Interview of [REDACTED]

On July 26th, 2005 at approximately 2330 hours, I interviewed [REDACTED] concerning a disturbance at her house that lead to an officer involved shooting in which her father, Scott Osler was shot and eventually died as a result of his wounds. At the time of the interview, [REDACTED] did not know her father had passed away. The interview was recorded. The following is a synopsis of the interview.

[REDACTED] lives in the family home at [REDACTED] with her mother, father and sister. [REDACTED] told me that her family had just arrived home after going on a houseboat vacation to Lake Trinity. [REDACTED] swam and played a lot and had a very good time with her family.

I explained to [REDACTED] that she obviously knew why I wanted to talk to her and asked her to tell me in her own words what took place.

[REDACTED] began by telling me that her dad was at a friends house visiting. [REDACTED] said her dad had stopped by the friend's house to have a beer with him and then added, "I don't know how much

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he had [to drink].” [REDACTED] dad was supposed to pick up dinner so her mom called and asked if he could hurry up and come home because the food was going to get cold. [REDACTED] dad had already stopped and picked up dinner and had the food with him while he was visiting his friend.]

He (Scott) came home and, “he was kinda cranky. He didn’t really look drunk to me, but I don’t really know.” [REDACTED] said she was not sure how “it” started, but her dad was complaining about how hard he worked and kept asking her mom [REDACTED] how much she worked. He (Scott) claimed that he worked harder. According to [REDACTED] “He started yelling at her [REDACTED]; it wasn’t that bad, but it was still kinda bad.”

[REDACTED] said her dad then “took off” and she did not know where her dad went or what he did. After an period of time he came back and, “they got into a big argument, started yelling really bad names, a lot of cursing words and uhm, I heard this glass breaking right in front of my door and apparently it was a picture frame.”

[REDACTED] began to become emotional and I could hear her voice cracking as she continued to tell me what happened. [REDACTED] told me, “And then he came in my room and like, asked me a question. I didn’t really know what he said; he sounded drunk and I said, ‘I don’t know.’ And he said, ‘No, you know.’ So I ran into my mom’s room and hid in her closet and I called my aunt and 911.”

[Note: [REDACTED] and has a cellular phone for safety reasons.]

[REDACTED] continued saying, “He said – he told my mom if she called the police he would hurt them or he wouldn’t go down without a fight and just a lot of bad words to my mom. And that’s all I remember.”

I then told [REDACTED] that I needed to ask her some questions to help me fully understand what took place. [REDACTED] said he understood and we continued to talk about what had happened.

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I clarified with [REDACTED] what took place at the dinner table when her dad was arguing with her mom about who worked harder. [REDACTED] said her dad did not get up and leave immediately and explained that while her parents were arguing, she went into her sister's room and they (she and her sister) waited for a while. While they were waiting in the room, "it got really bad and then my mom told him just to leave and then he left."

[REDACTED] then clarified what she did during the course of the night. [REDACTED] explained that she was eating with her family when the arguing started. She then went to her sister's room with her sister and stayed there while the argument between her parents continued at the dinner table. [REDACTED] then went into her room and got her cell phone. [REDACTED] now told me that she called her aunt and 911 while she was in her room although later she again indicated that she made the calls while hiding in the closet of her mother's room. While she was in her room, her father came into her room and asked her something. [REDACTED] ran out of her room and hid in her mom's closet. She then stayed in the closet until the police arrived.

I asked [REDACTED] to tell me again about what happened when her dad came into her room. I confirmed that he asked her something but she was not sure what he said. [REDACTED] answered, "Yeah, he seemed really drunk. I don't know what, what he said." [REDACTED] went on to say that the question had to do with what was said when he first got home, but she did not understand what her dad was trying to say. [REDACTED] reiterated that she did not understand what he was saying and answered her father by saying that she did not know. Her dad then said, "NO! You know!" [REDACTED] got scared and ran from the room. [REDACTED] heard her mom tell her dad, "don't, don't mess with them. Just deal with me and leave the children alone."

I then asked [REDACTED] to tell me about the things she heard her dad say about doing something to the police. According to [REDACTED], "He said, he said - - all I can remember is he said, 'If you call the

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police - - ' and then I can remember him saying that um, 'I'll hurt the police' and then he said, 'If they come, I'm not going down without a fight.'" I asked [REDACTED] if she remembered these statements clearly in her mind and explained that it was important to know if a person is sure of what they heard or if they aren't quite sure of what they heard. [REDACTED] said, "I'm positive I remember him saying that if the police come, I'm gonna hurt them. But it - - I think I kinda remember him saying I'm not going down without a fight, but I'm not quite sure. But I'm positive about the thing that he said that 'I'm gonna hurt the police.'"

I then asked [REDACTED] if she continued to hear things while she was in her mother's closet. [REDACTED] said she remembered hearing a lot of bad words. She also remembered talking to the "Police" on the phone. [REDACTED] asked the person she was speaking with to please hurry. The male then told her that the Police were outside her house.

[REDACTED] then became visibly shaken and her voice quivered. She continued saying, "I remember my - - hearing my dad open the drawer in the kitchen and getting something out of it and I got really scared." [REDACTED] paused to catch her breath. I asked [REDACTED] if she could hear things going on in the kitchen. [REDACTED] answered, "Well, I heard him open the door [sic] grab something out of silverware - - I heard silverware - - and then slam it really hard. And then I heard gunshots and then my mom scream."

I sensed that [REDACTED] was at a very vulnerable place, so I stopped all discussion of the incident and talked to her about a teddy bear she was holding for a few moments.

I then returned to our conversation about what she could hear while in her mom's closet. I asked [REDACTED] if she could hear her mom say anything to her dad after he got into the kitchen drawer. [REDACTED] said she heard her mom say, "Scott, NO! Scott, NO! ... NO Scott!" I asked if she heard her

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dad leave the house. [REDACTED] began to cry and said, "No. And then I just curled up in a ball and closed my ears."

I asked [REDACTED] if she could hear the deputies outside yelling to her dad. [REDACTED] said she could hear them yelling but could not make out what they were saying. I then questioned [REDACTED] about the gunshots and whether or not she heard them. [REDACTED] told me she heard two shots and then said; "I know my Mommy told me that they just shot him in the leg so he would stop coming at them. But I didn't see any of that. I just heard it from my mom."

[REDACTED] was still upset and I again decided to move the conversation away from what had happened earlier. I told [REDACTED] I wanted to talk about the past and asked her if her dad has ever done anything that has scared her. [REDACTED] said, "Well he's yelled at my mom; but nothing this serious and he hasn't scared me before. I mean he's [cracking voice and crying] really nice." I told [REDACTED] that it sounded like she had a very nice dad and that something about tonight was different. [REDACTED] said, "I don't know what happened to him." [REDACTED] also told me that the yelling at her mother was "every so often" and it was "complaining about how he works so hard." [REDACTED] then added, "But I don't know if he's been drunk the last couple of times. I'm not very sure. But I know like, he's not an alcoholic."

[REDACTED] knew that the police had come to her house in the past when her dad threw an ice chest at her mom, but did not know any details of the incident other than her mom had a bruise on her leg and the police took pictures of the injury. I asked [REDACTED] again about her father yelling at her and her sister. [REDACTED] said her dad would yell at her and her sister, but they would go to their rooms and things would then get better. I asked [REDACTED] if the yelling was when they would "deserve it" or if it was, "Whoa, this isn't good." [REDACTED] said it was the, "Whoa, this isn't good" kind of yelling. [REDACTED] added, "Not cause like we didn't clean our room. He just yells at us."

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█████ then described an incident that she thought took place about one year ago at McDonalds. █████ said her dad was really mad and kept slamming on the brakes and, "orange juice flew all over us." █████ said she told her mom and her school about the incident. I asked if the police came and talked to her about the incident. █████ replied, "No, it's just like, he didn't hurt us in any way. It just kinda scared us."

Towards the end of the interview, █████ explained to me that she has her own cell phone █████ █████ I asked █████ who she called first when she made the phone calls. █████ told me she called her aunt first and then the police. █████ also said, "Cause I was kinda scared, because I didn't want daddy to get hurt because he kept on saying, 'You better not call 911.' But I just thought something bad might happen, so I just called." I asked █████ what her aunt told her when they spoke. █████ aunt told her she would get there as soon as she could and asked █████ if she had called 911 yet. █████ told her aunt she was going to call 911 as soon as they hung up.

█████ told me she has not noticed anything different about her dad over the last few weeks. I asked █████ if she could think of anything that happened that we had not talked about; █████ said she could not think of anything.

I concluded the interview and walked █████ back to her mother and sister. A digital recording of this interview was given to Detective's Montagna and Evans for inclusion in their case file.


On 7/26/2005, at approximately 10:00 P.M., I was notified by Captain Kelley by telephone and directed to respond to an officer involved shooting at [REDACTED] Ojai. I arrived at the scene at approximately 11:00 P.M. Upon arriving at the scene, I noticed several patrol units parked on [REDACTED]

As I approached the house, I saw yellow crime scene tape across the driveway of the residence. The residence, [REDACTED] was located behind [REDACTED] and can be access via a concrete downward driveway located along the south side of [REDACTED]. The officers briefly advised the suspect, identified as Scott Osler, was transported to VCMC. The two deputies, identified as Victor Medina and Dave Sparks, were transported to the Ojai Police Station. The suspect's family, identified as [REDACTED] and daughters [REDACTED], were at the scene. Several investigators were currently interviewing several of the family members.

Shortly after arriving at the scene, Detective Rivera told me Suspect Scott Osler died while under going surgery at VCMC. The Medical Examiner and Sheriff's CSI personnel were enroute to the hospital. In the meantime, Detective Peterson was completing a search warrant for the suspect's residence.

INVESTIGATION

I walked down the driveway to the residence to obtain a description of the residence for a search warrant. At the bottom of the driveway, I saw a uniform deputy on the front porch maintaining security until a search warrant was executed. While walking down the driveway, I saw several shell casings, a live round, bloody clothing, a knife, and several phones. Parked in front of the garage were

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



I ARRIVED AT [REDACTED] AT 2215 HRS. I COULD SEE SEVERAL POLICE UNITS PARKED ON [REDACTED] NEAR THE 90-DEGREE TURN. 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On 07-26-2005, at about 2113 hours, I was assigned to work patrol in the unincorporated area of Ventura. I was dispatched to assist Ojai Station Deputies reference a shooting at [REDACTED] in the community of Oak View. I was dispatched code-3 (emergency- lights and siren.) When I arrived, I parked my patrol car on [REDACTED]

I walked to the residence and I contacted Dep. Jalaty #2819. Dep. Jalaty was standing next to a patrol car that was parked in front of the residence. I saw a Lifeline Ambulance #501 parked in the middle of the street. I did not know that inside the ambulance was suspect Scott Osler [REDACTED]. Before I could ask what the circumstances were of the call for service, a fire or ambulance personnel asked that we move the patrol car so the ambulance could get turned around. The street was narrow and there was limited road space to get the ambulance turned around.

Dep. Jalaty moved the patrol car and I went to the end of the street [REDACTED] to move the other patrol cars so the ambulance could maneuver out of the residential tract. The ambulance left to the hospital (Ventura County Medical Center.) As the ambulance was leaving I asked Sgt. Ruby #1852 via the radio if he wanted me to follow the ambulance to the hospital. Sgt. Ruby acknowledged in the affirmative and I advised Sheriff's Dispatch that I was following the ambulance to VCMC.

We arrived at VCMC at about 2200 hours and Osler was taken into an emergency room. While medical personnel were treating Osler's injuries, I identified the rescue personnel that rode in the ambulance with Osler. There were 2 Ventura County Fire Department Firefighters. The Firefighters' were assigned to station #23 in Oak View. Their names were [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. I also identified the ambulance personnel as Paramedic [REDACTED] and EMT [REDACTED]. Refer to supplemental report for further details on [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] statements.

I called Capt. Boyd #1053 (Watch Commander) and gave him an update of the situation. I requested assistance with dealing with the evolving situation at VCMC. Capt. Boyd said he would dispatch a deputy to assist me. During the time I was guarding Osler in the emergency room and in surgery, he (Osler) did not say anything. He was unconscious during the time.

At about 2220 hours, Osler was taken to surgery on the second floor. I waited at the nurse's station on the second floor. At about 2240 hours, SST. [REDACTED] (B.I.) arrived on the second floor of VCMC. At about 2245 hours, Dep. Mano arrived on the second floor of VCMC. At about 2305 hours, Det. Rivera #2696 arrived on the second floor at VCMC. I briefed Det. Rivera about the situation at the hospital.

On 07-27-2005, at about 2320 hours, Doctor [REDACTED] (Surgical Doctor) met with us and told us that he had pronounced Osler's death. Det. Rivera telephoned Capt.

[REDACTED] said he did not hear Osler make any statements. [REDACTED] said he heard Osler make several statements several times such as, "it's not their fault, don't blame the cops." 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Narrative:
 On 07/26/05, I was working uniformed patrol in the City of Ojai (1A21). At approximately 2123 hours, I was dispatched code 3 to [REDACTED] to assist units that were on scene of a domestic disturbance.

Upon arrival, I saw medical personnel running down the driveway of [REDACTED]. I followed them and met Deputy Sparks and Deputy Medina midway down the driveway. There was a male subject, later identified as Osler, Scott, laying on the ground with medical personnel working on him. Deputy Sparks directed me to a female sitting in a chair at the bottom of the driveway and asked me to secure her.

I contacted the female, and she verbally identified herself as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] had blood spatters on the front of her shirt, so I asked her if she was injured. She said no, that the blood was from Scott. Scott punched a picture frame inside the house and cut his hand. Scott was flinging his hand around and yelling, causing blood to fly all around. I asked [REDACTED] what happened and she told me the following: Scott stopped off at a friend's house after work today to have a beer. At about 2000 hours, [REDACTED] called Scott and asked him to come home with the food he had picked up. Scott came home and was angry because she told him to come home. They sat down to eat, and in the middle of eating, Scott kinda lost it and got crazy. He left in his truck and then came back and wanted to take the motor home. She told him not to take the motor home and he became violent. [REDACTED] told him she was going to call the police. Scott then broke a window, and one of their daughters called the police. Scott told her, "If they come, I'll kill them, or they'll have to kill me". [REDACTED] told him she was not going to call, and she didn't call. Scott was acting completely irrationally. She heard Scott and the officers exchanging words. She looked out her bedroom window and could see them. The officers told Scott to put the knife down, but he wouldn't put it down. [REDACTED] screamed at him to put the knife down, but he wouldn't and the officers shot him.

I waited with [REDACTED] and her daughters until Major Crimes detectives arrived to take their statements. At approximately 2210 hours, Detective Evans and I entered the residence to remove [REDACTED] for [REDACTED] daughters. At approximately 0200 hours, I relieved Deputy Preciado and secured the residence until the residence could be searched by the Major Crimes detectives.

I tape-recorded [REDACTED] statements, and booked the tape as evidence at the Ojai Substation.



Once we stepped inside, I could see droplets of blood on the kitchen floor. I immediately told Aguirre what I noticed so we could do our best not to disturb the crime scene. Once we visually cleared the kitchen, we then proceeded into the living room area. Here too I could see droplets of blood and I also noticed some broken glass behind the front door.

As I looked at the wall facing the front door, there was a picture with broken glass and some blood under the picture on the wall. As we cleared our way to the first bedroom nearest the kitchen, the two young females opened the door. I asked them if they were ok. Once both of them told me they were ok, I asked if anyone else was inside the house. They told me, "No."

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Narrative:

On 7-26-05 at approximately 2123 hours, while working uniformed patrol as 3S21 in a marked 4X4 patrol vehicle (#4027) in the Ojai Valley, I heard (3A21) Deputy Victor Medina (#3580), who had responded along with (3A23) Deputy Dave Sparks (#2409) to a report of domestic violence at [REDACTED] advise that shots had been fired at his location. Upon hearing this, all of the available patrol units in the Ojai Valley responded to the location Code-3 (emergency lights and sirens).

I was also responding Code-3 from the Ojai Police Station along with off-duty Deputy Joseph Preciado (#2899) who had been in the process of leaving the station at the completion of his scheduled shift, when the call went out.

We arrived on scene at 2132 hours, and I immediately responded to the shooting location, and contacted Deputies Medina and Sparks. The subject, later identified as Scott Osler, was laying on his back in the driveway approximately 10-15 feet from where I was standing with Deputies Medina and Sparks. Ventura County Fire Department personnel and LifeLine Ambulance personnel were administering first aid to Osler. I initially asked the deputies if they were all right, and they stated that they were. I then asked them what had happened, and they replied that the subject, Scott Osler, came at them armed with a knife, refused numerous orders to drop the weapon, causing the deputies to fire their weapons at him. I asked how many rounds were fired and they stated that three rounds were fired; two by Deputy Medina, and one by Deputy Sparks, who then experienced a weapon malfunction after the first round fired.

I quickly looked around the immediate scene, and saw a knife with a wood handle laying in the driveway, and Deputies Sparks and Medina pointed out the empty shell casings laying to the right of where we were standing. Deputies Sparks and Medina were standing over the knife in an effort to protect the evidence while Osler was being treated by medical personnel, before being removed from the crime scene.

I asked if everyone was out of the house, and they stated that they believed that the two female juveniles were still in the residence. By this time, (3S14) Sgt. James Aguirre (#1452), who had responded from the Headquarters Station and had arrived on scene, went with Deputy Preciado towards the residence to secure it. I instructed (3A22) Deputy Allen Jalaty (#2819) who was parked at the top of the driveway, and was taping off the driveway as a crime scene, to start a crime scene log and record anyone who goes in or out of the crime scene.

Narrative:

By this time, Ventura County Fire Department personnel and LifeLine Ambulance personnel were preparing Osler to be loaded onto a gurney and eventually transported by ambulance to Ventura County Medical Center (VCMC). Due to the limited number of personnel at the scene, I instructed (3D23) Deputy Luis Vazquez (#2877), who was just arriving on the scene, to follow the ambulance to the hospital as security.

I then moved into the residence and helped Sgt. Aguirre and Deputy Preciado locate the female juveniles and assist them in exiting the residence. I also assisted in getting the 3 pet dogs out of the residence. (1A21) Deputy Tom Triplett (#3232) who had arrived prior to me, was standing outside the residence with the wife of Osler and eventually her two daughters as well. Upon clearing the residence, and after Osler had left the scene in the ambulance, we escorted Osler's wife and daughters to the top of the driveway and outside of the crime scene. They were greeted by Ventura County Sheriff's Department Chaplain [REDACTED] who had also responded at the request of family members, and kept them company throughout the next few hours. I instructed Deputy Preciado to station himself outside of the open door to the residence where we had entered/exited. He was there to secure the residence until relieved by other uniformed personnel or Major Crimes detectives.

By this time, after speaking to Captain Boyd on the cell phone, and confirming that Major Crimes Detectives, Bureau of Identification personnel, as well as all of the proper notifications had been made, additional investigative personnel started arriving. Commander Mark Ball (#1383) arrived around 2156 hours, and assumed the responsibility as the Officer In Charge.

At this point, I had (1B21) Deputy Steve Sulkowski (#3166) transport Deputy Medina, and Sgt. Aguirre transport Deputy Sparks to the Ojai Police Station, per our Department Policy concerning Officer Involved Shooting protocol, to await investigators and representatives.

I was on scene throughout the night as the uniformed personnel supervisor until approximately 0530 hours, when I was released from the scene.

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Narrative:

On July 26, 2005 I was assigned as the Sheriff's Headquarters Patrol Sergeant on Shift two (1730 Hrs. - 0530 Hrs.) and I was driving a marked black and white patrol unit. At approximately 2125 hrs I had just finished a traffic stop on Southbound Hwy 101 just North of Hwy 33. As I entered my unit the cellular telephone was ringing. I answered it and the call was from Capt. Boyd.

Capt. Boyd told me there had been a shooting at [REDACTED] and asked me to respond and to take one of the deputies assigned to me. I told him I would take Deputy Luis Vazquez #2877, since he was the closest Headquarters unit.

I responded to the call code three, emergency lights and siren. As I was on my way to the call I attempted to contact Deputy Vazquez by radio. I heard him asking if he should respond code three to the shooting and I told him to respond code three.

My route to the scene was by way of Southbound 101 to Northbound 33 to [REDACTED]. I radioed to the units on scene asking where they needed me. At about the same time a marked black and white Sheriff's expedition turned right [REDACTED]. A deputy in the expedition told me by radio to follow them.

I followed the expedition [REDACTED]. It was now approximately 2130 Hrs. I was aware that the Ojai units were dispatched to a domestic disturbance on [REDACTED] and shots had been fired. Knowing only this information I retrieved my AR 15 rifle from the trunk of my unit.

As I walked to the scene at [REDACTED] I saw that the Fire Department and ambulance were on scene. There were several deputies on scene that I did not know. I recognized Sgt. Pat Ruby who is a Ojai patrol sergeant, Deputy Joe Preciado who was in plain clothes, and Deputy David Sparks.

I heard Deputy Sparks explaining to one of the deputies that he fired one shot and his weapon malfunctioned. He stated he cleared the malfunction and pointed to the unfired bullet that was on the ground in front of him.

Fire and ambulance personnel were working on a subject that Deputy Sparks and another deputy had shot, (later discovered to be Deputy Victor Medina) On the ground within a few feet of the subject who had been shot was a wooden handled kitchen

ON 07/28/2005, I WENT TO BOTH THE HILL TOP AND HUT BARS. I SPOKE TO MANAGERS AND BARTENDERS AT BOTH BARS. OSLER WAS KNOWN TO BOTH BARS BUT HAD NOT BEEN SEEN IN EITHER ONE FOR THE LAST THREE MONTHS. BOTH MANAGERS HAD TALKED WITH THEIR EMPLOYEES WORKING ON THE NIGHT OF THE SHOOTING. BOTH MANAGERS SAID OSLER HAD NOT BEEN IN THE BARS FOR THE PAST FEW MONTHS. 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

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

ON 08/04/2005, I MET WITH [REDACTED] IN THE CREW'S QUARTERS FOR LIFE LINE AMBULANCE. LIFE LINE AMBULANCE PROVIDES SERVICE TO THE OJAI VALLEY. [REDACTED] IS ONE OF TWO PEOPLE WHO PROVIDED MEDICAL ATTENTION TO SCOTT OSLER.

ON 07/26/2005, CHUCK WAS WORKING RIG # 501 FOR LIFE LINE AMBULANCE WITH HIS PARTNER SAM SZCZEEANEK. THEY WERE DISPATCHED TO AN ASSAULT CALL AT [REDACTED] AFTER BEING DISPATCHED, THEY WERE TOLD TO STAGE IN THE AREA. WHEN THEY ARRIVED, THEY STAGED BEHIND RESCUE ENGINE 23 ON [REDACTED]

ONCE ON SCENE, THEY COULD SEE THE CAPTAIN OF STATION 23 TALKING WITH ONE OF THE DEPUTIES. THE CAPTAIN APPROACHED THEM AND SAID, "THEY JUST HAD TO SHOOT SOME BODY, SO GET ALL YOUR GEAR". THE CAPTAIN ALSO TOLD THEM TO BE CAREFUL WHERE THEY WALKED BECAUSE THIS WAS NOW A CRIME SCENE.

[REDACTED] SAID OSLER USED THE EXACT WORDS "SUICIDE BY COP". [REDACTED] SAID OSLER MADE ANOTHER STATEMENT SIMILAR TO "I GAVE THEM NO CHOICE". [REDACTED] WAS NOT SURE OF THE EXACT WORDS USED BY OSLER FOR THAT STATEMENT. [REDACTED] WAS HOLDING OSLER'S HEAD WHEN HE MADE THE STATEMENTS.

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██████████ AND HIS PARTNER BEGAN TO TREAT OSLER'S INJURIES AND PREPARE HIM FOR TRANSPORTATION. WHEN ██████████ APPLIED THE NECK BRACE, OSLER BECAME COMBATIVE AND REMOVED THE BRACE. THIS CAUSED ██████████ TO HOLD OSLER'S HEAD IN ORDER TO STABILIZE THE NECK. ██████████ SAID OSLER'S CONDITION BEGAN TO DETERIORATE VERY QUICKLY. OSLER THEN BEGAN TO GO IN AND OUT OF CONSCIOUSNESS. OSLER WENT UNCONSCIOUS AT LEAST ONCE AT THE SCENE. ██████████ SAID OSLER HAD TWO SUCKING CHEST WOUNDS AND HIS CONDITION WAS GETTING WORSE.

THEY WERE SECURING THE SCENE AND WE WERE SECURING THE PATIENT".

██████████ SAID A DEPUTY FOLLOWED THE AMBULANCE ALL THE WAY TO THE HOSPITAL. ██████████ SAID HE DROVE THE AMBULANCE TO THE HOSPITAL. ONCE AT THE HOSPITAL HE COULD SEE OSLER WAS PALE WHITE AND HIS CONDITION HAD DETERIORATED EVEN MORE. AT THE HOSPITAL, OSLER WAS TAKEN DIRECTLY TO THE O.R.

I ASKED ██████████ IF HE REMEMBERED OSLER TALKING ABOUT HIS CHILDREN. ██████████ SAID OSLER TALKED ABOUT HIS CHILDREN WHILE IN THE AMBULANCE. ██████████ ALSO REMEMBERED A FEMALE RUNNING UP TO THE AMBULANCE AS THEY WERE LEAVING FOR THE HOSPITAL. THE FEMALE RAN UP TO THE SIDE DOOR AND YELLED AT OSLER. SHE SAID SOMETHING LIKE "IF YOU DID ANYTHING TO MY SISTER I'LL KILL YOU MOTHER FUCKER". ██████████ DESCRIBED THE FEMALE AS BEING IN HER MID THIRTIES. On July 26, 2005, at approximately 2200 hours Captain Kelley called me at home and asked me to respond to [REDACTED] in the unincorporated area of Ojai to assist with an officer involved shooting investigation. When I arrived on scene, I was briefed on the circumstances of the shooting by Detective Evans and Detective Montagna. Detective Evans asked me to contact the residents at [REDACTED] to see if anyone at that location saw or heard anything. This interview took place at 2330 hours.

As I knocked at the front door, a female who was later identified as [REDACTED] answered the door. I asked [REDACTED] if I could come in to talk to her about what took place next door. [REDACTED] invited me inside the residence. Once inside the residence the rest of the family, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] came to the living room and joined us. During my initial contact and interview, all three family members were present. I then separated the family members and interviewed them one at a time.

My third interview was with [REDACTED] (daughter). I will refer to the family members by first names to avoid confusion. This interview was fragmented and at times, I asked clarifying

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questions. For ease of reading, this report is organized in a semi-chronological order. The following is a synopsis of our digitally recorded conversation.

██████ told me that this evening between 2100 hours and 2130 hours she was in the guest bedroom, which is located on the second floor at the south side of the residence. This bedroom has two windows. One window faces east and the other faces west and overlooks the front yard and a portion of the driveway to the Osler's residence. She said that she was in the bedroom with her baby son and her boyfriend, ██████ ██████ had left for the evening prior to my arrival at the residence. ██████ said she does not live on ██████ but was visiting for the night. She lives with her boyfriend, ██████ in Oxnard. I was able to obtain ██████ work information from ██████

██████ said that since she had her baby in her hands she stayed away from the window but ██████ went to the west window and was watching the events unfold. She said that she heard yelling and banging sounds. It sounded like someone was banging on a window. She then corrected her self and said that she did go and look out the west window and saw Scott on his porch. She said she heard him yelling, "I'm going to break the fucking window." She then told ██████ "They're about to fight out there." She said that she walked out of the room and was trying to set-up a laptop computer for ██████ in another room. She said that she did not hear anything for a while and thought that they were done fighting.

She said a while later, she saw a police car drive up. She said that she saw that from the front window (east). I asked her how did she know it was a police car outside. She said that she saw the lights and made a circular motion with one hand, which lead me to believe that she meant overhead lights of a unit. She said that it seemed that the deputies were having a hard time finding the house and parked on the north end of the street. She said that she saw the deputies walking up to the residence. She told ██████ that the police are here. She said that she saw the deputies walking toward the Osler's home. She saw this through the front window as the deputies were approaching the driveway of ██████ She then heard a commotion. She

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said she was not sure what the deputies were saying at first but then she heard yelling. She said she heard Scott say, "Go ahead and shoot me, go ahead and shoot me." She said she heard Scott say this several times. She could hear the police saying step back or get back but Scott continued to say, "Shoot me, shoot me." She said that she heard three shots. She then heard screaming but was not sure who was screaming. Her mother, [REDACTED] came into the bedroom and told them to get down. [REDACTED] said that she heard gunshots.

She said after the gunshot, she stayed in the room. She said much later on she and [REDACTED] went outside and spoke to [REDACTED] and her children. They asked if [REDACTED] and the children wanted to come into their home. She said that this was an hour after the incident and they did not discuss the incident.

I asked her if she saw or heard anything outside after the gunshots. She said that there was a lot of commotion but she was not listening to what exactly was being said.

I asked her about her conversation with [REDACTED] as this event was unfolding. She said that [REDACTED] told her that he saw Scott and Scott had his arms extended out about shoulder height. Scott was telling the officer to shoot him. She said that [REDACTED] said that Scott was walking towards the officers as he was saying this and the officers were walking backwards and telling Scott to back off. She said [REDACTED] could not see everything because it's hard to see through the west window. She said [REDACTED] told her that he did not see Scott being shot. She said that [REDACTED] saw Scott walking towards the officer and the officers walking backwards and that's why they were sure the officers shot Scott. She said that [REDACTED] told her that he heard Scott tell the officers that he had a knife and to shoot him.

I asked her if she knew the Olser family. She said that she grew up at the [REDACTED] address but did not really know the Olser family. I asked her if she knew of any domestic violence involving the family. She said that the only problem she knows of was the incident that [REDACTED] told me about where Scott walked into their home for no apparent reason.

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She said that she could hear Scott repeatedly tell the deputies, or she assumed the deputies, to shoot him. She said that she could hear the deputies tell Scott "to back off."

I went to the upstairs south bedroom and looked out of the west window. It was virtually impossible to see the driveway where this incident took place due to large trees that are on the property line that separates the [REDACTED] residence from the Osler's driveway. I could see portions of the front yard and porch area of the Osler's residence.



On July 27, 2005, at approximately 1330 hours, I interviewed [REDACTED] reference an officer involved shooting investigation. This incident took place at [REDACTED] in the unincorporated area of Ojai. [REDACTED] was visiting with his girlfriend, [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] and was present when this incident took place. I interviewed [REDACTED] at his place of business at [REDACTED]

This interview was fragmented and at times, I asked clarifying questions. For ease of reading, this report is organized in a semi-chronological order. The following is a synopsis of our digitally recorded conversation.

[REDACTED] told me that he was in the south bedroom with [REDACTED] when he heard a lot of shouting going on between Scott and his wife. He said that [REDACTED] bedroom is on the second floor and he could see what was going on at the Osler's. He heard stuff being thrown and it sounded like things were being thrown out of a window. He could hear Scott say, "Let me in, let me in." He said it stopped for a minute. He said he then heard it again and at that time, he and

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█████ saw deputies arriving at the residence. He said it seemed like the deputies had a hard time finding the residence so they parked their cars and approached on foot.

He said that he could see the deputies approaching with their flashlights and Scott yelling at them. ██████ said that he could see Scott and Scott was saying, "What, what" to the deputies. As ██████ said this he had his arms extended out to the sides, shoulder height. ██████ said that Scott was yelling that he had a knife and said something to the effect, "go ahead and shoot me, kill me." He said that he heard the officers say something similar to, "put it down, or stop." He said that he watched as Scott walked toward the officers with the knife. He said that Scott continued to approach the officer and was not "holding back at all." He said that he then heard three shots fired. He said after the shots were fired, paramedics arrived and other deputies arrived.

I asked him if he went outside after the altercation. He said that he did not go outside. ██████ said that he did not know Scott prior to this incident. He said that he learned that this was Scott that night from the ██████ family. He said that the ██████ have mentioned Scott before this incident and all of the problems that he causes around the neighborhood but this was the first time he saw Scott.

I asked ██████ when he first heard the commotion did he go immediately to the west window. ██████ said, "Yes I did." I asked him, when he looked out the window, what did he see. He said that he could not really see what Scott was doing because there were trees and a fence in the way. He said that he heard a lot of the commotion and Scott saying, "Let me in, let me in." He also heard what sounded like things being thrown outside the house but he could not see who was throwing the items. He said he could hear things like glass being thrown. He could see Scott pacing back and forth by his front door and he appeared upset. ██████ said he assumed Scott was upset because his wife would not let him in the house.

I asked ██████ if he could actually see anything in Scott's hands as he paced back and forth in front of his house. ██████ said that he could not see anything in Scott's hands but the reason he

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said that Scott had a knife was because he heard Scott say he had a knife. He said where Scott was standing and the light shining, he could only see Scott's hands up in the air. Again, as [REDACTED] said this, [REDACTED] had his arms extended to the sides about shoulder height. He said that Scott said he had a knife and for deputies to kill him. He also repeated that the deputies told Scott to stop and not to come any closer. He said that Scott continued to approach the officers as they told him to stop and put down the weapon. [REDACTED] said that Scott never stopped; he just continued to approach the officers. He said that as Scott got closer to the deputies, and prior to the shots being fired, [REDACTED] lost sight of Scott in the driveway due to the tall trees on the property. [REDACTED] said that he could not see how close Scott got to the deputies or where his hands might have been.

He said that he saw the officers making their initial approach in the driveway and Scott seeing them and getting very angry. As Scott saw the deputies, he started yelling at them and approaching them. He said that he lost sight of everyone as they got into the driveway. He said that he never saw the officers retreating as Scott approached them because of the trees on the property that separates the [REDACTED] Property from the Osler's property.

[REDACTED] said that he felt that the deputies were doing their job and that concluded the interview.



WITNESS INTERVIEW



On July 26, 2005, at approximately 2200 hours Captain Kelley called me at home and asked me to respond to 46 Watkins Way in the unincorporated area of Ojai to assist with an officer involved shooting investigation. When I arrived on scene, I was briefed on the circumstances of the shooting by Detective Evans and Detective Montagna. Detective Evans asked me to contact the resident at [REDACTED] to see if anyone at that location saw or heard anything.

The residence at [REDACTED] is directly in front (east) of [REDACTED]. The driveway to [REDACTED] is south of [REDACTED] and goes in a westerly direction to the residence. [REDACTED] is a two-story residence. [REDACTED] is a private road that is east of [REDACTED]. This interview took place at 2330 hours.

As I knocked at the front door, a female later identified as [REDACTED] answered the door. I asked [REDACTED] if I could come in to talk to her about what took place next door. [REDACTED] invited me inside her home. Once inside the residence the rest of the family, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], came to the living room and joined us. During my initial contact and interview, all three family members were present. I then separated the family members and interviewed them one at a time. They

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initially told me that they have lived at their residence for approximately twenty-one years and their neighbors, the Osler's, have lived next door for eighteen years.

My first interview was with [REDACTED] (father). I will refer to the family members by first names to avoid confusion. This interview was fragmented and at times, I asked clarifying questions. For ease of reading, this report is organized in a semi-chronological order. The following is a synopsis of our digitally recorded conversation.

[REDACTED] told me that this evening around 2100 hours he was in his bedroom, which is located on the second floor at the extreme north end of the residence when he heard a commotion. He said that he heard Scott pounding on the front window of his home (Scott's) and cursing, saying "open the door, open the door." He said that things then got quiet. He then heard Scott and [REDACTED] arguing. He heard someone kicking something that sounded like an ice chest and the sounds of doors slamming. He assumed that it was Scott but he did not actually look outside to see Scott doing this. He said that he did not hear [REDACTED] responding to Scott. He said that the next thing he heard was arguing but he did not realize it was Scott arguing with deputies. He said the sounds were too muffled to make out what was being said. He then heard three gunshots.

He said that he did not leave his bedroom until he heard the gunshots. He said that he went outside in his back yard and stood at his patio porch. His back patio porch faces Osler's driveway and front yard. He said that he heard Scott say something to the effect, "No, no, it was not the policeman's fault, it was all me." I asked [REDACTED] who was Scott saying this to. [REDACTED] said that Scott was yelling at the paramedics and police officers. He said that Scott said, "It's all me, it's all me" and said Scott said something like, it was a suicide attempt or a murder suicide.

I asked [REDACTED] if Scott said anything else. He said that Scott was saying "I think I'm dying, I think I'm dying" and that he said that he loved his children. He said that Scott was yelling out to his daughters that he loved them. He said that Scott was not belligerent at that point but rather calm.

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He said that he saw Scott's wife and heard her screaming prior to the shooting but after the shooting, he saw her on her front porch crying.

I asked [REDACTED] if he heard deputies speaking to anyone after the shooting. He said that Scott told one of the deputies, "Yeah, you shot me, you shot me." The deputy replied, "Well you came at us. " "You initiated it." I asked him if he knew who the deputy was that had this conversation with Scott. [REDACTED] said that he could not see any faces because of the thick bushes that separate his yard from Scott's driveway.

I asked [REDACTED] about the Osler's family history and if he was aware of any prior domestic violence between Scott and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] told me he was not aware of their family history. He told me the neighbors at [REDACTED] are good friends with Scott. He said the rest of the neighbors stay away from Scott. He said Scott does not directly cause trouble but he [REDACTED] and most of the neighbors would rather keep away from Scott and not associate with him. I asked [REDACTED] why would he say that. He said Scott does whatever he wants to do and his actions are minor. He gave me an example of a public easement on [REDACTED] and how most of the neighbors try to stay off the easement. He said Scott parks his recreational vehicle on the easement in front of his home for three to four weeks at a time. He said this causes the neighbors to call [REDACTED] and complain about the RV and he always has to go to tell Scott to move the RV. Scott has had a dispute with the female neighbors at [REDACTED] but [REDACTED] did not elaborate on the dispute.

[REDACTED] went on to say that this is the first time he saw Scott arguing with [REDACTED] in that manner. He said that he does not hear much arguing going on between Scott and [REDACTED]. He said that this was an unusual event for Scott and [REDACTED]. He said that he was surprised that this does not occur more often because Scott and [REDACTED] have strong personalities. [REDACTED] said that Scott and [REDACTED] have two young daughters and they appear to be well adjusted.

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I asked [REDACTED] if he is aware if Scott has a drinking problem. He said no, not that he is aware off. He said that he sees [REDACTED] going to work in the morning and taking the children to school just like everyone else.

I asked [REDACTED] if he knew if Scott was employed. [REDACTED] said that when they first moved in Scott was working but he was not sure if Scott is currently employed. He thought that Scott might be off work because of a disability.

I asked [REDACTED] if Scott has a bad temper. He said that he and Scott almost got into it one time but that was eight years ago. He said this was over a misunderstanding where Scott walked into [REDACTED] home uninvited. At the time, only [REDACTED] son and daughters were home. Scott saw [REDACTED] son looking out of the window and [REDACTED] son waved hi at Scott. Scott thought that he was being invited in the home and just let himself inside [REDACTED] home. He said that his son talked Scott into going back outside. [REDACTED] said that when he heard about this he got very upset at Scott. [REDACTED] went and confronted Scott and told him not to ever go into his home again. He said that they both got into each other's face but that was the extent of the confrontation. He said they have been cordial with each ever since. [REDACTED] said that no one else in his family has had a problem with Scott.

I asked [REDACTED] tell me what he knew about [REDACTED]. He said that she is a fighter and then corrected himself and said that she is hard to get along with. He said that she seems to handle the family business. If there is an issue with a neighbor, she addresses it. [REDACTED] said that he stays away from her too because he does not agree with the way she has handled some issues. I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] had a drinking issue and he said not that he was aware of. He said Scott drinks beers now and then but not in excess.

[REDACTED] said that ten years ago he did not trust Scott because he assumed that Scott was on drugs. I asked [REDACTED] what made him assume that Scott was on drugs. [REDACTED] said that at the time, he worked for a company at a commercial area but individuals were allowed to live in the businesses. He said that a friend of his knew one of the individuals living in one of the buildings

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and this individual was rumored to be a drug dealer. [REDACTED] said that he saw Scott visiting with this individual and that made him suspicious of Scott. He said that he cautioned his son about Scott. He said other than that one incident he has not seen anything else that would lead him to believe that Scott was using drugs.



WITNESS INTERVIEW



On July 26, 2005, at approximately 2200 hours Captain Kelley called me at home and asked me to respond to 46 Watkins Way in the unincorporated area of Ojai to assist with an officer involved shooting investigation. When I arrived on scene, I was briefed on the circumstances of the shooting by Detective Evans and Detective Montagna. Detective Evans asked me to contact the resident at [REDACTED] to see if anyone at that location saw or heard anything. This interview took place at 2330 hours.

As I knocked at the front door a female who was later identified as [REDACTED] answered the door. I asked if I could come in to talk to her about what took place next door. [REDACTED] invited me inside her home. Once inside the residence the rest of the family, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] came to the living room and joined us. During my initial contact and interview, all three family members were present. I then separated the family members and interviewed them one at a time.

My second interview was with [REDACTED]. I will refer to the family members by first names to avoid confusion. This interview was fragmented and at times and I asked clarifying

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questions. For ease of reading, this report is organized in a semi-chronological order. The following is a synopsis of our digitally recorded conversation.

██████ told me that this evening between 1930 and 2000 hours she heard her neighbor, Scott, arrive home on his motorcycle. At that time, she did not hear any commotion. Later in the evening around 2100 hours, while sitting in her bedroom, she heard scuffling noises, arguing, and screaming. Her bedroom is located in the middle of the second floor and faces east away from the Osler's home. The Osler's home is located directly behind the ██████ home.

I asked her when she first heard the commotion, could she hear what was being said. She said, "Not the exact words." She just heard yelling and screaming. She said it sounded like men forcefully saying something but she could not make out what was being said. She said she could hear arguing and screaming in the background.

She said that her daughter, ██████ called her to her bedroom. When she got to the south bedroom, she could hear someone saying "get back, get back." She said that her daughter, ██████ was in the bedroom with her ██████ boyfriend, ██████ She said that she started looking out the window that faces the Osler home but then ██████ said they have guns and they are going to shoot him. She said that she felt panicked and backed away. She then heard three gunshots and screaming. She said that she distinctly remembers someone saying, "get back, get back," and hearing three gunshots. She told ██████ to get away from the bedroom window. She said unlike her daughter, she could not recall hearing Scott saying, "Shoot me."

██████ said she did not know who was outside and did not know that deputies were on scene. She thought it was gang members or "druggies" outside. She said she was not sure what to think and that's why she told her daughter to get down. She said that she was afraid that these people (shooters) might come into their home and shoot them. She kept telling ██████ to get away from the window, not knowing that deputies were on scene. She said ██████ could not understand why she was telling him to get away from the window since he knew that deputies

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were on scene. He told her that deputies were outside and she said that at that point she was not as scared.

I asked her if she went outside after the shooting occurred. She indicated that they were looking out both windows (east and west windows) to see if they can see anything. She said they were going from window to window to see what was going on. They saw additional deputies and fire personnel arriving on scene. She said that she went downstairs to look out of the kitchen window but could not see anything. She then went outside and joined her husband at the back patio.

I asked her if she heard anything while standing outside with her husband, [REDACTED]. She said that she heard little girls crying and people talking but she could not make out what was being said. She saw Scott as he was being loaded in the ambulance and heard him yell out his daughter's names and tell them that he loved them. She said Scott was also yelling at the deputies but she could not hear what was being said. She said that she was not out on the patio as long as [REDACTED] and did not hear much more than what she told me.

I asked her about the Osler's family history. She said that they don't associate with the Osler family very much. She said that the Osler family is not very cooperative, as far as, neighbors go. She said Scott is always parking his RV on the street (easements) in front of [REDACTED] home and this has offended many neighbors. She said they don't like it either but they tolerate it. She said that the neighbors would call them [REDACTED] and complain about the RV. She said that this has caused a big problem between Scott and a neighbor by the name of [REDACTED] at [REDACTED]. She said that a number of neighbors have complained about the RV issue. She said they have had a number of conversations With Scott about the RV but he continues to ignore their request and parks the RV on the street. She said Scott is an uncaring person and unwilling to cooperate with the neighbors.

I asked if she has ever witnessed any other incidents between Scott and his wife. [REDACTED] said she has heard them argue in the past but not this bad. She was not aware of any past domestic

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violence. I asked her if she was aware of any drinking issue with the Oslers. She said she does not know what Scott does on his own time. She said Scott is very callous and has a very uncaring personality. She said she has never seen him acting drunk. She said that he seems to have very nice children and a hard working wife.

[REDACTED] told me that [REDACTED] left her a voice mail on her cell phone this evening. She returned the phone call tonight at 2100 hours and as she spoke to her, she heard [REDACTED] yell,

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"Scott, Scott." [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] what's wrong. [REDACTED] said that she had a fight with Scott and that he was now in the driveway. [REDACTED] said that she did not know what Scott was doing and that something was wrong. [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] if she wanted her to come over and [REDACTED] declined the offer and told [REDACTED] she would call her back and ended the phone call.

She said about 2115 hours, she received a phone call from her niece ([REDACTED] daughter), [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was crying hysterically and asking [REDACTED] to come over because her mother and father were fighting and she was scared. [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] if they were fighting or just yelling but she could not hear [REDACTED] so she hung-up and started driving to [REDACTED] house. As she was driving to [REDACTED] house, she called [REDACTED] and spoke to her other niece, [REDACTED]. She was also hysterical. [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] what's wrong. [REDACTED] said that there was blood and glass all over the hallway. [REDACTED] said that she could not see her mother. [REDACTED] said that she thought that her father was going to hurt her mother and wanted [REDACTED] to come over right away. [REDACTED] tried to calm [REDACTED] down and asked her to put [REDACTED] on the phone. [REDACTED] asked about [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] told her that [REDACTED] was hiding in another room. She tried to keep [REDACTED] on the phone but somehow got disconnected.

[REDACTED] called again and [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] answered the phone. She said that [REDACTED] has several phones in the house and they were both on different phone lines. She heard [REDACTED] say, "Scott, Scott," in a very quiet and calm voice. [REDACTED] could hear Scott calling [REDACTED] "fucking bitch, fucking cunt." He was using horrific language with [REDACTED]. She said that she once again got disconnected.

[REDACTED] called again and spoke to [REDACTED] and she was still hysterical. She was disconnected again. She arrived at the scene soon after this call and saw that the ambulance was on scene and working on someone. She asked the ambulance crew if they were working on a male or female because she was worried about [REDACTED] and the girls since [REDACTED] saw blood.

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She said that as they were loading Scott in the ambulance, she told him that if he hurt [REDACTED] or the girls, she was going to hunt him down and kill him. I asked her if Scott responded to her comment. She said that Scott had his hand over his oxygen mask and did not respond.

I asked [REDACTED], what's the relationship like between Scott and [REDACTED] She said that 99% of the time Scott is laid back and nothing bothers him. She said Scott is very sweet and likeable. However, she said when he gets "pissed" he gets stupid. She said she has only seen him get angry twice, once at her and she thought to herself that he was a "loon." The second time was with her sister but it was not this bad.

She said that about four to five years ago, Scott and [REDACTED] got into a fight and he threw an ice chest at her and made threats. The police were called for that incident and he might have served some jail time for it. She said that he was doing drugs at the time. I asked her why she thought he was doing drugs. She said because [REDACTED] made him go to some type of counseling for addiction but she did not know the specifics.

On July 26, 2005, Sergeant Moussa (1881) phoned me and asked that I respond to an officer involved shooting investigation in Oak View. I arrived and Detective Evans directed me to interview [REDACTED], the daughter of the suspect, Scott Osler.

We spoke in my detective vehicle, which was parked, on the roadway. The interview was lengthy, fragmented and I asked clarifying questions. For ease of reading, this report will be organized in a chronological order. [REDACTED] was articulate and appeared to be emotionally mature for her age. [REDACTED] is a thirteen years old and lives at [REDACTED] with her mother, [REDACTED], sister, [REDACTED], and her dad, Scott Osler. Before we began to speak about the incident, I told [REDACTED] that if she did not remember something or was not sure about something to tell me. The following is a synopsis of our tape-recorded conversation.

We began to talk about the events before the shooting. [REDACTED] said Scott left the house around 4:30 am. [REDACTED] told me that during the day she went to a dive camp in Thousand Oaks with [REDACTED]

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Sometime in the evening, ██████ phoned Scott to see if he was going to bring them burritos. ██████ thought Scott was at a friend's home and ██████ said something like he (Scott) should be home. Around 7:59 pm, Scott returned home and ██████ could tell he was "drunk." ██████ said she could tell when Scott was drunk because he talks more freely.

██████ Scott, ██████ and ██████ sat down to eat. During this time, Scott commented that he worked thirteen hours and asked ██████ how long she worked. ██████ said Scott made the comment that ██████ does not appreciate him. ██████ said Scott began to ask her and ██████ questions and ██████ felt Scott was trying to involve them in the argument. ██████ and Scott began to argue and she and ██████ went to their rooms. ██████ indicated she and ██████ often go to their rooms when Scott and ██████ argue. ██████ said Scott and ██████ argued and Scott left the residence for about twenty minutes.

Scott returned home and began to pound on the outside of the large living room front windows. ██████ indicated Scott was pounding on the windows "really hard." ██████ said she briefly looked out from her room and saw Scott banging on the window. ██████ did not see Scott again after she saw him banging on the window.

During this time, ██████ thought ██████ told Scott he had to leave and Scott was trying to take the motor home. ██████ remembered Scott was yelling, screaming, and wanted to take the motor home. ██████ was not sure if ██████ said she was going to phone the police or that she would not give Scott the keys to the motor home, but she heard Scott say he was going to "beat the shit out of her ██████." ██████ remembered that ██████ said something to the effect that if Scott just left, she would not phone the police. ██████ then heard Scott say something to ██████ like if she phoned the police he would "go after them." ██████ clarified that she said the argument moved from locations around the house and there were times when she could not hear Scott and ██████ arguing.

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██████████ and Scott continued to argue. ██████████ looked out of her room and saw "blood everywhere." ██████████ said the blood was on a door and "all over." ██████████ indicated she only heard the glass break and the glass was in a hallway.

During the incident, ██████████ phoned her aunt, ██████████ to tell her that ██████████ and Scott were arguing. While speaking with ██████████ Scott picked up the phone and hung up the phone. ██████████ thought Scott picked up the phone in the kitchen area. ██████████ reconnected a phone in her room and phoned ██████████ again. ██████████ told ██████████ that Scott was yelling and broke glass.

██████████ said she did not hear ██████████ and Scott and phoned the police because she was "really freaked out" because she had not heard any additional arguing. ██████████ stayed on the phone with 911, then heard sirens and three gunshots. ██████████ said she was not sure where ██████████ and Scott were when she heard the three gunshots and did not remember hearing any arguing or screaming before the gunshots. ██████████ did not see Scott interacting with deputies and emphasized she did not see the incident.

██████████ said ██████████ and Scott have had arguments in the past but has never seen Scott become physically violent with ██████████ ██████████ said Scott drinks and clarified that when Scott was drunk he would say things she ██████████ knew Scott did not mean. ██████████ said that her dad might drink twice a month to the point where "it's bad." ██████████ did not know where Scott drank because Scott would deny he was drinking. ██████████ said ██████████ and Scott would argue over trivial things. ██████████ claimed that Scott would usually start the argument and often would tell ██████████ she does not appreciate how much he (Scott) works. ██████████ estimated that Scott and ██████████ argue once a month and indicated she and ██████████ usually go to their rooms. ██████████ said ██████████ does not drink.

██████████ said ██████████ told her that Scott has not been physically violent toward her ██████████ ██████████ said, "Tonight was a lot different." ██████████ could tell Scott was mad and she indicated this argument was more threatening. ██████████ said Scott has never physically

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harmed her and she did not believe Scott has ever harmed [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] told her Scott has become more upset after Scott's father and brother died recently and Scott keeps all of his emotions inside.

[REDACTED] said Scott does not talk to her much and talks more with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] felt Scott did not like the police because of the comments he has made. [REDACTED] has been with Scott when he was pulled over by the police and he (Scott) was respectful, but [REDACTED] felt Scott generally did not like police. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] told her that Scott came into her room and spoke with her during the incident. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] did not tell her what happened and did not tell her [REDACTED] what to tell the police. [REDACTED] estimated the entire incident lasted between two and two and half hours.

AUTOPSY REPORT

Report

On 7-27-05, at approximately 0845 hours, I attended the autopsy of Scott Osler at the Ventura County Medical Examiner's Office. The autopsy was conducted by Dr. J. Frank and assisted by Autopsy Assistant [REDACTED] and was attended by Evidence Technician [REDACTED] and me.

Before the autopsy began, I observed the body bag, which contained Osler's body. I noted that the bag was sealed with tag #53139. The seal was open and Osler's body was placed on the examination table.

I made the following visual observations:

The body was that of a white male with short brownish hair and a mustache and Goatee. The body was nude and brown paper evidence bags covered both hands. The clothing that had been worn by Osler was brought to the autopsy by Evidence Technician [REDACTED]. Dr. Frank examined the clothing prior to conducting the autopsy.



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Exam

Dr. Frank began the examination of the body. Rigor Mortis was present and mildly developed in the extremities. Lividity was present, unfixed and consistent with the position of the body. There were no apparent needle/injection sites on the body other than therapeutic injection sites.

Most noticeable, were two obvious gunshot wounds visible on the right side of the chest just below the nipple and a large freshly sutured surgery site (about 13 inches long), which ran vertically down the abdomen. As the examination continued a cut was located on the knuckles of the left hand. Two scabbed over healing wounds were located on the shins with the right wound appearing more recent and the left wound looking nearly healed. An additional gunshot wound was located on the lower portion of the left buttock and an exit wound was located on the right side of the body at waist level.

The uppermost chest wound was labeled as GSW1, the wound directly below it was labeled GSW2 and the wound on the buttock was labeled GSW3. For the specific location of each wound on the body, refer to the diagram I prepared during the autopsy. Dr. Frank examined each of the gunshot wounds.

GSW1 – Bullet Path – Entered the abdomen in the right upper quadrant. The bullet traveled through the liver, perforated the right kidney and exited through the exit wound described above. The bullet path was right to left, forward to back and at a slight downward angle.

This bullet was likely the one recovered several yards from the body near a wheel barrow which was leaned up against the low fence separating the driveway from the front yard. See photos and scene diagram for further.

GSW2 – Bullet Path – Grazed the chest wall and entered the abdomen below the diaphragm. The bullet perforated the liver and stomach, lacerated the spleen and exited the abdomen through the diaphragm. The bullet then traveled through the left lung and came to rest at the 10th rib. The bullet path was right to left, forward to back and at a slight up angle.

This bullet was recovered inside the body. The bullet measured approximately .43”

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GSW3 – Bullet Path – Enters pelvic area travels up and lodges in the upper hip area. The bullet path was back to front and at an up angle.

This bullet was recovered inside the body. The bullet measured approximately .43”

Photographs of the body and individual injuries and areas of interest were taken. Additionally, gun shot residue (GSR) collection was conducted on each of Osler’s hands. The collection pads and bags used to cover the hands were collected by Evidence Technician [REDACTED]. Dr. Frank continued the autopsy and completed an internal examination of Osler’s body. The rest of the internal examination was unremarkable from an investigative standpoint.




CAUSE OF DEATH: Homicide, shot during confrontation with law enforcement officers.





SUMMARY OF INVESTIGATION

On 7/26/2005, at about 2332 hours, Captain Boyd from the Ventura County Sheriff's Department contacted me. He advised that Scott Osler, age [REDACTED] had expired in the operating room at the Ventura County Medical Center in Ventura. Captain Boyd stated that earlier in the evening, deputies from the Ventura County Sheriff's Department had responded to a domestic disturbance in Oak View. The deputies encountered Mr. Osler, in the driveway of his home. Mr. Osler was holding a knife and refused to comply with the demands from the deputies to drop the weapon. Mr. Osler advanced on the deputies, who continued to order him to drop the weapon. Mr. Osler refused and continued to advance of the deputies, who eventually fired several shots from their service pistols. Captain Boyd stated that the shots had been fired at about 2123 hours. Emergency medical personnel from the LifeLine Ambulance Service and the Ventura County Fire Department responded to the scene. The decedent was transported to the Ventura County Medical Center in Ventura where he was taken to the operating room a short time after arrival. Captain Boyd requested that I respond to the Ventura County Medical Center in Ventura and meet with Detective J. Rivera. I responded at about 2345 hours and arrived at the hospital at about 0010 hours on 7/27/2005.

At the hospital, I went to the operating room to examine the decedent. I was advised by the medical staff that the decedent had been admitted to the Emergency Room at about 2153 hours. The decedent was brought to the operating room at about 2230 hours where an exploratory laparotomy was performed. The decedent was pronounced by Dr. [REDACTED] at about 2322 hours.

After the body was photographed by myself and a Crime Scene Technician from the Sheriff's Crime Laboratory, I examined the decedent. The body was that of a white male adult whose appearance was consistent with the stated age of [REDACTED] years. The body was supine on the operating table. The body was warm to the touch and absent of rigor. Mild blanching lividity was present and consistent with the current position of the body.

Evidence of medical treatment included a nasogastric tube, endotracheal tube, oral suction line in the mouth, EKG monitor pads on the chest and lower back, chest drain tube in the right side of the chest and a Foley catheter. IV lines were present in the right antecubital fossa, right hand, left hand, and left side of the groin. The laparotomy site had been sutured closed by the medical staff.

Visible trauma consisted of two gunshot wounds on the right side of the chest about 3 inches below the nipple, a gunshot wound in the lower right side of the back and a gunshot wound in the left buttock. These injuries will be fully described by the Medical Examiner in the autopsy report.

The body was placed into a blue body bag and seal number 53139 was placed at about 0058 hours on 7/27/2005. The body was transported to the Ventura County Medical Examiner's Office by Cathedral Mortuary Associates pending a review of the case with the Medical Examiner.

I was advised by both the medical staff and Detective Rivera that the decedent's family had not yet been told of the death. Detective Rivera contacted detectives at the scene and learned that the decedent's wife and two daughters were staying with family members in the City of Ventura. We responded to the address that he had been provided.

At about 0135 hours, Detective Rivera, a chaplain from the Ventura County Sheriff's Department and I contacted [REDACTED] and informed her of the death. I explained that an autopsy would be performed later this date.

[REDACTED] stated that her husband had a past history of methamphetamine abuse. She stated that the family had returned home on 7/25/2005 from a 12-day vacation. She stated that the family had a very enjoyable time and that there had been no problems. She stated that the decedent left the house at about 0430 hours on 7/26/2005 to go to his work site. She stated that she spoke to the decedent several times on their cellular telephones during the day and that there had been no problems. [REDACTED] stated that the decedent called her at about 1800 hours and stated that on his way home, he was going to stop at a friend's home and then pickup some burritos to bring home for the family dinner. [REDACTED] stated that she called the decedent at about 2000 hours to see when he would be home with the food. The decedent came home a short time later and was upset with her for calling him while he was at his friend's home. [REDACTED] stated that the decedent became more argumentative and verbally abusive toward her throughout the evening. When the decedent started displaying violent behavior, [REDACTED] and the daughters went into another part of their home and she summoned the Sheriff's department. I explained to her that a full toxicology examination would be performed as part of the autopsy procedure.

On 7/27/2005, I reviewed the case with Janice G. Frank, M.D., Assistant Chief Medical Examiner for the County of Ventura. She advised that an autopsy would be performed. At the conclusion of the

GENERAL DESCRIPTION:

The body is received in a blue vinyl pouch, with a medical examiner's tag attached to the zipper and inscribed with the decedent's name. The pouch is locked with seal #053139. Paper bags are over the hands. No clothing is on the body. A yellow metal stud earring with a clear stone is in the left earlobe.

CLOTHING:

Received in unlabeled brown sheriff's evidence bags, enclosed in larger brown paper bags are the following:

1. Faded blue denim jeans that have been cut up the front of the legs and across the waistband on either side. There is soil on the front of the jeans distributed from the waistband down to the cuffs, and also multiple spots of blood are on the jeans. The left front pocket contains a book of matches. The right front pocket is empty. On the left hip pocket is a frayed defect, which is located approximately 5 ¼" from the top of the waistband and 6" to the left of the midline seam. A moderate quantity of blood is soaked into the fabric around the defect, and numerous ants are present. The defect passes through the pocket and through the seat of the jeans, corresponding in position to a gunshot wound described below. No other defects are observed on the jeans.
2. A bright green fabric safety vest, with reflective orange and silver stripes, has been cut across the front on both sides. There is a large amount of soil on the vest, as well as numerous ants. A round defect in the right front of the vest is located 1" below the bottom of the "V" and approximately 1" to the right of the zipper. The defect measures 0.5 cm. in diameter and there is dark gray deposit on the fabric around the defect, most heavily deposited from the 1 o'clock to the 10 o'clock position. On the right back of the vest, centered approximately 2 ½" above the bottom edge and 9" posterior to the underarm seam; is an irregular frayed defect, with no loss of fabric in the center. The defect measures approximately 1 cm. in length. To the side of the defect is heavy bloodstaining on the lower portion of the vest.
3. A white cotton tee shirt that has been cut up the middle of the front and across the chest and through both sleeves. There is some bloodstaining on the right front of the shirt and a heavy area of bloodstaining on the lower mid-back of the shirt. On the right front are two defects. The upper defect has a slightly frayed appearance and the lower defect is a more clearly punched-out round hole. There is a small amount of bloodstaining around the upper defect and some bloodstaining separate from and below the lower defect. On the lower mid-back of the shirt, near the top of the large bloodstain is an irregular slightly frayed defect.

4. A white long sleeve button-front uniform shirt, with a patch over the right pocket, which reads "Scott". The shirt has been cut up the left side of the placket and across both sides of the chest and down the sleeves. There is a moderate amount of soil on the front of the shirt, as well as on the sleeves. An irregular bloodstain is located below the right pocket, and a larger area of bloodstain is on the lower mid-back of the shirt. Two defects are observed on the front of the shirt. One is located 1" from the bottom of the pocket and approximately 4" from the center placket. This is a round defect, with slightly frayed edges that measures 0.7 cm. in diameter. A second defect is located approximately 1/2" below the pocket and 4" to the right of the center placket. The defect measures approximately 0.6 cm. in diameter. EXTERNAL EXAMINATION:

The body is that of a well-developed, moderately obese Caucasian male, whose appearance is consistent with the recorded age of [REDACTED]. The length is [REDACTED] and the weight is [REDACTED] pounds. The body has not been embalmed and is well preserved. There is very mild rigidity in the extremities, and fully developed rigidity in the jaw. Lividity is posterior and unfixed. The body has been refrigerated and is cool to the touch.

The intact scalp is covered by [REDACTED] hair, which measures up to 3" in length. The corneas are clear, and the irides are [REDACTED]. The conjunctivae are pale and edematous, without petechial hemorrhages. The nose is intact and contains a small amount of blood. The lips are intact and the teeth are natural and in a good state of repair. A 2 cm. brown moustache and goatee-type beard are on the face. The surrounding beard area is shaved and covered by short stubble. The ears are normally formed, with a pierce hole in the left earlobe. The neck is straight and symmetrical and the trachea is midline.

The chest is symmetrical and the breasts are those of a normal adult male. The abdomen is obese, without palpable organomegaly. The genitals are those of a normal circumcised adult male, with the testicles bilaterally descended into the scrotum.

The arms and hands are normally formed. The nailbeds are pale and the fingernails do not extend to the fingertips. There is moderate soil beneath the fingernails and ground-in soil on the palmar surfaces of the hands. A diagonally oriented scar on the right index proximal phalanx measures approximately 1.5 cm. in length. Adjacent to this is a shorter scar. Two fine linear scars are on the proximal phalanx of the right third finger and measure 1 cm. in length. A slightly irregular linear scar on the right fourth proximal phalanx measures 1.2 cm. in length. There is a flexion deformity of the right fifth finger PIP joint. Multiple irregular scars are on the dorsal surface of the left fingers, including two linear scars on the MP joint of the index finger, which intersect each other and measure 1 cm. in length respectively. No scars are on the anterior wrists or in the antecubital fossa. There are no needle tracks or needle marks, other than therapeutic ones. There are some hypopigmented scars on the dorsal surface of both forearms. There are no tattoos. The legs are normally formed, without angularity or edema. A transverse scar across the right kneecap measures approximately 2 cm. in length. There are multiple small hypopigmented scars on both anterior tibial areas. Some small crusted abrasions are on the left anterior tibial area and measure up to 0.5 cm. in diameter. A healing injury on the right calf measures 6 x 2 cm. The outside edges of scar are pale and the interior is covered by crust. A nearly healed injury on the left lateral calf measures 6 x 2 cm. There are only a few areas of crust remaining. A diagonally oriented scar extends from the left lateral hip onto the buttock and measures approximately 22 cm. in length. The feet and toenails are unremarkable.

Entrance – On the right lower chest, centered approximately 21" from the top of the head and 4 ½" to the right of anterior midline, is a tangential gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 1 cm. in diameter. Marginal abrasion is widest from the 9 o'clock to the 12 o'clock position, where it measures 0.5 cm. in width. The wound itself is more superficial at this lateral upper side. Marginal abrasion opposite, measures 0.2 cm. in width. Some superficial abrasions are just below the wound and measure 0.2 and 1 cm. in length respectively. There is very slight light blue contusion of the skin around the perimeter of the wound. A tiny fragment of red plastic material is recovered from the surface of the wound and appears similar to the plastic of the cigarette lighter found in the chest pocket of the shirt.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissue of the right chest, the bullet follows a subcutaneous soft tissue course over the outside of the chest wall, and then enters the abdominal cavity in the right upper quadrant. It produces injury to the liver and perforates the right kidney. It then proceeds posteriorly, lateral to the iliopsoas muscle, and exits the posterior abdominal wall on the right side. The bullet then exits the body as described below.

Exit – On the right flank, centered approximately 26" from the top of the head and 10" to the right of posterior midline, is a transversely oriented slit-like gunshot exit wound, which measures 1.3 cm. in length.

Direction-of-fire – The bullet passes from front-to-back, right-to-left and downward.

GUNSHOT WOUND OF RIGHT COSTAL MARGIN:

Entrance – On the right front of the chest at the costal margin, centered approximately 23" from the top of the head and 4 ½" to the right of anterior midline, is a slightly ovoid gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 1 cm. in transverse diameter by 0.8 cm. in vertical diameter. The area of dry marginal abrasion around the wound is relatively uniform, measuring 0.1 cm. in width. The more superficial area of the wound is located from the 2 o'clock to the 5 o'clock position, giving the impression of a tangential entrance. There is very slight light blue contusion of the skin around the perimeter of the wound.

OSLER, SCOTT

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Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissue of the right chest at the costal margin, the bullet grazes the anterior chest wall producing some hemorrhage in chest wall muscles. It then enters the abdominal cavity, just below the diaphragm, producing a contusion of the right lateral diaphragm. The bullet perforates the right lobe of the liver, causing massive disruption of liver parenchyma. It exits the posterior aspect of the left lobe of the liver, perforates the stomach and lacerates the medial spleen. The bullet then enters the left thoracic cavity through the posterior diaphragm, perforates the posterior edge of the left lower lobe of the lung and exits the left thoracic cavity through the posterolateral tenth rib. Accompanying the gunshot wound is hemoperitoneum, as well as 500 cc. of blood mixed with gastric content in the left pleural cavity.

Exit – None.

Bullet – A partially jacketed mushroomed large caliber projectile is recovered from soft tissue of the left back, centered approximately 20" from the top of the head, and 10" to the left of posterior midline. The base of the bullet measures .43" in diameter.

Direction-of-fire – The bullet passes from right-to-left, front-to-back and slightly upward.

GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT BUTTOCK:

Entrance – On the left inferior lateral buttock, centered approximately 38" from the top of the head and 7 3/4" to the left of posterior midline, is a gunshot entrance wound, which measures approximately 0.7 cm. in diameter. This appears to be slightly tangential, with a wider area of marginal abrasion from the 3 o'clock to the 5 o'clock position. The marginal abrasion measures approximately 0.2 cm. in width. There is slight purple subcutaneous hemorrhage around most of the perimeter of the wound.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissue of the left buttock, the bullet proceeds anteriorly, perforating the pelvic bone near the hip joint and passing outside the peritoneum along the inner surface of the ileum and then into abdominal wall soft tissue.

Exit – None.

Bullet – A partially jacketed mushroomed projectile is recovered from soft tissue of the left anterolateral abdominal wall, approximately 29" from the top of the head. The base of the bullet measures .43" in diameter.

Direction-of-fire – The bullet passes from back-to-front and upward, with minimal left-to-right deviation.



1. A vertically oriented laceration is over the left third MP joint and measures 1.5 cm. in length.
2. Two very superficial lacerations are over the left fourth IP joint and measure 0.2 and 0.5 cm. cm in maximum size.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION:


The body is opened through an abdominal fat layer of 3-4 cm. and a muscle layer of 1 cm. The internal organs are found in their normal positions and are covered by glistening serosal surfaces. There has been an emergent laparotomy and approximately twenty-two blood-saturated laparotomy packs are in the abdominal cavity, primarily situated around the liver. A portion of the right lobe of the liver has been resected and the surgical surface is open and raw, with numerous staples visible, clamping off large vessels within the liver parenchyma. The right kidney has been surgically removed and staples are across the renal vein and artery. There is approximately 200 cc. of blood in the right chest cavity and 500 cc. in the left chest cavity. Only a scant amount of free blood is in the abdominal cavity. The pericardial sac contains approximately 25-30 cc. of clear pale yellow fluid. Internal injury has been described.

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


SPARK'S WALK-THRU INTERVIEW

On 7-27-2005 at approximately 0400, Detective Evans and I conducted a walk-thru with Deputy Sparks. The walk-thru included Attorney Howard Liberman, DDA Cheryl Temple, DA Investigator Rob Briner, Sergeant Mike Arnada and Attorney Jim Eichler.

The walk-thru started at the top of the driveway. Refer to crime scene diagrams for details. Deputy Sparks described his actions chronologically as he walked through the scene. The following is a summary of a digitally recorded interview with Deputy Sparks:

Deputy Sparks was working uniform patrol assigned to the Ojai / West County area. Earlier this evening, Deputies Sparks and Medina were dispatched to a domestic disturbance at [REDACTED] Oakview. Deputy Sparks recalled dispatch advised a twelve year-old female reported her parents were fighting. In addition, dispatch informed Sparks and Medina a rifle was inside the house and it was unknown if the rifle was involved in the fight. Seconds later, dispatch advised the twelve year-old female saw blood on the floor inside the residence. Upon receiving that information about the blood in the residence, Deputy Sparks stated, "It heightened my awareness...as something was going on inside the house." Deputy Sparks arrived shortly after Deputy Medina arrived on scene. Both deputies parked their patrol cars at the intersection of [REDACTED]

Deputy Sparks stated they initially had difficulty locating the residence due to its location. Deputy Sparks recalled responding to this same residence approximately four or five years ago concerning a possible domestic disturbance. Eventually, they saw the numbers [REDACTED] on a pole and

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
realized the residence was located at the bottom of the driveway. At the top of the driveway, Deputy Sparks heard a male yelling. Deputy Sparks described the male voice as one who was "pretty agitated" and "loud."

As Sparks and Medina continued down the driveway, Deputy Spark heard the male yelled, "Why don't you come get your dog. You care more about your dog then anything else." The male was still agitated. Deputy Sparks indicated Deputy Medina was slightly to his left as they walked down the middle of the driveway together. As they continued down to the bottom of the driveway, Deputy Sparks saw the male suspect, later identified as Scott Osler, standing in front of the residence on the front porch.

Deputies Sparks and Medina immediately "lit up" Osler with their flashlights and identified themselves as deputy sheriffs. Osler immediately turned towards them and told them, "I have a knife" and began to walk towards them through the white gate and onto the driveway. Deputy Sparks said Osler was walking at "a pretty good pace."

As Osler continued to walk "briskly" towards them, Osler yelled, "Fuck you! You're going to have to kill me! You're going to have to kill! I have a knife!" At the same time, Deputy Sparks saw a female at the front window of the residence. Deputy Sparks stated he was unable to tell if the female was inside or outside of the residence. Deputy Sparks said the female was a "concern" because Osler was walking by the window. During this time, Deputy Sparks withdrew his handgun and pointed it at Osler. At the same time, Deputy Sparks placed his handheld flashlight into his rear pants' pocket and activated the flashlight that was attached to his handgun. Both deputies began yelling at Osler repeatedly to drop the knife. Osler continued to walk "briskly" towards them, holding the knife in front of him.

As Osler continued to approached them, Deputy Sparks said he and Medina began to step backwards in an attempt to maintain a reasonable distance between themselves and Osler. At the same time, the deputies repeatedly yelled at Osler to drop the knife. Osler continued to hold the knife in front of himself, yelling at the deputies, "You're going to have to kill me!" Deputy Sparks said Osler was not responding to their statements and continued to approach them with the knife in his hand. Deputy Sparks stated, although they were stepping backwards away from Osler with their weapons

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
still pointing at him, Olser was walking faster than they were able to step backwards. Deputy Sparks said Olser was “obviously not listening to us...and I was worry about getting to close...He was gaining on us faster than we were moving back...and my partner was still to my left.”

As they continued to “move back” and Olser was “gaining on us”, Deputy Sparks recalled thinking that “OC is not going to work...my night stick is not going to work...nothing else was going to work so I kept my weapon up.” During all this time, the deputies continued to yell at Olser to drop the knife. Olser continued to advance towards the deputies, holding the knife in front of him. Deputy Sparks said his intent was to maintain a safe distance between he and Olser, but Sparks indicated Olser “he was getting closer. He did not want to stop. He had a purpose.” The deputies continued to yell at Olser to drop the knife.

Deputy Sparks stated Olser continue to get closer while holding the knife in front of him. Deputy Sparks said, as Olser got closer to him and Deputy Medina, he was worry that Olser was going to stab him and Medina. Olser continued to yell at the deputies that they would have to kill him. Deputy Sparks said Olser was “angry” and was “not backing down.”

As they were stepping back, Deputy Sparks recalled Deputy Medina was to his left and approximately three feet in front of him. At this time, Deputy Sparks continued to say, “I was scared as hell for one. For me but for Victor (Medina) more because he was getting closer and closer to Victor.” Deputy Sparks said, “There is no question in my mind” that Olser could hear him and Medina yelling at him to drop the knife. Deputy Sparks also said that the female at the window could have heard him and Medina yelling at Olser.

As Olser got within six to eight feet, Deputy Sparks felt Olser was about to stab either he or Medina. Olser continued to refused to drop the knife. Fearing Olser was about to stab him or Medina, Deputy Sparks said he shot Olser one time. As he attempted to shot Olser a second time, Deputy Sparks said his weapon malfunctioned. Deputy Sparks immediately went through with a “malfunction drill”, which he said he “rack his slide” to his weapon. Deputy Sparks was unsure if his weapon was functional so he “rack his slide” again and believed he ejected a live round. Realizing that his weapon was ready to fire again, Deputy Sparks saw Olser had fallen to the ground and did not shoot. Deputy Sparks said Olser obviously saw that he and Medina were pointing their guns at him, yelling at him to

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

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drop the knife. Deputy Sparks said, "In my head he was not going to stop. He was there to do damage to either one of us. He was going to stab one. Probably Vic (Medina) first. And who knows after that...He was going to stab one of us." During the entire incident, he and Medina continued to repeatedly ordered Olser to drop the knife. And Olser continued to approach them "non-stop" while holding the knife in front of him, yelling, "Fuck you. You're going to have to kill me."

Once Olser was shot, he fell to the ground and rolled over to one side. Deputy Sparks said he holstered his gun and placed handcuffs on Olser. At the same time, Deputy Sparks activated his tape recorder that was attached to his belt. Deputy Sparks said Olser was conscious and talking. Deputy Sparks asked Olser why he did not stop and drop the knife. Olser said something to the effect, "My wife was going to call the police...and I was not going back to jail." Then Deputy Sparks asked Olser, "Was your life worth it?" Olser replied, "Yea." Just prior to the arrival of paramedics, Olser continued to tell Deputy Sparks he was "sorry" and "I am dying." In summary, Deputy Sparks stated, "I couldn't believe this whole thing happened." Refer to the recording and transcription of additional details.

CRIME SCENE WALK-THRU WITH DEPUTY MEDINA

ON 07/27/2005 AT 0423 HRS; I CONDUCTED A WALK-THRU OF THE CRIME SCENE WITH DEPUTY MEDINA. THE WALK-THRU CONSISTED OF DEPUTY MEDINA, DETECTIVE MONTAGNA, DETECTIVE EVANS, ATTORNEY HOWARD LIBERMAN, DEPUTY DISTRICT ATTORNEY CHERYL TEMPLE, DISTRICT ATTORNEY INVESTIGATOR ROB BRINER, SGT. MIKE ARANDA AND JIM EICHLER.

THE WALK-THRU STARTED AT THE TOP OF THE DRIVEWAY TO [REDACTED] DEPUTY MEDINA DESCRIBED HIS ACTIONS AS THEY OCCURRED DURING THE SHOOTING INCIDENT. THIS WALK-THRU WAS DIGITALLY RECORDED. THE RECORDING WILL BE TRANSFERRED TO A DISC AND MAINTAINED IN THE CASE FILE.

THE FOLLOWING IS A SUMMARY OF DEPUTY MEDINA'S ACCOUNT OF THE SHOOTING INCIDENT.

DURING THIS WALK-THRU, THERE ARE EVIDENCE MARKERS ON THE DRIVEWAY. DURING THIS REPORT, I WILL REFER TO THE EVIDENCE MARKS TO SHOW LOCATIONS OF THE DEPUTIES. REFER TO CRIME SCENE DIAGRAM FOR EXACT LOCATIONS.

I STARTED BY HAVING MEDINA TELL ME WHERE HE WAS AND WHAT HE WAS DOING WHEN HE RECEIVED THE RADIO CALL. MEDINA SAID HE WAS WORKING IN OAK VIEW, WHEN HE AND SPARKS RECEIVED A DOMESTIC CALL AT [REDACTED] DISPATCH TOLD MEDINA AND SPARKS THAT A 12 YEAR OLD RP SAID HER MOTHER AND FATHER WERE YELLING AND SCREAMING AT EACH OTHER. THE 12 YEAR OLD ALSO REPORTED SEEING BLOOD ON THE FLOOR IN HER HALLWAY. DISPATCH ALSO TOLD THEM THERE WAS A RIFLE IN THE HOUSE DOWN STAIRS AND WAS BELIEVED TO BE SECURED.

MEDINA RESPONDED FROM THE [REDACTED] AREA AND ARRIVED SLIGHTLY BEFORE SPARKS. MEDINA COULD NOT FIND THE RESIDENCE INITIALLY. HE DROVE UP [REDACTED] AND ACTUALLY TURNED AROUND DIRECTLY IN FRONT OF [REDACTED] MEDINA PARKED HIS CAR DOWN THE STREET WHERE [REDACTED] TURNS FROM WEST BOUND TO SOUTH BOUND. SPARKS ARRIVED AND PARKED NEXT TO MEDINA. THE TWO OF THEM WALKED WEST ON [REDACTED] UNTIL THEY SAW [REDACTED] THEY THEN WALKED SOUTH TO THE TOP OF THE DRIVE WAY AT [REDACTED]

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MEDINA SAID HE AND SPARKS BEGAN TO WALK DOWN THE DRIVEWAY AT [REDACTED] SPARKS WAS ON THE RIGHT SIDE OF THE DRIVEWAY AND TO THE RIGHT OF MEDINA. AS THEY WALKED DOWN THE DRIVEWAY, MEDINA HEARD A MAN AND WOMAN SCREAMING. THE FEMALE SOUNDED AS IF SHE WAS CRYING. MEDINA COULD NOT UNDERSTAND WHAT THE MALE WAS SAYING, HE COULD ONLY HEAR THE MAN YELLING.

MEDINA SAID HE AND SPARKS WERE WALKING TOGETHER AND HE CAN STILL HEAR SCREAMING COMING FROM INSIDE THE HOUSE. MEDINA HAD HIS FLASHLIGHT IN HIS HAND BUT HE WAS UNSURE IF IT WAS ON. MEDINA THOUGHT HE MIGHT HAVE HAD HIS HAND OVER THE LIGHT SO HE COULD NOT BE SEEN.

AS THEY WALKED DOWN THE DRIVEWAY, THEY CAME TO AN AREA WHERE THEY COULD SEE THE PORCH OF THE HOUSE. MEDINA SAID HE COULD SEE A MALE SUBJECT WEARING A YELLOW COAT WITH REFLECTORS, SIMILAR TO A FIREMAN'S COAT. MEDINA SHINED HIS FLASHLIGHT ONTO THE MALE. AT THIS POINT DEPUTY SPARKS IS STANDING NEAR THE #15 EVIDENCE MARKER AND MEDINA IS STANDING TO SPARKS' LEFT.

MEDINA SAID THE MAN WALKS RAPIDLY FROM THE PORCH TOWARD HE AND SPARKS. AS THE MAN STEPS OFF THE PORCH, MEDINA SEES THE MAN HAS SOMETHING IN HIS HAND. AS THE MAN GETS CLOSER, MEDINA SEES HE IS HOLDING A KNIFE IN HIS RIGHT HAND. THE MAN IS HOLDING THE KNIFE ABOVE HIS SHOULDER AND HEAD. MEDINA SAYS THE MAN IS ANGRY AND THE DEPUTIES BEGIN IDENTIFYING THEMSELVES. MEDINA SAID HE AND SPARKS ARE YELLING, "SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT DROP THE KNIFE, DROP THE KNIFE." THE MAN CONTINUES TO WALK AT A FAST PACE TOWARD MEDINA AND SPARKS. MEDINA BEGINS SCREAMING AT THE MAN "DROP THE KNIFE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT DROP THE KNIFE." MEDINA SAID HE HAS NOW DRAWN HIS GUN AND HIS FLASHLIGHT IS LIGHTING THE MAN UP. MEDINA SAID THE MALE IS YELLING, "GO AHEAD AND KILL ME, KILL ME. GO AHEAD AND SHOOT ME."

DET. MONTAGNA ASKED MEDINA TO STOP AND TELL US WHAT HE WAS FEELING AT THIS POINT IN THE INCIDENT. MEDINA SAID HE WAS FEELING A LOT OF ADRENALIN AND WAS AFRAID. THE MAN HAD THE KNIFE AND WAS WALKING TOWARD THE TWO OF THEM. MEDINA SAID THE MAN WAS NOT LISTENING TO THEIR COMMANDS AND THIS WAS MAKING MEDINA FEEL AFRAID. MEDINA SAID THE MAN WAS CLOSING IN ON THEM AND THEY WERE STILL GIVING THE MAN COMMANDS TO STOP. MEDINA SAID BOTH HE AND SPARKS ARE YELLING FOR THE MAN TO DROP THE KNIFE.

MEDINA SAID THE MAN PICKED UP THE PACE OF HIS WALK TOWARD SPARKS AND HIM. MEDINA SAID, " HE WENT FROM FAST TO FASTER." AT THIS POINT, HE AND SPARKS STARTED WALKING BACKWARDS UP THE DRIVEWAY. MEDINA SAID THE MAN WAS CLOSING THE DISTANCE BETWEEN HIM AND THE DEPUTIES FASTER THAN THEY COULD RETREAT, MEDINA SAID THEY CONTINUED TO ORDER THE MAN TO DROP THE KNIFE. THE MAN WOULD ONLY REPLY FOR THEM TO SHOOT HIM AND KILL HIM. MEDINA AND SPARKS CONTINUED TO YELL AT THE MAN TO DROP THE KNIFE. THE MAN CONTINUED TO ADVANCE ON THEM AS THEY WERE TRYING TO BACK AWAY FROM HIM.

MEDINA SAID HE WAS SURPRISED THEY COULD NOT CALM THE MAN DOWN. MEDINA IS TRAINED IN CRISIS INTERVENTION AND HAS DEALT WITH SUICIDAL PEOPLE IN THE PAST. MEDINA

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SAID THE MAN WAS LOUD, ANGRY AND IRRATIONAL AND NOTHING WAS WORKING ON HIM. THE MAN WAS STILL CHARGING THEM. MEDINA WAS SURPRISED THAT THE MAN WOULD NOT RESPOND TO ANY OF THEIR COMMANDS. THE MAN ONLY CONTINUED TO CLOSE IN ON THEM RAPIDLY.

MEDINA SAID THE MAN HELD THE KNIFE ABOVE HIS SHOULDER THE ENTIRE TIME. MEDINA DESCRIBED THE KNIFE AS BEING ABOUT 7 INCHES LONG.

MEDINA SAID THE MAN WAS STANDING NEAR EVIDENCE MARKER 22 WHEN THEY BEGAN TO RETREAT. THE MAN WALKED TOWARDS THEM DIRECTLY UP THE CENTER OF THE DRIVEWAY. MEDINA SAID THE MAN NEVER HESITATED ONCE HE CAME OFF THE PORCH AND TOWARD SPARKS AND HIM.

MEDINA AND SPARKS HAD RETREATED TO THE AREA OF MARKER #5. THE MAN WAS STILL ADVANCING ON THEM WHILE THEY CONTINUED TO SCREAM FOR HIM TO DROP THE KNIFE. MEDINA THINKS AT ONE POINT, SPARKS TELLS THE MAN NOT TO MAKE THEM SHOOT HIM. THE MAN CONTINUES TO ADVANCE ON THE TWO OF THEM.

MEDINA SAID THE MAN WAS HOLDING THE KNIFE ABOVE HIS SHOULDER THE ENTIRE TIME. WHEN THE MAN GOT TO MARKER #8, HE CHARGED OR LUNGED TOWARDS MEDINA. MEDINA SAID HE WAS TELLING THE MAN TO STOP AND PUT DOWN THE KNIFE WHEN HE LUNGED. MEDINA THEN FIRED HIS WEAPON TWICE AT THE MAN. MEDINA SAID THE MAN FELL DIRECTLY TO THE GROUND AND WAS NO LONGER A THREAT.

I COULD SEE THERE IS ABOUT EIGHT TO TWELVE FEET FROM WHERE MEDINA IS STANDING AND MARKER #8. IT APPEARS THE MAN IS WITHIN FIFTEEN FEET OF MEDINA WHEN THE SHOTS ARE FIRED.

MEDINA SAID, AT THE RATE THE MAD WAS GOING, HE BELIEVED THE MAN WAS GOING TO STAB EITHER SPARKS OR HIM. MEDINA SAID HE WAS AFRAID AND HE SHOT.

MEDINA BELIEVES SPARKS ALSO SHOT AT THE MAN. MEDINA KNOWS SPARKS WAS STILL STANDING TO HIS RIGHT.

AFTER MEDINA FIRES, HE SEES THE KNIFE FALL FROM THE MAN'S HAND. THE MAN FALLS BACK AND TO THE RIGHT. THE MAN IS NOW LAYING WITH HIS HEAD FACING DOWN THE DRIVEWAY. MEDINA HEARS THE MAN SAYING HE IS GOING TO SEE HIS BROTHER IN HEAVEN. MEDINA REMEMBER FEELING ANGRY AND ASKING THE MAN WHY HE MADE THEM DO THIS. SPARKS ALSO ASKED THE MAN WHY HE DID THIS. THE MAN REPLIED HE WAS SORRY.

THEY ORDER THE MAN TO ROLL OVER AND ONTO HIS STOMACH. SPARKS HELPS THE MAN ROLL OVER AND HANDCUFFS HIM WHILE MEDINA COVERS THEM. MEDINA THEN PUT OUT THE SHOTS FIRED ON THE RADIO.

MEDINA SAID WHEN THE PARAMEDICS ARRIVED THE MAN TOLD THEM IT WAS NOT THEIR FAULT IT WAS A SUICIDE BY COP. MEDINA SAID THE MAN SAID HE WANTED A SUICIDE BY COP.

MEDINA NOTICES THAT A WOMAN IS STANDING AT THE BOTTOM OF THE DRIVEWAY NEAR MARKER #24. THE WOMAN IS CRYING AND HAS BLOOD ON HER. MEDINA CONTACTS HER TO MAKE SURE SHE IS NOT INJURED. THE WOMAN IS NOT INJURED AND SHE GOT THE BLOOD FROM A PICTURE FRAME THAT WAS BROKEN IN THE HOUSE. MEDINA SAID THE WOMAN BECAME UPSET AND WENT INTO THE HOUSE.

MONTAGNA ASKED MEDINA TO ESTIMATE THE TIME BETWEEN WHEN THEY FIRST SEE THE MAN AND THE TIME THE MAN IS SHOT. MEDINA SAYS IT HAPPENS VERY FAST. THE MAN NEVER STOPS FROM THE FIRST TIME THEY SEE HIM TO THE TIME THEY SHOOT HIM. MEDINA ESTIMATED THE ENTIRE INCIDENT TOOK LESS THAN 20 SECONDS.

THE WALK-THRU WAS CONCLUDED AT 0447 HRS.

1 JE: What time you got on your watch there? I got it.
2 It's 3:47, 7-27.

3 MV: Can I use this?

4 MV: (INAUDIBLE).

5 MV: Yes, there is. The other one (INAUDIBLE).

6 MV: Okay. People involved in this thing, we've got
7 myself (INAUDIBLE) Victor (INAUDIBLE).

8 JE: He's getting a log right now.

9 MV: Yeah. He's getting a log right now.

10 MV: Yeah.

11 MV: All right. Good, thanks. How you doing?

12 MV: All right. Isn't this your beat?

13 MV: Get out of here.

14 MV: Are you on it too?

16 JE: Victor, can you hang out front? Why don't we just
17 step over here and step by this wall.

21 Dave, let's start with where you were at when you got the
22 call and what the call came out as to --

23 DS: I believe I was down on [REDACTED] area on [REDACTED]

25 address. They told us that a twelve-year-old reporting party
26 called and said that her -- I believe she said that her mother and
27 father were fighting. Dispatch told us that there was a rifle in
28 the residence but they didn't know if the rifle was involved.

1 A couple -- couple seconds later they came back with an
2 update and said that there -- I gu- -- the twelve-year-old RP told
3 them there was blood on the floor somewhere in the residence. So
4 that kind of heightened my awareness anyways as to something was
5 going inside the house.

6 JE: That information was passed on to you as soon as it
7 came out?

8 DS: It -- well --

9 JE: It came out through the radio?

10 DS: It came out through the radio from dispatch while I
11 was still in the car.

12 I got here coming, up the street. Apparently Victor was
13 coming down the street. He was having trouble finding the address.
14 When -- when I came I parked right on the corner where my unit is
15 now. I --

16 JE: Okay. That's right there [REDACTED] makes the bend
17 to go from southbound -- westbound to south- -- eastbound to
18 southbound.

19 DS: Right. Right about where the flashing light are.

20 JE: Okay.

21 SD: Yeah. Right where you said. He was coming down the
22 street, Victor. He parked just on the opposite corner, same part
23 of the street but then on opposite corner.

24 JE: Okay.

25 DS: We originally thought the address was up the street
26 which would be, I guess, east from where our cars were parked so we
27 walked up that way. The numbers didn't -- weren't right. So I
28 remembered this house from before. I had been here before

1 probably, I don't know, three or four years ago. I don't know if
2 these were the same people or not but I remembered this peculiar
3 driveway. We couldn't find the addresses on the house so I
4 remember this driveway going between the houses and the house
5 actually sat off the -- off the street.

6 JE: And that's the driveway here where the incident
7 occurred?

8 DS: The driveway here.

9 JE: Okay.

10 DS: Where the incident occurred. So I remember that
11 house from before. And sure enough, as we walked up we saw the
12 numbers on the telephone pole to the address right here.

13 JE: Okay.

14 DS: [REDACTED] We started walking down the driveway and as
15 we -- well, immediately from the street I can hear a male's voice,
16 yelling. I couldn't tell what he was saying right away. I could
17 tell that he was pretty agitated and he's yelling just, you know,
18 louder than a normal talk. As we got farther down the driveway
19 probably about the, I don't know, the third panel of that wood
20 fence right there --

21 JE: Uh-huh.

22 DS: -- I heard him some- -- say something to the effect
23 of, why don't you come get your dog? You care about it more than
24 anything else anyways. Something to that effect. That he was
25 still agitated. I didn't hear any other voices at that point.

26 So we continued down the driveway. We didn't have any
27 lights on at that point. We were just walking down the driveway
28 using pretty much ambient light to -- to see what we're doing.

1 So we got down to the end of fence where the panel
2 stopped. We're probably, I don't know, in the middle of the
3 driveway walking down. You can see pretty much the whole front of
4 the house.

5 We saw subject over by the, I guess, there's this front
6 porch area. I didn't know if that was the person yelling or not.
7 As soon as we got around the corner, we both lit him up with our
8 flashlights and he immediately turned.

9 JE: Okay. Let's stop right there for a second.

10 DS: Okay.

11 EM: Stop right here. What we'll do is, let's go down and
12 walk through and show us.

13 JE: I'd like to back up here for a minute, Ernie.

14 When you guys are walking up the street here, are there any other
15 people out on the street? Is there anybody out in front of their
16 houses? Are you noticing anybody else?

17 DS: No. I didn't notice anybody else.

18 JE: And you don't hear anything until you actually get
19 in to the driveway?

20 DS: Well, actually right at the top of the driveway, I
21 guess, in the street I could hear talking.

22 JE: Okay. When you guys come up to the point in the
23 driveway here, where are you standing in relationship to Victor?

24 DS: I was probably -- I don't know if you want to walk
25 over there. I was --

26 JE: Yeah, I do.

27 DS: -- I was probably -- well, when we first saw the
28 address it was pretty much right here.

2 EM: Why don't you hold this. It'll be easier.

3 DS: Oh, all right. I -- I think Victor was on my
4 left-hand side as we were walked down the driveway.

8 JE: Okay. Had you communicated anything about you
9 having been at this address before to Victor before you got here?

10 DS: I think I did.

11 JE: Okay.

12 DS: Because that's how I remember this peculiar driveway
13 because it doesn't -- the -- the addresses don't match up and I
14 remember this driveway. And I -- I told Victor I think I remember
15 this driveway. Let's go check. And that's -- sure enough, as we
16 walked up we saw the street.

17 JE: Uh-huh.

18 DS: And the sign.

19 JE: And what do you remember about this driveway from
20 the last time you were here?

21 DS: I'm not a hundred percent sure but I think we had a
22 domestic here.

23 JE: Okay.

24 DS: It was -- I worked Ojai twice before on two
25 different occasions so I -- I don't remember which one it was.

26 JE: Okay.

27 DS: And I don't -- and I don't know if these were the
28 same people that lived here.

1 JE: Okay. That sounds good.

2 EM: So you start walking down?

3 DS: Start walking down the driveway.

4 EM: And as you're walking down, what do you hear and
5 what do you --

6 DS: As I -- as I got a little closer, I heard talking
7 from the back but I couldn't hear what was being said. I could
8 hear a male's voice, couldn't hear what was being said. As we got
9 closer, probably, I don't know, another couple feet up I heard him
10 say something to the effect that, why don't you get -- come and get
11 your dog, you care about it more than anything else.

12 EM: How did that voice sound? Was it loud?
13 (INAUDIBLE).

14 DS: Yeah, agitated. It was -- it was like a
15 argumentative voice.

16 EM: Okay.

17 DS: Wasn't a normal, you know, monotone voice.

18 EM: But loud enough and clear enough so that you could
19 hear it?

20 DS: Yeah, loud enough and clear enough. Loud enough to
21 tell me that something was going on. It was an argument of some
22 sort.

23 EM: Okay. Did you hear any other voices?

24 DS: No. I don't remember hearing any other voices at
25 that point.

26 EM: Okay. So the two of you are walking down?

27 DS: We're walking down the driveway.

28 EM: Are you in the center of the driveway or off to the

1 side?

2 DS: Probably right about where I'm at now, this area.

3 And Vic's on the side of me. On the left side.

5 JE: About five feet off of the --

15 DS: We continue down until we can get a clear view of
16 the front of the house.

17 EM: So you walk --

18 JE: To where?

19 EM: -- continuously all the way down to --

20 DS: All the way down to right about here.

21 EM: So just --

22 EM: So you're between Item Number 9 and Item Number 14?

23 DS: Yeah. That's -- I don't know who -- what deputy
24 is standing there, but right on that porch is where I first saw a
25 male --

26 EM: You saw the subject?

27 DS: Yeah, standing.

28 EM: He was on the patio?

1 DS: He was up on the porch. Yeah.

2 EM: Okay.

3 DS: He looked like he was walking away from us at the --
4 at one point.

5 EM: Now, again this -- this is all dark, right?

6 DS: It's dark but it was light enough that we could see.
7 I mean, not -- not see, see, but light enough that we can actually

11 as Sheriff's Department.

12 He immediately turned and started walking. And the first
13 thing he said was, "I have a knife" and he started walking out
14 the -- off the porch and out that little walkway between the house
15 and the fence right there.

16 JE: Could you see him come through the gate and out that
17 walkway there?

18 DS: I can see everything from right here.

19 JE: Okay.

20 DS: From where -- I think that's Tom Triplett's down
21 there. I can see him walk off the porch, walk through the little
22 walkway there and right out into the driveway.

23 JE: And is he -- is he focusing on you when he's
24 walking?

25 DS: Yeah. He's walking straight out towards us.

26 JE: And is he just kind of strolling or is he --

27 DS: No.

28 JE: -- with a mission?

1 DS: He -- he's walking at a pretty good pace.

2 JE: Okay.

3 DS: And he told us right away -- I mean as soon as he
4 turned he told us he had a knife and that immediately, the --
5 our -- my alert went up. As he's walking out and he's yelling
6 stuff like, fuck you, you're going to have to kill me. You're
7 going to have to kill me. I have a knife. And he's walking out
8 very briskly.

9 At that point I remember looking down at that window and I
10 don't know if she was inside or outside, but I saw a female.

11 And that was one of my concerns was he was walking up with
12 a knife at one point and I don't remember when I drew my weapon. I
13 had my flashlight in my hand as he was getting closer. I have a
14 flashlight on my weapon so I turned that on, put my regular
15 flashlight -- this flashlight in my sap pocket and used the
16 flashlight on my weapon.

17 My concern was -- my first concern was that he was
18 walking up and she was directly behind him and I was worried of
19 a -- a crossfire.

20 JE: Okay.

21 DS: He --

22 EM: Stop there for a second.

23 JE: Okay.

24 EM: The relationship to the numbers down there, was he
25 beyond those numbers?

26 DS: Which numbers?

27 EM: 21, 20 or 22? Or was it further back?

28 DS: Well, he kind of -- when he came through the gate he

1 kind of just came straight up.

2 EM: Okay.

3 DS: I mean, kind of between those numbers and the gate,
4 he just came straight up.

5 EM: And you said he was coming towards you with the
6 knife?

7 DS: Uh-huh.

8 EM: How was he displaying that knife?

9 DS: The knife? I don't know if he was holding it this
10 way or this way but he had it out in front of him.

11 EM: Out in front of him?

12 DS: And he was -- yeah.

13 EM: Okay. Do you recall if he had anything else in the
14 other hand?

15 DS: No.

16 EM: And what was he doing with the other hand?

17 DS: Just --

18 EM: Just doing this?

19 DS: Yeah. Just walking. He's just --

20 EM: Okay.

21 DS: -- coming.

22 JE: Did you notice what -- do you know if he was wearing
23 any kind of jacket or any heavy articles of clothing when he came
24 out that gate?

25 DS: No. But I remember seeing a jacket afterwards that
26 was laying on the ground. I don't know if he was wearing it. I
27 don't know if he was wearing that before or after. I'm not sure.
28 But I remember seeing it on the ground afterwards.

1 JE: You don't remember if he was wearing it when he came
2 out of the gate?

3 DS: No.

4 JE: Okay.

5 DS: No.

6 EM: And in clarifying, the window we're talking about
7 the window where the light is?

8 DS: Right. Yeah, just to the right of that light.

9 EM: Okay.

10 JE: Okay. So you guys are here. He comes out and tells
11 you some words about, you're going to have to kill me or something
12 to that effect.

13 DS: We -- we immediately told him, put the knife down,
14 put the knife down. We both drew our weapons, kept telling him to
15 put the knife down.

16 EM: So what did he reply?

17 DS: "Fuck you, you're going to have to kill me."

18 EM: How was that voice? Was it loud?

19 DS: Very loud. Yeah, screaming.

20 EM: Screaming?

21 DS: Loud. He continued up the driveway. As he got to
22 probably about where the numbers are, kind of squared up. I
23 remember him coming up here 'cause I remember at one point she was
24 out of the picture so I didn't have to worry about her anymore.

25 EM: Now, were you standing right about where you're at
26 now?

27 DS: Originally we were.

28 EM: Okay. Right around the 14?

1 DS: Uh-huh.

2 EM: Okay. And then as he comes up by the numbers --

3 DS: Uh-huh.

4 EM: -- what did he do at that point?

5 DS: As he's coming up with the numbers, yelling "Fuck
6 you, you're going to have to kill me," we're telling him, put the
7 knife down, just put the knife down and we started backpedaling.

8 EM: Okay. And how -- when he's over where Number 20 is
9 roughly, or 21?

10 DS: Yeah, probably a little closer.

11 EM: A little closer?

12 DS: About where that crack is, somewhere in there.

13 EM: Okay. And he's approaching you, is it a fast pace?

14 DS: Yeah, he's still moving, he's not --

15 EM: Fast pace?

16 DS: -- not listening to anything we're telling him.

17 EM: Is he moving faster than what you're moving
18 backwards?

19 DS: Yeah. He was gaining on us faster than we were
20 backing up.

21 EM: Okay. All right. So what happens at that point?
22 Now, at that point what's going in your head right now?

23 DS: Obviously this guy's not listening to what I'm
24 telling him. He's not listening to either one of us and I was
25 worried about him getting too close especially with the knife.

26 EM: Uh-huh.

27 DS: He was gaining on us faster than we were moving
28 back.

1 EM: Okay. And your partner is still to your left?
2 DS: He was still to my left.
3 EM: Okay.
4 EM: Now --
5 JE: Now, can -- I'm sorry, go ahead.
6 EM: Go ahead.
7 JE: Can you clearly -- at what point can you clearly see
8 the knife in his hand?
9 DS: I can see it right around where the numbers are.
10 JE: As you look down there, can you remember what hand he
11 had the knife in?
12 DS: No.
13 JE: Okay.
14 DS: I don't remember.
15 JE: Do you remember what the knife looked like? What
16 went through your mind when you first saw it?
17 DS: All I could see was the blade. I couldn't see
18 anything else.
19 JE: Big blade, little blade?
20 DS: About, I don't know, seven inches.
21 JE: Look like you're making seven, eight inch blade?
22 DS: Eight inches, yeah.
23 JE: Okay. Did it seem like a -- like a -- like a
24 kitchen type of knife as opposed to a hunting knife or --
25 DS: I saw it afterwards so I know --
26 JE: Okay.
27 DS: -- what kind of knife it was. At the point -- at
28 that point all's I saw was a blade.

1 JE: Okay. The knife that you saw afterwards on the
2 ground, was that the same knife he had in his hand?

3 DS: Oh, yeah. Yeah.

4 JE: Okay. So he comes up and he's still aggressive at
5 this point?

6 DS: Very aggressive.

7 JE: And had you started to back up yet and retreat?

8 DS: As he's getting closer, yeah, we're backing up.

9 JE: Okay. Are you communicating with Victor at this
10 time or are you both communicating only with him?

11 DS: We're both communicating with him. Telling him, put
12 the knife down, just put the knife down.

13 JE: Do you begin to back up together?

14 DS: Yeah. We both started backing up.

15 JE: Okay.

16 EM: So where he passes the numbers 20, 21, he's coming
17 up. Coming up the driveway, you're backing up?

18 DS: Uh-huh.

19 EM: Okay. What happens as we do this? What -- what's
20 happening?

21 DS: We're still telling him, you know, put the knife
22 down, put the knife down.

23 EM: Okay.

24 DS: He's getting closer. And the whole thing I'm
25 thinking of is, OC's not going to work. I already thought about
26 that. My nightstick's not going to work. Nothing else is going to
27 work so I kept my weapon out.

28 EM: Okay. Let's demonstrate. Now, he's walking up.

1 You're -- you're starting to walk backwards.

2 DS: We're starting to -- I don't want to trip on
3 anything.

4 EM: (INAUDIBLE) numbers (INAUDIBLE).

5 DS: Yeah. I don't want to trip on anything but -- and I
6 had my weapon out. And I have it --

7 EM: Uh-huh.

8 DS: -- and I have it sighted. I actually remember
9 sighting it on him so there was enough light. I have night sights
10 on my weapon but there was enough light.

11 EM: Right.

12 DS: That I was actually -- got a sight picture on him.
13 I remember that distinctively.

14 JE: Okay. Where -- at what point when he's coming up,
15 do you remember when you start to move?

16 DS: Pro- -- well, probably just a little back farther
17 than where you were at.

18 EM: You mean where this crack is?

19 DS: Maybe -- maybe a little bit farther back.

7 malfunction drill where I -- I think I racked my slide once and
8 then for some reason I wanted to make sure the thing was working
9 again so I racked it again and I think I actually racked down a
10 live round the second time.

11 EM: Okay.

12 DS: But I only got off one round.

13 EM: Okay.

14 MA: How were you holding that -- your gun at the time?

15 DS: Both hands.

16 MA: Both hands?

17 DS: 'Cause I had -- I had my flashlight attached to my
18 weapon.

19 MA: Okay.

20 DS: So I had both hands on my weapon.

21 MA: And -- and there's no reason in your mind that
22 obviously if you saw the gun pointing at him.

23 DS: Yeah. Oh, yeah. I mean, I had it out in front of

28 DS: Uh-huh.

9 EM: And slightly about --

10 DS: Yeah.

11 JE: By Number 4.

12 EM: Okay.

13 JE: Dave, during this whole time when you're backing up,
14 is there ever a time that it's progressing slow enough that you can
15 actually look behind you and check your footing?

16 DS: No. I wanted to keep my eyes on him the whole time.
17 As he got up -- as he got up closer -- I mean, I knew the driveway
18 was pretty much empty, there's no cars in the driveway but as he
19 got up closer, I wasn't going to turn around and look. I was going
20 to keep my eyes on him.

21 JE: Okay.

22 EM: And again, in your head?

23 DS: In my head he wasn't going to stop, he was there to
24 do damage to either one of us. He's going to stab one.

25 EM: Uh-huh.

26 DS: Probably Vic first and who knows after that.

27 EM: Okay.

28 DS: And my -- my thought process, he was going to stab

2 EM: And your commands were?

3 DS: Put the knife down, just put it down. The entire

5 EM: And what is he replying again to you?

9 JE: What do you think your, if you can remember, from
10 the time that he comes out and you confront him at gunpoint to the
11 time you get back up here and your weapon goes off? Any idea?
12 Time?

13 DS: Oh, time wise? Probably, from the time that he's on
14 the porch all the way back here, probably 30 seconds or less. I
15 mean, it happened that fast. As soon as we lit him up and he
16 turned around, he was out.

17 JE: Did he ever --

18 DS: Coming out.

19 JE: -- did he ever break his stride or was it nonstop
20 pretty much?

21 DS: Oh, it was nonstop. I've remember it being -- I
22 mean, as soon as he turned around and said, "I have a knife," it
23 was nonstop, he was coming. And at that -- and when he got down to
24 about where the 20, 21, 22, I -- I knew that he wasn't stopping.
25 He was just -- he kept going, kept going. And as he got closer,
26 that's when we started to back up and he wasn't stopping. There
27 was no stopping his stride, he just kept coming.

28 JE: Was there ever a time that you were able to

1 retreat faster than what he could approach you?

2 DS: Not without taking my eyes off of him. I mean, I --
3 I kept my eyes on him so there's no way that I can --

4 JE: Let me rephrase that question. You misunderstood
5 me. At any time during this incident, did your retreat outpace his
6 advance?

7 DS: Oh, no, no, no. No. He was coming faster than what
8 we were retreating.

9 JE: Okay.

10 DS: The entire time.

11 EM: Okay. So shots are fired. He goes straight down.
12 Okay?

13 DS: Well, yeah. Somehow he ended up over there.

14 EM: Where -- where (INAUDIBLE) did he fall, right in
15 here?

16 DS: Well, no. I don't know if he rolled around but he
17 ended up over -- right over where 12 and that blood stain is.

18 EM: 12? Okay.

19 DS: Ri- -- like in that area.

20 EM: Did he fall (INAUDIBLE).

21 DS: No. I don't recall how he got there.

22 EM: So, okay. Once he shot down, you got your weapon,

1 handcuffs. I remember looking over at Vic and telling Vic to

4 DS: And when I rolled him over -- over to handcuff him,
5 I used my handcuffs and I had to have Vic hand me his because the
6 guy was -- his hands wouldn't go together. So I had to use two
7 pair.

8 EM: Okay. And was he conscious at the time?

9 DS: Yeah, he was conscious.

10 EM: Did he say anything to you?

11 DS: Yeah. Well, let me back up a little bit. As soon
12 as I started to handcuff him, I turned -- I turned my tape recorder
13 on that was on my belt.

14 EM: (INAUDIBLE).

15 DS: They -- I think they've already taken -- they ended
16 up taking the --

17 EM: Mini -- mini cassette type?

18 DS: -- tape recorder. Yeah, it's the one --

19 JE: It's been seized and booked.

20 EM: Okay.

21 DS: I -- I just subconsciously, I guess, turned my tape
22 recorder on.

23 EM: Okay. And he's shot, he falls. Do you recall where
24 the knife was?

25 DS: Somehow the knife ended up over here somewhere. I

27 that's where it ended up but it was -- I remember it being back
28 over here somewhere.

1 JE: I guess right there 'cause that's where the picture
2 is.

3 EM: Okay. So he's shot, the knife falls, he somehow
4 rolls and falls over here. When he falls, is he on his back or his
5 stomach?

6 DS: He was kind of on his side 'cause I remember having
7 to roll him over on his stomach to cu- -- cuff him.

8 EM: So he's on his side. Do you recall if he was
9 facing --

10 DS: I'm just trying to think on which way he was facing.
11 I --

12 EM: Remember what side his head was (INAUDIBLE).

13 DS: That's what I was trying to think. I was -- I'm not
14 a hundred percent sure but I think his head was facing down but
15 that --

16 EM: Okay.

17 DS: Not a hundred percent sure about that.

18 EM: Okay. So you handcuff him. He made some
19 statements?

20 DS: Yeah.

21 EM: Do you recall what he said or some of the words he
22 may have said?

23 DS: Well, I -- while we were handcuffing him, we -- we
24 made sure we got fire and ambulance on the way in here, that was
25 one of the things we did. Made sure we were getting all the units
26 to the right place. A couple of times I had to -- well, several
27 times I had to try to get on the air to have the dispatcher hear --
28 hear me.

1 EM: Uh-huh.

2 DS: And at one point I asked him why he -- said, why did
3 you do this? And he said something to the effect that, you were
4 going to call my -- my wife was going to call the police and I told
5 him something to the effect that we were here already. Why didn't
6 you just put the knife down? And he told me, I wasn't -- I'm not
7 going back to jail. And I said, is your life worth it? And he
8 said, yeah.

9 EM: Really?

10 DS: Yeah, it's all on tape.

11 EM: Okay. And as you're doing this, do you recall
12 anybody over here?

13 DS: Yeah, the -- I remember the lady. I don't know if
14 she was outside or inside. I remember that window being open I
15 think. The curtains on the window, so I'm not sure if she was
16 outside.

17 EM: Wide open?

18 DS: Yeah. She might have been outside at this point.
19 Out by the curb down where that -- I don't know what that yellow
20 thing is down there, but right in that area.

21 EM: Okay.

22 DS: Tom Triplett, Deputy Triplett showed up a couple
23 minutes later and I told her -- told him to go down and secure her
24 and he went down there.

25 EM: Okay.

26 DS: Started talking with her.

27 EM: And while you're waiting for the ambulance and that,
28 what's going on with him and you guys? Is he saying anything else?

1 DS: He was conscious and still awake. He told me that
2 he was sorry a couple times.

3 EM: Uh-huh.

4 DS: I just trying -- he kept saying, I'm dying, I'm
5 dying. And I told him, you're not dying, stay with us.

6 EM: Uh-huh.

7 DS: And I basically tried to give him first aid the best
8 that I could. Because he was alert and talking, I -- I just kind
9 of stayed with him.

10 EM: Uh-huh.

11 DS: I had to leave him at one point because the fire
12 department couldn't find where we were at so I ran up to the top of
13 the street and lit them up and got them down this area.

14 EM: Okay. Okay. When they came here, did you watch the
15 paramedics kind of work on him a little bit?

16 DS: Yeah, off and on. I was kind of going back -- I was
17 in this general area but I was kind of watching back and forth.

18 EM: Okay.

19 Any questions?

20 CT: Uh-uh.

21 JE: Victor stayed here while you went up to ambulance?

22 DS: You know what? I don't -- yeah, I want to say that
23 he stayed in the general area but I'm not positive if he stayed
24 right here. Tom went down to talk to the -- or down to the lady
25 so --

26 EM: So this is (INAUDIBLE) at this point what's going on
27 now? How do you feel and --

28 DS: How did I feel? Kind of disbelief that it actually

1 happened.

2 EM: Uh-huh.

3 DS: I was kind of focused on him pretty much the entire
4 time trying to do what we could for him. And as soon as fire got
5 here I kind of backed up and I was -- I just sat back in amazement.
6 Like couldn't believe this whole thing happened.

7 EM: Okay.

8 CT: I'm good.

9 EM: What time is it? 4:25? Okay. This is the end of
10 the interview, 4:25.

13 one to come up [REDACTED] I noticed the first house on my right was
14 [REDACTED] I continued up the street, noticed it was [REDACTED] turned
15 around right about here, went back down 'cause I noticed the
16 numbers were increasing.

17 JE: Um-hm.

18 VM: At that time Sparks arrived and I told him, hey, I
19 believe it's the house up -- up from where my units at now.

20 JE: So you guys met down there at the -- where the --
21 makes the right --

22 VM: Right.

23 JE: -- to come up here?

24 VM: Right.

25 JE: Where it goes from eastbound to southbound?

26 VM: We walked up that end of the street and noticed that
27 was [REDACTED] Therefore, we walked back up on the street where
28 we're standing now.

1. JE: Uh-huh.

2 VM: And located [REDACTED] on the wall. Sparks was to my right.
3 We walked down this driveway here and --

4 JE: Before you got to here, did you guys talk at all
5 about this address?

6 VM: I don't recall, no.

7 JE: Okay. So you both get here and Dave's on the right
8 as you come to the top of this driveway?

9 VM: Correct.

10 JE: You're on his left and then what happened?

11 VM: Right about here I could start hearing some yelling
12 between a male and a female screaming. A female appears to be
13 crying. The male is yelling, but I can't make out what he's
14 saying.

15 JE: Um-hm.

16 VM: Can I walk -- we --

17 JE: Yeah.

18 VM: -- walk down.

19 JE: Sure.

20 VM: Walk down the driveway. I think -- Sparks is on my
21 right. Sparks is on my right and as we're getting closer we can
22 hear more screaming, yelling. I can't make out what exactly is
23 being said.

24 JE: Okay. Stop right here for a second. You're coming
25 down here. Are you using flashlights and are you talking to each
26 other?

27 VM: I do have my flashlight on -- in my left -- left
28 hand. It's -- it's dark. I believe I have mine covered. I don't

1 want to illuminate myself, but I -- I still hear the voices, the
2 screaming, coming from inside the house so we're still walking.

3 JE: Okay. Just watch where you walk when you go down,
4 don't step on the tags.

5 VM: When we got to -- well, we had a visual on the porch
6 area it was right about here. Right about here I can see a male
7 subject wearing, like, a yellow coat with reflectors. I -- I
8 can -- I shined him and it reminded me of, like, a fireman's coat.

9 JE: Um-hm.

10 VM: So I shine him, Sparks is here and --

11 JE: So Sparks is standing basically by this Number 15?

12 VM: Basically, yeah.

13 JE: And you're just off to his left.

14 VM: I'm to his left, yes.

15 JE: Okay.

16 VM: The whole time I'm to his left. And he comes
17 walking pretty rapidly from the porch up about -- downstairs out
18 this way and right where the deputy -- right where he's standing I
19 notice he has something in his hand. When he gets -- the subject
20 gets right about there, it -- it's a knife. He's holding it with
21 his right hand up above his -- up above his head around shoulder to
22 head height. And he's angry. I mean he's yelling. I go Sheriff's
23 Department. Drop the knife. Drop the knife. And he wasn't
24 listening. He was walking fast and I started pretty much screaming
25 at him, drop the knife. Sheriff's Department, drop the knife.
26 When I see the knife, I draw. I've got my flashlight.

27 EM: About what point did you see him with the knife?
28 Was it as he passes the fence or just before?

1 VM: Right about there I notice he's got the knife out
2 here and he goes --

3 EM: Okay.

4 VM: And he's yelling and -- he's yelling punk, go ahead
5 and kill me. Kill me. Go ahead and shoot me. And he -- I've

7 EM: Okay.

8 VM: And he's walking fast at us.

9 EM: So let's stop here for a second. Go ahead.

10 VM: Okay.

11 EM: Tell me a little bit about what's going on inside

26 VM: I heard Dave saying drop the knife. Drop the knife.

27 EM: Okay. And there's no doubt in your mind that he
28 sees you and he knows who you guys are?

1 VM: Oh, yeah. There's no doubt in my mind.
2 EM: Okay.
3 JE: And your flashlights are fully on now. This guy is
4 lit up.
5 VM: Correct.
6 JE: Okay.
7 EM: And what is he yelling?
8 VM: I'm lighting up the whole time and he's -- I just
9 remember him saying go ahead and kill me. Kill me. Shoot me. And
10 we're -- we're about right here and he -- he's walking real fast
11 towards us. He goes from a fast speed walk to -- from fast to
12 faster, okay. And Dave and I start retreating back. Drop the
13 knife. Drop the knife.
14 EM: Um-hm.
15 VM: And we scoot back. Scoot back.
16 EM: As he's approaching you --
17 VM: As he's approaching -- he's close --
18 EM: How's -- how's he holding his knife?
19 VM: He still has -- he had it up the whole time.
20 EM: Okay.
21 VM: He had it above his -- between shoulder and head --
22 head height.
23 EM: Now was the knife --
24 VM: And he's --
25 EM: -- held like -- or do you recall? You see --
26 VM: It was either like this or like that. I -- but I
27 just -- I'm just lighting up and I see the knife.
28 EM: There is no doubt in your mind it's a knife.

28 point it' --

2 what in particular other than just go ahead and kill me. Kill me.
3 Shoot me.

4 EM: Okay. And the way he's saying that is -- is angry?

5 VM: He's -- he's angry. He's --

22 drop the knife. And as soon as we -- we drew up, I thought he'd
23 drop it right away 'cause --

24 EM: Um-hm.

25 VM: 'Cause of our presence and so forth. That wasn't
26 the case. He closed in on us rapidly.

27 EM: Okay.

28 VM: So we retreated and he was closing the gap a lot

1 faster than we can retreat.

2 EM: Okay. So -- while we're standing here somewhere
3 around -- we're right at the end of the driveway basically where
4 it's -- I don't know what kind of plant that is, cactus or
5 whatever, we're parallel with that. Where is he at that point when
6 you're standing there?

7 VM: I'd have to say right about --

8 EM: Right here?

9 VM: Right about there. Yeah, and we're --

10 EM: Right about 22?

8 faster, and that's when I double tap and shot him twice.

9 EM: By fast do you think he's charging is what you're --

10 VM: A charge, correct. Like a --

11 EM: How was he charging -- I mean where is that knife?

13 He -- he's up here.

14 EM: Up here?

8 VM: I'm covering -- I tell Dave - Dave, I'll cover you,
9 handcuff him. He gets his handcuffs, puts the handcuff on. I

15 EM: -- for a second now. When he is shot --

16 JE: Stay right there.

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
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
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


Interview of

On July 26, 2005 at approximately 2250 hours, I conducted a recorded interview with   is the wife of the deceased in this case, Scott Osler. The interview was conducted in my car, near  home.

Prior to interviewing  about the incident, I asked her to describe her family to me.  explained to me that she lives with her husband, Scott, and her two children,  and   and Scott have been married for almost 15 years.  works for  and Scott works for  Scott drives a cement truck and has worked for the company for several years.

The Osler's have had a stable marriage with one exception. About 6 or 7 years ago, Scott was out of work and began using Methamphetamine. During an argument around the same time, Scott threw an ice chest at  which struck her in the leg. Scott was arrested and charged with spousal abuse.  obtained a restraining order and had it served on Scott. She intended to divorce Scott; however, Scott attended court ordered counseling and stopped using drugs and they reconciled their marriage. Since that

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time, they have not had any serious problems in their marriage. ██████ said that a few times in any given year, Scott might drink too much; however he would usually sleep it off. ██████ told me that Scott is tested regularly at work for drugs.


I asked ██████ to tell me what happened. In summary, ██████ told me the following.

The family ██████ Scott, ██████ & ██████ arrived home on 7-25-05, from a 12-day vacation. For vacation, they went on a 12-day houseboat ride on Lake Trinity. According to ██████ the family had a great vacation together.

The following morning Scott and ██████ went to work as usual. Scott called ██████ at work around 1900 hours (7-26-05) and told her would stop and get burritos for dinner. ██████ told Scott she was getting ready to leave work and would be home soon.

██████ arrived home at about 1930 hours and discovered that Scott was not home yet. ██████ called Scott on his cell phone. Scott told ██████ that he had stopped by a friend's ██████ house to have a beer with him in celebration of his friend selling his home. Scott told ██████ he already had the burritos. ██████ pointed out that the burritos were going to get cold and asked Scott to bring them to the house. Scott said he would be home shortly.

At about 7:55 PM, Scott arrived home and the family began eating. ██████ said, "So, he got home. We sat down; we ate dinner. And as we were eating dinner, he just seemed like he had been drinking and um, starting getting, just kind of silly talk. And so, the girls and I just got up and walked out of the room. And he walked into my room and just was complaining about [sic], um, that I don't, I don't know what the word he said -- I don't respect him, and he works a lot of long hours and how many hours did he work today. He gets like that sometimes." I asked ██████ if Scott was using vulgar language. ██████ said he was, and he was calling her names. I also asked ██████ at what point she and her daughters got up to leave the dinner table. ██████ said it was about five minutes after they sat down.

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
I asked [redacted] if Scott was drinking at the house. [redacted] told me that he did not drink at the house and that Scott "came home intoxicated. I don't know what he'd dranken [sic]. He said he had a beer, but I know it had to be more than a beer. He was at a friends house." I asked [redacted] to describe to me what she meant by intoxicated. [redacted] said, "I could just- - he wasn't making sense and he was kind of, not belligerent and not slurring his words. He just wasn't himself. He wasn't- - The girls and I just knew. I said, 'Have you been drinkin?'" He said, 'I had a beer.' And I said, 'you've had to have more than that; something's wrong.' And he said, 'All I had was a beer. I told him I was gonna have a beer.'" I asked [redacted] if she could smell alcohol on him. [redacted] said she could not.

I told [redacted] that I realized Scott was tested for drugs at work, but asked if she thought there was a chance Scott had used some drugs tonight. [redacted] said it was certainly a possibility. I asked if Scott's friend [redacted] was the type of person who would do drugs. [redacted] said she knows [redacted] and does not think he is that type of person but added that you never know about people anymore.

[redacted] told me that in the past if she simply walked away from Scott when he was like this, things would settle down. However, tonight Scott would not let things go and kept talking and talking about how he was not respected and appreciated.

Scott became more "belligerent" and said he was going to take the family's motor home. [redacted] pointed out to Scott that the motor home had a bad tire on it and told him if he was going to leave he should take the truck or his motorcycle. This upset Scott and he took off in his truck. Scott came back to the house about 20 minutes later. [redacted] saw Scott walking down the driveway and wondered where his truck was. She went outside, called to Scott and asked him what he was doing. Scott told her he parked his truck up the street and was going to get his motorcycle. Scott then went inside and locked [redacted] out of the house. [redacted] was able to call one of her daughters to let her back into the house.

Scott began telling [redacted] that she does not respect what he does and all of the work he does for the family. Scott continued talking and became "really nasty" and said he was going to divorce [redacted]. Scott then punched a picture in the hallway and cut his knuckles. Scott began, "leaking blood everywhere." As Scott walked back and forth through the house, he dripped blood "everywhere."

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██████ told Scott that if he did not leave she would call the police. According to ██████ Scott then said, "You call the police and I'm gonna run my head through a wall and tell them you hit me." Scott walked out of the house and came back inside. Scott continued to talk, "nonsense" and saying things like, "I'm not going down without a fight." ██████ tried to calm Scott down by telling him that she wouldn't call the police and she just wanted him to calm down. Scott then began "taunting" their daughter. When Scott started doing this, ██████ told him, "I will call the police if you don't lay off."

Scott then went into the kitchen and got a knife. Scott asked ██████ "Do you want me to slit your throat?" According to ██████ Scott also said, "If you call the police then I'm go - - um, I'm gonna make - - I'm not gonna go without a fight. Or something to that effect." ██████ told me that at this point she had not called the police, but said "apparently somebody had called the police because as soon as he went outside there were two officers in the driveway."

██████ told me she went to her bedroom window, which overlooks the driveway, and began screaming for Scott to put the knife down. According to ██████ "The officers were telling him to put the knife down. He wouldn't put the knife down. The officer's were backing up. He wouldn't put the knife down. They asked him, 'please put the knife down.' He wouldn't put the knife down and finally - - I think they shot him twice and he went down. That's it."

I asked ██████ where ██████ and ██████ were when all of this was happening. ██████ said that ██████ was in her room with her door closed and ██████ was in ██████ closet on the phone with the police. ██████ told me she did not learn that ██████ called the police until after the shooting. ██████ also told me that both of her daughters heard the gunshots, but she did not think they (her daughters) knew that their father had a knife.

I began to ask ██████ specific questions about the actual shooting. When ██████ looked out her bedroom window, she could see the deputies and Scott. I asked ██████ how far apart they were. ██████ said, "I don't know. I wanna say like, ten - twenty feet apart - ten - fifteen feet apart, I think originally." I added, "Like a car length apart?" ██████ agreed. I then said, "I'm not trying to put words in your mouth." ██████ answered, "No, I'm thinking. It changed -- I mean he was - my husband was

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walking up the driveway so as they – and they were in the shadows a little bit. I could see two officers and I could hear them telling him to put the knife down and my husband saying no. I remember what he was telling them something [sic]. And then they kept telling him to put it down and they were backing up and he was going forward. And then um, I saw them shoot him.”

I asked [redacted] if she could remember any of the things that were being said. [redacted] answered, “Yeah, you know what; I think he was just - - I think he was saying, ‘You’re gonna have to kill me’ or, I don’t know what he- - I can’t remember actually what he was saying. I - - I heard the officer, ‘Put it down, put it down, put it down.’ He [Scott] never stopped, he kept walking.” [redacted] told me she could hear the officers very clearly. [redacted] then added, “He was screaming. My husband was screaming something. I just can’t remember what it was.”

I then talked to [redacted] about how Scott was holding the knife during the confrontation with the deputies. [redacted] told me he was holding the knife in his fist but because his back was to her, she could not see and/or remember what he was doing with the knife. [redacted] also said, “I just, yeah, I just know that he kept walking. He wouldn’t put it down.”

We then talked about the manner in which the deputies interacted with Scott during the confrontation. [redacted] described the deputies as initially talking in a calming tone but then escalating to firm orders just prior to the shooting. [redacted] said, “I think they thought that, you know, all they would do is ask him to put it down and he would put it down. But, he wasn’t going for it.” I asked if Scott was stubborn in that way. [redacted] said, “Stupid that way! You know what, I – I honestly, I don’t understand that personally. I really, I honest to God, I don’t - - To me it’s just a selfish thing to do. I don’t understand why he did it. Honest to God, I really don’t. You know what I mean? I mean why would you do something like that. You know what happens. You know what I mean. I mean, you can’t come at a police officer with a weapon and not expect to know what happens. I just, it doesn’t make sense to me. So, I don’t—stubborn, to me it’s more than stubborn, it’s, it’s stupid.”

Later in the interview I asked [redacted] if we could talk about what happened immediately after the shooting. I asked [redacted] to clarify if she heard the deputies shoot or actually saw the shooting. [redacted]

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said, 'No, I saw them. I – I was screaming cause I just knew that they were going to shoot him. He wasn't, he wasn't backing off and I was screaming and I saw them shoot, and I was like 'oh no, they shot him.' And then, all I could think of was my kids. I didn't want them to see that and um, as soon as they did that; I went to look for my kids and make sure that were O.K. And I saw that my little one was on the phone with the police and my oldest was on the phone with my sister. And then the officer came to my door and said we should come outside and sit outside for a while. So that's what I did." I asked [REDACTED] if she saw the flash of the gunfire. [REDACTED] said she saw the smoke and thought she saw something else but was unsure if it was the flash of the shots.

I asked [REDACTED] to tell me what she heard after the shots and after Scott made the statement about going to be with his brother. [REDACTED] said, "I heard them tell him to put your arms behind your back, that kind of stuff. I didn't think they were still wrestling with him. You know, he was down and I heard him say, 'You shot me, you shot me.' Or something like that."

I asked [REDACTED] if she could think of anything that may have contributed to what happened or if she saw anything leading up to tonight. [REDACTED] said she could not think of a single thing, she continued and said that she wished she could think of something because then it would make it all easier to understand. [REDACTED] continued and told me that even after he had been shot she heard him "talking stupid." [REDACTED] said, "I heard—what was he sayin' – after they shot him he said, 'I'm gonna go be with my brother and my- -'" [REDACTED] continued and told me that Scott's father is also dead.

I asked if there was any history of mental illness in Scott's family or if Scott ever sought counseling for any reason. [REDACTED] said there was no mental illness in his family and Scott only saw a counselor as a result of his domestic violence arrest. I asked [REDACTED] if she could remember the name of the counselor. [REDACTED] told me the counselor was [REDACTED] in Ventura. I also asked [REDACTED] if Scott has had any recent mood changes; [REDACTED] said no.

We then talked about Scott's medical history. [REDACTED] told me that Scott has no current medical problems, but did [REDACTED]

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
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I noticed that [REDACTED] had a small cut on her arm and I asked her about it. [REDACTED] told me that the injury happened while they were on vacation. [REDACTED] then said, "He didn't touch me. He didn't lay a hand on me. I mean, he knew."

After about 35 minutes, I concluded the interview. I asked [REDACTED] if I could recontact her later if I had additional questions. [REDACTED] told me that would be fine. [REDACTED] returned to the area her daughters were sitting and I then began an interview with [REDACTED]. For the details of that interview, refer to my report titled, "Interview of [REDACTED]"
