On 7-22-04, I was working as the Medical Senior Deputy at the Pre-Trial Detention Facility. At approximately 1140 hours, I was with Dr. ██████████ as he was seeing inmates. While standing near cell #4, I overheard Inmate Jed Temple (BK# ██████████) in cell #7 and Inmate ██████████ (BK# ██████████) in cell #6, yelling back and fourth to each other. I overheard ██████████ ask Temple what charges he was in jail for. Temple's reply was something to the effect of, "I tried to shoot a couple of cops!"

I stopped in the hallway and listened for a few minutes as ██████████ and Temple continued their conversation. ██████████ asked Temple what happened. Temple told him that he had got into a shoot out with the cops and was shot during the shootout. ██████████ asked if he had shot one of the "cops." Temple replied, "I'm not sure if I got one or not." ██████████ asked Temple if he was told by the police that he shot one of the officers. Temple said he wasn't told anything. ██████████ said, "You didn't get one then. If you had got one then they would have told you." The conversation continued for a couple of minutes with ██████████ telling Temple about his charges.

On 07-15-04, I was working a uniformed security assignment at the Ventura County Medical Center guarding inmate Jed Temple (Booking Number# XXXXXXXXXX).

At approximately 0600 hours, I relieved Deputy Bowie. She stated that Temple had been medicated and was sleeping. I went into room #207 and found Temple in the bed closest to the door, he was asleep. There was another patient housed in the room, closest to the window. Temple was handcuffed by his right wrist to the bedrail and a shackle was on his left upper arm above his cast and a shackle on his right ankle. The shackles were attached to the bedrails. I checked the handcuff and shackles for tightness.

At approximately 0700 hours, breakfast was delivered to Temple's room. He did not wake-up to eat.

At approximately 1030 hours, Temple woke-up complaining of pain. He stated he had pain in his left leg and his right upper arm (bicep area). A nurse responded and gave pain medication to Temple.

At approximately 1115 hours, Temple woke-up and again complained about pain in his left leg and right upper arm. I asked Temple if there was anything I could do to help. Temple stated, "Just shoot me in the head." I told Temple, I could not complete his request.

At approximately 1245 hours, Temple's lunch arrived to his room. I placed the food tray close to the right side of his bed, within his reach, and asked him if he wanted to eat. Temple stated, "Just Poison Me." I again told Temple that I could not complete his request. I asked Temple if he was going to eat. He stated he could not raise his right arm enough to feed himself. I told Temple that I was not going to feed him, but I could ask staff to feed him if he wanted. Temple was fed lunch by hospital staff.

At approximately 1530 hours, Temple became agitated and stated he was going to get out of bed and leave. I told Temple that he was not free to leave and he was restrained to the bed. Temple stated that I was kidnapping him and keeping him against his will. I told Temple that he was not being kidnapped but had been arrested. Temple attempted to sit up in bed and stated, "I could bite you. I have Hepatitis and AIDS, and you

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would die." I told Temple that he would not be the first person to bite me. I also told him that biting me would be hard since he was restrained to the bed.

Temple then stated that since he was arrested, he was entitled to phone calls. I told Temple he would receive his phone calls when he was housed at the Ventura County Main Jail. Temple began stating he was being deprived of his rights per Title 15. I again told him that he would get his phone calls when he went to the Main Jail. Temple began screaming for a Nurse.

Medical Staff arrived and spoke with Temple, while I was standing in the room beside Temple's bed. He told the medical staff that he was being denied his rights and wanted to make phone calls. I explained to Temple that the medical staff was concerned with his medical needs only.

I walked out of Temple's room with the medical staff. They requested I call and advise my Watch Commander of Temple's request. I telephoned and spoke with Sergeant Rubright at the Ventura County Main Jail. I explained Temple's request to Sergeant Rubright, who stated he would check on Temple's request and get back to me.

After approximately ten minutes, Sergeant Rubright telephoned and told me that Temple would be allowed his three phone calls. However, I would place the phone calls and also be present during the entire phone call. The phone calls were also restricted to four individuals: Bailbondsmen, Public Defender, Private Attorney or Family Member.

I explained to Temple that he would get his three phone calls and that the phone calls would be restricted to four individuals. I also explained to Temple that I would be standing next to his bed during his entire phone calls. While I was explaining the phone calls to Temple, he began to fall asleep. I snapped my fingers to wake him up and further explained that if he fell asleep during the phone call I would consider the phone call over.

I plugged in the telephone given to me by hospital staff. I stood to the left side of Temple's bed and began to make a phone call for Temple. He stated he wanted to call a friend. I again reminded him that he was only allowed to call four individuals.

I recorded Temple's phone conversations using the microcassette recorder on my duty belt. The following is a summary of Temple's phone conversations, refer to tape for further details.



On 07/14/2004 at approximately 0100 hours I received a call to respond to Norway Drive and North Ventura Avenue regarding an officer involved shooting.

I arrived on scene at approximately 0115 hours. The crime scene had already been established and was being secured by patrol deputies. Sgt. Mike Hasty was coordinating the responding officers and giving assignments. The suspect, Jed Temple, had already been transported via ambulance to the Ventura County Medical Center (VCMC).

Sgt. Hasty asked me to find and established an alternate route for residents of the "Norway" housing tract to enter/exit the tract since the main roadway was blocked by the crime scene. I was familiar with a private road that entered the tract off of Canada Larga Road. I went to that location and contacted a resident named [REDACTED] who lived in a trailer on the private road. I explained the circumstances and asked permission to use the private roadway for citizens to drive out of the housing tract. [REDACTED] gave me permission to use the driveway. I cut the lock at the top of the private roadway that lead into the housing tract. Deputy Jalaty used the alternate route to escort citizens in and out of the housing tract.

Detective Evans and I went to VCMC and obtained the arrest report from Deputy Dave Sparks who was guarding Jed Temple. Detective Evans and I completed booking paperwork for Jed Temple

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then went to the PTFD and booked Temple for the listed charges. Jed Temple remained at VCMC pending surgery for his gunshot wounds.

At approximately 0230 hours I was given an assignment to canvas an area of the neighborhood for potential witnesses near the shooting scene. I contacted residents at the following addresses: [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] I also went to [REDACTED] Norway Drive but no one answered the door. None of the above listed interviews were tape-recorded, as a recorder was not available.

Interview with Deputy Stephen Sulkowski (ID# 3166)
Ojai Sheriff's Station

On 07-14-04, at approximately 0514 hours, Sergeant E. Montagna and I contacted Deputy Stephen Sulkowski in a conference room at the Ojai Sheriff's Station. Our purpose for contacting Stephen was to obtain information regarding the officer involved shooting that occurred earlier that evening near [REDACTED] Norway Drive in the unincorporated area of Ventura County north of the City of Ventura. Attorney Howard Liberman (Silver, Hadden & Silver) was present in the room during the interview representing Deputy Sulkowski. The following is a summary of our conversation with Deputy Sulkowski. For more specific details, refer to the digital recording (compact disk).

Deputy Sulkowski began his shift at 1900 hours on 07-13-04. He was assigned to the "3A3" (3 Adam 3) beat in the unincorporated area of the Ojai Valley. Deputy Sulkowski stated that at approximately 0030 hours on 07-14-04, he was at the Ojai Station eating his lunch when he heard Deputy Duffner (3A22) get dispatched to a call at [REDACTED] Norway Drive. Dispatched advised there was a male subject at the location causing a disturbance. Sheriff's dispatch advised, via the radio, the name of the disturbing party and that he had three outstanding \$10,000 misdemeanor warrants for his arrest. Deputy Sulkowski was unable to remember the name of the disturbing party at the time of this interview. Deputy Sulkowski left the Ojai Station and responded to the address to provide backup for Deputy Duffner.

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When Deputy Sulkowski arrived in the area of the disturbance (█████ Norway), he could see that the porch light was on and the front door was open. Deputy Sulkowski did not see anyone around the front of the house. Deputy Sulkowski parked his marked Sheriff's unit and walked up the driveway of ██████ Norway Drive. A chain link fence encircled the front yard of the residence. Deputy Sulkowski opened a small chain link gate that provided access to the front yard from the driveway. As he turned (west) to walk up to the front door of the house, he saw a white male subject walking towards the front door inside the house. The male subject (later identified as Jed Temple) made eye contact with Sulkowski. Jed immediately turned around and disappeared behind a hallway wall inside the house. Deputy Sulkowski lost sight of Jed.

Deputy Sulkowski yelled into the house and ordered Jed to step out of the house. A female subject came out from one of the hallways and told Deputy Sulkowski to enter the house and stated Jed had run out the back door of the residence.

At this point in the interview, Sgt. Montagna received a phone call and we decided to take a break. The digital recorder was stopped and it was determined that the interview would be moved to the location of the incident. The audio file was stopped and a second digital audio file was started. Deputy Sulkowski agreed to participate in a scene walk thru. The interview at the Ojai Station was concluded at approximately 0519 hours.

At approximately 0555 hours, a third digital recording file was started at the scene of the officer involved shooting. The purpose was to conduct a crime scene walk through and interview with Deputy Sulkowski. After I identified myself for the recording, the following people verbally identified themselves: Deputy Sulkowski (3166), Howard Liberman (attorney for Deputy Sulkowski), Sgt. Montagna (1047), Sgt. B. Macedo (1440), James Eicher (County Counsel), Patricia Murphy (Assistant District Attorney), and Sgt. M. Smith (2622).

The interview began in the street just north of ██████ Norway Drive. I asked Deputy Sulkowski to tell us what happened that morning. Deputy Sulkowski stated he responded to a call of a male subject (later identified as Jed Temple) causing a disturbance at ██████ Norway. Prior to his

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arrival, dispatch advised Deputy Sulkowski and Deputy Duffner, via the radio, that Jed had three outstanding warrants totaling \$30,000. When Deputy Sulkowski arrived on scene, he drove passed the residence (█████ Norway) and could see that the front porch light was on and the front door was open. Deputy Sulkowski parked his patrol car (unit #3470) across the street and to the north of the house. Deputy Sulkowski walked up the driveway and opened a chain link gate leading to the front yard of the residence.

As Deputy Sulkowski walked towards the front door of the residence, he saw a male subject (Jed) walk towards the front door from inside the house. Deputy Sulkowski and Jed made eye contact and Jed turned around. Jed walked behind a wall and Deputy Sulkowski yelled for Jed to stop, but quickly lost sight of him. Deputy Sulkowski knocked on the front door and a female subject came out from one of the hallways and invited Sulkowski inside. The female subject told Sulkowski that Jed had just run out the back door of the residence. As Sulkowski walked into the living room of the residence, he saw a second female subject, whom he surmised was Jed's mother. Jed's mother told Sulkowski that Jed had run out the back door and he was more than welcome to go out back. Jed's mother warned Sulkowski about two dogs out back and advised they were not mean.

Sulkowski scanned the back yard and determined Jed was not out there. As Sulkowski was walking through the back yard, he heard Deputy Duffner advise, via the radio, he had arrived on scene. Sulkowski advised Duffner, via his handheld radio, that Jed had run out the back door of the residence and was possibly running towards North Ventura Avenue. Immediately following Sulkowski's radio broadcast, he heard Duffner advise, via the radio, that he was in foot pursuit. Sulkowski ran around the south side of the house and over a fence separating ██████ Norway from a vacant lot south of the residence and north of ██████ Norway. As Sulkowski ran around the south side of ██████ Norway, he could see Duffner chasing Jed south on Norway towards Ventura Avenue.

Sulkowski traversed the vacant lot south of ██████ Norway in a south/east direction towards the front of ██████ Norway Drive. Sulkowski jumped another chain link fence on the east side of the

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vacant lot onto the west sidewalk of Norway Drive just north of [REDACTED] Norway. As Sulkowski jumped the fence, he heard Duffner call out for Jed. Duffner told Jed to "stop" and yelled "Sheriff's Department." Sulkowski ran south on the west sidewalk of Norway towards [REDACTED] Norway. As Sulkowski ran towards [REDACTED] Norway, he heard several gunshots and saw several muzzle flashes. Sulkowski ran towards a gray Honda Accord parked in the driveway of [REDACTED] Norway Drive and took cover behind the Honda's right rear quarter panel. Both Jed and Duffner were laying in the street. Sulkowski could see Duffner "scooting" (sliding / crawling) southwest towards the west curb of Norway Drive in front of [REDACTED]. Sulkowski lost sight of Duffner as he (Duffner) neared the west curb line of the street, as there was a van parked in the driveway south of the Honda.

Sulkowski saw Jed fire two more rounds at Duffner. Fearing for Duffner's life as well as his own, Sulkowski fired his pistol four times at Jed. After Sulkowski fired at Jed, Jed laid back in the street and put his hands towards the mid section of his (Jed's) torso. Sulkowski did not see Jed's weapon fall to the ground. Sulkowski stated it did not appear as though Jed was trying to raise his hands at that time. Sulkowski began to give verbal commands for Jed to get his hands out and away from his body, to lay flat, and to remain still. At this point, Jed began to roll from side to side on his back. Sulkowski still could not see Jed's weapon. Jed eventually tossed his gun, which landed near (2 to 2 1/2 feet) from his (Jed's) feet.

Sulkowski heard Duffner give Jed commands as well. Duffner advised Sheriff's Dispatch, via his portable radio, that shots had been fired. At this point, Sulkowski thought Duffner had been shot several times and put out "999" requesting emergency assistance. Sulkowski continued to give Jed commands to get his hands out away from his body, which went ignored. Jed continued to roll over and would at times roll towards his gun. Jed began to shout that he wanted them (the deputies) to kill him and to shoot him in the head. At this point, Jed again began to roll towards his gun. Sulkowski continued to give Jed commands to stay away from the gun and get his hands out away from his body.

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Sulkowski heard Duffner request fire and ambulance over the radio. At this time, officers from the Ventura Police Department arrived. Upon the arrival of the Ventura Police officers, Sulkowski decided to move from his position near the Honda to the south side of the van to avoid a crossfire situation. Sulkowski walked around the front of the two vehicles parked in the driveway to the south side of the van. Duffner and a Ventura Police officer approached Jed, pulled him east across the street away from the handgun, and handcuffed him. Sulkowski then searched Jed for additional weapons.

I asked Sulkowski to show us where he was when he first saw the muzzle flashes from the exchange of gunfire between Jed and Duffner. Sulkowski indicated he heard the gunfire and saw the muzzle flashes as he jumped over the chain link fence on the east property line of the empty lot near the double swing gate at the southeast corner of the lot.

I asked Sulkowski to show us where Jed and Duffner were when they exchanged gunfire. Sulkowski stated Jed was lying in the street approximately 6 feet from the west curb line directly in front of the driveway to [REDACTED] Norway. Jed was in a low-seated position with his legs out in front of him (pointed west). Duffner was down on the pavement approximately 2 feet to the south of Jed (near yellow evidence marker 15) and trying to move away toward the west curb line of Norway.

Sulkowski stated he heard Duffner make a loud painful type noise during the exchange of gunfire and he thought Duffner had been shot. Sulkowski yelled at Duffner in an attempt to see if he was okay. Sulkowski could not remember exactly how Duffner responded to his inquiries. Sulkowski stated he thought Duffner said he wasn't sure. Shortly after the exchange of gunfire an older red and gray primer colored car drove up from the north and Sulkowski told the driver to back up and away. The driver of the car parked the vehicle directly in front of [REDACTED] Norway and walked away.

I asked Sulkowski if he heard Jed say anything during the confrontation. Sulkowski stated he heard Jed make noises like he was in pain followed by his request for them to kill him and for

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the deputies to shoot him in the head. Sulkowski remembered hearing Jed say something like, "Why did I do it." I asked if Jed appeared to be complying with their demands after the shooting. Sulkowski stated Jed was in obvious pain and repeatedly stated he could not keep his hands out, as it was too painful. Sulkowski stated Jed would continually move towards his gun and Sulkowski was afraid Jed was going to try and shoot at them again.

I confirmed that Sulkowski fired his weapon while he was behind the right rear quarter panel of the Honda Accord. Sulkowski believed he shot his weapon four times during the confrontation. Sulkowski did not shoot his weapon again after he moved to the other side of the van.

I asked how many times he thought Jed fired his handgun at Duffner. Sulkowski responded, "I think -total- five or six times." Sulkowski stated he saw Jed look over at him several times, however, Jed fired all of his rounds at Deputy Duffner. Sulkowski believed Jed fired three to four rounds at Duffner while they were on the ground within 2 feet of each other and then two more rounds at Duffner after he (Duffner) was able to distance himself a little bit. Sulkowski confirmed that Jed shot all of his rounds while seated on the ground.

I asked Sulkowski if the suspect appeared to be aiming his gun at Duffner. Sulkowski stated Jed was not raising the gun up as if he was sighting in on Duffner; however, it was obvious he was shooting at Duffner. Sulkowski stated he thought Jed was holding the gun in his right hand. Sulkowski added, "There was no doubt in my mind he (Jed) was trying to kill Duffner."

Sulkowski confirmed that he had been wearing his full duty uniform including tan shirt, badge, green pants, and black gun belt.

Sulkowski was unable to see what type of weapon Jed was firing until after he dropped it. Sulkowski described Jed's weapon as being a blue steel revolver with a brown grip.

I asked Sulkowski if there was anything that I failed to ask him about that he thought would be helpful in this investigation. Sulkowski stated he was really concerned for Duffner's life and his

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own during the gun battle. Sulkowski stated he feared most for Duffner's safety due to his close proximity to Jed and the lack of cover.

I asked Sulkowski if he had any idea how many rounds Duffner fired at Jed. Sulkowski stated he knew that Duffner had returned fire, however, he did not know how many rounds Duffner fired.

Liberman asked Sulkowski if he had turned on his tape recorder at any point during this incident. Sulkowski confirmed that after the shooting had ceased, he turned on his tape recorder and recorded the commands given to Jed. Sulkowski confirmed he had given me the Micro Cassette from his recorder earlier that same morning.

I ended the third digital recording file at approximately 0617 hours.

At approximately 0620 hours, I began a fourth digital recording file for the purpose of asking Deputy Sulkowski some additional questions at the scene of the incident. I began by asking Sulkowski to describe the lighting conditions at the time of the incident. Sulkowski stated he believed the streetlight was on and functioning properly. He had his flashlight with him, however, he did not find it necessary to use the flashlight as he could see well enough. Sulkowski added that he was pretty sure the light on the exterior of the garage of [REDACTED] Norway was on as well. Sulkowski described the illumination out in the street as "fairly bright" and stated he could see Jed without too much trouble. Sulkowski went on to say that he could see Jed's body, face and hands fairly well.

I asked Sulkowski if he remembered seeing anyone else in the area at the time of the shooting. Sulkowski believed Jed's mother was outside sitting on the fence in front of her house ([REDACTED] Norway). Sulkowski restated that a red and primer colored car pulled up just after the shots were exchanged. Sulkowski remembered a second vehicle (unknown description) pulled up and was told to leave the area. Sulkowski heard over the radio that the residents at [REDACTED] Norway had called Sheriff's Dispatch and stated the deputies were in front of their house.

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I asked Sulkowski if he reloaded his weapon during the incident. Sulkowski stated he did change the magazine in his pistol with a fully loaded magazine from his gun belt after he fired the four rounds. Sulkowski placed the partially expended magazine into the holder on his gun belt. Sulkowski did not fire any additional rounds from the fresh magazine. Sulkowski stated he did not know if Deputy Duffner or the suspect reloaded their weapons during the exchange of gunfire. Sulkowski confirmed he was still in possession of his weapon and all of his magazines.

Sgt. Macedo asked Sulkowski if he had any conversations with Deputy Duffner after the shooting about what had taken place. Sulkowski replied, "No. Just—I just asked Duffner if he was hit--If he was okay. Um no, basically it was – we didn't really—I don't remember talking to anyone. I just asked him if he was okay. After everything was code four, I was told not talk about the incident..." Macedo asked Sulkowski if he qualified with his weapon during the last qualification period. Sulkowski stated he did not shoot during the last qualification period.

Our interview with Deputy Sulkowski was concluded at approximately 0624 hours.



BACKGROUND:

On 7/14/2004, I received a telephone call from [REDACTED]. At the time, [REDACTED] suspected that the gun his nephew Jed had used in the shooting with Deputy Duffner might have been taken from his home. [REDACTED]'s sister had called and told [REDACTED] about the shooting. [REDACTED] asked his sister to respond to the residence and check for the weapon. At the time, [REDACTED] was in the Tahoe area and not able to return. When I spoke to [REDACTED] over the telephone, he advised that he would check his residence when he returned.

NARRATIVE:

On 7/19/2004, at approximately 1150 hours, I received a message from [REDACTED]. The following is a synopsis of that taped recorded message left on my work phone. [REDACTED] had returned from his trip and had examined the house for signs of entry. There were certain things around the house that led [REDACTED] to believe that not only did someone make entry into residence without permission but [REDACTED] felt that person was his nephew, Jed Temple.

After [REDACTED] had returned home on Friday, July 16, 2004, he checked the residence and remembered he had recently (July 9, 2004) checked the drawer where the gun was located within his residence for something else and didn't recall seeing the weapon at that time. The last time [REDACTED] remembered actually holding the gun was in May of 2004.

[REDACTED] said there was evidence that indicated Jed had entered the house between, July 11 through July 13, 2004. Apparently Jed had printed some items, which [REDACTED] had found in his

Smith contacted me and requested I respond to the area of Ventura Avenue and Norway Drive in the unincorporated area of Ventura County north of the City of Ventura regarding an officer involved shooting that had just occurred. I arrived at the area of the officer involved shooting at approximately 0150 hours.

Upon my arrival, I entered the crime scene and contacted Sgt. Smith. Sgt. Smith directed me to go to the Ojai Sheriff's Station and confirm that the involved deputies (Identified as S. Duffner ID# 2608 and S. Sulkowski ID# 3166) had contacted representation. I stood by at the station pending the involved deputies making a determination whether or not they wished to speak with department investigators. I arrived at the Ojai Sheriff's Station and found Deputies Sulkowski and Duffner seated in the briefing room watching television with Sgt. Inglis and Pat Buckley (President of the Ventura County Deputy Sheriff's Association). I remained in the room and waited for the deputies legal representative to arrive. While in the briefing room, everyone conversed about topics unrelated to the shooting.

At approximately 0400 hours, Howard Liberman (Attorney at Law) arrived to represent both Deputies. After a brief private conversation with Mr. Liberman, both deputies consented to speak with department investigators regarding the case. Sgt. E. Montagna responded to the station to assist me with the interviews. Refer to the individual supplemental reports regarding the interviews. During the interview with Deputy Sulkowski, it was determined that a walk through of the scene would assist him and us with the incident details. The interview was temporarily suspended and both Deputy Sulkowski and Deputy Duffner were transported to the

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incident scene in separate vehicles. Walk through interviews were conduct with each deputy individually.

At approximately 0700 hours, I concluded the interviews and left the location.





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

On 7/14/2004, at approximately 0856 hours, I received a telephone call from a male who identified himself as [REDACTED], Jed Temple's maternal uncle. [REDACTED] told me the following: [REDACTED] told me that he just learned about his nephew's "shoot out" last night with the Sheriff's Department and believes the weapon Jed used might be his. [REDACTED] explained that he was currently visiting relatives in the Lake Tahoe area.

[REDACTED] told me that he is employed as a peace officer with the Department of Consumer Affairs. [REDACTED] was concerned that his service weapon may have been stolen and used by his nephew, Jed Temple in the shooting that occurred earlier this morning.

[REDACTED] explained that he used to be employed as a Deputy Sheriff with the State of Arizona. A friend who was terminally ill gave [REDACTED] a snub nose 38-caliber gun, which he left at his residence inside a top dresser drawer. [REDACTED] had actually forgot about the weapon until he heard about the shooting from relatives. [REDACTED] asked his family to check his house for the gun.

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████ described the gun as having small grips as it was designed for a female hand. █████ doesn't have the serial number for the weapon and said he never fired it; explaining the gun needed a good cleaning. When █████ last saw the gun it was unloaded. █████ couldn't recall if the rounds were stored near the gun or not. While I was speaking with █████, I heard someone in the background comment about some ammunition being inside the car, which he had with him in Lake Tahoe.

████ told me that he gave his brother who resides in South Lake Tahoe all of his deceased brother's weapons because of Jed. Since hearing about the shooting, █████ called his supervisor and made notifications as to what happened with Jed since he suspected one of his weapons may have been used by Jed in the shooting earlier with the Sheriff's Department.

████ asked his niece and sister to look for the gun but at this point had been unable to locate the gun. █████ said this whole thing didn't really surprise him and said he locked his service weapon using a trigger guard and lock before leaving. █████ explained he had a premonition that something like this would happen but also mentioned that he has had premonitions in the past but nothing had happened.

I asked █████ whether there was a holster with the gun. █████ said the gun came with a brown off duty holster. (This description matched the holster that was recovered near the scene amongst some clothing)

As we were talking, █████ received a telephone call on another line. At some point, █████ disconnected the call at approximately 0855 hours and called me back.

This time I used my digital recorder and the following is a summary of the rest of the conversation. █████ continued saying that he didn't care for Jed but tolerated him because of his sister, █████. █████ mentioned he and █████ have had words over what Jed was doing and felt █████ has been more of a crutch to Jed. Although █████ doesn't have children of his own, he felt as

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though he would have done things differently if he had any of his own. [REDACTED] has been more tolerant of Jed over the last 10 months because of the four recent deaths in the family.


I asked [REDACTED] if Jed routinely visited his home. [REDACTED] said Jed came over for family functions. [REDACTED] recently had a birthday (last Saturday) but Jed didn't come by because he had a warrant for his arrest. [REDACTED] explained Jed hadn't gone to court on July 7, 2004 and a warrant was issued for his arrest. Due to the warrant, [REDACTED] didn't want Jed coming around the house so Jed didn't come by.

Yesterday, July 13, 2004, [REDACTED] ([REDACTED] / [REDACTED] sister) had gone to [REDACTED] house to make sure things were in order. While [REDACTED] was at [REDACTED] house, she saw Jed outside [REDACTED] house. [REDACTED] stayed at [REDACTED] house until about 2100 hours then returned to her home, which she shares with [REDACTED] and Jed.

[REDACTED] said he had spoken to [REDACTED] Allen about Jed and learned Jed might have been visiting her daughter, [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] lives next door to [REDACTED] on Primrose and has a daughter who communicates with Jed.

According to [REDACTED] niece and sister, [REDACTED], the house appeared secure with all doors being locked. [REDACTED] is unsure how or when Jed was able to get the gun. [REDACTED] described Jed as a "kind of a sneaky little guy." [REDACTED] could understand Jed getting the gun when he was "high." Jed was last at [REDACTED] house on Sunday, July 4, 2004 and seemed "very cordial" which was strange for Jed.

[REDACTED] last saw the .38 caliber gun in December of 2003. [REDACTED] totally forgot about existence of the gun given everything that has occurred over the last ten months. [REDACTED] said he didn't have a serial number for the gun and explained that when he received the gun, his friend who gave him the gun as a gift was on her deathbed. [REDACTED] said his friend had purchased the gun from a guy named, [REDACTED] [REDACTED], of Arizona who had a federal firearms license at the time. [REDACTED] said is unsure whether [REDACTED] still resides in the Arizona area.

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████ said he left for Tahoe on Sunday, July 11, 2004 and planned to return Friday, July 16, 2004. █████ apologized and said he was "very sorry that this happened." █████ said it was his understanding Jed had fired on the deputy. █████ said that based on that the deputy had every right "to take him out." █████ said he knew Jed was wounded and understood that this whole situation was hard on his sister but it was his opinion "the kid is no good." █████ kept repeating that the Jed was no good and said he was trying to make his sister use a little "tough love" on Jed.

On 7/16/2004, at approximately 0824 hours, Detective Rivera and I responded to Ventura County Medical Center VCMC to interview Jed Temple.

Jed Temple was lying on a bed inside Room #214. As we walked into the room, I noticed that the room was dark and Jed had his eyes open and appeared awake. As I walked into the room, I identified myself and asked Jed if I could turn the lights on. Jed closed his eyes and told me that he would mind.

I asked Jed how he was feeling. Jed said he was in a lot of pain. I asked Jed if he had spoken to his mother, to which he replied, "not really." I asked Jed if the doctor had been in to see him. Jed told me he wasn't sure if the person who had been into see him earlier was a doctor or not.

I asked Jed if he was awake. I informed Jed that I wanted to speak with him about the shooting the other night. Jed said that he didn't want to speak with me unless he had a lawyer present. I asked Jed if he would sign a consent form so that I could obtain his medical records. Jed again said he didn't wish to sign the paperwork without an attorney. We terminated the interview and left the room.

On 7/14/2004, at approximately 0140 hours, I responded to the area of Norway and Ventura Avenue to investigate the attempt homicide of a peace officer.

During the initial briefing that occurred upon my arrival, I was told by Sgt. Hasty that [REDACTED] was the reporting party on the initial disturbance call. At approximately 0213 hours, I responded to the residence located at [REDACTED] Norway to interview [REDACTED] [REDACTED] daughter who had just arrived and wasn't present during the shooting invited me into the residence. After our initial greeting, I asked [REDACTED] if she would mind speaking with me about what had occurred. [REDACTED] agreed and followed me outside to the front of the residence.

We sat on the tailgate of her truck and the following is a summary of the recorded interview: [REDACTED] told me that she lives with her sister, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and her son, who was involved in the shooting incident. I asked [REDACTED] what happened tonight. [REDACTED] said she really didn't know and said she has never known Jed to carry a gun. [REDACTED] didn't think that Jed even had the money to purchase a gun.

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At approximately 2330 hours, [REDACTED] arrived home from work and contacted Jed who was at the house with a female companion named [REDACTED]. Jed had packed some belongings, saying he was leaving because he wanted to clean up (detox.) from his drug usage. [REDACTED] said Jed felt as though he couldn't get clean from drugs if he went to jail. [REDACTED] provided some background and told me that Jed failed to appear for a court appearance last week. Due to Jed's failure to appear in court, the judge issued three misdemeanor warrants for his arrest. It was [REDACTED]'s rule not to allow Jed to remain at the house with her if he had warrants.

[REDACTED] said around midnight Jed packed and acted as though someone was going to pick him up. [REDACTED] is unsure what time she called the police. At some point before the officers arrived, Jed continued to ask for [REDACTED]'s car keys because he said he wanted to leave.

When the officers arrived at her house, [REDACTED] was in the living room and believes Jed saw the officers. [REDACTED] believes Jed must have either been on the porch or in the hallway of the residence at the time because [REDACTED] then saw Jed exit the residence through the rear door. The unknown deputy who [REDACTED] described as a brunette, tall and good looking, approached the front door of the residence. Based on [REDACTED]'s description as well as Sulkowski and Duffner statement's, I determined the deputy who entered the residence was Sulkowski. For ease of reading, I will refer to Sulkowski by name throughout this report. [REDACTED] invited Deputy Sulkowski into the house. Deputy Sulkowski followed Jed out the rear door. Since [REDACTED] had dogs in the rear yard, [REDACTED] went outside with Sulkowski.

[REDACTED] said that by the time the deputy (Sulkowski) jumped the fence after Jed, Jed had already ran passed the house. [REDACTED] recalled the other officer (Duffner) was in the middle of the street on foot. As the deputy (Sulkowski) ran through her yard, she heard him yell to the deputy (Duffner) in the middle of the street that he had jumped the fence and ran that way, pointing southbound. [REDACTED] saw Deputy Sulkowski jump over the fence after Jed who was still running northbound on Norway Drive. [REDACTED] turned to enter the house to open the door when she heard four shots. [REDACTED] then ran to the front of the residence towards the sidewalk area, where she was able to hear the deputies yelling at Jed.

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█ heard the deputies tell Jed to stay on his back and Jed telling the deputies he couldn't. At some point, the deputies told █ to stay back because she was starting to walk closer to the area where the shooting occurred. █ recalled hearing Jed say that he couldn't move and "just shoot me in the head."

█ didn't hear Jed say anything until he was lying on the ground, "moaning and groaning." I asked █ about the name █ that she had mentioned earlier in the interview. █ referred to █ as that "little bitch." █ said Jed has failed to appear for court cases in the past, but has never behaved the way he did tonight.

█ said she called the police this past weekend about Jed's warrants and believed it was either Friday (7/9) or Saturday (7/10). Jed left "real quick" before deputies arrived and wasn't arrested. █ said she also told the deputies that █ mentioned earlier tonight that she had warrants for her arrest. █ thought █ might still be in the neighborhood right now. █ said she mentioned to Jed that █ was nothing but trouble.

When I asked █ what was happening with Jed, she mentioned he was a drug addict. █ thinks Jed is "mentally retarded" and explained she is aware he has a drug problem. █ believes Jed has a problem with Methamphetamine.

█ said Jed is unemployed and has his own bedroom in her residence. I asked █ if she has had any problems with Jed. █ has had problems with Jed concerning his drug use but mentioned there has never been any violence. █ has seen Jed on occasions when she thought Jed was under the influence. █ believes someone has been playing with his mind and assumes it is █. █ doesn't know if it's because Jed is not very bright or his drug abuse.

█ said █ mentioned earlier that she was moving with Jed and that they had money set aside. █ said she hardly knew █ and got the impression █ was influencing Jed's thought process so much so that he would look to █ before answering certain things when

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she (████) was talking to him. █████ said she had been down this road before with Jed that is Jed packing and threatening to leave. █████ said Jed isn't capable of taking care of himself. I asked █████ to be specific. █████ said Jed can't handle day-to-day functions; Jed talks as though he is intelligent but can't "see the forest from the trees".

████ said Jed is diagnosed as being dyslexic. █████ told me that in junior high school, Jed was enrolled in special education classes at DeAnza Middle School. █████ took Jed out of the special education courses because he was having a fit and misbehaving. Jed did graduate from Ventura High School but she can't recall what his grades were like. I asked █████ if Jed played any sports. █████ said Jed had a medical condition, known as Aortic Stenosis, which prevented him from playing any sports in high school.

After graduation, Jed mostly got into trouble. Jed attended massage therapy school but really hasn't been interested in anything since. Jed has been arrested several times. █████ mentioned that Jed didn't start out this way and said he had jobs when he was younger. █████ said Jed worked at McDonald's when he was in custody at work furlough.

████ said that Jed's father, █████ █████ died in November of 2003 from cancer. I asked █████ about Jed's friends. █████ informed me that one of Jed's friends, █████ █████, recently moved out of the area to North Carolina.

████ said that she has kicked Jed out before when he has had warrants. There are certain situations in which █████ hasn't allowed Jed to remain at the house, which include having warrants or being under the influence or in possession of drugs. █████ clarified her statement and said she has never caught Jed in possession of drugs, just under the influence of drugs. █████ has been hoping that Jed would get focused and get better but had no idea that things would result the way they did tonight. █████ anticipated Jed would run from the officers but nothing more and if she had known Jed had a gun, she wouldn't have called the police.

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I asked [REDACTED] if she had guns or ever had guns in the house. [REDACTED] said that there were no guns in her house. I then made the statement that if there were no guns in her house, Jed must have brought the gun into the residence. [REDACTED] then responded, "no she had" and then clarified she doesn't know where the gun came from. I got the impression that [REDACTED] thought [REDACTED] might even be responsible for Jed having the gun.

[REDACTED] confirmed Jed had no car to drive, no license and wasn't allowed to drive her vehicle. [REDACTED] said Jed has never asked for the keys to her car and that Jed's actions tonight were very out of character for him.

I asked [REDACTED] what Jed typically did when law enforcement came to the house. [REDACTED] recalled Sgt. Hasty's name and said he might have been the last officer to arrest Jed. [REDACTED] added that usually Jed runs and the officers catch him. [REDACTED] said typically Jed can't run very well but offered that tonight he ran like a "gazelle." [REDACTED] said she wasn't putting all the blame on [REDACTED] and admitted that she should have handled this (Jed) herself. [REDACTED] said she was just tired of Jed's behavior.

[REDACTED] said that Jed gets depressed. I asked [REDACTED] about any medications. [REDACTED] said Jed should take medications but doesn't. [REDACTED] said Jed sees either Dr. [REDACTED] or Dr. [REDACTED] from the West Ventura Medical Office. Jed has Hepatitis B and in [REDACTED] opinion, should be taking anti-depressants or something for his mental issues. Jed doesn't take any medications for his heart condition or for the Hepatitis.

[REDACTED] said she hoped Jed would have been evaluated by someone from mental health. [REDACTED] couldn't offer any explanation as to Jed's behavior and said this wasn't like Jed. [REDACTED] suggested that's why she blames [REDACTED] for some of Jed's actions tonight.

[REDACTED] mentioned to me that Jed has been visiting [REDACTED] [REDACTED] who has been living in a truck in front of a home next door to [REDACTED] Primrose, just up the street. [REDACTED] went on to say that [REDACTED]'s husband was [REDACTED] [REDACTED] who according to [REDACTED] had been "beat the hell" in jail and he was currently brain dead at the hospital. [REDACTED] suggested that we talk to [REDACTED].

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█ expressed guilt for having called the police. I asked █ if she thought Jed was under the influence of drugs. █ said she couldn't tell and offered that it's sometimes hard to tell. █ said that usually when Jed is under the influence, he talks and can't control his muscles or anything. █ offered that Jed has to stick to a regimented diet of food and sleep; otherwise he talks incoherently and about things that don't matter.

I asked █ why Jed didn't like jail. █ said she thought Jed was just tired of it and didn't know how to get out of this cycle. █ thinks Jed didn't go to court last week because he thought he was going to get remanded into custody. █ believes Jed should be on medications, offering that he gets depressed and can't seem to get out of this pattern of behavior.

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

On 7/14/2004, at approximately 0809 hours, I was preparing to secure the crime scene and leave when a male subject who identified himself as [REDACTED] [REDACTED] contacted me and said he heard the gunshots last night and might have seen the subjects involved loitering in the area before the shooting. I turned my recorder on and the following is a summary of that taped interview: [REDACTED] said he was driving his wife, [REDACTED] and their friends [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] to his residence located on Primrose. As they entered the Norway tract, from Ventura Avenue, [REDACTED] and his three passengers noticed two subjects standing in front of the empty lot which runs between [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] Norway Drive. [REDACTED] thought it was odd it was to see two subjects standing in this area at that time of night.

[REDACTED] said both subjects were standing near the sidewalk area. [REDACTED] couldn't tell the gender of either subject or what they were wearing. Their body motions appeared odd in that it looked as though they weren't even talking with one another and one of the subjects was facing away as the other was talking. [REDACTED] still got the impression that they knew each other.

[REDACTED] thought the two subjects were "robbers" and said they had stuff with them. [REDACTED] recalled seeing two bags but couldn't recall what the bags looked like, one was smaller than the other.

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
█████ said he wondered what was in the bags. █████ said the streetlight was the only thing on. One of the subjects facing the street was almost hunched over so █████ couldn't see the subject's face. █████ said that neither of the subjects even looked at them and commented that he slowed down to as slow as almost 5 miles per hour.

█████ estimated that he traveled through this area between 0030 0045 hours. As soon as they arrived at his house, their friends got into their vehicle and left. █████ said that if his friends, the █████ had seen anything on their way out of the tract; they would have called █████ and █████. █████ believes the shooting must have happened after his friends had driven through the neighborhood as well.

█████ thought he went to sleep but then heard several rounds, which he thought were shots. He said, "There was a lot of shots" and estimated, more than ten. █████ said it sounded like firecrackers, some in rapid succession, pause and then additional rounds.

█████ said he stopped this morning to see if anyone had died. █████ said the neighborhood had noticed an increased activity and mentioned a problem with vandalism.



On 7/14/2004, at approximately 0310 hours, I contacted the resident at [REDACTED] Norway Drive. This residence was located directly in front of the crime scene where the shooting occurred. The following is a summary of that taped recorded interview: [REDACTED] is employed with Cottage Hospital in Santa Barbara as an Operating Room (O.R.) Nurse. [REDACTED] resides with her mother, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and two minor children, one of which wasn't home tonight.

[REDACTED] said she was sleeping and estimated that around 0045 hours, she awoke to the sounds of yelling and could hear the words, "stay down, stay down." [REDACTED] heard four to five pops in rapid succession. She was sleeping on the couch in another room and thought maybe it wasn't a good place to be so she got up and went to the back bedroom. She looked out and saw one police officer out front of her property with his gun drawn. [REDACTED] called 911 to confirm there were people enroute to assist the officers. [REDACTED] woke her mother up and warned her not to get up.

[REDACTED] couldn't see the subject who was on the ground but could tell that the officers were talking to someone. [REDACTED] was also able to ascertain that there were at least two officers on scene because of the two voices talking to subject on the ground.

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The dispatcher asked [REDACTED] if anyone was hurt. [REDACTED] told the dispatcher that she couldn't tell and didn't want to look out the window again, especially since she could hear the officers directing the subject what to do.

[REDACTED] also heard the officers tell the subject to stay down, lie down and stay on the ground. [REDACTED] recalled the subject saying that he couldn't comply with their directives. [REDACTED] also remembered hearing the officers shouting "put the gun down" and "leave the gun on the ground." [REDACTED] could tell the subject on the ground was a male by his voice.


[REDACTED] said that approximately ten minutes elapsed before she realized there were other officers on scene. [REDACTED] estimated the whole incident lasted approximately 20 minutes.

I asked [REDACTED] if she knew any of her neighbors. [REDACTED] said she didn't. I specifically asked her about the neighbors to the north. [REDACTED] said she didn't know her and described her as "a cranky old woman." [REDACTED] said she eventually was able to see the scene outside when she was contacted by an officer who had come to her door.

Initially when [REDACTED] heard the noises outside she was concerned that there was someone in the backyard and so she warned her mother not to wander around.

As I left the residence I obtained the following two license plates of the vehicles parked in the driveway of the residence. 1. Burgundy, Ford Windstar Van, [REDACTED]

INTERVIEW



On 7/14/2004, at approximately 0230 A.M., I responded to an officer involved shooting call located at [REDACTED] Norway Drive, Ventura. Upon my arrival, I saw several deputies were on scene and the area was secured. Shortly after my arrival, I was instructed to interview [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. The following is a summary of a tape-recorded interview I had with [REDACTED]. The interview took place inside [REDACTED]'s residence at [REDACTED] Norway Drive, which is located next to [REDACTED] Norway.

[REDACTED] stated she was at home when the shooting occurred. [REDACTED] said she arrived home earlier this evening at approximately 7:45 P.M. Shortly thereafter, [REDACTED] left the residence and went to her brother's house located in Ventura. At approximately 9:00 P.M., [REDACTED] returned to the house. [REDACTED] eventually went into her bedroom and began watching television. [REDACTED] was home alone. [REDACTED] indicated her sister, [REDACTED] [REDACTED], was working and was due to return home later this evening. At approximately 11:15 P.M., prior to [REDACTED] returning home, the suspect entered the residence and approached her in the bedroom. The suspect was identified as Jed [REDACTED], [REDACTED] [REDACTED]'s son. The suspect asked [REDACTED] for the keys to the pickup truck that was parked in the driveway. The suspect was unable to locate the keys. The suspect left her bedroom and walked outside to the front yard. [REDACTED] left her bedroom and walked into the kitchen. While in the kitchen, she looked outside through the kitchen window and saw the suspect standing in the front yard with an unknown female. [REDACTED] described the female as white, 30s years old, long brown hair, wearing a jacket.

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About the same time, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] arrived home. Shortly thereafter, [REDACTED] discovered [REDACTED] had called the police concerning the suspect being inside the house. During this time, [REDACTED] recalled the suspect entered the house again. Once inside the house, the suspect walked into [REDACTED]'s bedroom and began looking through her purse for the keys to the pickup truck. [REDACTED] said the suspect was acting "a little strangely." [REDACTED] indicated that the suspect is usually a loud person, but tonight, was not loud. She described the suspect's behavior as "definitely bizarre." [REDACTED] was unaware if the suspect was on any medication. [REDACTED] indicated the suspect was wearing a Pendleton shirt and unaware the suspect was in the possession of a handgun.

On the morning of 7/15/2004, I retrieved a message from [REDACTED], Jed Temple's mother who requested I call her back. I telephoned [REDACTED] residence at approximately 1135 hours and the following is a summary of that recorded interview: [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] was currently at her residence and was prepared to speak with me. Before [REDACTED] put [REDACTED] on the telephone, she informed me that a subject by the name of [REDACTED] had obtained a .357 weapon and he was going to kill Jed with it. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] was currently out on bail for an unknown crime and was facing a 25 to life sentence. [REDACTED] validated that was the reason Jed felt he needed to arm himself with a gun. **(At this point in the investigation, [REDACTED]'s name hadn't been brought up at all so I was a little confused by the information [REDACTED] had provided to me.)**

I asked [REDACTED] how Jed was doing since he was still at the hospital. [REDACTED] told me that the medical staff still didn't know about Jed's Sciatic nerve because Jed still wasn't cooperating and was still coming down.

[REDACTED] asked a male subject in the background if he would talk to me. A few moments later a male subject came on the telephone line and identified himself as [REDACTED], a neighbor and family friend of the [REDACTED]'s. [REDACTED] said that he had been contacted by deputies that night and had been told detectives would contact him at a later time because he seemed to have information.

[REDACTED] said he lived a couple of houses away from the [REDACTED]'s and considered himself to be a father figure to Jed for the last ten years. [REDACTED] then told me the following: About a week ago, Jed called [REDACTED]'s house and requested [REDACTED] pick him up from the Holiday Inn in Ventura. [REDACTED]

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explained that prior to that call, he had put some distance between Jed and even his own son because of their drug use. [REDACTED] drove to the Holiday Inn that day and picked Jed up. Jed told [REDACTED] that he was scared. Jed explained that he had just been released from jail and that a male subject named [REDACTED] had o.k'd his bail with a bail bondsman [REDACTED] knew as [REDACTED].

Jed had been visiting at [REDACTED] [REDACTED]'s house when [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] (possibly [REDACTED]) that Jed was waiting outside the house with a knife and that Jed was going to stab [REDACTED] when he exited. Jed told [REDACTED] that wasn't true. Jed expressed concern about the situation getting out of hand and [REDACTED] killing him. Jed requested [REDACTED] [REDACTED] contact [REDACTED]'s uncle [REDACTED] from Ojai in the hopes of straightening things out between the two. Jed said he wanted to get a gun because he felt [REDACTED] would come after him with one. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] told Jed that he had a gun but the one he had was registered to him ([REDACTED] [REDACTED]); therefore he couldn't let Jed have the gun.

About four days ago, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] called [REDACTED] [REDACTED] in an attempt to straighten things out between [REDACTED] and Jed. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] offered that he would come by [REDACTED]'s residence that night after he got off work to discuss the situation in more detail, but never did. [REDACTED] told Jed that [REDACTED] [REDACTED] stated he was going to come by his residence but never did. In response to that Jed said he had to get a gun. Jed let [REDACTED] [REDACTED] listen to a message [REDACTED] had left on Jed's cellular telephone. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] said the message left on Jed's phone stated, "You chose your weapon and now I chose mine. You're a dead mother fucker." [REDACTED] said Jed was very scared by the message and said that he hadn't seen Jed that scared before. [REDACTED] felt that if he had been in Jed's shoes and had received that message; he would have armed himself too because [REDACTED] message was threatening.

Yesterday, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] heard about the shooting and called [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] asked why he hadn't called before now. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] that he had spoken to [REDACTED] but said that [REDACTED] had it in his head that he wanted to kill Jed and take a cop out as well. [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] [REDACTED] why he doesn't just take the gun away from his nephew and call the police.

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██████████ characterized his nephew, ██████████, as being out of control, under the influence of drugs and afraid ██████████ will shoot him (██████████ ██████████). ██████████ told ██████████ that ██████████ is currently carrying a .357 gun on his person.

The day of the shooting ██████████ ██████████ received a telephone call from ██████████ ██████████, the bail bondsman who had bailed Jed out of custody. ██████████ considers ██████████ a friend and said he came by the house. Apparently, ██████████ wanted to revoke Jed's bail since he hadn't made any payments and was ignoring ██████████'s telephone calls.

██████████ said he didn't have a problem taking ██████████ to the house, suggesting that maybe Jed and ██████████ could talk and make some type of arrangements for payment. When ██████████ and ██████████ got Jed's house, they found Jed there with an unknown bald headed male and a female (the same female that had been with him later in the evening before the shooting, possibly ██████████). ██████████ told Jed that he needed to talk with ██████████ and even made the comment that ██████████ could take him back to jail. Jed told ██████████ and ██████████ that he didn't have any money. ██████████ said Jed and the female were extremely under the influence to the point that they had difficulty standing up.

As they left Jed's residence, ██████████ told ██████████ that he should've taken Jed to jail. ██████████ told ██████████ that he would give Jed until the following day (7/15/2004). ██████████ said after that everything started happening. Jed began to argue with his female friend accusing her of stealing some items from his mother and grandmother's house. Jed and the female were arguing up and down the street about the same things. ██████████ said that Jed was pretty high and there was no talking to him.

I asked ██████████ ██████████ to obtain information on ██████████ and said that I really needed to find out ██████████'s last name. Based on all the information I had learned, I believed ██████████ ██████████ posed a danger to the public as well as law enforcement. ██████████ said he would call me back with the information.

On 07-14-04, I received a micro cassette from Deputy Sulkowski. Deputy Sulkowski told me the cassette contained a recording of the events immediately following the shooting in front of [REDACTED] Norway Drive. Deputy Sulkowski stated after the shooting ceased, he was able to turn on the tape recorder attached to his gun belt and record the commands given to Jed and Jed's response to those commands. On 07-20-04, I listened to the micro cassette tape and the following is a summary of the recording. For more specific details refer to the cassette tape.

The tape began with the sound of a male subject (later identified as Jed Temple) yelling something inaudible. Deputy Sulkowski could be heard telling Jed, "Do not move." Sheriff's Dispatch asked Deputy Sulkowski if he could advise if any deputies were injured. Deputy Sulkowski told the dispatcher he did not know if any deputies were injured at that time. Sulkowski then began telling Jed to "get down." Sulkowski's tone of voice changed and he could be heard yelling, "No. Lay on your back. Move your hands." Sulkowski repeatedly told Jed to lay down and move his hands. While Sulkowski was giving Jed commands, Jed could be heard in the background yelling in pain. Jed could be heard telling the deputies to "Shoot me in the head." At this point, "Sulkowski yelled, "Do not move. Don't go for that gun. Do not go for the gun."

Deputy Sulkowski made repeated commands for Jed to not move and for Jed to not go for the gun. In the background Jed could be heard yelling in pain and telling the deputies to shoot him.

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Sulkowski told Jed to lay still and that fire and ambulance were enroute. At this point, Jed pleaded with the deputies, "Just shoot me in the head. Shoot me in the head please..." Sulkowski replied, "No, just lay there."

Sulkowski could be heard telling someone to turn his or her vehicle around. Sulkowski continued to yell, "Lay down" at Jed. Jed could be heard complaining about the pain. Sulkowski told Jed he was going to have to deal with it and to lay on his back. Sulkowski again demanded that Jed not move towards the gun. Jed could be heard yelling in pain. Another male voice could be heard in the background telling Jed to lay still.

Sulkowski continued to yell commands for Jed to lay still and could be heard giving directions for responding units over the radio. Sulkowski could be heard describing where Jed's gun was to fellow officers. Sulkowski advised "Scott" (Deputy Duffner) that he was going to move to the other side of the vehicles and get closer to him. While Sulkowski moved to a new position, Jed could be heard yelling in the background followed by a male voice ordering him to lay still with his hands out in front of him.

Sulkowski could be heard asking responding officers if they could see Jed's weapon. A deputy could be heard telling Sheriff's Dispatch to have fire and ambulance come into the scene. A responding officer could be heard asking Sulkowski if the other deputy was okay. Sulkowski replied, "I don't know. He was right up on top of him when the shots went off." Jed could be heard saying, "You shot my thumb off..."

In the background deputies could be heard advising dispatch that Jed was in custody. Dispatched advised that fire should be on scene. Sirens could be heard in the background. Sulkowski could be heard asking Jed if he had any additional weapons on him. Jed told Sulkowski he had a knife. Sulkowski advised arriving deputies that Jed was the only suspect. Sulkowski could then be heard arguing with a citizen who was refusing to turn his vehicle around and then pointing out the house where the suspect fled from to arriving deputies. The recording stopped at this point.



On 07-14-04, at approximately 0631hours, I conducted an interview and crime scene walk through with Deputy Scott Duffner in the area of Ventura Avenue and Norway Drive in the unincorporated area of Ventura County north of the City of Ventura. The purpose of the interview and walk through was to obtain information regarding the shooting that took place earlier that morning. Prior to the interview, Deputy Duffner had consulted with his attorney Howard Liberman. Deputy Duffner advised that he was willing to cooperate with this investigation. The following is a summary of my conversation with Deputy Duffner. For more specific details, refer to the digital recording (compact disk).

The following people were also present for the interview and walk through: Howard Liberman (attorney representing Scott Duffner), Sgt. Montagna (#1047), Patricia Murphy (Assistant District Attorney), Sgt. M. Smith (# 2622), James Eicher (County Counsel), and Sgt. B. Macedo (# 1440).

We began the interview on the street in front of [REDACTED] Norway Drive. I asked Duffner to explain what brought him to this location. Duffner stated that he and Deputy Sulkowski had been dispatched to a subject disturbing call at [REDACTED] Norway. The reporting party supplied the dispatcher with the name and date of birth of the disturbing party (identified as Jed Temple). The dispatcher checked local records and discovered Jed had three outstanding warrants.

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Deputy Sulkowski arrived at [REDACTED] Norway about one minute prior to Duffner. As Duffner turned the corner from Ventura Avenue to Norway Drive, he advised dispatch, via the radio, that he had arrived on scene. At that time, Duffner heard Sulkowski advise, via the radio, that Jed had run out the back of the house. As Duffner drove north on Norway, he saw a white male (later identified as Jed Temple) either jump over the fence in the front yard of the house or out the driveway and run north on Norway.

Duffner stopped his marked Sheriff's unit in the middle of the street directly in front of [REDACTED] Norway. Duffner advised over his radio that he was in foot pursuit. As Duffner exited his car, he saw Jed stop in front of the driveway of the house to the right (north) of [REDACTED] Norway, turn around, and run back down the sidewalk towards and passed him (Duffner). As Jed ran by Duffner, he (Duffner) told Jed to stop. Jed continued to run south on the west sidewalk of Norway Drive towards Ventura Avenue.

Duffner pursued Jed on foot and repeatedly ordered him to stop. As they passed the double gate along the east fence of the vacant lot between [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] Norway, Duffner reached out and made an attempt to grab Jed. Jed turned left and ran out into the street. Duffner caught up to Jed and again reached out to grab him. This time, Jed turned to look at Duffner and said, "This is it." Duffner saw Jed's hand go down to his waistband area. Duffner pushed Jed forward. Jed fell to the asphalt and Duffner tripped over him and fell to the asphalt as well. As Duffner landed on the ground, he rolled onto his left side. Duffner could see Jed sitting up in the middle of the street. Duffner saw muzzle flashes coming from Jed and towards him.

Duffner drew his service pistol and returned fire back at Jed. As Duffner returned gunfire, he (Duffner) used his left arm to pull himself away from Jed and gain some distance. I asked Duffner to walk us over to where he and Jed fell to the ground. Duffner took us to an area in the middle of the street directly in front of the driveway for [REDACTED] Norway. Duffner stated Jed fell down there and he (Duffner) tripped over Jed and fell to the ground further south on the street.

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When Duffner landed on the asphalt, his head was pointed southwest and he rolled onto his left side to face north.

Sgt. Montagna asked Duffner what was going through his head when he saw the muzzle flashes. Duffner replied, "Ah shit, I'm gonna get shot here." Duffner stated all he wanted to do at that point was to keep shooting and create some distance from Jed. I asked Duffner if he had given the suspect any commands during the shooting. Duffner replied, "I really don't remember." Duffner did not remember hearing Jed say anything during the gun battle. When Duffner got to the west curb of Norway, his pistol ran out of ammunition. As Duffner reloaded his pistol with a fresh magazine, he heard Jed yelling and making noises like he was in pain. Duffner then heard Sulkowski yelling, "Scott are you okay? Are you okay?" Duffner responded, "I don't know."

Duffner stood up and began to give Jed verbal orders to stay there and show his hands. Jed responded by telling him to shoot him in the head and to get it over with. At this point, Duffner could not see where the gun was. Sulkowski told Duffner that the gun was at Jed's feet. Duffner then saw the gun on the ground. Jed continued to yell that he was in a lot of pain. Duffner could see Jed's blood on the pavement. Duffner and Sulkowski continued to give Jed verbal commands to lie on his back and show his hands. Duffner used his portable radio to broadcast "999" requesting emergency assistance.

Ventura Police officers arrived on scene first and one Ventura Police officer (unknown) assisted Duffner in approaching Jed. Jed was lying face down on the street, as he was instructed to by Duffner and Sulkowski. Duffner grabbed Jed by the shirt and dragged him towards the east curb of Norway, away from the gun. While on the east side of the street, Duffner handcuffed Jed and requested fire and ambulance via his portable radio.

I asked Duffner if he could see Sulkowski while he (Duffner) was down on the ground during the shooting. Duffner replied, "No. I heard him. I heard him yelling at me to see if I was okay."

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
Duffner stated he did not know if Sulkowski had fired his pistol, as he did not hear him fire any shots.

I confirmed that Duffner's pistol ran out of ammunition while he was on the ground returning fire. I asked Duffner if he reloaded his pistol while he was on the ground. Duffner replied, "I think so." I asked Duffner if he fired any rounds from the fresh magazine he loaded into his pistol. Duffner answered, "I don't think I did. I don't know." I asked what he did with the first magazine he removed from his pistol. Duffner stated he left that on the ground where he was at the time. I asked Duffner if he knew how many rounds he fired. Duffner replied, "I know I fired at least 13." I confirmed that he knew it was at least 13 rounds because the pistol ran dry (out of ammunition).

Duffner stated the only light came from the streetlights. Duffner stated he had a flashlight but he dropped it on the ground and did not use it. Duffner described the lighting as, "At best poor." I asked Duffner if he had any difficulty seeing Jed. Duffer replied, "Laying in the street, yes. I didn't know if he had a gun because he kept his hands towards his waist. And it was just dark. I didn't have a light at all..."

I confirmed that Duffner was wearing the same clothing while we were talking that he had been wearing during the incident. Duffner was dressed in a full department uniform including: tan shirt with "Sheriff" patches on both shoulders, gold "Ventura County Sheriff" badge, green pants, and black gun belt. I also confirmed that Duffner had driven a marked Sheriff's patrol car (#447 on roof) to the location and the car was still parked in the original location where he left it.

I asked Duffner if he was in fear for his safety when the shooting took place. Duffner replied, "Yes." Duffner went on to say, "I thought I was gonna die." I asked Duffner about his partner (Deputy Sulkowski). Duffner said, "I was concerned about him because I didn't know where he

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was. But I knew he was okay when he was yelling at me..." Duffner did not see anyone else in the area during the shooting.

I asked Duffner to describe how Jed was holding his gun. Duffner said, "To me, it looked like he was actually pointing it at me. And I want to say he was holding it with two hands and pointing it at me and shooting." I asked Duffner if he could describe Jed's gun. Duffner stated he could only see the muzzle flashes during the shooting and only saw the gun after Jed dropped it on the ground. Duffner described the gun as a black revolver with a wood grip.

I asked Duffner if he knew how many times Jed shot at him. Duffner replied, "I know that at least before I started shooting back, (inaudible) I saw two muzzle flashes." Duffner did not see Jed shoot at anyone or anything else.

I concluded the interview at approximately 0643 hours.

NARRATIVE:

On July 14, 2004, the undersigned responded to the intersection of Ventura Avenue and Norway Drive, in the city of Ventura, to examine the crime scene for bullet ricochet damage. Photographic documentation and evidence collection was provided by Field Evidence Technician [REDACTED] of the Sheriff's Department Crime Scene Investigation Unit.

The crime scene consisted of the west end of Norway Drive. Bloody clothing was present in the street, along with numerous discharged cartridge cases and other items of evidence (see Crime Scene Investigation Unit report for details). The area was examined for the presence of bullet ricochet damage.

EVIDENCE:





Figure 1: Overall crime scene diagram.

All bullet ricochet damage mentioned in this report was documented photographically by the Sheriff's Department Crime Scene Investigation Unit. All identification numbers are reflective of the photographic markers (PM#) at the crime scene assigned to possible bullet ricochet damage by the Crime Scene Investigation Unit. For the locations of the bullet ricochet damage, please refer to the crime scene diagrams (figures 1 and 2).

Bullet ricochet damage from the west end road surface of Norway Drive:

PM# 12, 13, 36-44, 55, 60, 62-64.



Crime Scene Investigation

On 7-14-2004, at 0055 hours, I responded to [REDACTED] Norway Avenue in the unincorporated area of Ventura to assist with an officer involved shooting investigation. Shortly after I arrived, I was assigned to oversee the processing of the crime scene. Field Evidence Technician, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and Firearms Examiner, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] assisted me with the crime scene.

Norway Drive

Norway Drive extends in a north east direction from Ventura Avenue. It then curves in front of [REDACTED] Norway Drive. The road extends north intersecting with Bounds Road and continues north. Visibility was clear and the weather at the time was cool and slightly breezy.

[REDACTED] Norway Drive, Ventura

This residence is located on the west side of Norway Drive directly across from the intersection of Bounds Road. The residence faces east and has a garage on the north side that extends east from the house. There is a cement driveway that extends from the garage to Norway Drive. There are two cars parked in the

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driveway, one is a gray Nissan truck (Lic# [REDACTED]) and the other is a white Ford Taurus (Lic# [REDACTED]).

Directly to the right of the garage (north side) there is a large chain link gate, which extends north into the fence that divides it from the property to the north. There is no fence or barrier that surrounds the front of the garage or driveway, but there is a small chain link fence that surrounds the front yard of the residence. There is an older model vehicle parked on the street in front of the residence. The vehicle was a primer red color and displayed a CA license number of [REDACTED]. I did not find any other identifying emblems on this vehicle.

There are two Ventura County Sheriff patrol cars parked on the street facing north. The patrol cars are painted in a black and white scheme and both have various emblems identifying them as law enforcement vehicles. Additionally, both vehicles have emergency lighting equipment affixed along the tops of the vehicles. All the lighting and equipment on both vehicles are plainly visible.

The first patrol unit is identified as #3447. This unit is parked in the middle of the street, facing north and directly across from the driveway of [REDACTED] Norway Drive. The driver's door was extended in the open position and the exterior lights were off. The engine on this unit was also off.

The second patrol car is identified as unit #3470. It is parked facing north at the corner of Norway Drive and Bounds Road. This is several feet north of unit #3447. All the doors to this vehicle were closed. The vehicle's parking lights were turned on and the engine was running.

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The public sidewalk in front of [REDACTED] Norway Drive descends slightly as it extends south. On the south side of the residence is an empty lot. The residence to the south of the empty lot is [REDACTED] Norway Drive.

The street where the units were parked is well lit. There is a street lamp located a few feet north from the north east corner of Norway Drive and Bounds Road. This streetlight illuminated the area where both units are parked. The residence at [REDACTED] Norway Drive has a light fixture on the side of the front door that illuminated the front of the residence.

[REDACTED] Norway Drive, Ventura

The shooting occurred on the street in front of the residence at [REDACTED] Norway Drive. The residence sits on the north corner of Norway Drive and Ventura Avenue. The residence faces east and backs up to Ventura Avenue. There is a driveway on the north side of the property that extends east to Norway Drive.

The location where the shooting took place was dimly lit. There was no direct light over this area, but it does receive some indirect lighting from two nearby streetlights located on Norway Drive. One of the streetlights is about 20-25 yards to the southwest of the crime scene, while the other is about 10-15 yards to the northeast. Both street lamps were in working order.

A white picket style wooden fence surrounds the front yard of the residence. There was also a brown wood fence that extended south from the residence that surrounds the rear yard.

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There are two vehicles parked in the driveway. The vehicle on the left side of the driveway is a maroon Ford Windstar, Ca [REDACTED] and the vehicle on the right side is a silver Honda, Ca # [REDACTED]. Both vehicles are parked facing the garage door.

To the north of the residence and driveway is a large open area that is paved with gravel. To the north of the open area is a chain link fence that divides [REDACTED] Norway Drive with an empty lot.

Directly across the street from [REDACTED] Norway Drive (east side) is a hillside that extends north. The hillside stops when it reaches the backyard of the property located at [REDACTED] Bounds Road. This residence faces north and is at the south east corner of Bounds Road and Norway Drive.

Evidence from Shooting Scene

In the gravel area, a few feet to the north from the top of the driveway, there are four casings. These casings were marked as **items #32, #33, #34, and #35**. All four casings were made of a white metal. The casings are stamped and identified as .40 caliber, Speer Smith and Wesson brand. About two feet to the east of the casings is a mobile basketball hoop and stand.

At the east end of the north fence line, there was a large pile of clothing and other miscellaneous items. The clothing was later marked as **item #65**. During a search of the items, a brown leather holster was found.

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In front of [REDACTED] Norway Drive, just east of the sidewalk there is a level planter filled with gravel with a few plants spread several feet apart. I noticed there was some gravel rocks on the cement sidewalk and also on the street just east of the planter. It appeared as though someone had stepped into the planter and kicked up some of the gravel. Field Evidence Technician [REDACTED] [REDACTED] photographed the planter and marked the location as **Item #59**. Inside the planter were two casings, which were marked as **items #29 and #30**.

About one foot east of the driveway of [REDACTED] Norway Drive, there was a tan colored shoe. The shoe was a left foot shoe and had a possible bloodstain in the top of it. The shoe was marked as **item #16**.

The rest of the crime scene was located on the street, east of [REDACTED] Norway Drive. About 4' east of the driveway, there was several large bloodstains. Blood from these stains had dripped west towards the driveway. These stains were marked as **Item #15**. [REDACTED] collected the swabs from these stains as evidence.

Just north of these large bloodstains were several small pieces of fabric that appeared to be fiberfill from Temple's quilted shirt. These pieces of fabric were marked as **Items #45 through #54 and Item #56** and were near several strike marks in the street. The strike marks are later described in this report.

On the street, about one foot to the north of the bloodstains was a handgun. The gun was marked as **item #1**. The handgun was lying on its left side and is further described as a Colt .38 Caliber revolver, blue steel frame, 2" inch barrel, with

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brown grips. The hammer on the gun was in the de-cocked position. The rims of the casings were visible from the top of the gun's chamber.

Field Evidence Technician, [REDACTED], picked up the gun. I noticed that the side of the chamber that was lying against the street had a fresh scrape, possibly from the asphalt. [REDACTED] opened the chamber and revealed that the gun was fully loaded with six rounds. All six rounds had a strike mark indicating that the firing pin had struck each of them. After further examination, it was discovered that all six rounds had been fired.

There was a pile of bloodstained clothing just east of the bloodstains. This was identified as the clothing worn by Temple at the time of the shooting. The clothing was bloodstained and had been cut off his body. The clothing consisted of **Item #9**- bloodstained Wrangler blue jeans, blue plaid boxers, black belt with key chain, and **Item #11**- bloodstained white tee shirt & flannel shirt. Paramedics cut the clothing open when they removed it from Temple's body.

Item #10 was identified as a bloodstained wallet removed from a chain attached to item #9. There was also some currency and coins found underneath Temple's clothing which was marked as **Item #67**. Inside Temple's shirt pocket were two hypodermic needles, **Item #68**. A tube of homeopathic medicine, **Item #69** and a plastic baggie, **Item #66**, were found inside Temple's front pants pocket.

About two feet south of the clothing was a brown paper bag containing: (1) orange lighter, (1) round container of Skoal brand chewing tobacco, (1) pack of camel cigarettes, (1) pack of basic cigarettes, (1) black folding knife (bloodstained), (1)

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white metal folding knife (bloodstained), (1) black ball point pen, and (2) plastic baggies- (1) with white powdered substance and (1) with white powdered residue. These were personal items removed from Temple and marked as **Item #14**.

The following items were also found and collected near the location of the bloodstained clothing. **Item #2**-clear plastic baggie, **Item #3**-pager, **Item #4**-baseball style cap, with West Coast Choppers logo on front, **Item #5**-purple lighter, **Item #6**-white sock with bloodstains, **Item #7**- tan colored right shoe, bloodstained, **Item #8**- bullet, deformed, bloodstained, with some fabric material adhered to it.

There were several casings found on the street in front of [REDACTED] Norway Drive. These casings were marked and identified as **item #18 through #30** and described as .40 caliber Speer brand casings. There was also a large black metal flashlight identified as belonging to Deputy Duffner lying on the street in front of [REDACTED] Norway Drive. The flashlight was on when I first arrived at the scene. The flashlight was marked as **item #17**.

On the street, several feet to the south, east of the curb, was an empty ammunition magazine. The magazine had a sticker with identification number #2608 (Duffner's) on the bottom of it. It was marked as **item #31**. A small used self-adhesive bandage was found in the gutter. It was marked as **Item #57**.

There was also a small piece of brass colored metal that was found a few feet east of Temple's clothing. The metal was flattened and it appeared as though it was originally a hollow object. The item was marked as **Item #58**.

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Bullet Strikes

There were several bullet strikes in the street in front of [REDACTED] Norway Drive. I requested the assistance of a Firearms Expert to respond to the scene in order to assist with the identification and direction of several strikes in the street.

Originally, [REDACTED] and I had located and identified **Items #12, #13, #36, #37, #38, #39, #40, #41, #42, #43, #44, and #55** as possible strikes.

Firearms Examiner, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] confirmed the strikes we originally identified were in fact caused by bullets. [REDACTED] additionally identified **Items #60, #62, #63, #64** as strike marks caused by bullets. [REDACTED] conducted lead tests and was also able to determine the direction most of the rounds were fired.

Duffner was in a south west position and fired in a north east direction. Temple was in a north east position and fired his shots in a south west direction towards Deputy Duffner's direction.

Collection of Service Weapons and Equipment

At 0640 hours, I met with Deputy Sulkowski and Field Evidence Technician [REDACTED] [REDACTED] in order to collect his service weapon and extra magazines. Before we collected any equipment from Sulkowski, I requested [REDACTED] photograph Sulkowski in the manner he was dressed. Sulkowski was wearing a tan shirt, olive green uniform pants and black work boots. Plainly visible on the shirt were shoulder patches, one on each shoulder, and a brass badge, on the left front chest, that identified Sulkowski as a Ventura County Sheriff's Deputy. Sulkowski was also wearing a black leather duty belt which had various equipment attached around it that included his duty weapon and extra magazines.

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On 7-14-04 I was working uniformed patrol as 3C21. I heard Dispatch put out a "10-33" because of a foot pursuit in Ojai. At 0044 hours, I heard Dispatch advise that shots were fired and broadcast a "999" for the Ojai units. I responded from Camarillo to assist.

I arrived at Norway Drive and Ventura Avenue in Ventura at 0104 hours. Immediately after checking in, I was ordered by Sergeant Hasty (3S1) to accompany the suspect, later identified as (A) Jed Temple (██████████) to the hospital. I rode in the ambulance (AMR 481) with Temple. I activated my tape recorder while in the ambulance and kept it on for the next two hours.

During my time with Temple I did not ask him any questions. However I overheard Paramedic ██████████ ask Temple if he was taking any medication. He replied, "Yeah, heroin and OxyContin."

We arrived at VCMC at 0023 hours. Dr ██████████ treated Temple. Temple had three gunshot wounds: one to his left thumb, one to his left thigh/buttock, and one to his left foot. I photographed the injuries before and during treatment. Temple made no spontaneous statements in regard to the shooting. I was joined at the hospital by Deputy D. Sparks (3D22).

At 0145 hours, Nurse W. ██████████ drew a sample of Temple's blood for evidentiary purposes. This was done at my request. However, ██████████ told me that prior to the blood draw, she had given Temple 2 mg of Adavan and 4 mg of Morphine intravenously for pain. ██████████ gave me the sample and I retained possession of it.

Deputy Sparks and I bagged Temple's hands for a GSR test. I confirmed with ██████████ that during his treatment, Temple's hands were not washed. The bag on Temple's left hand was removed once so Dr ██████████ and ██████████ could examine and redress the wound. Deputy Sparks and I rebagged the hand.

██████████ told me that Temple would be admitted to VCMC for surgery. We relayed this to (Watch Commander) Captain Boyd. At 0500 hours, Deputy Ogonowski of the PTDF relieved Deputy Sparks and me.

On 07-14-2004, at about 0054 hours, Sheriff's Dispatch advised that 3A22 (Dep. S. Duffner) and 3A23 (Dep. Sulkowski) requested a "Code 999, shots fired" on Norway Drive at Ventura Avenue. I advised Sheriff's Dispatch that I was responding to assist. I also heard 3D22 (Dep. D. Sparks) and 3D23 (Dep. Ogawa) advise that they were responding.

When I arrived, Dep. Sparks directed me to park my patrol car on Ventura Avenue north of Norway Drive. I met the Ventura City Fire Department Engine 1 on Ventura Avenue at Norway Drive and escorted the fire crew along the south curb of Norway Drive to (A)Jed Temple's location. Temple was on the ground, in the middle of the road (Norway Drive) east of Ventura Avenue. The Fire Capt. Requested that I tell the paramedics to bring the gurney. I contacted the paramedics (American Medical Response) on Ventura Avenue at Norway Drive. I escorted the paramedics along the south curb of Norway Drive to Temple's location.

Sgt. Hasty directed me to maintain the perimeter of the crime scene on Norway Drive at Ventura Avenue. Yellow Crime Scene tape was posted across Norway Drive at Ventura Avenue. I started and maintained the Crime Scene Log during the incident. Refer to the Crime Scene Log sheets for times and list of personnel at the crime scene. At 0805 hours, Sgt. M. Smith told me to close out the Crime Scene Log and that Norway Drive was being opened to the public. I gave the Crime Scene Log sheets to Sgt. Werre.

On 7-14-04 at approximately 1230 hours, I was working patrol as 3D23. At that time dispatch advised that Ojai Station units were in foot pursuit in the area of Norway and Ventura Avenue. I started to respond to their location from the El Rio area of Oxnard. A few moments later, dispatch advised that there was a "Code 999" with shots fired. Dispatch was initially unable to get further information from the units at the location. I immediately responded "Code Three" to the location and arrived prior to many of the other Sheriff units arriving.

Upon arrival, I observed a male subject ((A) Jed Temple) lying on the ground with his hands cuffed behind his back. Deputy Sulkowski was standing over Temple with several Ventura P.D. officers providing cover. I assisted with covering Temple. Temple was bleeding from several areas of his body most noticeable from his left thumb and the left side of his pants near the crotch. Temple made several statements during this time stating that he wanted us to put a bullet in his head. Temple then stated that he had a knife and attempted to reach into his pocket with his cuffed hand. Deputy Sulkowski searched Temple and found that he had two knives in his possession and found illegal drugs (possibly methamphetamine) in his pockets. During the search, Temple moved around and attempted to eat the baggie containing the white powdery substance that Sulkowski had found. The baggie was on the ground when Temple made the attempt to eat the baggie. Ventura P.D. Officers then used Crime scene tape to close off the area. Once searched we allowed Emergency medical personnel to treat Temple. Temple was transported by ambulance to the hospital.

At this time, I was unaware that Sulkowski had been involved with the shooting and he did not make any statements to me. I knew Deputy Scott Duffner had been involved because his empty magazine was on the ground next to several bullet casings. Duffner did not make any statements to me regarding the incident. Sgt Hasty and Sgt Inglis then arrived and took control of the location. I was left to guard the inner perimeter of the crime scene until Sheriff's B.I. and Major crimes arrived.

No further information was received and no other action was taken.

The suspect was transported to the hospital via ambulance with multiple gunshot wounds. Upon arriving at the emergency room, I discovered the suspect was inside one of the treatment room located in the emergency room. The suspect was naked and covered by a white sheet. I saw the suspect had several injuries to his body that were covered with blood that included a wound to his left hand, left foot, and an obvious gunshot wound to his buttocks. Inside the room, Deputies Sparks #2409 (3C21) and Beauvis #3173 (3D22) were assigned to remain with the suspect. The suspect was extremely loud and continuously screaming. Several hospital medical personnel were also present in the room. The medical staff was attempting to treat the suspect. The deputies advised the suspect's clothing was possibly left at the scene. The deputies took photographs of the suspect and obtained blood samples, which were booked into property.

Since the suspect was incapable of talking, I responded to the crime scene. Shortly after my arrival at the crime scene, I was instructed by Sgt. Smith to interview the suspect's aunt [REDACTED]. I contacted [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] Norway Drive and conducted a tape-recorded interview inside her residence. Refer to supplemental report and audiotape for details.

At approximately 0425 A.M., I was instructed to interview Deputies Duffner and Sulkowski at the Ojai Police Station. I approximately 0500 A.M., I arrived at the station and began to conduct an interview with Deputy Sulkowski in an interview room. Also present at the interview were Detective

1 out my service pistol in the holster and
2 started returning fire. As I was shooting, I
3 had my gun in my right hand and I was
4 basically crawling backwards on my left side
5 towards the curb on Norway.

6 CD: Can you walk us to where the --
7 the suspect and when you pushed the suspect
8 down and where you fell over him?

9 SD: Sure. I pushed him down right
10 about in this area. So --

11 CD: Towards the middle of the street
12 right in front --

13 SD: Towards the middle of the street.

14 CD: -- of the driveway of [REDACTED] or
15 [REDACTED]?

16 SD: Yeah, yeah.

17 CD: Okay.

18 SD: He fell down. I don't know what
19 happened 'cause when I went over him, I
20 tripped and I fell towards that side of the
21 street.

6 that's when I started hearing him yelling,
7 basically he sounded like he was in pain.

8 And then I heard Steve yelling at me,
9 Scott, are you okay, are you okay? And I
10 answered Steve back. I go I don't know. I
11 stood up and that's when I started yelling at
12 the subject laying in the street, stay there,
13 lay on your back, let me see your hands. He
14 just kept moaning and yelling back. He told
15 us a couple times to shoot him, just shoot me
16 in the head, get it over with.

17 And I didn't see it, where the gun
18 was. I didn't know if he had it, if it was
19 on the ground. Finally Steve yelled at me
20 that the gun was at his feet and then I could
21 see that.

22 But he was still yelling, he was in a
23 lot of pain. I could see the blood on the
24 street and we kept yelling at him, keep
25 showing his hands, lay on your back. I got
26 on the radio, put a 999 and in a couple
27 minutes Ventura Police Department showed up.

1 Then they got here. I don't know who I was
2 with. I came up with somebody.

3 And he was laying on his belly 'cause
4 we instructed him to lay down on his belly.
5 I came up with the Ventura Police officer and
6 I grabbed the subject by the shirt and drug
7 him over to the other curb away from the gun.

8 And when he was over there, I
9 handcuffed him and got on the radio and told
10 dispatch to have fire and ambulance come in.

7 towards the front door, noticed a white male
8 subject walking towards me from inside the house.
9 We made eye contact, he immediately turned around
10 and went behind a wall. I lost sight of him.

14 out the back door. As I walked into the living

10 noticed Deputy Duffner and was chasing the subject
11 south on Norway. I ran, I jumped the chain link
12 fence right there on the corner, jumped down into
13 this field. I was -- starting running south,
14 jumped this, jumped the chain link fence right
15 here. Noticed the subject, Deputy Duffner caught
16 up with the subject right by this driveway.

17 EM: Let's go ahead and walk.

11 out a 999 and still giving commands to the subject
12 to lay still, keep his hands out.

13 He was still keeping his hands inside his
14 midsection. Didn't know if he had any other
15 weapons on him. He kept rolling over and at times
16 he'd roll towards the weapon, tell him not to --
17 to move.

18 He -- then he started yelling out just to
19 kill him, shoot him in his head. And at that time
20 he started to roll towards the gun when -- I
21 thought he was going to reach for the weapon
22 again, which we give him commands not to, you
23 know, go for the weapon, lay still, get his hands
24 out, which he -- he would comply and then he would
25 bring his hands back in.

26 Shortly after that, Deputy Duffner advised
27 dispatch to have fire and ambulance respond and

1 stage. Ventura Police Department arrived. Once
2 Ventura PD arrived, I moved from the sil- --
3 silver vehicle on the other side, this -- of
4 the -- the minivan so there wouldn't be a
5 crossfire situation.

6 Deputy Duffner and one of the Ventura
7 police officers approached the subject. Deputy
8 Duffner drug the -- the subject away from the
9 weapon, handcuffed him. I searched him for any
10 other weapons, found two pocket knives and at that
11 time we let fire and paramedics attend to the
12 subject.

13 CD: Okay. I'll bring you back to a little
14 bit. Now we're on the -- we're on the west
15 sidewalk. We're in between the house where you
16 initially -- you initially saw the -- the suspect,
17 correct? And there's a -- there's a vacant lot
18 and then there's [REDACTED], which is the -- the street
19 area in front of [REDACTED] Norway is where the shooting
20 took place, correct?

21 SS: Yes.

22 CD: When you jumped the fence, at what
23 point did you see the muzzle flash from the
24 suspect's gun? Where were you at?

25 SS: I -- I was probably within this range
26 right here. Just within -- I jumped right here
27 and as soon as I basically jumped the fence,

1 started running up and it was within this area. I
2 mean, as far as --

3 CD: Okay. Where was the suspect at?

4 SS: They were -- they were in the street,
5 so it was -- it was within this area right in here
6 when I was running up. I mean, to tell you
7 exactly, it was within running up in here and I
8 noticed them in the street and then, 'cause it was
9 just a short little -- you know, as soon as I --
10 as soon as I saw and heard the muzzle flash, I
11 took cover to the vehicle over there.

12 CD: Okay, look. Where in -- where in the
13 street was the suspect and -- and how was he
14 facing?

15 SS: Okay. We'll -- we'll have to cross
16 over here.

17 EM: (INAUDIBLE).

18 SS: Okay. He -- the su- -- he was laying
19 right basically --

20 EM: I think right was the paper bag
21 (INAUDIBLE) have to stand there. Why don't you
22 direct me up to where he was.

23 SS: He was basically right where -- right
24 around where 15.

25 EM: Right here?

26 SS: Out a little bit farther.

27 CD: See Marker 15?

1 SS: So over to the right a little bit.

2 EM: There?

3 SS: Yeah. Right in there. Yes, he was
4 facing this way. His feet -- his feet were this
5 way. He was laying back but kind of sitting up
6 and he was firing that way.

7 EM: Where was Duffner? What was -- what
8 was going on?

9 SS: The initial shots, they were --
10 Duffner was within two feet of where 15 was at.
11 So he was basically sitting, or on the ground --

12 EM: Uh-huh.

13 SS: -- two feet from where -- right around
14 where 15's at.

15 EM: Shots were going?

16 SS: Shots were going that way.

17 EM: This way?

18 SS: 'Cause he was shooting at Duffner and
19 Duffner was on the south side of the -- the
20 subject.

21 EM: Okay.

22 SS: And --

23 CD: How many -- how many feet were between
24 Duffner and the suspect?

25 SS: I -- I would say at least two feet. I
26 mean, no more than two feet. I mean, it was that
27 close.

1 CD: Was Duffner returning fire at that
2 point?

3 SS: Yes.

4 BM: What was going through your mind at
5 that time?

6 SS: By that time I thought that close
7 proximity, I -- I thought Duffner was struck
8 because I heard him yell or make a -- make a loud
9 painful noise. And then a couple more shots rang
10 out and then when I took cover here, I lost
11 Duffner, I lost sight of Deputy Duffner when he
12 scooted over.

13 EM: (INAUDIBLE).

14 SS: And then the subject -- I was -- I was
15 getting nervous (INAUDIBLE). And Duffner moved
16 over that way. Subject was still laying there,
17 had the -- had his hands.

18 CD: So you were right by the right rear
19 door?

20 SS: Yes.

21 CD: Of the grey Honda, this Accord?

22 EM: Were you still there? Could you still
23 see Duffner from where you're at here?

24 SS: I saw -- I saw a glimpse of him
25 standing.

26 EM: Okay.

27 SS: But he would -- he would back up again

1 'cause there was no cover there. So I -- when I
2 yelled to ask if he was okay 'cause I didn't see
3 him, I didn't know if he -- at that time I didn't
4 know if he was on the ground.

5 EM: Uh-huh.

6 SS: I yelled, asked him if he was all
7 right. He said he wasn't -- I can't remember if
8 he said he wasn't sure or if he doesn't know but
9 neither of us knew at that time if he was struck.
10 But at that time we were both giving commands.
11 Once I made contact with him verbally and I -- you
12 know, he was giving commands, we were talking back
13 and forth, at that time, that's when we focused
14 our attention 'cause the gun was still laying next
15 to his feet. Noticed a vehicle drive up, we're
16 trying to tell him to back his vehicle up.
17 Subject's still rolling back and forth. And then
18 that's when Ventura came in and -- and then we --
19 we didn't --

20 CD: Was the suspect saying anything during
21 all this?

22 SS: He was, after -- after all the shots,
23 he was -- you can tell he's in pain by just the
24 noises he was making. And he -- he was asking me
25 to shoot him in the head and kill him. But other
26 than that, I -- something to the effect of you
27 know, why did I do it? But pretty much just he

1 was in pain and rolling back and forth.

2 CD: When the suspect was down and you said
3 you gave him commands and after the shooting, was
4 he complying with your orders?

5 SS: For the most part he wasn't 'cause he
6 was -- he kept saying he was in pain and he --
7 we're telling him to move his hands, keep his
8 hands away from his -- his body and he said -- he
9 would do it and then he'd bring them back. And he
10 just said he was -- he, I guess the pain was just
11 too much. He couldn't keep his -- his hands out.

12 He was complying but he was still too close
13 to the weapons and at times it looked like he
14 would roll towards it and then he would say just
15 shoot me, kill me. And I -- several times I
16 thought he was actually going to try to reach for
17 the weapon to either shoot himself or shoot at us
18 to return fire and maybe end it. 'Cause he -- he
19 said it several times, just to shoot him in the
20 head.

21 CD: You said that you were -- you were
22 back here. Did you fire your weapon from right
23 here?

24 SS: Yes.

25 CD: How many ro- -- how many times do you
26 think you fired your weapon?

27 SS: Four. Four rounds.

CONFIDENTIAL

1 CD: Four. And then you moved?

2 SS: Yes. Once Ventura arrived and they
3 were -- they had the whole area lit up, their
4 units were in position, they made contact with
5 Deputy Duffner. I advised Duffner I was going to
6 move around to the other side of the minivan so
7 there wouldn't be a crossfire situation when they
8 moved in to take control of the subject to get him
9 away from the weapon.

10 CD: How'd you make that move?

11 SS: I just circled around.

12 CD: Uh-huh.

13 SS: Right around the two vehicles to --

14 CD: To around the front of them?

15 SS: Yeah.

16 CD: Between the cars, the vehicles and the
17 garage door?

18 SS: Yes. At that time there were num- --
19 several Ventura and Deputy Duffner that were
20 covering the subject. And at that time basically
21 they moved in. I -- I moved in with them just for
22 cover. Deputy Duffner drug the subject away from
23 the -- the weapon, handcuffed him. I searched him
24 for any other weapons and that's when the fire and
25 ambulance came in.

26 CD: Total how many times do you think the
27 suspect shot his weapon?

1 SS: I think total probably five to six
2 times.

3 CD: All at Duffner?

4 SS: Yes. He -- he did, I mean, he looked
5 at me several times. He -- he knew I was standing
6 here but all the rounds were going towards
7 Duffner. He didn't shoot at the -- in my
8 direction at any time.

9 CD: Were all those round fired -- were
10 all -- all those rounds fired when Duffner was
11 within that short distance?

12 SS: I think the initial were probably
13 three to four when they were on the ground
14 together. And then when Duffner was able to get
15 some distance, that's when I was already in
16 position, fired two more rounds and then that's
17 when I fired my rounds.

18 CD: Was the suspect shooting from the
19 ground or was he standing?

20 SS: He was shooting from the ground on
21 his -- laying on -- he was kind of sitting up but
22 he was crumped on the ground.

23 CD: Can you kind of demonstrate for me how
24 the shot -- the suspect was firing his weapon?
25 Was he aiming, did he appear to be?

26 SS: I think he was more like from, he was
27 just taking shots. He wasn't -- he didn't take

1 aim. He was just pointing --

2 EM: (INAUDIBLE).

3 SS: -- in the direction.

4 EM: So up like this is or what?

5 SS: From -- from what I -- from what I
6 saw, I think it was one hand. He was just laying
7 and -- and at that time 'cause when they were both
8 on the ground, I think he was just randomly trying
9 to hit. He wasn't aiming. Probably thought he
10 was close enough, he'd be able to get a few rounds
11 into Duffner. And then Duffner got a -- got --
12 got separation and he still just couple rounds in
13 the direction.

14 CD: Was the suspect firing the gun from
15 his right or left hand?

16 SS: I think it was his right. 'Cause the
17 way he was laying and the way Duffner, 'cause it
18 just -- I believe it was his right hand.

19 CD: Okay. So now I want to make the --
20 make sure I have this clear, that it's your -- it
21 was your impression that the suspect was firing at
22 Duffner?

23 SS: Definitely. I -- I thought -- I -- I
24 knew for a fact he was firing at Duffner and I
25 thought Duffner was struck several times just
26 because of the proximity and the rounds, that he
27 was -- no doubt in my mind he was trying to kill

1 Duffner.

2 CD: At any point during this foot chase
3 and the subsequent shooting, did you hear Deputy
4 Duffner give the suspect any commands?

5 SS: Yeah. As I was jumping, as I came
6 around and was getting ready to jump the fence, I
7 heard him yell stop, Sheriff's Department several
8 times and then basically that's -- that's when
9 they ended up in the street.

10 EM: So you were wearing what you're
11 wearing now?

12 SS: Yes, full uniform. My duty uniform.

13 CD: Did you see the suspect's weapon
14 before you saw the muzzle flash and the gunfire?

15 SS: No. Saw the -- saw the muzzle flash,
16 heard and saw the muzzle flash simultaneously.
17 Took cover and that's -- I didn't -- I didn't see
18 the -- the -- it was a small weapon, after I saw
19 it on the ground. I didn't see the actual weapon
20 in his hand but I -- I saw the muzzle flash coming
21 from the hand. And then once he threw the weapon
22 on the ground, that's when I got, you know, a -- a
23 better look at the -- the weapon.

24 CD: What did the weapon look like?

25 SS: The brown -- brown handle, blue steel
26 or black revolver.

27 EM: (INAUDIBLE).

1 CD: Which -- which unit is yours or the
2 one you were driving?

3 SS: My unit's the one on the north side
4 parked -- or I'm sorry, the west side of that unit
5 right there, 3470. Yeah, just in the interse- --
6 or --

7 CD: So like the northeast corner there?

8 SS: Yes.

9 CD: Okay. So furthest away from the
10 suspect's home?

11 SS: Yes.

12 CD: Or the residence where you saw him at?

13 SS: Yes.

14 CD: And that's where it was when you --
15 when you stopped?

16 SS: Yeah.

17 CD: It hasn't been moved?

18 SS: No, it has not been moved.

19 CD: When you attempted to make contact
20 with the suspect at the residence, did you
21 identify yourself or give any commands?

22 SS: It happened so -- he looked at me and
23 as soon as he saw me, he turned around and I
24 yelled for him to stop but he continued on. I
25 knocked on the door and right at that time someone
26 came out and told me, invited me inside.

27 CD: Okay.

1 SS: So I didn't have time to --

2 CD: Can you remember anything that I
3 haven't asked you about you haven't already told
4 me that might be helpful in this investigation?

5 SS: No. I -- I think I covered it all. I
6 mean, just it's -- it's -- I -- I definitely
7 thought Duffner was -- was shot and I -- I -- I
8 just feared for his life. I mean, it was -- it
9 was pretty stressful.

10 CD: Okay. (INAUDIBLE).

11 JA: Do you -- did you also have concerns
12 about your own life?

13 SS: Yes, of course. I -- I mean, I was
14 concerned for my -- my safety, but I knew I had
15 cover and I -- I lost sight of Duffner after
16 the -- the -- the rounds went off. I didn't know,
17 you know, the extent of his injuries. But I mean,
18 his safety first of all 'cause the proximity of
19 where he was at in relations -- relation with
20 the -- the suspect shooting the -- the rounds off.
21 And then of course I was in fear for my safety. I
22 took cover and the -- the subject knew where I was
23 standing here but I think he felt Duffner was more
24 of a threat because he already had contact with
25 him and he was out in the open.

26 CD: One more thing from me. You have any
27 idea how many rounds Deputy Duffner might have

1 fired?

2 SS: Honestly, I -- I couldn't even say.

3 PM: Were you aware at the time that
4 Duffner had fired also?

5 SS: Yes. I -- I knew he returned fire. I
6 saw the muzzle flash come in from his direction
7 also. But I -- I don't know how many rounds.

8 HL: At some point after the shooting, did
9 you have the presence of mind to turn on your
10 recorder?

11 SS: Yes. After -- after he was basically
12 had his hands into his waistband, I immediately
13 clicked on my tape recorder and then just started
14 giving him commands, trying to find out if Duffner
15 had any -- any injuries, any wounds. And we just
16 continued to give him commands to, you know, don't
17 go for the gun and to lay still.

18 HL: And -- and did you provide that to
19 Detective Dunn?

20 SS: Yes.

21 CD: That would be the Certron M-60
22 microcassette?

23 SS: Yes.

24 PM: As you're coming up the sidewalk, the
25 first time you see Duffner and the suspect,
26 they're on the ground?

27 SS: Yes. That -- well, what I -- when --

1 I saw them actually running. You know, he was
2 chasing him. I saw him from the -- from the yard.
3 And then once I jumped this, I was right in this
4 area when I saw him on the ground and that's when
5 I saw the -- and heard the -- the -- the gunshots
6 and the muzzle, muzzle flash.

7 PM: Is that the same time that you see
8 Duffner on the ground and --

9 SS: Yes.

10 PM: -- you hear the gunshot?

11 SS: Yes.

12 EM: That's it, that's it.

13 CD: Oh.

14 EM: From me.

15 CD: Okay. Then we're going to go off
16 tape. It's 0617 hours.

17 JA: Was that clear enough for you guys
18 when he, you know, when he said, you know, he
19 wasn't aiming?

1 CD: Okay. Steve, it's 0620 hours.
2 Same date. A couple questions, if you don't
3 mind, came up.

4 What were the lighting conditions like
5 out here?

6 SS: The -- I believe the st- -- the
7 streetlight was -- was fun- -- it was on. It
8 was functioning and I'm pretty sure that the
9 -- the light on the garage was -- was on.

10 CD: Okay.

11 EM: Did you have a flashlight or
12 anything?

13 SS: I had a flashlight. I didn't
14 have it on. I had it in my hand but I -- I
15 didn't have it on.

16 CD: What would you -- how would you
17 describe the illumination out in the street?

18 SS: The illumination was -- it was
19 fairly bright. I was able to clearly see the
20 subject without, you know, too much trouble.
21 I -- I can see his whole body, see detail;
22 you know, face, hands with the -- with the
23 light that was present.

24 CD: And any -- while -- while this
25 was taking place, did you notice anybody else
26 around this area?

27 SS: I'm pretty positive his mother

1 was standing and sitting on the fence. Well,
2 I didn't clarify if it was her or not because
3 the interaction was, he ran out the back
4 door, be careful of -- you know, there's dogs
5 out there. And as I came around and I was
6 standing here, I noticed a female sitting on
7 the fence, probably see the -- the gate and
8 then maybe the second section of the -- the
9 chain link fence right here on the sidewalk.

10 CD: Right.

11 SS: And then the car, that -- that
12 red vehicle, the red primered vehicle, after
13 all the shots and everything were -- were
14 done, and we were giving the commands, that
15 vehicle pulled up right at the storm drain.
16 I had to -- both my -- myself and Duffner
17 told that vehicle to back off, get out of the
18 area. And then there was another vehicle
19 that pulled up. I don't know, it -- I don't
20 know what kind of vehicle it was, it pulled
21 up. Just told them they needed to leave,
22 which they backed up and -- and left.

23 CD: Did anybody ever come out of this
24 house during the incident?

25 SS: Not that I'm aware of. All I
26 know is that the radio traffic, they called
27 saying that we were in front of the house.

1 EM: Something about reloads or
2 anything like that?

3 CD: All right.

4 Did -- did you reload your weapon
5 during that?

6 SS: As I was standing here, I did
7 exchange my magazine. I put the -- the
8 magazine, it was in my handgun in the pouch
9 and I put a fresh magazine in.

10 CD: Did you fire any from that fresh
11 magazine?

12 SS: No.

13 CD: Do you know if Deputy Duffner
14 reloaded?

15 SS: I don't know if he did or not.

16 CD: How about the suspect?

17 SS: No, I -- I don't know if he did
18 or not.

19 EM: Just, all the magazines and
20 everything are where they are now?

21 SS: Yes.

22 EM: Yeah?

23 SS: Everything I have has been -- is
24 still on me.

25 EM: Yes, sir.

26 BM: Sergeant Macedo.

27 Did you have any conversations with

1 Duffner or anyone after the incidents?

2 SS: No. Just, I just asked Duffner
3 if he was hit, if he's okay. And that
4 basically was -- didn't really -- I don't
5 remember talking to anyone. Just asked him
6 if he was okay and we were -- after
7 everything was basically Code 4, told not to
8 -- to you know, talk about the -- the
9 incident.

10 BM: So no other statements were
11 provided to any -- anyone else, any
12 supervisors that came on scene?

13 SS: No. I -- I didn't talk to any
14 supervisors. I don't know if Duffner did or
15 not. But we were -- once everything, we were
16 aside, they told us not to talk to anybody,
17 just wait till, you know, everything was
18 settled down and get -- get us back to the
19 station.

20 BM: And have you qualified with your
21 weapon in the last qualification period?

22 SS: Actually, I -- I missed last
