


AUTOPSY FINDINGS:

- Gunshot wound upper lateral back
 - A. Entrance right upper lateral back
 - B. Path passes through posterior ribs, right diaphragm, right lower liver, thoracic spine, left diaphragm, left lower lobe of lung, and left ninth intercostal space
 - C. Bullet recovered from left lateral chest soft tissues
 - D. Direction of fire right-to-left, back-to-front and upward
- II. Gunshot wound of right mid back
 - A. Entrance right mid back
 - B. Path perforates right lower posterior ribs, passes behind lumbar spine and penetrates left kidney
 - C. Bullet recovered from left kidney
 - D. Direction of fire right-to-left and back-to-front



IDENTIFICATION:

The body is received in a blue vinyl pouch, with a medical examiner's tag attached to the zipper and inscribed with the decedent's name. The pouch is locked with seal #000932. The body is lying on a rigid board, which is on top of a green hospital sheet. Paper bags are over the hands.

CLOTHING:

A green, with blue and white stripes, knit short sleeve polo shirt has been cut from 1. body. The left sleeve is over the left arm, and the left side of the shirt is tucked underneath the left shoulder. There is bloodstaining on the front of the shirt, and the following defects are observed: A large ragged round defect is on the left anterior shoulder of the shirt, centered approximately 3" below the shoulder seam. The defect measures approximately 1" in diameter. Above and slightly lateral to this are two to three additional small defects in the shirt that measures approximately 1.4" in diameter each. There is bloodstaining around the defects. A ragged irregular defect on the left front of the shirt, just above the lateral top corner of the chest pocket, measures approximately 1" in maximum diameter. A portion of torn fabric partially bridges this defect, but is detached from the inner edge of the main defect. There is bloodstaining on the shirt anterior to the defect. A number of defects are grouped at the cut front edge of the shirt, just medial to the bottom of the placket. These range in size from 1/4" - 1/2". Below these, opposite the medial bottom edge of the pocket are two to three roughly round, slightly irregular defects, which measure between 1/4" - 1/2" in diameter. An oval defect 1/2" below the left chest pocket, measures approximately 1" x ½". A ragged defect on the lower portion of the pocket itself has edges that are outwardly curved and measures 1/2" in diameter. A small sliver of tan foreign material is clinging to the frayed threads of the defect. A small round hole is on the medial edge of the pocket, over the seam, and approximately 1" above the bottom of the pocket. This hole measures 1/4" in diameter.

A diagonally oriented oval defect, located 3 ½" below the lateral bottom corner of the pocket measures 1" x ½". A round defect located 6" below the pocket and more medial to the oval defect, measures ¼" in diameter. A very irregular defect on the left side of the shirt, just to the left of midline, located approximately 10" above the bottom hem, measures approximately 2.0 x 1.0 cm. Lateral to this is an irregular oval defect, which is approximately ½" in maximum diameter. Medial to the large defect is another slightly oval-shaped defect that measures 1" x ½". On the left lower front of the shirt, centered approximately 5 ½" above the bottom hemline is a group of four irregular round defects, which are arranged in an open S-shape and measure up to ¼" in maximum diameter. An irregular defect on the right front of the shirt, just to the right of midline and 3" above the bottom hem, measures approximately 1 ¼" x ¾".



A downwardly curved defect in the mid portion of the front of the shirt, approximately 3/2" above the hem, measures 1/2" transversely. An L-shaped fragment of copper jacketing, with attached green threads, is stuck to the lower front of the shirt and is located approximately 5" above the bottom hem, in the midline. On the left posterior shoulder area, adjacent to the shoulder seam, is a transversely oriented defect, which measures 1/2". A group of irregular defects on the more lateral posterior shoulder, located 2 1/2" below and behind the shoulder seam, covers an area measuring approximately 1" in maximum diameter. The smallest hole is approximately 1" in diameter. There is a small smear of blood on the fabric, adjacent to these defects. A folded deposit ticket, with the name "Thomas Patton" and the date "10/12/01" is in the pocket of the shirt. The deposit indicated on the ticket is one hundred dollars. There is a ragged defect at the bottom of the deposit slip that corresponds in shape to the defect in the pocket of the shirt.

The other half of the polo shirt was not with the body and was not recovered at the scene.

- 2. Red Jockey-brand bikini underbriefs. The briefs have been cut across the waistband on both sides and are lying underneath the pelvis. The front of the briefs is heavily saturated with blood, and there is heavy bloodstaining on the right and left backs of the briefs as well. The following defects are observed: An irregular hole in the left posterior hip area measures approximately 1" in diameter. A curved notch is out of the right side of the waistband, just in front of the side seam, and measures approximately ¼" in diameter. A vertically oriented interrupted tear is along the front edge of the right side seam and measures approximately ¾" in length. A round hole on the right side of the briefs, just below the waistband and 1" behind the side seam, measures ¼" in diameter.
- 3. A pair of green Bermuda shorts was recovered at the scene. The shorts have been cut up the front of both legs. There is bloodstaining on the front of the shorts. The following defects are observed: A series of irregular tears is vertically oriented on the left side of the shorts, extending from 5" below the top of the waistband to the mid thigh. The largest tear is over the lower portion of the pocket and measures approximately 1 ¾" in length. An irregular tear on the left leg of the shorts, centered approximately 7" above the bottom hem, measures 1". The edges of the tear are frayed. A smaller, slightly frayed defect on the left leg of the shorts, is located 6" above the bottom hem and medial to the previously described tear. This measures ¼" in diameter. An irregular defect on the right waistband of the shorts, just above the right side of the zipper, is partially folded back and measures approximately 1.0 cm. There is blood and a small amount of soft tissue clinging to the surface around the defect. A ragged, roughly round hole on the right leg of the shorts is located ¾" above the hem, and measures ¼" in diameter.

An oval frayed defect on the right side of the shorts, over the lower portion of the pocket, measures approximately 1/4" in maximum size. A transversely oriented tear inside the right pocket of the short, extends from the seam into a hidden portion of the pocket, and tears through the watch pocket. This large defect measures approximately 2 1/2" x 3". Two round to oval defects on the right back leg of the shorts are located 8" and 11" below the top of the waistband. The higher defect is below the lateral side of the hip pocket, and measures 3/8" in diameter. The lower defect is on a level with the mid portion of the pocket, and measures 5/8" x 1/4". Two additional defects on the right back of the shorts are aligned with the medial edge of the hip pocket, and are located approximately 12" and 13" from the top of the waistband. The defects are aligned and measure 3/4" and 1/4" in their maximum diameters. An Lshaped defect in the left back of the shorts, located approximately 3/4" above the hem. measures 1/4" x 1/4" on a side. There is a heavy deposit of clotted blood and a small amount of soft tissue on the hem of the shorts near this defect. A slightly frayed round defect on the right waistband of the shorts is approximately 1/2" in diameter. There is also a round frayed defect over the right tab of the shorts that passes through the tab and through the waistband. These two superimposed defects measure approximately 1/4" in diameter.

EVIDENCE OF MEDICAL THERAPY:

- An endotracheal tube is strapped in the mouth.
- EKG monitor pads are on the anterior torso.
- A vascular line is in the right side of the neck.
- Two rolls of gauze, taped to a syringe attached to a catheter at one end and a piece of rubber at the other end, are lying next to the head.

EXTERNAL EXAMINATION:

The body is that of a well-developed, well-nourished Caucasian male, who appears consistent with the listed age of 56 years. The length is 68" and the weight is 213 pounds. The body has not been embalmed and is well preserved. Rigidity is well developed on the extremities, and lividity is posterior and fixed. The body has been refrigerated and is cold to the touch.

The intact scalp is covered by straight gray hair, which measures up to 4" in length. The corneas are clear, and the irides are blue. The conjunctivae are pale, and without petechial hemorrhage. The nose is intact, without secretions. The lips are intact and the jaws are edentulous. A small amount of regurgitated gastric contents are in the mouth. A red-gray 2.0 cm. moustache is in place.

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The remainder of the beard area is covered by very short stubble. The ears are normally formed. The neck is straight and symmetrical and the trachea is midline.

The chest is symmetrical and the breasts are those of a normal adult male.

The abdomen is flat, without palpable organomegaly. The genitals are those of a normal circumcised adult male, with the testicles bilaterally descended into the scrotum.

The arms and hands are normally formed. The nailbeds are cyanotic and the fingernails are of varying lengths. A moderate amount of soil is beneath the fingernails, and there is ground-in soil on the palmar surfaces of the hands. The legs are normally formed, without angularity or edema. The feet and toenails are unremarkable.

The back is straight and symmetrical and the anus is without injury.

EVIDENCE OF INJURY:

The gunshot wounds are numbered for the purposes of description, without reference to chronology.

GUNSHOT WOUNDS:

I. GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT UPPER LATERAL BACK:

Entrance – Labeled "A" in the diagram, centered 22 ½" from the top of the head and 6" to the right of posterior midline, is a gunshot entrance wound, which measures 0.8 cm. in diameter. Marginal abrasion around the wound is circumferential, and measures approximately 0.1 cm. in width.

Path – After passing through skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the right lateral upper back, the bullet enters the right thoracic cavity, producing fractures of right posterolateral ribs eight and nine. The bullet then passes through the right diaphragmatic leaf, perforates the lower portion of the right hepatic lobe, perforates the thoracic spine at approximately the T10 level, perforates the left leaf of the diaphragm, and the lower lobe of the left lung. It then exits the left thoracic cavity through the ninth intercostal space.

Exit - None.

Bullet –A medium caliber deformed, partially jacketed slug is recovered from soft tissue in the left lateral chest wall.

Direction of fire – The bullet passes from right-to-left, slightly back-to-front, and very slightly upward.

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II. GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT MID BACK:

Entrance – Labeled "B" in the diagram, on the right mid back, centered 24" from the top of the head and 3 ½" to the right of posterior midline, is a gunshot wound, which measures approximately 0.7 cm. in diameter. The entrance is surrounded by circumferential margin abrasion, which measures approximately 0.1 cm. in width.

Path – After passing through skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the right mid back, the bullet fractures right lower posterior ribs, passes posterior to the upper lumbar spine, and enters the left abdomen, where it penetrates the left kidney.

Exit - None.

Bullet – A medium caliber, partially jacketed, deformed slug is recovered from left kidney parenchyma.

Direction of fire – The bullet passes from right-to-left and back-to-front, without significant vertical deviation.

III. SHOTGUN WOUND OF RIGHT FLANK:

Entrance – Labeled "C" in the diagram, on the right flank, centered approximately 26" from the top of the head and 9" to the right of anterior midline, is a shotgun entrance wound, which has a smooth uninterrupted margin, and measures 3.0 cm. in diameter. There is slight marginal abrasion at the superior edge of the wound, which measures approximately 0.2 cm. in width.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the right flank, the slug enters the abdominal cavity and fragments the right kidney, perforates the inferior vena cava, fragments the lower lumbar spine, and lodges as described below.

Exit - None.

Bullet – A deformed shotgun slug is recovered from soft tissues in the left lower flank. The shotgun wad is recovered from the left side of the lumbar spine.

Direction of fire – The projectile passes from right-to-left and slightly downward, without significant anterior or posterior deviation.

IV. GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT UPPER POSTERIOR THIGH:

Entrance – Labeled "D" on the diagram, on the right posterior upper thigh, 27" above the right heel, is a gunshot entrance wound,



which measures approximately 0.7 cm. in diameter, and has marginal abrasion located primarily on its inferior edge, where it measures 0.2 cm. in width.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous tissue, the bullet passes through the muscle and left tissue and lodges as described below.

Exit - None.

Bullet – A deformed partially jacketed slug is recovered from the pelvis, medial to the right lesser trochanter.

Direction of fire - The bullet passes from back-to-front and upwrad.

V. GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT MID POSTERIOR THIGH:

Entrance – Labeled "E" in the diagram, on the right mid posterior thigh, centered 24 ½" above the bottom of the right heel, is a round gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 0.8 cm. in diameter, and exhibits marginal abrasion on its inferior margin.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the thigh, the bullet passes through muscle, behind the proximal femur, and exits as described below.

Exit – Labeled "M" on the diagram, on the right upper inner thigh, is an irregular gunshot exit wound, which measures approximately 1.5 x 1.0 cm. in its largest dimensions.

PARTIAL RE-ENTRY:

Re-entry – Labeled "K" on the diagram, on the left upper medial thigh, 30" above the left heel, is a V-shaped atypical superficial gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 1.0 cm. on each side.

Path - The bullet penetrates for a very short distance into subcutaneous fat.

Bullet - Not recovered.

Direction of fire - The bullet passes from right-to-left, back-to-front and upward.

VI. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT MEDIAL POSTERIOR THIGH:

Entrance – Labeled "F" in the diagram, on the left posteromedial thigh, centered 27" above the bottom of the left heel, is a gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 0.7 cm. in diameter. Subcutaneous hemorrhage is located at its inferolateral margin.



Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the left posterior thigh, the bullet passes through muscle of the thigh, strikes the pelvis, and lodges as described below.

Exit - None.

BULLET - A projectile is recovered from soft tissue in the left lateral thigh.

Direction of fire - The bullet passes from back-to-front, right-to-left, and upward.

VII. GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT ANTERIOR CHEST:

Entrance – Labeled "G" in the diagram, on the right upper anterior chest, centered 16" from the top of the head and 6" to the right of anterior midline, is a tangential gunshot entrance wound, which measures 1.8 cm. transversely, by 1.0 cm. vertically. Marginal abrasion is located primarily superiorly and laterally, where it measures up to 0.5 cm. in width.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the right anterior chest, the bullet follows a subcutaneous course for a short distance through pectoral muscle, and then enters the right thoracic cavity through the fourth anterolateral intercostal space. The bullet perforates the anterior edge of the right middle lobe of the lung, perforates the right diaphragm and perforates the right lobe of the liver. It then perforates the small intestine and fractures the left tenth rib.

Exit - None.

Bullet - A projectile is recovered from soft tissue adjacent to the left tenth rib.

Direction of fire - The bullet passes right-to-left, front-to-back and downward.


VIII. GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT UPPER LATERAL THIGH:

Entrance – Labeled "H" in the diagram, on the right upper lateral thigh, 35" above the bottom of the right heel, is a gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 0.7 cm. in diameter, and has marginal abrasion located primarily at its inferior edge.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the right thigh, the bullet passes upward through the thigh and enters the pelvic cavity through the right ileum. The bullet then strikes the lumbar spine and lodges as described below.

Exit - None.

Bullet – A deformed, partially jacketed medium caliber projectile is recovered from the L2-3 disc.



Direction of fire - The bullet passes right-to-left and upward.

IX. GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT LOWER LATERAL THIGH:

Entrance – Labeled "I" in the diagram, 34" above the right heel, in the right lower lateral thigh, is a gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 0.6 cm. in diameter. Marginal abrasion around the wound measures up to 0.2 cm. in width.

Path — After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the thigh, the bullet fractures the right pubic ramus and enters the pelvic cavity, where it passes behind the urinary bladder, perforates the sigmoid, and lodges in bone as described below.

Exit - None.

Bullet - A deformed, partially jacketed projectile is recovered from the left posterior ileum.

Direction of fire - The bullet passes right-to-left, front-to-back and upward.

X. GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT ANTERIOR MID THIGH:

Entrance – Labeled "J" in the diagram, on the right anterior thigh, centered 30" above the bottom of the right heel, is a tangential gunshot entrance wound, which measures 1.0 cm. in diameter. Marginal abrasion is primarily inferior, where it measures up to 0.5 cm. in width.

Path – The bullet follows a subcutaneous and soft tissue course upward through the thigh, across the anterior surface of the right pubic ramus and into the abdominal wall.


Exit – Labeled "N" on the diagram, on the right lower abdomen, 34" from the top of the head and approximately 1" to the right of midline, is a gunshot exit wound, which measures approximately 1.8 x 1.0 in its largest dimensions. The ovoid wound is diagonally oriented and is surrounded by contusion.

Direction of fire - The bullet passes from right-to-left and upward.

XI. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT MEDIAL THIGH:

Entrance – Labeled "L" on the diagram, on the left medial thigh, 27" above the bottom of the left heel, is a gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 0.7 cm. in diameter.

Path - The bullet passes through muscle.



Exit – Labeled "FF" on the diagram, on the left upper posterior thigh, just below the gluteal crease, centered approximately 33" above the bottom of the left heel, is an irregular gunshot exit wound, which measures approximately 1.5 cm. in maximum dimension.

Direction of fire - The bullet passes right-to-left, front-to-back and upward.

XII. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT ANTERIOR THIGH:

Entrance – Labeled "O" on the diagram, on the left anterior thigh, is a tangential shotgun entrance wound, located 31 ½" above the left heel.

Path – The bullet passes through soft tissue.

Exit - None.

Bullet - The bullet is recovered from soft tissue of the left lateral thigh.

Direction of fire - The projectile passes right-to-left, front-to-back and upward.

XIII. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT DELTOID:

Entrance – Labeled "U" on the diagram, on the left anterior deltoid, centered 4" below the top of the left shoulder, is a gunshot entrance wound, which measures 1.5 cm. vertically by 0.7 cm. transversely. A broad area of marginal abrasion is on the anterior edge of the wound and measures up to 1.0 cm. in width.


Path – The bullet perforates skin, subcutaneous soft tissues and muscles of the left shoulder.

Exit – Labeled "V" on the diagram, on the left posterior shoulder, 4" below the top of the shoulder, is a slit-like gunshot exit wound, which measures 1.2 cm. in length.

Direction of fire – The bullet passes from front-to-back, without significant right-to-left or vertical deviation.

XIV. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT WRIST:

Entrance – Labeled "W" on the diagram, on the radial aspect of the left upper wrist, is a gunshot entrance wound, with severe disruption of soft tissues. There is a focus of marginal abrasion on the wound.



Exit – Labeled "X" on the diagram, on the ulnar aspect of the left wrist, is a severely disrupted gunshot exit wound. A fragment of jacketing material is recovered from soft tissues within this wound.

Direction of fire – With the arm held in the normal anatomic position, the bullet travels from left-to-right.

XV. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT POSTERIOR UPPER FOREARM:

Entrance – Labeled "Y" on the diagram, on the left posterior upper forearm, is a tangential gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 2.0 cm. in length.

Path – After passing through skin and subcutaneous soft tissues, the bullet produces a comminuted fracture of the left proximal ulna, and enters the soft tissues of the left upper arm.

Exit - None.

Bullet – A deformed, partially jacketed slug is recovered from soft tissues, just above the left elbow.

Direction of fire – With the arm held in the normal anatomic position, the bullet passes from left-to-right and upward.

XVI. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT POSTERIOR FOREARM:


Entrance – Labeled "Z" on the diagram, on the posterior left forearm, is a widely gaping and complex gunshot entrance wound. There is dark gray deposit on some of the inferior edges of the lacerated skin and subcutaneous soft tissue.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues, the bullet passes into the forearm, producing comminuted fractures of the radius and ulna, and then travels upward across the elbow into the upper arm.

Exit - None.

Bullet – A deformed, partially jacketed slug is recovered from soft tissues in the area of the left triceps muscle.

Direction of fire – With the arm held in the normal anatomic position, the bullet travels upward, without significant anterior-posterior or right-to-left deviation.



XVII. SECOND GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT POSTERIOR FOREARM:

Entrance – Labeled "Z on the diagram, on the posterior left forearm, is a widely gaping and complex gunshot entrance wound. There is dark gray deposit on some of the inferior edges of the lacerated skin and subcutaneous soft tissue.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissue, the bullet passes into the forearm, producing comminuted fractures of the radius and ulna, and then travels upward across the elbow into the upper arm.

Exit - None.

Bullet – A deformed, partially jacketed slug is recovered from soft tissues in the area of the left triceps muscle.

Direction of fire – With the arm held in the anatomical position, the bullet travels upward, without significant anterior-posterior or right-to-left deviation.

XVIII. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT DORSAL WRIST:

Entrance -Labeled "AA" on the diagram, on the ulnar aspect of the dorsal left wrist, is a lacerated irregular gunshot entrance wound.

Path – The bullet follows a subcutaneous course across the dorsum of the wrist, producing chip fractures of the distal carpal bones.

Exit – Labeled "BB" on the diagram, on the radial aspect of the dorsal left wrist, is an irregular gunshot exit wound.

Direction of fire – With the arm held in the normal anatomic position, the bullet passes from right-to-left, without significant vertical or anterior-posterior deviation.

XIX. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT LOWER LEG:

Entrance – Labeled "CC" on the diagram, on the left anterior lower leg, just lateral to the tibia, 14" above the bottom of the left heel, is a gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 0.8 cm. in diameter.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissues of the anterior lower leg, the bullet passes through muscles of the lateral lower leg and exits as described below.



Exit – Labeled "DD" on the diagram, 19" above the bottom of the left heel, on the left lateral calf, is an irregular gunshot exit wound, which measures approximately 1.5 cm. in maximum size.

Direction of fire - The bullet passes from right-to-left, front-to-back and upward.

XX. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT LOWER ABDOMEN:

Entrance – Labeled "Q" in the diagram, centered 28 ½" from the top of the head and ½" to the left, and above the umbilicus, is a gunshot entrance wound which measures approximately 0.7 cm. in diameter.

Path – The bullet enters the abdominal cavity and travels upward, fragmenting the spleen. It passes through the left diaphragmatic leaf and perforates the anterior edge of the left lower lobe of the lung. It exits the left pleural cavity through the left seventh intercostal space.

Exit -None.

Bullet – A deformed, partially jacketed projectile is recovered from soft tissues in the left flank, 21" from the top of the head and 13" to the left of anterior midline.

Direction of fire - The bullet passes from right-to-left, front-to-back and upward.

XXI. GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT UPPER ABDOMEN:

Entrance – Labeled "R" on the diagram, on the left abdomen, centered 29" from the top of the head and 3" to the left of anterior midline, is a gunshot entrance wound, which measures 0.8 cm. in diameter.

Path - The bullet pursues a subcutaneous course through the abdominal wall soft tissue.

Exit – Labeled "P" on the diagram, 28" from the top of the head and 1 ½" to the left of anterior midline, above the umbilicus, is a gunshot exit wound, which measures approximately 1.0 cm. in maximum dimension.

Direction of fire - The bullet passes from left-to-right and slightly upward.

XXII. GRAZE WOUND OF LEFT LOWER LEG:

Entrance – Labeled "EE" on the diagram, on the left lower leg, immediately above gunshot wound "CC", is a superficial graze wound, which is diagonally oriented and measures approximately 3.0 cm. in length.



Direction of fire – The bullet passes from slightly right-to-left and upward.

XXIII. GRAZE WOUND OF LEFT LATERAL ABDOMEN:

Entrance – Labeled "S" on the diagram, on the left lateral abdomen, just above the anterior iliac crest, 30" from the top of the head and 5 ½" to the left of midline,

is a complex superficial graze wound, which is slightly diagonally oriented and measures approximately 5.0 cm. in length.

Direction of fire - The bullet passes from right-to-left and slightly upward.

XXIV. GRAZE WOUND OF LEFT CHEST:

Entrance – Labeled "T" on the diagram, on the left anterior chest, 23" from the top of the head and 3" to the left of anterior midline, is a transversely oriented superficial graze wound, which measures approximately 3.0 cm. in length.

Direction of fire - Could not be determined.

XXV. GRAZE WOUND OF LEFT MID LATERAL ABDOMEN:

Entrance – Labeled "GG" on the diagram, on the left mid lateral abdomen, approximately 32.0 cm. from the top of the head and 7.0 cm. to the left of anterior midline, is a vertically oriented dark red graze-type wound, which measures 3.0 cm. vertically by 1.0 cm. transversely. The wound is located directly above the lateral edge of gunshot wound "S".

Direction of fire - Could not be determined.

XXVI. GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT FLANK:

Entrance – Superimposed over shotgun wound "C" on the diagram, and obliterated by entrance wound "C", is a gunshot entrance wound on the right flank, located approximately 26" from the top of the head and 9" to the right of anterior midline

Path – The bullet enters the abdominal cavity, strikes the lower lumbar spine.

Bullet - A mushroomed, partially jacketed, slug is recovered free within the pelvic cavity.

Direction of fire - The bullet passes right-to-left.


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- Multiple small scattered abrasions are on the mid abdomen and measure up to 0.5 cm. in maximum size.
- A linear abrasion over the right scapula measures 3.0 cm. in length.
- A curvilinear abrasion over the left scapula measures approximately 5.0 cm. in length.
- A dry dark red abrasion on the right posterior forearm is vertically oriented and measures 8.0 x 1.0 cm.
- A light red abrasion on the right medial elbow measures 2.0 x 1.0 cm.
- Dark red irregular abrasion is on the ulnar aspect of the right wrist, and measures 1.0
 x 2.0 cm. There is slightly angulated circumferential contusion around the right wrist
 that measures approximately 0.5 cm. in width. The position of the contusion is
 consistent with injury from a handcuff.
- A light red abrasion over the right fifth PIP joint measures 1.0 x 0.5 cm.
- A light red abrasion over the right third MP joint measures 1.0 x 2.0 cm.
- A contusion over the right fifth DIP joint measures 1.0 x 1.0 cm.
- A round to oval deep abrasion is on the radial aspect of the right thumb IP joint, and measures 1.2 cm. in diameter.
- Dark blue contusion is over the dorsum of the right thumb, extending from the MP joint to the cuticle. Incision of the area reveals hemorrhage down to tendon.
- Slightly angulated light blue contusion is about the left wrist, and measures 0.5 cm. in width. The position of the contusion is consistent with the position of a handcuff.
- Multiple nonpatterned irregular abrasions are on the left deltoid area, around the gunshot entrance wound, and measures up to 1.0 cm. in maximum size.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION:

The body is opened through an abdominal fat layer of 2.0-3.0 cm. and a muscle layer of 1.0 cm. at the level of the umbilicus. The internal organs are found in their normal positions and are covered by glistening serosal surfaces. There is marked atelectasis of the right lung, and the right pleural cavity contains approximately 50 cc. of blood. The left pleural cavity contains approximately 400 cc. of liquid blood.



There is no abnormal accumulation of pericardial cavity fluid. The abdominal organs are heavily coated with blood, and approximately 100-200 cc. of blood has accumulated within the abdominal cavity. Internal injuries have been described.

SYSTEMS REVIEW:

CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM: The heart weighs 460 grams and is covered by glistening epicardium, with a large amount of epicardial fat. The coronary arteries arise normally and follow a right-dominant course.

There is focally calcific atherosclerosis of the left anterior descending coronary artery, with up to 50% narrowing of the vessel lumen. The circumflex and right coronary arteries exhibit minimal atherosclerosis. Sections of the myocardium are firm, red-brown and finely fibrillar, without evidence of recent or old ischemic injury. The heart is lined by glistening endocardium. The cardiac valves have their normal structure and the leaflets are thin and translucent, without calcification or vegetations. The coronary ostia are patent. The aorta follows a normal course through the chest and into the abdomen, and exhibits calcific atherosclerosis throughout its length. Blood vessels contain scant quantities of liquid blood.

RESPIRATORY SYSTEM: The right and left lungs together weigh 830 grams. Both are covered by glistening tan to purple pleural surfaces, with very large quantities of subpleural anthracotic pigment deposition. The bronchi are patent and are lined by tan mucosa, which is coated with thick tan mucus. There are no pulmonary thromboemboli. Cut surfaces of the lungs are atelectatic and severely anthracotic, without areas of consolidation or other focal lesions. Injury has been described.

HEPATOBILIARY SYSTEM: The liver weighs 1910 grams and is covered by a glistening red-brown capsule. Gunshot wounds have been described. Cut surfaces are firm and red-brown, without lesions. The bile ducts are patent and the gallbladder contains approximately 1 cc. of bile and no stones.

GASTROINTESTINAL SYSTEM: The intact esophagus is lined by tan mucosa. The stomach contains approximately 200 cc. of thick unidentifiable liquid. The gastric mucosa is unremarkable. The pylorus is patent and the duodenal contents are bile-stained. The remainder of the small intestine and large intestine are normal to inspection and palpation, aside from gunshot wound injuries of the small intestine and sigmoid colon. The appendix is normal.

The pancreas is of normal size and shape, and cut surfaces are tan and lobulated, without lesions.

. . **HEMATOPOIETIC SYSTEM:** The spleen weighs 160 grams and is covered by a glistening purple capsule. Massive injury has been described. Cut surfaces are very soft, with inconspicuous white pulp areas. Lymph nodes within the neck, chest and abdomen are unremarkable. The thymus is replaced by fat.

GENITOURINARY SYSTEM: The right and left kidneys together weigh 280 grams. The capsules strip with ease from both, revealing glistening purple cortical surfaces. Injury has been described. Cut surfaces show clear demarcation between congested cortical and medullary areas. The renal calyces and pelves are not dilated and drain into ureters of normal caliber, which follow a normal course to the urinary bladder, which contains approximately 60 cc. of clear yellow urine. The bladder is lined by unremarkable tan mucosa. The prostate is normal to sectioning. The testicles are normal to palpation within the scrotum.

ENDOCRINE SYSTEM: The thyroid is of normal size and shape, and cut surfaces are maroon and finely lobulated, without lesions. There is a 1.0 cm. nodule in the right thyroid lobe. The adrenal glands are of normal size and shape, and cut surfaces show unremarkable golden cortical and maroon medullary areas. The pituitary is normal.


NECK: There is no hemorrhage within the strap muscles, thyroid or posterior pharyngeal constrictors. The bony and cartilaginous structures of the larynx, and the hyoid bone, are intact. The larynx and trachea are patent and are lined by tan mucosa. There is no abnormal mobility or crepitance of the cervical vertebrae.

MUSCULOSKELETAL SYSTEM: The muscles are normally developed and consistent with those of an adult male. The skeleton is normally developed and consistent with that of an adult male. Multiple fractures have been described.

HEAD: Reflection of the scalp reveals no subgaleal hemorrhage. The calvarium is intact. There is no epidural or subdural hemorrhage. Removal of the dura from the base of the skull reveals no hemorrhage or fractures. The pituitary and proximal spinal cord are intact.

CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM: The fresh brain weighs 1430 grams and is covered by glistening transparent leptomeninges. The gyri are normally oriented and exhibit no significant flattening. Examination of the base of the brain reveals an intact circle of Willis, without atherosclerosis or aneurysms. The cranial nerves are intact. There is no uncal or cerebellar tonsillar herniation. There is no subarachnoid hemorrhage. The brainstem has a normal external appearance. There is firmness to the posterior aspects of both the right and left cerebellar lobes.

Sections of the cerebral hemispheres reveal an intact cortical ribbon and underlying white matter. The basal ganglia and thalamus have their normal appearance. The ventricles are not dilated and are lined by glistening ependyma, without intraventricular hemorrhage.



Sections of the cerebellum show firm areas within the central white matter of both right and left lobes.

TOXICOLOGY:

The following specimens are retained: Central blood, urine and

gastric contents.

HISTOLOGY:

Representative tissues are retained.

PHOTOGRAPHS:

35 mm. photographs are obtained.

X-RAYS:

Multiple x-rays are available for examination.

EVIDENCE:

A purple top tube of blood, clothing and the recovered bullets are

submitted to the sheriff's office B.I. Swabs of the face are obtained

by sheriff's B.I., as are fingerprints from the right hand.

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


DIAGRAM OVERALL VIEW

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

It was a lot of shots fired." I asked what happened after she went to the front yard and looked over toward Thomas' residence. She said, "They're just -- the police were running around everywhere and stuff." I asked what the deputies were doing. She said, "I don't know. Just talking to people or saying what had happened. 

- Ammunition casings from handguns and a shotgun.
- Blood stained clothing that Tom Patton was wearing at the time of his assault on the deputies.
- Expended ammunition slugs, including one slug that was imbedded into the doorframe of the front door leading into the residence.

During the search for ammunition casings, Detective Laughlin and I had to cut back a significant portion of ivy that was in the front yard directly across from the front door. This was done in order to locate several ammunition casings that were concealed by the ivy. Once the evidence was located, I assisted the Field Evidence Technicians in the collection and storage of the items to be seized pursuant to the search warrant.

Once the evidence was collected, I cleared the scene at approximately 0935 hours.



As you enter the residence through the front door, there is an entryway that leads south and west to the kitchen and hallway. Immediately west of the entryway is the kitchen area. West from the kitchen is a door to the garage area. The garage area had been converted to a living area. There was a living room and dining area north of the kitchen.

Continuing east from the entryway is a hallway that runs east within the residence. The first door on the north side of the hallway leads to a bathroom. The first door on the south side leads to a room which contained a computer desk, stereo and other items.

Continuing east, there is a second door on the north side of the hallway which leads to a bedroom. There was a dresser, bed, end tables and other items within the room. The second door on the south side of the hallway leads to a bedroom that contained a bed, a dresser, and other items within the room.

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

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The following is a synopsis of our tape-recorded conversation.


Deputy Stubblefield was driving his traffic motorcycle north on Moorpark (Moorpark Road) at Gainsborough (Gainsborough Road). When Deputy Stubblefield plugged into his motorcycle radio, he forgot to switch over from his portable radio to his regular radio. Deputy Stubblefield heard someone ask for back-up and dispatch told "nine ocean" (9021) to respond code-three. Deputy Stubblefield switched his box over (radio control unit) to regular radio, so he could hear better and asked for the location. Deputy Stubblefield was told the address was Deputy Stubblefield realized he was right around the corner and responded code (code three) to help the officers that were at the location.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield where he parked his motorcycle. Deputy Stubblefield parked near the front of a house. (Deputy Stubblefield did not know the address of the location, but pointed to Deputy Stubblefield explained he was traveling north on Moorpark and turned east on Flores (Avenida De Las Flores). As he drove, Deputy Stubblefield asked for a cross street and thought one of the officers said, "Montgomery." As Deputy Stubblefield came closer, he saw the units parked on the south side of the road and saw the officers in front of (south east corner). Deputy Stubblefield parked in front of the house.

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I asked Deputy Stubblefield what officers he saw in front of the house. Deputy Stubblefield said he saw Deputy Hutchinson and Deputy Sabio. Deputy Stubblefield then said he was the first one there (third officer on scene). Deputy Stubblefield was referring to the units who were responding to assist Deputy Hutchinson and Deputy Sabio.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield what happened. I was referring to when he arrived. Deputy Stubblefield said when he pulled-up, he heard shots fired. Deputy Stubblefield did not know who fired the shots. Deputy Stubblefield put out "10-97" (arrived at scene), shots fired and suspect down.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield what was the distance between the suspect, Hutchinson and Sabio.

Deputy Stubblefield said the suspect was near the front door area on the porch. Deputy Hutchinson and Deputy Sabio were east on the walkway. Deputy Stubblefield estimated the distance at between five to ten feet.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield who had their weapons drawn and what stance they were in.

Deputy Stubblefield explained that when he drove up he saw their weapons were out. Deputy

Stubblefield again said the weapons were out and shots were fired.

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I asked Deputy Stubblefield if he heard the shots being fired. Deputy Stubblefield said he saw the shots being fired. Deputy Stubblefield explained that when he pulled-up he heard shots as he was parking. Deputy Stubblefield was not sure if the suspect went to the ground or doubled over, but he knew the suspect had been shot.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield how far the suspect was from Deputy Hutchinson. Deputy Stubblefield estimated he (Deputy Hutchinson) was between five to ten feet from the suspect.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield how far the suspect was from Deputy Sabio. Deputy Stubblefield said Deputy Sabio was right next to Deputy Hutchinson. Deputy Stubblefield said they were side-by-side and Deputy Sabio was behind Deputy Hutchinson. Deputy Stubblefield was on the sidewalk and estimated he was about twenty-five feet away from the incident. Deputy Stubblefield then motioned to a blue van parked in front of

and said he parked in front of the van and jumped off of his bike (motorcycle).

Deputy Stubblefield explained that after he got off of his motorcycle, he drew his weapon and saw the suspect get up. Deputy Stubblefield said he was not sure if the suspect went to the ground or just doubled over, but said the suspect never dropped the knife. Deputy Stubblefield said they repeated commands like "drop the knife, drop the knife." Deputy Stubblefield said the suspect was saying, "I'm not going back to jail, I'm not going to do it."

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Deputy Stubblefield also said the suspect was yelling at someone in the house and said, "Why did you do this to me, why did you call." Deputy Stubblefield thought he heard the suspect say, "We've been married thirty years." The suspect then tried to go back inside the house.

Someone told the suspect he was not going inside and they were yelling at him to drop the knife. The suspect walked to the side gate (Deputy Stubblefield motioned to the east side of the residence) and went into the backyard. They (deputies) tried to open the gate, and the suspect was standing there. The suspect would lunge the knife at them and would say, "Stay away" and "get away from me." Deputy Stubblefield saw Deputies Sedgewick and Alvarez arrive and go to the other side yard and look over the fence. (Deputy Stubblefield motioned to the area east of

At this time Deputy Stubblefield received a call from his wife and there was a brief break in the interview.

When the conversation resumed, Deputy Stubblefield again said they (deputies) tried to open the gate and one time he (the suspect) lunged his knife out.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield who the suspect lunged the knife toward. Deputy Stubblefield thought it was Deputy Hutchinson who opened the gate and the suspect lunged with the knife.

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Deputy Stubblefield clarified that the suspect walked east, near the front of the residence, and entered the back yard from the side gate. Deputy Stubblefield then said they didn't want him to get back into the house, so they tried to open the side gate to follow the suspect. At that time

the suspect was still at the gate, and lunged his knife at a deputy. Deputy Stubblefield thought

it was Deputy Hutchinson.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield where he was. Deputy Stubblefield said some other deputies had

arrived and he was about five feet from the front of the gate, covering the gate. They opened

the gate and the suspect was at the gate and pulled it back. (Deputy Stubblefield made the

motion as if the gate were pulled closed.) Deputy Sedgewick and another deputy were velling

"put your knife down" over the fence. They tried to open the gate again and the suspect was

holding the gate.

Deputy Hutchinson said he needed someone to go into the back yard with him. Deputies

Hutchinson and Stubblefield entered the residence through the front door and went into the

back yard. The suspect came into the backyard. They confronted the suspect again and told

him to "drop the knife." The suspect was saying, "I can't do that, I'm not going back to jail, I

can't go back to jail."

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I asked Deputy Stubblefield what hand the suspect was holding the knife in. Deputy Stubblefield said the knife was in the suspect's right hand. I asked if the suspect had any Deputy Stubblefield said the suspect had been shot and was bleeding in the injuries. abdominal area.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield what the suspect's state of mind was. Deputy Stubblefield said the suspect was "agitated" and did not want to go back to jail and was not going to be arrested. Deputy Stubblefield continued to say that they blocked his way into the house and the other deputies had come to the back yard from the side gate. The suspect was circling around and was not standing still. Deputies were talking to each other and made sure there was no cross fire situations. The suspect was able to get around to the side yard on the east side of the house and someone tried to pepper spray the suspect. The suspect then ran east and north on the east side of the house back out to the front.

Deputy Hutchinson and Stubblefield went through the house and went out the front door to the front yard. At that point Deputy Stubblefield pulled out his baton. Deputy Stubblefield explained the suspect was looking around and he thought he might be able to get a strike on the hand with the knife, because the suspect was turning the knife in his hand so he could stab. At one point the suspect pointed the knife at Deputy Stubblefield and said, "Put that thing away" as he

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was walking backwards. Deputy Stubblefield saw Deputy Sedgewick hit the suspect in the hand. The suspect ran away from Deputy Sedgewick but never dropped the knife. The deputies formed a semi-circle around the suspect and the suspect began walking west bound across Montgomery (Montgomery Road).

I clarified if the suspect was out in the front yard. Deputy Stubblefield explained that the suspect was in the grass area, east of the front door. After Deputy Sedgewick struck the suspect with the baton, the suspect tried to get into the house, but deputies were there and he could not get in the house. The suspect then walked westbound in the yard and the deputies formed a semi-circle around the suspect.

The suspect started to cross Montgomery (Montgomery Road). Deputies were saying, "Drop the knife or you will be shot." The suspect said, "I've already been shot, I don't care." The suspect also repeatedly said, "I'm not going back to jail" and was yelling at his wife. The suspect then walked to the front yard. Deputy Stubblefield motioned to

The deputies surrounded the suspect and the suspect made it to the doorway.

At this point, Deputy Stubblefield was north of the suspect, near the front door. Deputy Stubblefield saw people in a yard. (Deputy Stubblefield motioned to an area near the driveway of At this time, Deputy Stubblefield turned his attention to the citizens and told them to get back. When Deputy Stubblefield turned around, the deputies had

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closed in on the suspect so they were in front of him. Deputy Stubblefield was now a secondary officer and was between five and ten feet from the suspect.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield what deputies were with him. Deputy Stubblefield saw Deputies Vaden, Waters, Sedgewick, Coulter and Hutchinson.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield where this was occurring. Deputy Stubblefield said it was at the doorway and the suspect was trying to go inside the house.

I asked if the suspect was making any statements. Deputy Stubblefield said the suspect was talking and all he could remember was that the suspect was talking about his wife and not going back to jail. All the deputies were yelling don't let him in the house and don't go into the house. Deputy Stubblefield could not remember what was specifically said.

Deputy Stubblefield saw the suspect was trying to open the screen door. As the suspect was trying to go in the door, Deputy Stubblefield thought it looked like a deputy grabbed the suspect to pull him back, the suspect had the knife and shots were fired.

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I asked Deputy Stubblefield how the suspect held the knife. Deputy Stubblefield said the knife was always up. Deputy Stubblefield described the knife as being above the suspect waist, and out in front of him. Deputy Stubblefield said the suspect was moving the knife around in front of him and would not let anyone get close to him. Deputy Stubblefield gave an example and said if you were in front of the suspect, he would not charge you, but he would hold the knife out in front of him. Deputy Stubblefield made a hand motion similar moving your hand up and forward from his body.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield to describe the manner how the suspect was holding the knife. Deputy Stubblefield said it was "aggressive" and "assaultive."

I asked Deputy Stubblefield to describe the knife. Deputy Stubblefield described the knife as a butcher knife with a twelve inch blade. Deputy Stubblefield said it was a long kitchen knife with a brown or dark handle.

At this point, I began to review the circumstances at the time when the suspect came back out from the backyard (and walked westbound across Montgomery. I asked Deputy Stubblefield what direction he was facing and what were his actions. Deputy Stubblefield said the suspect walked out of the yard (rear yard) and walked north in the grass. At that point, Deputy Stubblefield had his baton out and confronted the suspect in front of the car. (Deputy Stubblefield motioned to one of the two vehicles parked in the driveway of

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) The suspect had the knife raised at Deputy Stubblefield and said, "Put that thing away." Deputy Sedgwick was able to strike the suspect's hand. The suspect turned and walked westbound toward the front door of

I asked Deputy Stubblefield where Deputy Sedgwick was in relation to him. Deputy Stubblefield said Deputy Sedgwick was to his left. Deputy Stubblefield thought Deputy Sedgewick came from the area near the front of the car in the driveway.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield if the baton strike had any effect. Deputy Stubblefield said, "It hurt him." Deputy Stubblefield said the suspect bent and ran to the front door. Deputy Stubblefield said it was in a southwest direction toward the front door, but there were a lot of deputies there to try to corral him in. Deputy Stubblefield also heard one of the deputies say they needed "less than lethal" over the radio.

Montgomery Road from

Deputy Stubblefield said it was a quick pace, but mentioned that the pace changed. Deputy Stubblefield said that when a deputy tried to spray the suspect with O.C., the suspect ran and when the suspect was struck with the baton his pace quickened, he tried to get away. Deputy Stubblefield said the baton strike hurt the suspect, but he did not drop the knife.

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I asked Deputy Stubblefield if he knew how many times the suspect was sprayed with O.C. Deputy Stubblefield said he only saw the one time. Deputy Stubblefield thought it might have been Deputy Sedgewick, but he was unsure.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield where Deputy Sedgewick struck the suspect. Deputy Stubblefield said it was the right arm near the wrist or hand. Deputy Stubblefield said it was a downward strike at the hand where the knife was. The baton strike doubled the suspect over and the suspect grabbed his hand with his other hand and ran.

I asked Deputy Stubblefield what the suspect was doing and saying when he walked across

Deputy

Stubblefield said everyone was yelling at the suspect to "drop the knife, drop the knife, put the knife down." Deputy Stubblefield said it was hard to hear what he (the suspect) was saying, but the suspect did hear a deputy say, "Put the knife down or you're going to get shot" and the suspect replied, "I already been shot, I don't care." Deputy Stubblefield did not know who made the initial statement, but it came from his right.

Deputy Stubblefield again mentioned he heard the suspect yell, "Why did you do this to me", "why did you call", and "we've been married thirty years." Deputy Stubblefield said that occurred at the house where the people were inside. (Deputy Stubblefield was referring to

I asked how far the deputies were from the suspect. Deputy Stubblefield estimated the deputies were between five and ten feet from the suspects.



I asked Deputy Stubblefield how the suspect was holding the knife at that time. I was referring Deputy Stubblefield said the knife to the time of the shooting at was in the suspects right hand and the blade was facing out. Deputy Stubblefield said the suspect was holding the knife in a defensive position and said that when anyone tried to approach the suspect, he could lunge it at them.

I asked what direction the suspect was facing. Deputy Stubblefield said he remembered the suspect was facing the deputies. Deputy Stubblefield remembered he looked at the suspect and noticed he was trying to use his free hand to grab the latch to the door. Deputy Stubblefield described the suspect making "quick peeks" at the door. The suspect had had the knife in his right hand and his right shoulder was at an angle against the wall. The suspect was in the corner in front of the door and he was reaching for the handle with his left hand to try to open the door.

Deputy Stubblefield said it looked like a deputy reached up and tried to pull him away. Deputy Stubblefield said every time someone would come close to him, you would see the knife and then shots were fired. As Deputy Stubblefield spoke, he raised his right hand up and out in front of him. Deputy Stubblefield said if a deputy would come close to the suspect he would raise the knife up and outward from his body.

Additional resource began to arrive and an ICS program was established to help manage the incident. We organized a team of deputies to start canvassing the area for other potential victims and witnesses. Through traffic was closed in all directions. Both crime scenes were secured and detectives and command staff began to arrive. Cmdr. Parks arrived on scene as well as Capt. Humphries. Cmdr. Parks assumed control of the incident after a quick briefing. I remain on scene to assist with the operational phase of the investigation.

Sgt. Roger Dewames also arrived and remained on scene to assist with the operational portion of the incident. Shortly before I left the scene, Detective Jose Rivera supervised the collection of the department shot gun from my patrol car. It was loaded with one round in the chamber and two additional rounds in the tube. The weapon and shells were collected by a crime scene tech as evidence. At approximately 0035 hours, I was released from my responsibilities at the crime scene and I returned to the station.





half of the shirt was inside the bag with the body. It is unknown where the other half of the shirt is. The shirt had been cut in half, down the front and back. There were numerous holes and tears in the bloodstained shirt. Dr. Frank proceeded to measure and describe the shirt, refer to her report for details. Dr. Frank located a small fragment of the copper jacket of a bullet on the front of the shirt about five inches above the bottom hem about midline on the shirt. FET collected the fragment.

Dr. Frank then found a pair of red "Jockey" brand briefs under the body. The briefs were bloodstained with several holes in them. They had been cut up both sides from the outside of the leg to the waistband.

FET then gave Dr. Frank a pair of green shorts that had been recovered during the initial investigation. Dr. Frank examined the shorts that had also been cut off of the suspect. These shorts were also blood stained and had several holes in them.

Dr. Frank then began examining the body. She could find no obvious injuries on the suspect's neck or head. Dr. Frank then began diagramming and photographing the wounds on the body, as did FET took a swab of the skin on the suspect's face to test for evidence of Oleoresin Capsicum, OC.

Dr. Frank examined each wound in the suspect's body in order to determine if the wound was a bullet entry wound, a bullet exit wound, a bullet graze or was caused by some other object. Dr. Frank also examined the bullets bath as it entered and traveled through the body. Refer to Dr. Frank's diagram and report for details. Dr. Frank recovered nine bullets from the body. She believes that eight of the bullets are handgun bullets and one is the slug from a shotgun.


Prior to the examination I had told Dr. Frank that one of the deputies had struck the suspect on the right hand or wrist with his baton. I asked her to examine the suspect hand and wrist to determine if there was any bruising that may have been caused by a baton strike. Dr. Frank looked at the suspect's right wrist and saw four injuries. The first injury was impressions that Dr. Frank felt were left by the handcuffs. The second obvious injury was on the inside of the right wrist. Dr. Frank felt that the deputy placing the handcuffs on the suspect could have caused this injury. The third injury was what appeared to be a bullet

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graze along the outside of the suspect's thumb between the knuckle and the thumbnail. The fourth injury was a purple bruise along the entire length of the suspect's right thumb to just above the wrist. Dr. Frank examined the bruise and felt that the bullet graze did not cause the injury. She felt that the injury was the result of the thumb coming in contact with a hard object with great force not unlike a baton strike.

Dr. Frank then told me that she was going to examine her notes in order to second check her findings.

FET and I collected all items that had been seized as evidence and left the location. Det.

Rhods had left earlier.

On 10-15-01, I received a phone call from Coroner Investigator Baroni. Investigator Baroni told me that while Dr. Frank examined her notes she felt that there were possibly more bullets in the suspect's body that had not been located. The suspect's body was x-rayed again and four more bullets were visible. The bullets had been hidden from view on the first set of x-rays by metal clasps attached to the body board that the suspect was lying on. Dr. Frank recovered all four bullets along with the wading from the shotgun slug that was recovered earlier. Refer to Dr. Frank's report for details of the injuries on the suspect's body.


