attention to the subject by the use of my spotlight.

Deputy Therrien stopped his unit northbound on Highway 23 in the median divider.

I continued southbound on the median divider passing Deputy Therrien's unit.

I made a U-turn on Highway 23, activated my revolving lights and bright headlights, stopping my unit on the northbound shoulder of the freeway directly across from Deputy Therrien's unit, which was parked northbound on the center divider.

I activated my spotlight and pointed it at the suspect, who was approximately 27 yards to the front of my unit.

I got out of my patrol car, leaving the driver's door open. I walked toward the left front fender of my unit and yelled to the subject, "Police, stop, put your stick down."

The subject continued walking toward me, waving his arms and stick in the air as he continued to "growl" like a bear.

I drew my baton and again yelled, "Police officer, drop your weapon."

The subject continued to advance toward me, yelling, "Fuck you."

When the subject got approximately 12 yards from me, he stopped for a second and with his right hand reached in the left side of his coat toward his waistband as if he were reaching for a gun.

The subject began running toward me, yelling obscenities and growling. He kept his right hand hidden under the left side of his coat while he waved his left hand in the air.

I immediately backtracked, drawing my on-duty weapon, a .45 caliber semi automatic, and taking cover behind the driver's door of my unit.

I yelled, "Police, freeze, take your hand out of your coat; police, freeze, expose your hands; freeze!"

The subject continued to advance, yelling, "Fuck you" and growling as he approached the front of my unit. His right hand remained hidden under the left portion of his coat.

I got up from a squatting position and began running backward toward the back of my unit, yelling, "Stop, stop, police, stop."

At the rear of my unit, the suspect removed an object from his left waistband with his right hand, raising it toward the right side of his head, and brought the weapon downward as if he was going to shoot me.

I immediately dropped to the ground while discharging three rounds at the subject.

Prior to discharging the rounds, the subject lunged at me from three to five feet away.

In my mind I felt positive the subject was going to kill me.

The subject fell on the dirt shoulder to the right side of me. I immediately got up.

Deputy Therrien rolled the subject on his back, where he continued to growl like a wild animal and shake his arms in a raging manner.

OBSERVATIONS OF [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] had been arrested by Deputy Braga on January 27, 1983 at 8: 23 p.m. and was handcuffed and witnessed the incident from the backseat of the patrol car. His statement is as follows:

"I caught a glimpse of the guy but the officer's eyes are sharp because he had said, 'Did you see that guy, he had a club.' So he did a U-turn and was driving in the center island of the freeway and drove along the divider with his light on the guy and I could see it looked like the guy was spaced. There was no question about it, he was walking along with clubs in both hands at the time. Originally the club in the right hand was a big club, I mean it wasn't a small one. It was a good-size one. It was as big as your billy club or whatever you call those nightsticks you carry and probably bigger around, but he was rather nicely dressed, I mean the guy had on a sportcoat, looked like it was corduroy. He was probably over 200 lbs. and probably over six feet, a big guy. The next thing that would happen was that he would go along and just yell at the world and shake his fists. So about that time the officer called for a backup and then shortly after that you could see the guy was endangering himself and somebody else because you couldn't tell whether he was gonna head out into the freeway because he was walking opposing traffic -- or wherever he was just gonna hit somebody. Finally the officer got out with his nightstick first and the guy stopped and he told him to stop and drop his clubs and the next

thing the guy did he just stuck his hand inside his coat like that and the officer dropped back and pulled his revolver, cocked it and told him to take his hand out of his coat. What happened after that happened awful fast. He stood there for just a moment, then he started this yell-type growl type thing then he raced at the officer with a club in his hand I did not see. The thing happened very quickly . . .

I know my first response when I saw him coming at me at the car was here I am with handcuffs on, what am I going to do to protect myself if he comes in this car after me. He chased the officer back to the back of his car and the officer shot him.

I'm no judge of anything but as far as I'm concerned, I put myself in the position of that officer. This was a big man coming at me with a club and it was me or him at that point.

He had an object in his hand when he went around the car. Now I can't guarantee that was not a gun rather than a club. He had the club raised up to strike the officer.

I don't drink and I don't smoke, I don't take drugs, but if I had to guess and I'm the worst guesser in the world, I would guess he had to be on drugs. I've never seen anybody quite that spaced out before.

Just yelling and gorilla tactics and screaming and yelling and made no sense at all."

██████████ was asked whether when Mr. Hardwick was facing the officer with his hand in his coat, did he obey the officer at any time. Traver said, "No, because when he had his hand in his coat then, when he removed his hand from the coat he removed it running like that. He was running at the officer at the time." Traver added the officer started backing up as fast as he could.

"As far as I'm concerned the officer did his duty as best he possibly could. You've got to realize at the time I'm arrested I'm mad, right. I'm mad, I'm pissed off that I'm arrested. Naturally I'm mad at the officer because he's the guy that got me, right. Guilty or not, I'm listening to him, we talked going up the road and he was telling me what's going on, because he checked out my record and said well you've got a traffic violation, they've got a warrant for your arrest, it's going to cost you 150 bucks close to that. The officer said and I'll even bring you back to the car. We talked about speed tickets. I immediately realized this guy was an unusual officer. The guy had some compassion. He wasn't an asshole by any means and from the way he handled himself from that time forward and throughout the entire process of handcuffing that individual, he did so as a person very concerned. The first thing he came and said after the shot was over was he came back and said, 'See what happens, shit.' The guy really felt bad about what he'd done."

What gets me is the officers are expected to be able to have split-second reaction and thoughts, but as far as I'm concerned he had no choice. He was, first off, he was in the interest of protecting the community, but her last thing that happened was he was protecting his own life. That guy was big enough, the guy was bigger than the officer and with a big club in his hand and what are you going to do at that point in time, you don't know what else the guy's got.

STATEMENT OF OFFICER THERRIEN

Officer Therrien was the backup officer and made the following statement.

I could see a patrol unit in the center divider with its headlights and the driver's side spotlight on facing southbound. Thinking the subject was in front of that unit I pulled over into the center divider. Deputy Braga immediately flashed his spotlight over the shoulder on the freeway pointing to the suspect. My unit was approximately 50 feet from the subject. I exited my unit and started to cross the freeway. A vehicle drove past in the lane and the subject took a swipe at the vehicle with a three-foot club in his left hand. The subject was standing approximately one foot from the fog line. I told the subject to hold it right there. Deputy Braga drove from the center divider to the shoulder of the freeway, parking his patrol unit directly in front of the subject. Deputy Braga turned his overhead revolving lights on. Braga exited his unit and walked toward the front of the unit, telling the subject to freeze, police.

The subject at this time had stepped back to the dirt portion of the freeway approximately 70 feet from the right headlight of the unit. The subject stated, come on out, fucker, swinging the object in his left hand and waving his right hand toward Deputy Braga. The subject was yelling and growling, gritting his teeth and acting very enraged. Deputy Braga was repeatedly telling the

subject, freeze, police, the subject acted like he was going to take a step toward Braga and at that time Braga pulled his baton from the ring.

The subject was yelling something at Braga but I couldn't hear what he was saying.

The subject abruptly stuck his right hand under his jacket, concealing his hand. Braga then stepped back, telling the subject, put your hands in the air. When the subject didn't comply with orders we both drew our service weapons at the subject.

Braga set his baton down and took cover behind the driver's door of his unit. I stepped back and took cover behind my trunk of the unit.

I was yelling at the subject, put your hands in the air, raise your hands. The subject was still yelling and growling toward us. The subject then started running toward the left front of Deputy Braga's unit with his right hand still concealed. When he reached the front of the unit Deputy Braga was stepping backwards telling the subject to stop. The subject had just passed the driver's door and pulled from underneath his jacket an object in his right hand.

The subject raised his right hand by his head and then leaped towards Braga pointing the object at Braga.

The subject was less than four feet away when he lunged toward Braga. Deputy Braga was falling backwards when he discharged three rounds from his weapon. Braga fell to the ground and the subject fell falling face forward.

The shooting occurred in the rear of Braga's unit.

I was standing between the No. 1 and 2 lanes of the 23 freeway. I walked over and said to Braga, "Let's cuff him up." The subject was still moving and growling. I then handcuffed him.

A passerby stating he was a paramedic assisted me with CPR. The civilian was giving breathing while I did the chest compressions. We executed the CPR approximately three minutes, reviving the subject at that time.

At the hospital Dr. [REDACTED] told me that the subject's last words were "get fucked" or "fuck you."

In the search of the subject's property a pair of toy vampire teeth were found in the lower pocket of his shirt.

- 8:33:50 - Braga again asked for an ambulance.
- 10:00 - East Valley Sheriff's Department phones Deputy District Attorney Dobroth informing him of the incident.
- 10:05 - Deputy District Attorney Dobroth phones Officer McDaniel at East Valley Sheriff's Station and informs him that a deputy district attorney will remain available for assistance during the rest of the evening.




AT ABOUT 8:30 P.M. LAST EVENING, AN INDIVIDUAL WHO WAS WALKING ON THE FILLMORE FWY #23, SOUTH IN THE NORTHSOUND LANES NEAR OLSEN ROAD, THOUSAND OAKS, WAS OBSERVED EXHIBITING BIZARRE BEHAVIOR.

A PASSING MOTORIST HAD REPORTED THE SUBJECT TO THE EAST VALLEY SHERIFFS STATION AS A PASSING SHERIFFS DEPUTY ON PATROL OBSERVED THE SUBJECT SWINGING WHAT APPEARED TO BE A WOODEN STAKE ABOUT 3 FEET IN LENGTH AT PASSING VEHICLES.

AND BEGAN RUNNING TOWARDS THE DEPUTY WHILE REMOVING AN OBJECT FROM HIS WAISTBAND.

THE SUBJECT WITHDREW THE OBJECT FROM HIS WAISTBAND, AND WHILE "GROWLING" LIKE AN ANIMAL" POINTED THE OBJECT AT THE OFFICER WHILE CHARGING HIM. (THE OBJECT LATER PROVED TO BE A BROKEN HAMMER HANDLE.)


THE OFFICER DISCHARGED HIS WEAPON, STRIKING THE SUBJECT TWICE IN THE CHEST. THE INCIDENT WAS OBSERVED BY SEVERAL PASSING MOTORISTS, AND THE ARRESTEE IN THE BACKSEAT OF THE OFFICER'S VEHICLE.

THE SHOOTING OFFICER, AND THE BACK-UP OFFICER, SUMMONED AN AMBULANCE AND ADMINISTERED FIRST AID AND C.P.R. TO THE WOUNDED SUBJECT.

IT WAS LEARNED THAT MR. HARDWICK WAS A MEDICALLY RETIRED LOS ANGELES POLICE OFFICER WHO







GENERAL: The following items were examined in conjunction with this case.

1. One fired bullet.
2. Three fired .45ACP cartridge cases.
3. AMT "Hardballer" semi-automatic pistol, caliber .45ACP, S/N [REDACTED]
4. SMITH AND WESSON model 66 revolver, caliber .357 Magnum, S/N [REDACTED]
5. One brown corduroy sport jacket.
6. One brown, white and yellow plaid shirt.

OBJECT:

1. To determine if the fired bullet (Item 1) and the fired cartridge cases (Item 2) were fired in the semi-automatic (Item 3).
2. To determine the type of ammunition contained in both guns (Items 3 and 4).
3. To determine if gunpowder residue was present on the jacket (Item 5) or the shirt (Item 6).
4. To determine if the semi-automatic pistol (Item 3) left a powder residue pattern at 3.5 feet.

DATA:

1. The fired bullet and cartridge cases were compared to bullets and cartridge cases test fired in the semi-automatic pistol by comparative microscopy.
2. Both guns were physically examined to determine ammunition type.
3. The jacket was examined physically and chemically tested for a gunpowder residue pattern.
4. The shirt was physically examined for gunpowder residue.
5. A gunpowder pattern test was conducted at 3.5 feet.

CONCLUSIONS:

1. The bullet (Item 1) and the three cartridge cases (Item 2) were fired in the AMT pistol (Item 3).
2. Both guns were loaded with ammunition of the type issued by the Ventura County Sheriff's Department for duty use.
3. No powder was detected on the brown jacket or the plaid shirt.
4. No powder pattern was detected on the target at 3.5 feet from the muzzle of the AMT pistol.




