

Incident Scene Report

On 11/14/06, at about 1835 hours, I received a telephone call from Captain Kelley, who requested that I respond to assist with the investigation of an officer-involved shooting at [REDACTED] Thousand Oaks. I responded to the incident scene from the Ventura Major Crimes' Office, and I arrived at the scene at about 1920 hours.

When I arrived on scene, I noted numerous emergency services resources already deployed, including numerous sheriff's personnel and Ventura County Fire Department personnel. I also noted that crime scene tape marked off an outer perimeter, and that an inner perimeter surrounding the incident scene had also been cordoned off with crime scene tape. There were no personnel inside the inner perimeter scene when I arrived.

I met with my partner, Detective Rob Davidson, who had arrived before me. Detective Davidson briefed me on the circumstances surrounding the shooting, and, in summary, told me the following. Senior Deputy Shane Matthews was working as a plain-clothes property crimes detective, and he went to the apartments at [REDACTED] to interview a witness in a grand theft investigation. During his interview with the witness, a man, who was later identified as Adrian Canley, approached Matthews and initiated a confrontation. As the confrontation unfolded, Canley got into a white Ford pickup and drove toward Matthews. Matthews then reportedly fired several shots from his service pistol at Canley, striking Canley at least once in the upper chest. Canley was administered first aid at the scene, and he was transported to the

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
Los Robles Regional Medical Center where he died from his wounds. As we spoke, Detective Davidson pointed out various features inside the inner perimeter scene, including a white Ford F-150 pickup, several expended pistol cartridges, clothing, and first aid supplies.

I noted the property at [REDACTED] consists of (2) two-story apartment buildings, a community center building, and numerous covered carports with an open parking area. The property to the west of [REDACTED] which has an address of [REDACTED] [REDACTED] has a three story senior citizen complex that overlooks the parking area where this incident occurred. The property east of [REDACTED] is mostly undeveloped with some low-lying residential structures.

The complex at [REDACTED] is known as [REDACTED] and it is accessed off of [REDACTED]. As one enters the complex, there is a long asphalt driveway that extends approximately 350 feet toward the south end of the property. On the east side of the driveway, just past the property entrance, is a two-story apartment building containing apartments [REDACTED] and there are covered carports along the west side of the driveway. There is a community center building with an outdoor pool on the east side of the property, just south of the aforementioned apartment building.

In the center of the driveway, past the first apartment building and the community center building, is a large circular planter containing a tree. This planter and tree serve as a traffic round, and the driveway continues around and past the planter. There are two opposing sets of covered carports just south of the planter, and there is a U-shaped two-story apartment building just south of the covered carports. The U-shaped apartment building contains apartments [REDACTED]. To the east of the opposing carports is a small parking lot, which is where this incident unfolded.

The parking lot is paved with asphalt and it is accessed off of the traffic round (just east of the large circular planter with the tree). The access way into the parking lot is at the northwest corner of the parking lot. The parking lot is rectangular in shape and measures approximately 100 feet in length (north to south) and approximately 66 feet in width (east to west). The north side of the parking lot is enclosed with a concrete curb, planter, sidewalk, and the community center building. The east side of the parking lot is enclosed with a concrete

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curb, planter, and a 6-foot cinder block wall, which is capped with wrought iron fencing. The south side of the parking lot is enclosed with a concrete curb, a grassy standoff, and the north exterior wall of apartments 108 and 208. The west side of the parking lot is enclosed with a cement curb, a grassy standoff, and the east wall of the covered carports. There are 9 parking stalls perpendicular to the west curb line and there are 11 parking stalls perpendicular to the east curb line. There is a raised cement planter on the north side of the parking stalls against the west curb line. That planter contained several thick rose bushes and a tree.

I examined the inner perimeter of the incident scene, which included the entire parking lot area described above. There were 14 vehicles parked within the parking area. All of the vehicles were within marked parking stalls with the exception of a marked black and white Thousand Oaks Police Ford Crown Victoria patrol vehicle (unit #3263) and a white Ford F-150 pickup truck, [REDACTED]. The patrol unit was parked facing in an easterly direction just inside the driveway entrance to the parking lot, and the white Ford F-150 was parked facing in a northerly direction against the north curb line of the parking area. The black and white patrol unit was parked partially behind and perpendicular to the Ford F-150. Also of note was Detective Matthews' unmarked police vehicle, which was a maroon colored Chevrolet Astro van, [REDACTED]. It was parked against the east curb line in the third stall south of the north curb line and, its right rear cargo door was standing open.

I examined each of the vehicles located within the incident scene and I saw no evidence that led me to believe any of the other vehicles within the parking area contained any evidence, sustained any damage, or were involved in this incident in any manner. For specific details of the other vehicles parked within the scene, refer to Senior Deputy Godfrey's supplemental report and/or the incident scene images.

As I walked around the perimeter of the incident scene, I saw a small notebook and a compact disc with a Sheriff's Department label lying on the grassy area on the west side of the parking area between the sidewalk and the east wall of the carports. I later learned that the notebook and disc belonged to Detective Matthews and he dropped them on the grass as the confrontation between he and Canley unfolded.

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

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I continued examining the incident scene, and I found a pair of acceleration scuffmarks in the third parking stall south of the parking area entrance, on the west side of the parking lot. Each of the scuffmarks were approximately 3 feet in length and appeared to have been freshly created based on the black powdery rubber residue I could see on the surface of the scuffmarks. The scuffmarks were in such a position within the stall that they appeared to have been made by the rapid acceleration of the rear wheels of a vehicle that was parked nose in (or the front wheels of a vehicle that was backed into the stall). Senior Deputy Godfrey, who responded to the scene to prepare a factual diagram, measured the scuffmarks and found them to be approximately the same size as the exterior wheelbase of the rear tires on the Ford F-150 pickup. I found no other fresh acceleration or deceleration scuffmarks on the parking lot.

I noted four expended silver colored .40 caliber Speer cartridge casings lying on the asphalt near the southern most portion of the entrance to the parking area. A fifth casing was found lying in the raised flowerbed that borders the southern most portion of the entrance to the parking area. All of the casings were within approximately 3 feet of each other.

In the driveway of the parking area immediately adjacent to the first parking stall south of the entrance to the parking area was a field of automotive fluid. The fluid field began at the first parking stall south of the parking area entrance and led to the underside of the engine compartment area of the Ford F-150 pickup where it pooled at the north curb line of the parking area. I could smell the distinct odor of radiator coolant emanating from the fluid field. Near the beginning of the fluid field, I noted a piece of copper bullet jacketing and a fragment of lead. I noted another piece of copper bullet jacketing under the marked police vehicle, which was parked across the fluid field. Refer to Senior Deputy Godfrey's diagram and the crime scene images for additional information.

I examined the white Ford F-150 pickup, and I noted that each of its four tires appeared to be properly inflated. I saw minor collision damage on the driver's side and front bumper of the vehicle, and miscellaneous scratches and dings on the truck body. I could see that the truck's driver's side window and passenger side window were partially rolled down, and I could see scratches and handprints on the exterior of the window. I looked into the truck from the exterior and noted the gear selector was in "D" or "drive." I could see that the ignition was in an

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"off" position, and I noted the vehicle keys were still in the ignition. I could also see a small folding knife wedged into the space between the driver's seat cushion and the seat back. The blade on the folding knife was open; however, it appeared to have been wedged in the seat for some time based on the amount of debris that was accumulated on top of the knife. I also noted a pair of binoculars sitting on the seat cushion of the front passenger's seat.

As I examined the Ford F-150, I noted two apparent bullet strikes on the front grill area of the truck. The first impact I noted was on the front bumper. I could see the bullet imbedded in the metal of the bumper without penetrating the metal. The second impact penetrated the truck's plastic grill and traveled through the radiator and into the engine compartment. I believe the fragments from this particular bullet were the ones I noted at the beginning of the fluid field the truck left behind. I also noted three bullet holes in the truck's windshield, directly in front of the driver's seat. I could see corresponding damage to the truck's dashboard from the bullets that passed through the windshield.

I observed several items of clothing, various emergency medical supplies, a cellular telephone, a butane lighter, knit gloves, white tennis shoes, an expended bullet, and a large caliber black handgun lying on the ground, next to the left front tire of the truck. Based on statements of witnesses I obtained, the clothing was removed from Canley during attempted life saving procedures. I also learned that the personal property was removed from Canley's person, including the black handgun, which had been found tucked in the right side waistband of Canley's pants by attending paramedics/firefighters. Much of the clothing and the handgun were soaked in radiator fluid.

Field Evidence Technician [REDACTED] responded to the incident scene and took overall digital images. He then placed photo markers on each item of evidence and took more overall digital images of the scene and of each item of evidence.

I examined the firearm that had been found on Canley's person by emergency medical personnel. I found the pistol to be manufactured by Hi-Point Firearms with a model number of JHP45ACP and a serial number of [REDACTED]. The pistol was black in color and manufactured in .45 ACP caliber. I noted that the weapon's safety was "on," meaning the thumb safety lever would have to be depressed before the weapon could be fired. I removed the magazine from

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the pistol and I found it to be loaded with seven .45 ACP rounds. I then opened the pistol's action and found a single .45 ACP round in the firing chamber. After clearing the weapon, I gave it to [REDACTED]

After taking digital images of the scene, [REDACTED] collected and packaged each item of evidence. He later booked the evidence into a secure storage locker at the East County Sheriff's Station. Refer to [REDACTED] property report for additional information.



Transcript of Matthews Walk-thru

On 02/01/06, I reviewed the digital audio recording Detective Rob Davidson created of the statement and walk-thru demonstration Detective Shane Matthews provided concerning his encounter and subsequent shooting of Adrian Canley on 11/14/06. Detective Davidson provided me with a copy of the recording, which I submitted for transcription. On 01/31/07, I received a typewritten transcript of the audio recording.

I listened to the entire audio recording, and I made some minor editing corrections to the written transcript. The typewritten transcript is now an accurate representation of the contents of the digital audio recording. Refer to the attached transcript and the digital audio recording for specific details.

(SHANE MATTHEWS WALK-THROUGH)

1 RD: Okay. The date is November the 15th, 2006. It is
2 approximately two minutes after midnight. This will be a walk-thru
3 with Detective Shane Matthews regarding an officer-involved
4 shooting that took place in a parking lot at [REDACTED] at
5 approximately 1800 hours. I'm going to go ahead and go around and
6 have everyone introduce themselves as being present for the
walk-thru just so that I don't forget any names.

8 I'll -- I'll announce my partner Bill Ayub, obviously
9 Detective Matthews.

10 BH: Bill Hadden.

11 RS: Rick Shimmel.

12 SR: Stacy Ratner.

13 BK: Brian Keighron.

14 LS: Lance Steaman.

15 DM: Dave Murray.

16 TI: Todd Inglis.

17 RD: Okay. And those are the -- the people that are
18 being present for the walk-thru. And for the benefit of tape we'll
19 be beginning the walk-thru at the entrance to a -- to the small
parking lot where the incident took place. The scene has already

1 been processed, photo markers are -- have been left in place for
2 our benefit and I believe some evidence is still present. The
3 scene's still being processed.

4 So Shane, what we're going to do as I told you or alluded
5 to earlier, is we're going to start here and I'd like you to
6 describe for us if you could just in general what brought you here.
7 Okay? Not the incident at all. Just what brought you here and
8 what the conditions were, were you here, who you were talking to,
9 that kind of stuff. Just kind of introduce us to -- to why you
10 were here.

11 SM: I came here just after 5:00 o'clock to interview a
12 witness slash suspect in a grand theft that I was investigating
13 from GNC at the Oaks mall. He lives in Apartment [REDACTED] which is
14 south from here up the stairs on the second level. I walked over
15 to the apartment, I knocked on the door. His mom and his brother
16 answered. His -- the -- the person I was trying to contact, his
17 name was [REDACTED] His brother [REDACTED] and his mom answered the
18 door. They told me he was not at the location. I gave them my
19 name and my phone number and asked them to have him call me.

20 I already knew what [REDACTED] looked like 'cause I had
21 pulled a DMV photo earlier of him. I turned my recorder off, I
22 came down the stairs. I -- as I was walking, exited the bottom
23 portion of the stairs and was walking past this first couple cars,
24 [REDACTED] passed me walking towards his apartment. I recognized him
25 and I asked if he was [REDACTED] He said yes. I introduced myself
26 and we had a conversation on the sidewalk in front of that mini
27 van, the white mini van for approximately ten minutes.

28 RD: Okay. I'm going to stop you just for the -- for our

benefit. The -- the white mini van is the last vehicle in the southwest most corner of the parking lot. It's the -- it's the last vehicle or the first vehicle depending on which way you're coming into the parking lot. And the apartment complex would be to the southeast of you. And then there's another lower one-story building that's to your west.

SM: Actually a parking structure.

RD: And it's a -- okay. It's a parking structure.

SM: Correct.

RD: So go ahead and continue. Okay, correct.

SM: So after about ten minutes, I asked him if he wanted to go into his apartment and sit down and continue our conversation. He said no, let's just sit on the stairs. So we walked over to the stairs that you see right there on south of the mini van. He sat on the stairs and I stood next to him while we talked about the case. We spoke for about a half an hour total.

At -- towards the end of our conversation a guy appeared behind me maybe ten feet behind me. I don't know where he came from or how he got there, all I heard was something to the effect of, I know you're the fuckin' sheriff and I'm not-- and you're not going to take me. And I turned around and I saw Hispanic male about 5'10, a hundred and seventy, black-hooded sweatshirt, black pants. I believe black shoes and he was pacing back and forth and kind of -- kind of animated in his hand movements and mad-dogging me and staring at me. And my initial opinion was he's high on some kind of stimulant and he's a gang member. He looked like a gang member, shaved head.

I don't remember saying anything to him at that time. I

1 just kind of turned my back and turned back to -- looked at [REDACTED]
2 and [REDACTED] just kind of shrugged his shoulders like I don't know
3 who the guy is. So he -- the -- the Hispanic male walked westbound
4 on the sidewalk kind of out of my view. [REDACTED] and I wrapped up
5 our conversation.

6 At that time he -- the guy walked back over and made
7 another comment, something to the effect of fuckin' sheriff ain't
8 going to take me. I'm not -- you're not going to take me alive.
9 Words to those effect. At that point I told [REDACTED] thanks for
10 talking to me. I turned and I -- I headed for the suspect who,
11 he's maybe fifteen feet in front of me.

12 RD: Okay.

13 SM: To -- 'cause now -- now I don't -- I don't know
14 what's going on. He's telling me I'm not going to take him alive.
15 It looked -- it appeared to me that he had just been chased. Like
16 he had that adrenaline rush going, he's high, he'd just been chased
17 like somebody's looking for him. And he knew I was a sheriff.
18 He's saying, fuckin' sheriff ain't going to take me alive so I was
19 going to contact him.

20 RD: Okay.

21 SM: And he immediately bolted.

22 RD: Okay. With that, let's move down to that area so
23 that we're -- we're kind of a little more in the area that we're
24 now talking about.

25 SM: Okay.

26 RD: So for the benefit of the tape, we're going south
27 through the entrance to the parking lot and we're now on the -- the
28 walkway that leads along the west side of the parking lot and we

1 are walking towards the stairwell and the white mini van that we
2 referenced earlier.

3 So whenever you think you're in a spot where you can kind
4 of point things out, go ahead and stop and we'll continue.

5 SM: I'll show you where I was standing, where he was
6 standing. I was standing (INAUDIBLE).

7 RD: Hold on. Hold on a second.

8 That's all right.

9 SM: I was standing right here.

10 RD: Okay. Let's --

11 BH: (INAUDIBLE) identify (INAUDIBLE).

12 SM: I'm standing at the base of the stairs on the
13 elevated platform to the stairs.

14 RD: Okay.

15 SM: Kind of right now 'cause I'm freezing cold.

16 RD: Here. Hold on a second. I hope you're an 'SC fan.

17 SM: Huh?

18 RD: I hope you're an 'SC fan.

19 SM: I am, actually.

20 RD: Good. For the benefit of -- of the tape, I'm just
21 going to ask you what is the address of this building if you know.

22 SM: It's -- the address where I was going?

23 RD: Yeah.

24 SM: It's [REDACTED]

25 RD: 210. Okay. So this is [REDACTED] 'Cause there's --
26 seems to be a lot of buildings in the area so I --

27 SM: Well, the sign at the bottom says 2222.

28 RD: Uh-huh.

1 SM: Apartment [REDACTED] up here.

2 RD: Okay. So we're at the --

3 SM: So --

4 RD: -- stairwell that leads to the second floor of that
5 building.

6 SM: Right. I'm standing here, suspect's standing at the
7 intersection by the -- the water spot is. Where the two sidewalks
8 meet.

9 RD: Okay. There's a sidewalk that goes to the --
10 north -- it's actually all, all points of the compass. North,
11 south, east and west. With the -- with the walkway that we just
12 came heading to the north and the suspect was standing at that
13 intersection.

14 Go ahead.

15 SM: So I -- as soon as I stepped off, I stepped off of
16 this platform here and -- and as soon as I took a couple of steps
17 towards him he took off running that way.

18 RD: Okay. Northbound through the -- or on the west
19 sidewalk.

20 SM: He went northbound on the sidewalk.

21 RD: Okay.

22 SM: West of the parking lot.

23 RD: Okay.

24 SM: Along the -- the trees there.

25 RD: Okay.

26 SM: I chased after him. As he -- as he started running,
27 he was -- he was fumbling with something and he was reaching into
28 the front of his waistband. I don't know if it was his waistband

1 or his sweatshirt or what it was but he was reaching in front and I
2 couldn't see. And he'd already made a comment about not being
3 taken or not being taken alive and either or both of those. I
4 can't remember. So as I'm running, I threw my notebook down, which
5 is next to the tree, the second tree along the sidewalk.

6 RD: Okay. Let's -- let's actually start walking back up
7 that way now.

8 SM: I remember about right --

9 RD: Hold on until we get up there just (INAUDIBLE).

10 SM: Well, I'll start here because --

11 RD: Okay.

12 SM: -- right about here is where I remember see --
13 seeing him reaching for something.

14 BH: And here is where?

15 SM: I'm sorry, the intersection of the sidewalks.

16 RD: Okay.

17 SM: So I remember having my notebook in my right hand
18 and about here is where I -- I drew my gun. I'm left-handed so I
19 drew my gun with my left hand and I threw my notebook down and --

20 RD: We're now proceeding north on the west walkway.

21 SM: And I was telling him to stop, Sheriff's Department,
22 stop. His truck was parked in the third parking space south of the
23 planter next to this blue car.

24 RD: Okay.

25 SM: He got into the driver's -- the truck was parked
26 nose in. He jumped in the driver door, I came up to the driver
27 door with my gun out yelling Sheriff's Department, stop. Get out
28 of the truck, get out of truck. The window was half down. He's --

1 he was hitting -- I was -- if I remember, trying to grab the window
2 but he was hitting the window trying to keep my hands off of it. I
3 tried to break the window twice by hitting my -- the -- the nose of
4 my gun against the window so I could grab it. It -- the window
5 didn't break. By that time he had the truck on and I grabbed the
6 driver handle and he -- he backed out quickly.

7 RD: Okay.

8 SM: So when he backed out I kind of went with -- I went
9 with the truck, not -- not on purpose but kind of just -- it kind
10 of pulled me out. So then his truck is here and I'm now standing
11 in front of the truck.

12 RD: Okay. Let -- for the benefit of the tape, you're --
13 you're motioning that he is backed out. Is the back of his truck
14 now facing the -- the building that you were just at? In other
15 words, the -- the tail end of the truck is south and the nose of
16 the truck is north.

17 SM: Correct.

18 RD: Okay.

19 SL: So the -- on -- on the -- I'm in front of the truck
20 but more towards the driver's side. I -- honest, I said to myself,
21 how did you end -- you know I'm thinking, how did I end up in front
22 of the truck 'cause I didn't -- I didn't intentionally end up in
23 front of the truck, just the -- the way the truck came out and me
24 holding on I just ended up here. I'm yelling at him to stop the
25 whole time. I start backing up, he -- and he's yelling at me the
26 whole time through the window. You know, fuck you. I -- I can't
27 remember everything that he was saying but he was pretty pissed
28 off.

1 RD: Okay. The -- the tone of what he's saying to you,
2 you can tell that he's pissed off?

3 SM: Yeah.

4 RD: Okay. And you made out -- are you sure that he said
5 fuck you? Or I mean, there was a lot --

6 SM: There's a lot of F's in there. I don't -- I don't
7 remember.

8 RD: Okay. Okay.

9 SM: If the "you" came out but --

10 RD: Okay.

11 SM: So I'm in front of the truck. I started
12 backpedaling to get away from the truck. He started coming
13 forward. I fired two rounds at the truck. I could -- at the truck
14 that was coming at me. I don't remember hearing the -- don't
15 remember hearing the -- the gunshots but I remember staring -- I
16 was staring at the grill of the truck as it was coming and that's
17 exactly where the shots went. And I knew my gun had fired because
18 of the recoil and the -- the pieces of the grill kind of went
19 flying. You know, it broke apart. I yelled stop again. I was
20 still just -- as this is going on I'm still walking backwards. So
21 I'm thinking about right -- right in here.

22 RD: In here we're in front of the parking space?

23 SM: It was second parking space.

24 RD: Okay. So we've moved now north a parking space.

25 SM: He revved the engine. I -- I heard the tires squeal
26 and, I mean, it happened -- it felt like it was in slow motion but
27 I know it was -- it was super quick. It was boom, boom. Stop,
28 stop. And then (tire screeching noise) and then boom, boom, boom.

1 I -- I remember specifically looking right at his head that was in
2 the windshield and aiming at his head when I fired. And the
3 rounds, I watched the rou- -- the -- where the windshield meets the
4 dashboard it kind of splintered or the -- the windshield cracked
5 and splintered and as he's coming at me I -- I fired the rounds and
6 peeled off and he -- he was yelling you shot me, I'm hit. And then
7 the truck just slowly rolled forward and it stops where you see it
8 now.

9 RD: Okay.

10 SM: So then I -- I ran up to the back of the truck and I
11 was yelling at him not to move, don't move. Let me see your hands.
12 I -- I remember yelling who are you? You know, what -- why did you
13 do this or what were you doing? Something to that effect.

14 I yelled to [REDACTED] who was standing about where Kadosono
15 is, about the third parking space down, to call 911 'cause I didn't
16 have a radio. I remember as I'm crouched behind the -- the
17 tailgate of the truck on the driver's side --

18 RD: You're motioning that you -- you're still drawn
19 down?

20 SM: I'm drawn down, I'm crouched behind the cover of the
21 tailgate.

22 RD: Okay.

23 SM: (INAUDIBLE) concealment not cover but -- and pulling
24 my Nextel out and trying to finger through my Nextel to -- to reach
25 any patrol unit. I tried 9G and 9D a couple times. It didn't go
26 through. And then I got through to 9041, who's Paul Ferruzza. He
27 acknowledged me and I just told him I'm at [REDACTED] shots
28 are fired, I need Code 3 backup right now. He said I'm en route

1 and hung up. I mean, it was that quick.

2 And about that time [REDACTED] asked me what my last name
3 was again so he could tell the dispatcher. I said Matthews.

4 The guy the whole time is -- is mo- -- yelling you shot
5 me. I'm hit. He's kind of moaning. I -- I back up and go to --
6 go to the back of my van. I -- I had a flashlight in the back of
7 the van. I grabbed my flashlight, I go back to the tailgate and I
8 shine my light. The driver's door was open. He had opened the
9 door so I could see a portion of his shoulder and a portion of his
10 head.

11 And he was no longer talking, he was just kind of
12 moaning. I told him let me see your hands, let me see your hands.
13 I approached. He was slouched over and both his hands were out
14 like this. I could see some blood on the -- on the front of his
15 jacket or his sweatshirt. I do remember asking him before I went
16 and got my flashlight, where -- where are you shot? And he said in
17 my chest. He had the look -- he had the I'm dying look. And he
18 was moaning and I've seen it before.

19 I decocked, I holstered my weapon, I grabbed him under
20 his -- his armpits, I drug him out of the truck, I laid him on the
21 ground, I opened his airway. By that time I could hear a couple
22 units pass by the entrance going Code 3. I was telling the
23 suspect -- I don't even know his name -- you know, stay here, stay
24 here, breathe, take some -- take some deep breaths. He was -- he
25 was moaning on his exhales, but nothing else.

26 I ran -- don't remember this -- I don't remember the
27 order. I either at that point ran over and flashed my light at the
28 units so they would know where I was and came back.

1 At some point, I think it was before that though, some
2 smaller Hispanic male ran over and asked what was going on. I
3 asked him if he knew the -- the guy. He said no. And then I told
4 him to get away and to go over - [REDACTED] -- [REDACTED] was standing
5 right in here on the sidewalk by the fire hydrant.

6 RD: Okay. There's a -- just for the benefit, there's a
7 turn-around to the west of the parking lot with a large tree in the
8 center of it. And on the south side of the turn-around that leads
9 to the parking structure referenced earlier is where we're
10 referring to.

11 SM: I told him to go stand with [REDACTED] and wait over
12 there and then I think I ran over and flashed my light.

13 Anyway, Deputy Natoli, Laura, and Keith Hall a motor
14 officer were the first two next to arrive. That's her car, her
15 police car parked behind the suspect vehicle. A -- initially they
16 asked me if I was all right. I told them I was. They asked me if
17 there was any outstanding suspects. I told them there was not.
18 And they asked me what I needed. I told them I needed a first aid
19 kit, some gloves and I needed some -- start setting up some crime
20 scene tape.

21 Put on gloves and started getting out some pressure
22 dressings. I asked Laura if she had a knife to cut off the
23 suspect's sweatshirt. And I made sure I told her cut -- cut the
24 left side of the sweatshirt, not -- not the right side 'cause if
25 it -- the blood was kind of on the upper right portion. She
26 started cutting it. By that time Deputy Berg showed up. He had a
27 pair of scissors, like medical scissors so he cut through the
28 sweatshirt and the T-shirt and we were able to see the bullet hole

1 in the upper right portion of the suspect's chest. By this time he
2 was -- eyes were starting to roll back. There was no response.
3 His breathing was shallow although he still had a carotid pulse but
4 he had no radial pulse.

5 RD: Okay. I'm going -- I'm going to stop you right
6 there. You're -- you're describing some very particular medical
7 terms. We've all had first aid training but I know through knowing
8 you that you've had some additional training so can you -- I'm just
9 going to as quick time-out here, can you just real briefly tell
10 us -- you don't have to give us a -- an entire resume but just tell
11 us what you're basic understanding of -- of medicine or first aid
12 is.

13 SM: I'm an EMT and I work at the air unit. I've been
14 involved on many medical calls. Prior to my employment here at the
15 sheriff's department, I worked at Community Memorial in surgery and
16 in the emergency room and I was an EMT there also.

17 RD: Perfect. Okay. Go ahead and continue.

18 SM: So I had checked his radial pulse, which is on his
19 wrist. There was nothing there. Checked his carotid both sides.
20 He had a carotid pulse on both sides of his carotid on his neck. I
21 got out the pocket mask. I gave him two or three breaths to assist
22 his breathing 'cause it was pretty shallow.

23 At that point Deputy Berg said why don't you let me
24 handle the medical stuff. And Berg is an EMT and I work with him
25 at the air unit so I know he's capable of doing that. And I said
26 it's probably a good idea. So I walked with Keith Hall over to
27 about the edge of the crime scene tape at the -- at the entrance to
28 this little parking lot.

1 RD: Okay. So you walked to the west?

2 SM: Right.

3 RD: Okay.

4 SM: Keith asks me -- asked me -- because they didn't
5 know what had all happened, asked me how big does the crime
6 scene -- where should the crime scene tape go? So I -- I helped
7 him put up the crime scene tape so that it was covering at least
8 what I thought was -- was needed -- that needed to be covered.

9 RD: Okay.

10 SM: And then multiple units started showing up and they
11 were -- you know, I basically -- I told them that [REDACTED] had seen
12 the whole thing. And I told them about the Hispanic male that we
13 never did find him or at least I -- I never saw if he was located
14 or not. But I -- I described him and they were looking for him.

15 And then about ten minutes later I was with Paul Ferruzza
16 at his unit, who Cary Peterson, Sergeant Peterson assigned him to
17 be with me and we were just sitting over at the unit, kind of away
18 from the situation. And I looked down and saw the red light in my
19 pocket and realized that my recorder had been on the whole time.
20 So I pulled the recorder out. I looked at it, said like fifty
21 something minutes. So I knew that I had included [REDACTED]
22 conversa- -- you know, our -- my interview with [REDACTED] and the
23 shooting. So I turned it off in front of Paul or I stopped the
24 recording. I turned it off and I gave it to him and I told him you
25 better hold on to this, it's got the whole shooting on the -- on
26 tape. And then -- and then I sat in the car.

27 RD: Okay.

28 SM: And waited.

1 RD: All right.

2 SM: (INAUDIBLE).

3 RD: I'm going to kind of walk you back through it just
4 to make sure I have a real accurate picture of what you just told
5 us. If I get anything wrong, correct me. I'm also going to ask a
6 little more probing questions now about just what you were
7 experiencing as you went through this. And then we'll kind of
8 conclude this (INAUDIBLE) asking additional questions. Okay?

9 SM: Okay.

10 RD: All right. So you're here to interview a guy named
11 [REDACTED] who lives in Apartment [REDACTED] second floor, totally unrelated
12 as far as we can tell to the situation?

13 SM: Correct.

14 RD: Having to do with a -- a theft from a GNC in the
15 Oaks mall?

16 SM: Correct.

17 RD: You're here, you -- at first you can't contact him
18 because he's not home but as you're leaving you notice he's walking
19 back or apparently to his apartments. You identify yourself,
20 figure out that it's him and you guys start talking?

21 SM: Correct.

22 RD: As you're talking to him, a guy kind of appears out
23 of nowhere kind of about ten feet away or so and he starts making
24 comments to you, you're not going to -- you know, you're a fucking
25 cop, you're not going to get me. Things to that nature. Can you
26 remember anymore what he said to you? Can you give me --

27 SM: I remember --

28 RD: -- the gist of what he's telling you?

1 SM: I remember that he thought [REDACTED] was a cop too.
2 He -- 'cause he said you -- I know you -- I know you guys are
3 sheriffs and you're not going to get me. Or you're not going to
4 take me.. You know, as I think back on it, his -- it was almost
5 challenging like he -- 'cause he stood there for a few -- a few
6 moments as if he wanted me to respond and I didn't. I turn -- I
7 turned my back on him and went to talking to [REDACTED] like I didn't
8 want to address it right at that moment.

9 But when he returned, then in my mind said something's --
10 I mean, obviously something's not right. This guy need to be
11 talked to and something -- I mean, to me a -- I mean, I've had drug
12 training, to me the guy was -- was high on meth or coke or some
13 kind of stimulant. Couldn't -- he was, you know, was pacing back
14 and forth. He couldn't hold still. He's -- he's -- honestly, he
15 had that -- that meth paranoia almost going. You know how they get
16 like everybody's after him? That's how it seemed like he thought I
17 was after him and he yet I didn't even know who the guy was.

18 RD: Okay.

19 SM: Um --

20 RD: Okay. So that -- so that takes place as you were
21 finishing up with [REDACTED]

22 SM: Correct.

23 RD: And then you turn your attention, he's now appeared
24 again and you turn your attention to him?

25 SM: Correct.

26 RD: And that's when you come down off the landing.

27 SM: Uh-huh.

28 RD: And as you take a couple steps he bolts?

1 SM: Right.

2 RD: And he starts running towards the parking lot, which
3 is north of you?

4 SM: Right.

5 RD: Okay. He runs and as he's running, describe for me
6 a little more. You say he's -- he's fumbling with something in his
7 waistband. Just talk about that a little more. Tell me what
8 you're thinking, what you're -- and what you're feeling as -- as
9 that is going on. What is your perception of what he's doing?

10 SM: As he's running, he's -- he's crouched over and
11 he's -- he's reaching with both hands to his front which I can't
12 see. And he's already told me that I'm not going to take him --
13 and I'm not going to take him alive. So I'm -- I assumed he's
14 going for a weapon. That's why I threw my notebook and pulled my
15 gun out as soon as I started running so that if he was to turn and
16 have a weapon I would already be up and on target to address that
17 threat.

18 But he never turned towards me and when his hands came
19 out at the truck I didn't see anything in them. I didn't -- I
20 don't even remember seeing any keys. I think I just answered the
21 question.

22 RD: It is. Okay. So -- so you've -- now we've walked
23 up and now he's -- he's at the car and he's getting in. How -- as
24 he's climbing into the -- the driver's door, how far back are you
25 from him? If -- if you can --

26 SM: I --

27 RD: -- estimate that.

28 SM: I would just -- I would imagine the same distance,

1 fifteen feet, maybe a little more.

2 RD: Okay.

3 SM: I -- I didn't gain anything on him when -- when I
4 ran after him.

5 RD: Okay. All right. So now he's getting -- he's
6 getting into the car, the -- and he's pulling it shut. You're
7 coming up to the -- to the car. Now, you're gunning him -- in
8 other words, you have your gun pointed at him and what are you --
9 what are your directives?

10 SM: I'm yelling at him, stop, Sheriff's Department, get
11 out of the truck. Let me see your hands. Get out of the truck.
12 Stop. Stop what you're doing and he's -- he's yelling back at
13 me -- God, I can't remember specific words but I want to say he --
14 I -- I can't remember what he was saying.

15 RD: That's fine.

16 SM: I just remember that he was yelling at me and he was
17 hitting at the window like trying to keep me from grabbing onto the
18 truck or --

19 RD: Okay.

20 SM: -- grabbing onto him.

21 RD: All right. He then starts the car?

22 SM: He starts the car. I tried to break the window when
23 he started the car. In my mind I had told myself there's no way
24 he's driving away, not in his condition. He's -- I mean, he --
25 something -- I mean, he was high and there's -- I mean, for him to
26 be driving that car around, there's no way. So I just remember
27 telling myself don't let him leave in the truck, don't let him
28 leave in the truck.

1 RD: Okay.

2 SM: When I hit the window and it didn't break I reached
3 for the door and I tried to open the door and that's when he -- he
4 backed out.

5 RD: Okay.

6 SM: And I -- I -- I went with the truck. I can't
7 remember if I held on or if I just instinctively just followed it
8 out. But when the truck came out, all of a sudden I'm standing in
9 front of it and I remember saying to myself how did I end up in
10 front of the truck? I was at the side before.

11 RD: Okay.

12 SM: And so I started -- and the whole time I'm yelling
13 stop, stop, Sheriff's Department. Stop what you're doing, you
14 know. And I -- I started walking back or I started backpedaling.
15 I don't -- I don't --

16 RD: Why -- why are you backpedaling? Let me ask that.

17 SM: 'Cause he's -- he's got the truck started and
18 he's -- looked -- he's coming after me. That's -- that's what I
19 believed. He's started to roll forward and he was revving the
20 engine and he -- so I don't know why I didn't sidestep but I was --
21 I was backpedaling and I fired two rounds at the truck. I remember
22 staring at the grill and seeing the grill break apart. And then
23 the screeching of tires or -- and thinking that he was going to run
24 me over and that I needed to shoot him in the head where I could
25 see. I -- I remember saying to myself shoot what you can see, and
26 all I could see was his head barely over the dash.

27 RD: Okay.

28 SM: So I -- I remember I was right on his -- on where

1 his head was and I fired.

2 RD: Okay.

3 SM: I thought it was two rounds but after counting the
4 rounds at the station, it turned out to be three.

5 RD: Okay. Tell me as -- as you hear -- you're hearing
6 the screeches and -- and he's starting to come forward. What --
7 what are you feeling at that point?

8 SM: I'm thinking I'm going to get run over.

9 RD: Okay.

10 SM: This guy's -- this guy's going to run me over. He's
11 in a -- he's in a big truck and he's gonna to do anything he can to
12 get away. And I -- I -- I still remember being in kind of
13 disbelief that I was in front of the truck 'cause I -- I couldn't
14 figure out how I got there but all I knew was that I was there and
15 I was backpedaling and I -- I fired the first two rounds, I saw
16 them hit the grill and -- it -- and I told myself that didn't do
17 anything and I came up to where his head was when he was still
18 coming forward. I remember saying stop really loud a couple of
19 times after the first two rounds and then -- and then he -- I
20 remember tires screeching.

21 RD: Okay.

22 SM: And him coming at me. I fired -- fired the three
23 rounds and peeled off and sidestepped and then at that point his
24 foot was definitely off the gas and he just -- he just coasted to
25 where the -- the truck is now. He wasn't going at any speed.

26 RD: Okay. All right. Hold, just a moment (INAUDIBLE).
27 Okay. For the benefit of -- of -- and at the station we kind of
28 covered this, but for the benefit of all those here, with the

1 exception of the red windbreaker that I gave you because it's cold
2 out here, are you dressed the way you were dressed when you -- when
3 confronted by this guy?

4 SM: Exactly.

5 RD: Okay. So you're wearing a -- a dark blue button
6 shirt with a -- with a tie, slacks. You have your -- your badge on
7 a belt clip. You've got your -- your gun in a holster, which is
8 readily visible. To the rear you have handcuffs in your -- in your
9 belt.

10 SM: Correct.

11 RD: And then around your neck on a lanyard you have your
12 sheriff's ID, which is white with a badge. As you're looking at it
13 to the left, your photo and a Sheriff's Department in -- in
14 lettering across the bottom.

15 SM: Except for your jacket this is exactly what I was
16 wearing.

17 RD: Okay. Now, when he walked up to you, if he came up
18 to you from your -- did he come to you from your -- he was on your
19 right-hand side? Or was he on -- which direction?

20 SM: I don't -- I don't know which direction he
21 originally came from.

22 RD: Okay.

23 SM: All I know is that he was standing right behind me
24 maybe ten feet away.

25 RD: Okay.

26 SM: And that I -- I wouldn't have known that he was even
27 there except for the fact that he said I know you're fuckin'
28 sheriff's and you're not going to take me.

1 RD: Okay.

2 SM: And that -- that's what made me turn around and took
3 to see who it was.

4 RD: Okay.

5 SM: He -- and then like I said, I didn't say anything
6 initially. He walked westbound on the -- on the sidewalk that runs
7 east and west and then reappeared maybe thirty seconds or a minute
8 later.

9 RD: Okay. All right. Now, you're over -- you -- you've
10 taken us through the -- the vehicle backing up. It's starting to
11 come forward, you fire two rounds into where you're looking, which
12 is grill area. You -- you see the rounds hit because you see
13 pieces of the car. You hear -- and I'm trying to put this in order
14 so correct me if I'm wrong. You hear tires screeching and you --
15 and the car is still coming towards you.

16 SM: Correct.

17 RD: You're afraid you're about to be run over so you --
18 in your mind you say shoot at what I can see. And so you fire, you
19 can just see his head above the steering wheel so that's where
20 you're aiming?

21 SM: Correct. Except that after I fired those first two
22 shots, I remember screaming really loud, stop, stop.

23 RD: Okay. Okay.

24 SM: I mean, and he was still yelling back at me. I
25 don't know what he was saying but he was yelling back at me.

26 RD: Okay.

27 SM: At that time.

28 RD: All right. Now his car rolls forward and comes to a

1 stop there. And -- and I -- and I feel like you've really
2 adequately described, you know, medically what was done there.

3 Did -- did you notice anything about what was on his
4 person? Did you ever look at what he physically had as you were
5 treating him?

6 SM: Once I laid him down and I opened his airway I --
7 I -- and I told [REDACTED] -- I don't know if I told him anything. I
8 don't think I told him anything at that point. I -- I -- there was
9 a -- a lighter hanging out of his right pocket kind of halfway. I
10 pulled that out, put it on the ground. I felt his -- his
11 sweatshirt pockets and there were -- found a cell phone. I reached
12 into his left pocket and found two black gloves, one of which I
13 believe had a crank pipe in it. I never saw the crank pipe but I
14 could feel it, set it aside. I reached under his back as far as I
15 could but I didn't get all the way but I couldn't feel anything
16 under his -- in the belt line under his back. And his arms, the
17 sleeves of his sweatshirts but that's about all I -- that's all I
18 patted down. Just those general areas real quick.

19 RD: Okay.

20 SM: And quite honestly, I wasn't concerned that he was
21 faking 'cause he had that -- he had the -- his color was fading,
22 his eyes are starting to roll back.

23 RD: Right.

24 SM: And I could see his hands clearly. There was
25 nothing in his hands.

26 RD: Right.

27 SM: So -- so I didn't think that --

28 RD: At that point he wasn't a threat to you?

1 SM: Right.

2 RD: Okay.

3 SM: I wasn't thinking, you know, continue searching. It
4 was more --

5 RD: Certainly.

6 SM: -- provide some help.

7 RD: And that -- okay. And that makes -- that certainly
8 makes sense. And that was of the extent of -- of your awareness
9 of -- of what he had on his person?

10 SM: Yeah. I -- I never looked inside the cab of the
11 truck except when I pulled him out but that entire time I was
12 looking at him and nothing else.

13 RD: Okay.

14 SM: He was the only person in the truck so he was my
15 threat as far as --

16 RD: Correct.

17 SM: -- as far as why I fired, so --

18 RD: Okay. I'm going to take you back to when you were
19 over here. Was there anyone else in the area with him or around
20 the truck during this time? Did you -- did you sense there was
21 any -- that he had a -- anyone with him?

22 SM: The only people I was aware of were me, [REDACTED] and
23 the -- and the suspect.

24 RD: Okay.

25 SM: That's the only people I saw in the area.

26 RD: Okay.

27 SM: The little Hispanic guy that came up after I had
28 pulled the suspect out of the truck, I have no idea where he was or

1 when he came (INAUDIBLE).

2 RD: Okay.

3 SM: And I just don't know.

4 RD: That's fine. Okay. I feel like I have a -- a
5 pretty accurate sense of everything.

6 Is there any -- does anybody have any questions they'd
7 like to route to us? No?

8 Okay. With that, I'm going to conclude the interview.
9 If I have any follow-up questions, I'll direct them to you, but
10 through your attorney. I'll just get ahold of him, make sure that
11 he's okay with recontact if -- if it ever became necessary.
12 And the time is about thirty-nine minutes after midnight.

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attempting to contact a person named [REDACTED] in connection with the theft. Matthews believed [REDACTED] lived in apartment [REDACTED]. Det. Matthews was able to talk with [REDACTED] mother [REDACTED] and brother [REDACTED] at the apartment. They told Matthews that [REDACTED] was not home. Matthews left his name and phone number and asked that they have [REDACTED] call him.

As Matthews began to walk toward the parking lot to leave, he passed [REDACTED]. Det. Matthews said he knew what [REDACTED] looked like, as he had viewed a DMV photograph of him as part of his investigation. Matthews called to [REDACTED] and introduced himself to [REDACTED]. Matthews asked [REDACTED] if they could talk, and turned on his digital recorder and began the interview. They stood near a white minivan, which was the first vehicle in the southwest most corner of the parking lot and spoke for about 10 minutes.

After about 10 minutes, Det. Matthews asked [REDACTED] if he wanted to go inside to continue the interview. [REDACTED] declined but suggested they sit on the stairs that lead up to his apartment. [REDACTED] sat on the stairs and Matthews stood next to him while they continued to talk. Det. Matthews said they talked for about 30 minutes. Toward the end of the conversation a male (Canley) appeared behind Matthews. Det. Matthews said he was unsure where Canley came from, but he was about 10 feet away. Canley then said something to the effect, "I know you're the fucking Sheriff and you're not going to take me."

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[For ease of reading, I will refer to Canley by name. However, it should be noted that Detective Matthews did not know Canley's name during this incident.]

Det. Matthews turned around and saw Canley; Matthews described Canley and his clothing in a manner consistent with Canley's physical description and clothing. Canley was pacing back and forth and moving his hands in an animated manner. According to Matthews, Canley was "mad dogging" him. Matthews said his initial impression of Canley was that he was under the influence of drugs and a gang member. Matthews said this was based on his appearance and behavior.

Det. Matthews did not believe he said anything to Canley at that time. Matthews turned back to [REDACTED] who shrugged his shoulders as if to say he did not know who Canley was either. Canley then walked west down the sidewalk out of Matthews' view. Det. Matthews began to wrap up his conversation with [REDACTED]. At this point, Canley walked back over and made another comment to the effect, "Fucking Sheriff ain't gonna take me. I'm not - you're not going to take me alive." Det. Matthews then added, "[sic] words to those effect."

Det. Matthews thanked [REDACTED] for his time and turned to walk toward Canley, who was about 15 feet in front of him. Det. Matthews said he was unsure what was going on because he was being confronted by a subject who said he would not be taken alive; and it appeared to Matthews that the Canley had just been chased. Matthews continued saying, "He had that adrenaline rush going, he's high, he's just been chased, like somebody's lookin'

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him and he knew I was the sheriff. As
riff ain't going to take me alive.' So, I was going to
contact him and he immediately bolted."

th that said I suggested that we move to the area Det. Matthews
is now referring to in his explanation of what took place. We
aded up at the base of the stairs of [REDACTED].
et. Matthews told us that as soon as he stepped off the raised
ement landing he was on and took a couple of steps, Canley took
off running northbound on the sidewalk along the west edge of the
parking lot. Det. Matthews said he chased after Canley. When
Det. Matthews reached the intersection of the walkways that
crossed the area, he noticed Canley started fumbling with
something and reaching into the front of his waistband or
sweatshirt area. Det. Matthews pointed out that Canley had
already made a statement about not being taken alive, and he
indicated that Canley was running away from him and therefore had
his back to him. Det. Matthews said that as he was running, he
threw his notebook to the ground.

We then walked along the path in the direction Det. Matthews
chased Canley. Matthews told us he saw Canley reaching toward
his waistband and when he (Matthews) reached the intersection of
the walkways he drew his firearm with his left hand (he is left
handed) and threw his notebook to the ground. Matthews was
telling Canley to stop saying, "Sheriff's Department stop."
Canley's vehicle, a white pickup, was parked in the 3rd parking
space south of a planter which created a portion of the entrance,
to the parking lot. The pickup was parked "nose in." Canley got
into the car. Det. Matthews ran up to the door with his gun out

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and shouted, "Sheriff's Department, stop. Get out of the truck. Get out of the truck." The window was half down and Det. Matthews remembered trying to grab the window but said that Canley kept hitting the window, trying to keep his hands off. Matthews tried to break the window twice by hitting it with the "nose" of his gun. The window did not break.

By this time, Canley had the pickup's engine started. Matthews told us, "I grabbed the driver handle [sic] and he backed out quickly. So when he backed out, I kinda went with, I went with the truck; not on purpose but kinda just - it kinda pulled me out." Matthews motioned and showed us that the tail end of the truck was now nearest the apartment building and the front of the truck was to the north. Matthews continued, "So the—I'm on the—I'm in front of the truck but more toward the driver's side. I said to myself, 'How did you end -- I'm thinking how did I end up in front of the truck, 'cause I didn't intentionally end up in front of the truck. Just the way the truck came out and me holding on, I just ended up here."

Det. Matthews said he continued to yell at Canley to stop the "whole time." Matthews started backing up. Matthews then made the observation that Canley was yelling at him (Matthews) the whole time through the window. Canley was yelling, "Fuck you" and other things that Matthews could not specifically recall, but Matthews had the impression that "he was pretty pissed off." I asked Matthews if it was the tone of Canley's voice that told him he was pissed off. Matthews said it was.

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Det. Matthews continued to explain what was taking place saying, "So, I'm in front of the truck. I started back pedaling to get away from the truck. He (Canley) started coming forward. I fired two rounds at the truck - at the truck that was coming at me. I don't remember hearing the-I don't remember hearing the gunshots, but I remember star - I was staring at the grill of the truck as it was coming; and that's exactly where the shots went. And I knew my gun had fired because of the recoil and the pieces of the grill kind of went flying, or you know, broke apart. I yelled stop again. I was still - as this is going on, I'm still walking backwards."

Det. Matthews showed us how he moved backwards and at this time he indicated that he had moved north to an area in front of the second parking stall from the planter area referred to above. Matthews continued, "He revved the engine. I heard the tires squeal and - I mean it happened - it felt like it was in slow motion but I know it was, it was super quick. It was boom, boom, 'Stop! Stop!' and then [squealing noise] and then boom, boom, boom. I remember specifically looking right at his head that was in the windshield and aiming at his head when I fired."

Matthews described how he saw the rounds strike the area where the windshield meets the dashboard. Matthews again continued saying, "As he's coming at me, I fired the rounds and peeled off and he was yelling, 'You shot me. I'm hit.' And then the truck just slowly rolled forward and it stopped where you see it now." Det. Matthews ran up to the back of the truck and yelled for Canley not to move. Matthews also instructed Canley to show his hands. Matthews then yelled to Canley, "Who are you? Why did

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you do this? Or, what were you doing? Or something to that effect."

Det. Matthews said he yelled to [REDACTED], the person he had just interviewed, to call 911 because he did not have a radio with him. Matthews said he was crouched down behind the tailgate of the truck on the driver's side of the truck. He was going through his Nextel phone trying to find someone who could respond to help him. Det. Matthews said he was eventually able to reach Deputy Paul Ferruzza, who was working patrol shift 9041. Matthews told Ferruzza his location, shots had been fired and requested code three (lights and siren) assistance immediately. Deputy Ferruzza acknowledged Matthews and hung up. At about the same time, [REDACTED] asked Matthews for his last name so he could provide it to the dispatcher.

During this time, Canley was yelling, "You shot me. I'm hit." He was also moaning. Deputy Matthews worked his way over to his vehicle and retrieved a flashlight and went back to the tailgate. He shone his flashlight into the interior of the truck. The driver's door was open as Canley had opened the door. Matthews said he could see a portion of Canley's shoulder and head. Detective Matthews said that by this time, Canley had stopped talking and was now moaning. Matthews continued to tell Canley to show his hands and he began to approach Canley. When Matthews arrived at the driver's door he could see that Canley's body was slouched down. Detective Matthews said he could see some blood on the front of Canley's sweatshirt. Matthews commented that Canley had the "I'm dying look and he was moaning. I've seen it before."

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Detective Matthews holstered his weapon and pulled Canley out of the truck and onto the ground. Detective Matthews said he then opened Canley's airway. During this time he could hear the sirens of a couple patrol cars going by the entrance to the apartment complex. Matthews told Canley to keep breathing and not to move. Matthews described Canley's breathing and said, "He was moaning on his exhales but nothing else."

At this point, Detective Matthews said two things happened and he was unsure which happened first; he ran over to the driveway and flashed his light at the patrol cars to get their attention and a, "smaller Hispanic male" ran over and asked what was going on. Det. Matthews asked the man if he knew Canley; the man said he did not. Det. Matthews directed the man to stand with [REDACTED] (the person he was interviewing earlier). Det. Matthews then said he thought he talked to the man first and then flashed his light at the patrol cars.

Deputies Natoli and Hall arrived. They asked Matthews if he was alright and if there were any outstanding suspects; Matthews told them he was fine and there were no other suspects. They then asked Detective Matthews what he needed. He told them he needed a first aid kit, gloves and for someone to put up crime scene tape to protect the scene.

Detective Matthews put on the gloves and retrieved some pressure dressings. He asked Deputy Natoli to cut Canley's sweatshirt off of him. Detective Matthews was specific in telling Deputy Natoli to cut the left side of the sweatshirt, because the blood was on

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the right side. At this point, Deputy Berg arrived and used a pair of medical scissors to cut the sweatshirt and underlying T-shirt off of Canley.

Detective Matthews said that once the clothing was off, he was able to see the bullet hole in the upper right portion of Canley's chest. Matthews continued, "By this time, he was -- eyes were starting to roll back, there was no response, his breathing was shallow; although he still had a carotid pulse but he had no radial pulse (Wrist)." I stopped Det. Matthews and pointed out that his description of Canley's condition seemed beyond basic first aid. I also stated for the tape and others, that I knew that he (Matthews) had more advanced medical training than first aid and I asked him to review his background for us. Detective Matthews stated that he was an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) and worked at the Sheriff's Air Unit. He has responded on numerous medical flights. Prior to his employment with the Sheriff's Department, Matthews said he worked for Community Memorial Hospital in both the Surgery Unit and the Emergency Room as an Emergency Medical Technician.

Detective Matthews then continued telling us what took place after the shooting. Matthews said he checked for a radial pulse and found none; he checked Canley's carotid pulse on both sides of his neck and found that he had a pulse. Detective Matthews then said, "I got out the pocket mask. I gave him 2 or 3 breaths to assist his breathing, 'cause it was pretty shallow." At this point, Deputy Berg suggested that he be allowed to handle Canley's medical care. Matthews said, "Berg is an EMT and I work

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with him at the Air Unit, so I know he is capable of doing it. And I said, 'It's probably a good idea.'

Detective Matthews said he walked with Deputy Hall to the west where the entrance to the parking area begins. Deputy Hall asked Matthews how big the Crime Scene needed to be. Detective Matthews said he helped place the crime scene tape around the area. Additional, patrol units began to arrive. Detective Matthews told the arriving deputies that [REDACTED] had seen the entire incident and he also mentioned the Hispanic man he had contacted earlier.

About ten minutes later, Detective Matthews was standing with Deputy Ferruzza, who had been assigned to stay with him, when he (Matthews) looked down and saw that his digital audio recorder was on and had been on during the entire incident. Detective Matthews looked at the recorder and saw that it had been running for, "50 something minutes." Matthews said he knew that this would include [REDACTED]'s interview and the shooting. Detective Matthews then said, "So I turned it off in front of Paul [Ferruzza], or I stopped the recording - I turned it off and I gave it to him and I told him, 'You better hold onto this, its got the whole shooting on the tape.'"

Detective Matthews said he then sat in the car and waited. Up until this point in the walk-through, I had asked very few questions. It was my intention to obtain Detective Matthews initial statement unfettered. I told Detective Matthews that I now wanted to walk him back through what he had said to ensure that I had a clear and accurate picture of what he had told us.

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I told Matthews that if I got anything wrong he was to correct me. I also told him I would now ask some probing questions about what he was experiencing as he went through the incident. Detective Matthews told me he understood.

I paraphrased Matthew's statement and as I reached portions of the incident, which I wanted to talk more about, I would stop and ask questions of Matthews.

The first question I asked Matthews was concerning the initial statements Canley made to him while he was talking to [REDACTED]. Matthews answered, "I remember that he thought [REDACTED] was a cop too, because he said, 'I know you - I know you guys are Sheriffs and you're not going to get me - or - you're not going to take me.' You know as I think back on it, it was almost challenging, like - 'cause he stood there for a few moments as if he wanted me to respond. And I didn't. I tur-I turned my back on him and went back to talking to [REDACTED], like I didn't want to address it right at that moment."

Matthews continued, "But when he returned then in my mind said, 'something - obviously something's not right this guy needs to be talked to and something - I mean to me - I mean I've had drug training, to me the guy was, was high on meth or coke or some kind of stimulant. Couldn't - you know he was pacing back and forth - he couldn't hold still. Honestly, he had that meth paranoia almost going. You know how they get, like everybody's after him. That's how it seemed like, he thought I was after him and yet, I didn't even know who the guy was."

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I then asked Detective Matthews to describe in more detail the portion of his statement where he is now chasing Canley and he (Canley) is fumbling with something in his waistband. I further asked Matthews to, "Tell me what you're thinking and what feeling as that is going on. What is your perception of what he's doing?"

Detective Matthews said, "As he's running, he's crouched over and he's reaching with both hands to his front, which I can't see. And he's already told me that I'm not going to take him, that I'm not going to take him alive, so I'm - I assume that he's going for a weapon. That's why I threw my notebook and pulled my gun out as soon as I started running; so that if he were to turn and have a weapon, I would already be up and on target to address that threat. But he never turned towards me and when his hands came out at the truck, I didn't see anything in them. I didn't remember seeing any keys."

Chronologically, we were at the point that Canley was getting into the truck. I asked Detective Matthews how far away he was from Canley as he was getting into the truck. Matthews estimated that he was about 15 feet away. Matthews added that he had not gained any ground on Canley as he chased after him. I then asked Matthews to tell me more about what took place when he arrived at the door and he had his gun pointed at Canley. Matthews said, "I'm yelling at him, Stop! Sheriff's Department, get out of the truck. Let me see your hands. Get out of the truck. Stop. Stop what you're doing." Matthews continued, "And he's yelling back at me, I can't remember specific words, but [pause] I want to say he - I, I can't remember what he was saying. I just

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remember that he was yelling at me and he was hitting at the window; like trying to keep me from grabbing onto the truck or from grabbing onto him."

I then prompted Matthews to continue by saying, "O.k., he then starts the car." Matthews kept talking saying, "He starts the car, I tried to break the window when he started the car. In my mind, I told myself there's no way he's driving away. Not in his condition. I mean he's - something - I mean he was high. For him to be driving that car around there's no way. So I just remember telling myself, don't let him leave in the truck - don't let him leave in the truck."

Matthews continued, "When I hit the window and it didn't break, I reached for the door and I tried to open the door and that's when he backed out. And I went with the truck - I can't remember if I held on or I just instinctively just followed it out, but when the truck came out, all of a sudden I'm standing in front of it. I then said, "Tell me, as you're hearing screeches and he's starting to come forward, what - what are you feeling at that point?" Detective Matthews answered, "I'm thinking, I'm gonna get run over. This guys gonna run me over, he's in a big truck and he's gonna do anything he can to get away. And uhm, I, I still remember being in disbelief that I was in front of the truck, cause I couldn't figure out how I got there. But all I knew was that I was there and I was back peddling; and I fired the first two rounds I saw them hit the grill and I told myself that didn't do anything. And I came up to where his head was when he was still coming forward - I remember saying 'stop' really loud a couple of times after the first two rounds, and then, and then he - I remember tires screeching and him coming at me. I fired the three rounds and peeled off and side stepped and then at that point, his foot was definitely off the gas and he just coasted to where the truck is now. He wasn't going at any speed."

I then asked Detective Matthews about the clothing he was wearing when the incident took place. I looked at Matthew's apparel and

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described it for the tape. Matthews was wearing a blue button front shirt, tie, slacks and a belt. Attached to his belt was Matthew's badge, gun/holster and handcuffs (in back). Also, around Matthew's neck on a lanyard was his department issued identification card. Matthews commented that except for a jacket, which I had given him to wear (it was after midnight and cold), he was dressed the same as when the incident took place. I asked Detective Matthews if he noticed anything on Canley's person when he was confronting him at the driver's door and/or look for anything on him after pulling him from the vehicle. Matthews said he saw a lighter hanging out of Canley's right pocket, which he pulled out and put on the ground. Matthews then said, "I felt his sweatshirt pockets and in there I found a cell phone. I reached into his left pocket and found 2 black gloves, one of which I believe had a crank pipe in it. I never saw the crank pipe, but I could feel it. I set it aside. I reached under his back as far as I could, but I didn't get all the way. But I couldn't feel anything under his - in the belt line under his back. And his arms, the sleeves of the sweatshirt, but that's about all I - that's all I patted down, just those general areas real quick. And, quite honestly, I wasn't concerned that he was faking, 'cause he had that - his color was fading, his eyes were starting to roll back and I could see his hands clearly; there was nothing in his hands." I interjected, "At that point he wasn't a threat to you." Matthews agreed and added, "Right, I wasn't thinkin' you know - continue searching. It was more to provide some help."

I confirmed there was no one else with Canley at any time during the incident. Matthews said there was not and the only people he

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was aware of in the area were Canley, [REDACTED] and himself. Matthews then said that he had no idea where the Hispanic male was during the incident or where he came from.

I told Detective Matthews that I had a good sense of what took place. I asked the other people in attendance if they would like to route a question to Detective Matthews through me; no one had any additional questions. I explained to Detective Matthews that if I had any follow-up questions for him I would direct them to him through his attorney. I then concluded the interview at 0039 hrs.

End of report.

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████████ confirmed that on the evening of November 14, 2006, he was working at Station 31 as a Firefighter / Paramedic. He confirmed that on the evening of November 14, 2006, he responded to call of a gunshot victim at ██████████ in the City of Thousand Oaks.

████████ was assigned to Squad 31 as the driver. Also assigned to Squad 31 were Firefighter / Paramedic ██████████ and Fire Cadet ██████████.

████████ and the fire personnel from Station 31 were at the scene of a traffic collision on the northbound 101 Freeway south of Hampshire Road when the call for the gunshot victim was received. He said the call was received at approximately 1800 hours. The dispatcher asked if the fire personnel from Station 31 were available for another call in their sector. The dispatcher was advised that the fire personnel from Station 31 were available to respond.

████████ explained that the fire personnel from Station 31 changed radio channels and were dispatched to the call of the gunshot victim. He explained that initially Engine 31 cancelled their response because Medic Engine 34 was closer to the call of the gunshot victim. ██████████ continued that Engine 31, Squad 31, and Medic Engine 34 all responded to the scene and staged at Conejo School Road and Los Feliz Drive (until cleared to enter the scene by the Sheriff's Department). He estimated it took approximately 10 seconds to arrive at the staging location because he and the other fire personnel in Squad 31 were on their way to Station 31.

████████ said he called Fire Dispatch and was told that Squad 31 was cleared to enter the scene of the gunshot victim at 1816 hours or 1817 hours.

████████ confirmed that he drove Squad 31 to the scene of the gunshot victim. The scene was located within an apartment complex. ██████████ explained that he parked Squad 31 between two Sheriff's Department vehicles in front of the crime scene tape.

Upon arrival, a Deputy Sheriff met ██████████ and he asked the Deputy Sheriff if the gunshot victim was alive. The Deputy Sheriff confirmed that the gunshot victim was alive. ██████████ explained that he retrieved the medical equipment from Squad 31 and approached the gunshot victim. He said Senior Deputy Berg was attending to the gunshot victim.

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████████ said the gunshot victim was lying "supine (on his back)" with his "face up," his head pointed toward Squad 31, and his feet were pointed toward a gray truck. He believed the gunshot victim was wearing a white shirt, possibly a T-shirt, black jeans, and black "Converse" shoes. When he initially saw the gunshot victim, ██████████ saw blood coming out of the gunshot victim's right chest area.

Senior Deputy Berg told ██████████ that the gunshot victim had a pulse and was breathing. ██████████ saw that an "emergency kit" used by the Sheriff's Department was open and it appeared that the "mouth to mask" was on the ground. He continued that Senior Deputy Berg was beginning to perform some kind of treatment to the gunshot victim before his arrival.

████████ explained that he was at the scene of the gunshot victim approximately 20 to 30 seconds before the arrival of an Engine. He continued that Senior Deputy Berg asked what he could do assist him. ██████████ said he gave Senior Deputy Berg a pair of "trauma shears" and told him to cut the gunshot victim's shirt off. He continued to explain the treatment he and Firefighter / Paramedic ██████████ provided the gunshot victim.

████████ explained that the gunshot victim was only taking two to four breaths a minute. He heard the Engine arriving at the scene and yelled to the fire personnel on the Engine that he needed a backboard and assistance with the gunshot victim. ██████████ explained that Firefighter / Emergency Medical Technician ██████████ began providing oxygen to the gunshot victim while he prepared the intubation equipment.

████████ explained that he inserted an airway into the gunshot victim and added that the gunshot victim did not have a gag reflex. He explained that as he prepared the intubation equipment he provided instructions to Firefighter / Paramedic ██████████ and the other emergency personnel. ██████████ explained that he intubated the gunshot victim and placed an endotracheal tube into the gunshot victim's trachea to control the airway. He continued to explain the other medical procedures performed on the gunshot victim.

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████████ said a cervical collar was placed on the gunshot victim's neck and he continued to explain the other medical procedures performed on the gunshot victim. Once the medical procedures were complete, ██████████ stood up to make sure everything was "going good." He continued that the ambulance arrived at the scene and the ambulance personnel assisted in inserting an "IV" into the left side of the gunshot victim while Firefighter / Paramedic ██████████ inserted an "IV" into the gunshot victim's right side.

████████ continued that he stood up and verbalized that the gunshot victim's pants needed to be "cut off." He then went to Squad 31 to retrieve the equipment needed to contact Los Robles Regional Medical Center to advise them of the incident. ██████████ said he cut the gunshot victim's pants off. He explained that after he went to Squad 31 he returned to the gunshot victim and saw that the gunshot victim pants had not been cut off. ██████████ said he obtained a pair of "shears" and cut the gunshot victim's pants and began "ripping" them off.

████████ said he began to cut the gunshot victim's pants on the right leg and ripped the pants up the leg from the cuff to the gunshot victim's waist. He did the same to the gunshot victim's left pant leg and could see the gunshot victim's underwear. ██████████ said he did not see a gun at that time because he was looking for blood in the gunshot victim's pants. He described the gun as being "camouflaged" with the gunshot victim's pants.

████████ explained that as he putting the "shears" away he and Firefighter / Paramedic ██████████ looked down and saw the gun. He corrected himself and stated that he actually cut the left leg of the gunshot victim's pants before the right leg. ██████████ said the gun was "leaning" next to the gunshot victim's "crotch" and right thigh. He confirmed that the gun was between the gunshot victim's legs and was closer to his right thigh. ██████████ explained that the way the gunshot victim's pants had been cut, the cut resembled a "seam" and the gun was lying next to the seam. The gun barrel was pointed toward the gunshot victim's feet and the "handle" was toward the gunshot victim's groin.

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██████████ said the gun was a black "handgun." I showed him my department issued semiautomatic gun. ██████████ said the gunshot victim's gun looked like my semiautomatic gun. He did not know if the gun was ready to be fired or if the slide was locked back (not ready to be fired).

After ██████████ saw the gun he told Senior Deputy Berg there was a gun on the person of the gunshot victim. Senior Deputy Berg said not to touch or move the gun, and he was putting on gloves to possibly secure the gun. ██████████ continued that it appeared that Firefighter / Paramedic ██████████ pushed the gun away toward the lower portion of the gunshot victim's legs or foot. He continued that at the same time the gunshot victim was being prepared to be placed on a backboard. ██████████ said the gunshot victim was successfully placed onto the backboard and then onto a gurney.

██████████ explained that the gunshot victim was secured onto the backboard and then he went to the ambulance to prepare for the transportation of the gunshot victim. Within 20 seconds, the gunshot victim was brought to the ambulance.

██████████ said he and Firefighter / Paramedic ██████████ responded to the Emergency Room at Los Robles Regional Medical Center in the back of the ambulance with the gunshot victim. They were with Paramedic ██████████. ██████████ said the ambulance responded to the Emergency Room with the use of its lights and siren (Code 3).

██████████ said the gunshot victim never regained consciousness at the scene and he never made any statements. He said the gunshot victim did not regain consciousness while being transported in the ambulance and he never made any statements.

While enroute to the Emergency Room, the gunshot victim maintained a pulse and blood pressure. However, the gunshot victim did experience respiratory arrest.

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I asked [REDACTED] if he saw a wound on the gunshot victim's shoulder after the gunshot victim's shirt had been removed. He explained that he did and the wound was above the gunshot victim's right clavicle. [REDACTED] did not see any other wounds on the gunshot victim's body. He explained how the gunshot victim's back was checked for injuries after the gunshot victim was rolled onto his right side. [REDACTED] said as the gunshot victim's back was being checked for injury, it was at that time that he saw the gunshot victim had a "piece" missing from his left thumb. He stated that it appeared the gunshot victim's thumb had "been possibly shot by a gun." [REDACTED] described the wound to the gunshot victim's left thumb as the tip being "amputated pretty much."

[REDACTED] explained that upon arrival to the Emergency Room, the medical personnel at the Emergency Room took over the gunshot victim's medical treatment. He attempted to explain to me which room the gunshot victim was placed into upon arrival to the Emergency Room. A nurse who was in the room while I interviewed [REDACTED] said the gunshot victim had been placed into Room 6 of the Emergency Room.

I asked [REDACTED] if he had any additional information to add to this interview. He explained that he placed a petroleum based dressing over the gunshot wound on the gunshot victim. [REDACTED] explained that he placed the dressing on the gunshot victim at the scene before he went to prepare the ambulance to transport the gunshot victim to the Emergency Room.

[REDACTED] had no additional information to add to this interview.

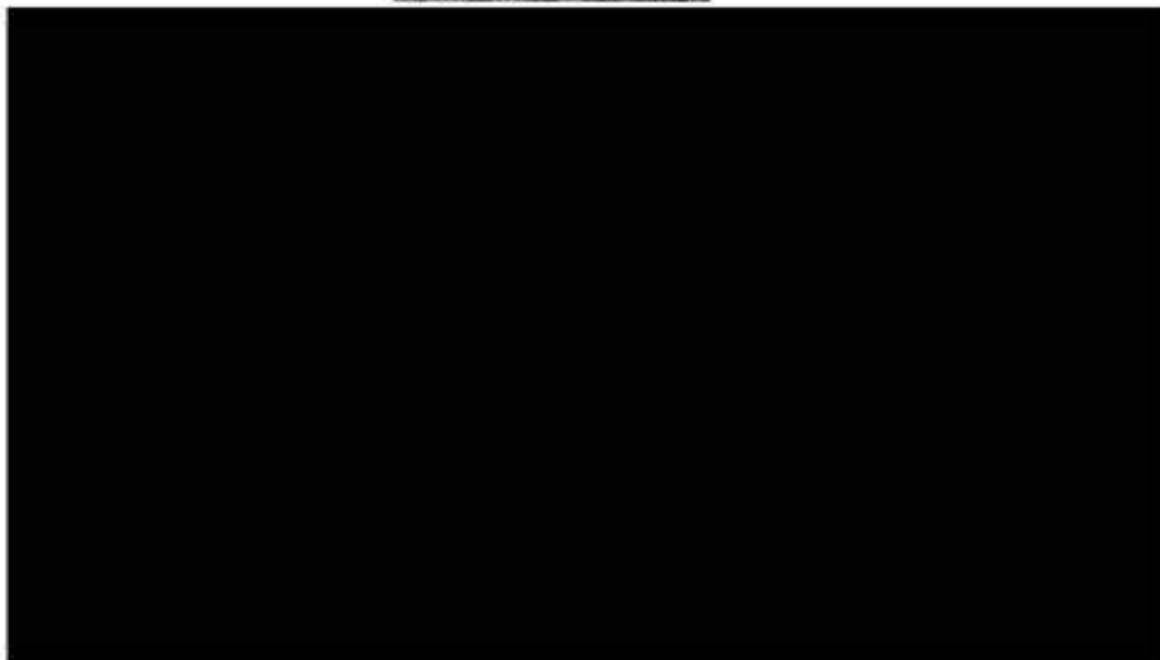

On November 14, 2006, at approximately 1958 hours, I interviewed Emergency Medical Technician [REDACTED], employed by American Medical Response (ambulance company), in the Nurses Lounge at Los Robles Regional Medical Center in the City of Thousand Oaks. This interview was digitally recorded. The following is a summary of the interview. Refer to the CD ROM containing the recording for additional information:

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██████████ confirmed that on the evening of November 14, 2006, he responded to a call of a gunshot victim at ██████████ in the City of Thousand Oaks. He was working with Paramedic ██████████. They were assigned as unit "452." ██████████ was driving the ambulance and ██████████ was the passenger.

██████████ could not remember the time he and ██████████ received the call of the gunshot victim. They were at "Borders (a bookstore)" in the City of Thousand Oaks when the call was received over their portable radio. The dispatcher advised the address of the call and stated the call concerned a victim with a gunshot wound. ██████████ explained that he only heard that Squad 31, from the Ventura County Fire Department, was also responding to the call.

██████████ confirmed that he and ██████████ responded to the call. ██████████ was driving the ambulance and he was the passenger. He explained that he used a map to guide ██████████ to the location of the call, and he told me the route they drove to the call. ██████████ estimated they arrived at the scene of the call within four to five minutes.

Upon arrival to the scene, ██████████ saw "activity" taking place on the right side of the ambulance near a white truck. ██████████ parked the ambulance near the scene behind a marked Sheriff's Department patrol vehicle. ██████████ said the scene was located in the parking lot area of an apartment complex near a "main driveway."

██████████ continued and said he saw "activity" taking place on the left side of the ambulance near a white truck. He saw personnel from the Ventura County Fire Department providing treatment to a "patient" lying on his back on the ground. ██████████ explained that the gunshot victim's head was pointed in a west or southwest direction. He believed Firefighter / Paramedic ██████████, assigned to Squad 31, was in the process of intubating the gunshot victim and cardiopulmonary resuscitation was not taking place. ██████████ said he was told the gunshot victim had a pulse and blood pressure.

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██████████ said the gunshot victim was not wearing a shirt and his pants had been cut open from his legs to his waist. He continued that the gunshot victim appeared to be a male, approximately 30 years of age or in his early thirties. ██████████ said the gunshot victim was approximately 5 feet 7 inches tall, approximately 150 pounds in weight, and had tattoos from his neck to his waist. He did not notice if the gunshot victim was wearing any footwear.

██████████ said there were enough emergency personnel treating the gunshot victim and he did not want to get involved and make the situation more crowded than it was. He explained that ██████████ approached the gunshot victim's left side and attempted to insert an "IV." ██████████ explained that he stood approximately 5 to 6 feet away from the gunshot victim's head.

██████████ said ██████████ was attempting to insert an "IV" in the gunshot victim's left arm while another Paramedic was attempting to insert an "IV" into the right arm. He continued that Firefighter / Paramedic ██████████ completed the intubation of the gunshot victim and secured the intubation tube. ██████████ saw one gunshot wound on the upper right chest area below the clavicle of the gunshot victim. He said there was "minor" bleeding around the wound. ██████████ said the gunshot victim was unconscious and unresponsive, but his eyes were open and he was not moving.

██████████ continued to explain that the "IV" on the gunshot victim's left arm was completed, but not on his right arm. Once the "IV's" were completed, an unknown person placed a cervical collar around the gunshot victim's neck. ██████████ explained that he was preparing a backboard and "head bed" to secure the gunshot victim's head to the backboard. He continued that once the "IV's" were established the other emergency personnel wanted to quickly move the gunshot victim.

██████████ continued that the gunshot victim was rolled onto his right side and he heard the other emergency personnel state that the gunshot victim did not have any visible wounds on his back. He explained that the gunshot victim was rolled back onto his back and the process of

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placing him on the backboard began. [REDACTED] explained that he secured the gunshot victim's head onto the backboard and the remainder of his body was also secured to the backboard. Once the gunshot victim was secured to the backboard, [REDACTED] stepped back and assisted with placing the gunshot victim onto the gurney. He explained how the Firefighters lifted the backboard containing the gunshot victim onto the gurney.

I told [REDACTED] when I interviewed [REDACTED] she told me at one point the gunshot victim's pants were being moved. I continued that when the gunshot victim's pants were moved "something" was seen. I asked [REDACTED] if he remembered that. He said, "I absolutely remember that." [REDACTED] explained that he handed [REDACTED] his "trauma shears" and she began to make "further" cuts to the gunshot victim's pants before he was placed on the backboard and after the "IV" had been established.

[REDACTED] said [REDACTED] finished cutting off the gunshot victim's pants so she could "visualize" the gunshot victim's pelvis and upper legs. He explained that at some point someone saw the "weapon" and said, "Deputy, there's a weapon here. It's down here." [REDACTED] looked and saw what appeared to be a "Glock semiautomatic black pistol." He said the gun was in a firing position (the slide was not locked back). [REDACTED] said the gun was by the gunshot victim's right leg. He said it appeared to him that the gun was in the "middle of the cut open pants" and he was not certain how the gun got there. [REDACTED] explained that he did not see the gun at the same time as the fire personnel. He clarified that the gun was on the right side of the gunshot victim's right leg, and he believed the gun's grip was facing upward toward the gunshot victim's head. [REDACTED] said the gun was "pointing outward from the body." He clarified that the "muzzle" of the gun was pointed out away from the gunshot victim's leg.

After seeing the gun, [REDACTED] made room for the Deputy Sheriff to secure it. He said he did not see the Deputy Sheriff secure the gun because he was preparing the backboard.

[REDACTED] explained that he believed the Deputy Sheriff secured the gun and removed it from the area of the gunshot victim's body.

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██████████ confirmed that the gunshot victim was placed inside the ambulance after he was secured onto the backboard and the gurney. He said he drove the ambulance utilizing the emergency lights and siren (Code 3) during the transportation of the gunshot victim to the Emergency Room at Los Robles Regional Medical Center. ██████████, Firefighter / Paramedic ██████████, and a Firefighter / Paramedic named Jeff treated the gunshot victim in the ambulance on the way to the medical center.

██████████ said at the scene the gunshot victim never regained consciousness. He did not believe that the gunshot victim regained consciousness during the transport to the medical center. At no time did the gunshot victim make any statements.

██████████ explained what occurred when he and the other emergency personnel arrived at the medical center and the medical center staff took over treatment of the gunshot victim.

I asked ██████████ if he remembered any additional information I had not asked him about. He said he remembered that it was "mentioned" that there were four gunshots. ██████████ continued that he was told that two shots struck the gunshot victim, one to the right shoulder or upper chest and one to an unknown finger. He said ██████████ or one of the Firefighter / Paramedics provided him that information as they entered the Emergency Room. ██████████ then clarified that he believed ██████████ provided him the information.

██████████ had no additional information to add to this interview.

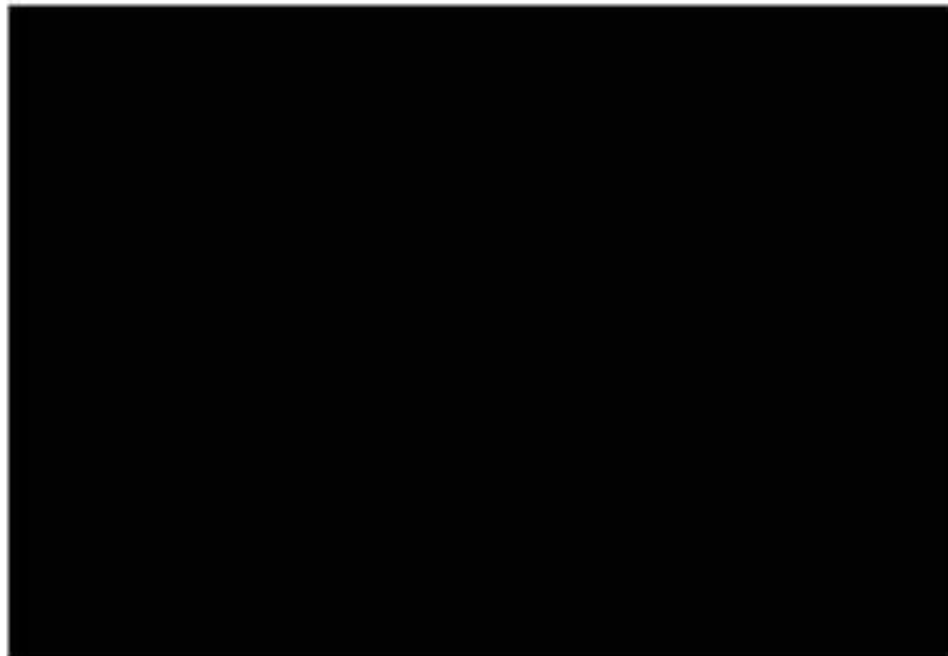

On November 14, 2006, at approximately 2119 hours, I interviewed Firefighter / Paramedic [REDACTED] employed by the Ventura County Fire Department, in the Nurses Lounge at Los Robles Regional Medical Center in the City of Thousand Oaks. This interview was digitally recorded. The following is a summary of the interview. Refer to the CD ROM containing the recording for additional information:

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

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█████ confirmed that on November 14, 2006, he was working at Station 31 as a Firefighter / Paramedic. He confirmed that on November 14, 2006, he responded to a call of a gunshot victim at ██████ in the City of Thousand Oaks. ██████ was assigned to Squad 31 with Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ and Fire Cadet ██████. Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ was assigned as the driver and ██████ was assigned as the "attendant."

█████ explained that he and the other fire personnel from Station 31 were at the scene of a traffic collision on the northbound 101 Freeway south of Hampshire Road when the call of the gunshot victim was received. The dispatcher advised the address where the gunshot victim was located ██████. The dispatcher further advised that the fire personnel were to stage for the arrival of law enforcement to the scene. ██████ confirmed that he, Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ and Fire Cadet ██████ responded to the scene of the gunshot victim from the scene of the traffic collision. He estimated it took approximately five minutes to arrive at the staging area. ██████ said he and the other fire personnel remained at the staging area for approximately one minute before being cleared to enter the scene where the gunshot victim was located.

█████ described the location of the scene as being within "some type of an apartment complex" or "condominium complex." He said Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ parked Squad 31 approximately 40 feet away from the gunshot victim with the squad's headlights facing the gunshot victim in an "eastbound direction."

Upon arrival to the scene, ██████ advised the dispatcher that Squad 31 had arrived at the scene. He exited Squad 31 and retrieved medical equipment from the Squad. ██████ also directed Fire Cadet ██████ to retrieve some additional medical equipment from the Squad. He said he then walked over to the gunshot victim. ██████ said the gunshot victim was an approximate 28-year-old male with breathing respirations that were not sufficient enough to maintain his life. He added that the gunshot victim was taking one breath approximately every five seconds. ██████ said the gunshot victim was "gasping for a breath."

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█████ said the gunshot victim was lying "supine (on his back)" and his extremities were "basically sprawled out." He believed the gunshot victim was wearing black jeans. █████ explained that when he arrived the gunshot victim's chest was exposed. He continued that it appeared that the gunshot victim was wearing a "sweatshirt" and possibly a "couple layers of shirts." █████ said the sweatshirt and layers of shirts on the gunshot victim were "already open." He believed that the sweatshirt and layers of shirts had been pulled up as opposed to being cut off.

█████ said the gunshot victim's sweatshirt was possibly black in color. The gunshot victim's other shirts were possibly white and gray in color. █████ could not recall if the gunshot victim was wearing any footwear. He did not see anything around the gunshot victim's body.

█████ confirmed that he saw an injury on the gunshot victim. He saw an "entry wound" on the gunshot victims' upper right chest that appeared to be below the clavicle. █████ believed the gunshot victim was not wearing the sweatshirt or layers of shirts when he initially saw the gunshot wound. He added that when he initially walked up to the gunshot victim he "clearly" saw the gunshot wound.

█████ explained the medical treatment that he and Firefighter / Paramedic █████ performed on the gunshot victim. He was on the gunshot victim's right side performing medical treatment. █████ believed there was a truck behind him that narrowed the space between him and the gunshot victim.

█████ said after he performed his initial medical treatment on the gunshot victim, he directed a uniformed Deputy Sheriff to cut off the gunshot victim's clothing. He clarified that he told the Deputy Sheriff to cut off all the clothing on the gunshot victim from his torso toward his head. █████ continued to explain the medical treatment and results that he performed on the gunshot victim. He continued that the Deputy Sheriff cut off "all" the gunshot victim's clothing. █████ clarified that the Deputy Sheriff only cut off the gunshot victim's sweatshirt and layers of shirts.

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He added that he assisted the Deputy Sheriff in cutting off the gunshot victim's upper clothing in a "cut, tear, rip operation."

██████ confirmed that he had a better view of the gunshot victim's gunshot wound after the gunshot victim's sweatshirt and layers of shirts had been removed. He said he was initially told that four shots had been fired at the scene. ██████ said the information he heard about the numbers of shots that had been fired was more "hearsay" rather than being directed to him by a specific person. He confirmed that the amount of shots that had been fired was one of the topics being discussed at the scene.

██████ said "initially" the entry of the gunshot wound was not "too hard to see." He continued that the clothing had been cut off the gunshot victim's upper torso so the gunshot victim could be checked for additional gunshot wounds. ██████ said the clothing from the gunshot victim's upper torso was lying on the ground under the gunshot victim's back, and he pulled the clothing out from under the gunshot victim.

██████ said the emergency personnel from "AMR (American Medical Response ambulance company)" arrived at the scene and he saw Paramedic ██████. He said Paramedic ██████ asked him what she could do. ██████ continued that he placed a tourniquet on the gunshot victim's right upper arm and asked Paramedic ██████ to establish an "IV" into the gunshot victim's left arm. He continued to explain the difficulties in establishing an "IV" into the gunshot victim's right arm. ██████ said that the gunshot victim's arms appeared to have "some type of what we refer to as track marks or scars." He clarified that the track marks or scars were on the gunshot victim's right arm. ██████ continued that he was unable to establish the "IV."

██████ said Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ intubated the gunshot victim. He continued to tell me about the medical treatment he provided to the gunshot victim after the gunshot victim was intubated. ██████ said he then directed "people" that he needed to have the gunshot victim's pants cut off because that was a "main priority." He said "a few minutes" passed before the gunshot victim's pants were cut off, and he believed Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ was the

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person who cut off the gunshot victim's pants. ██████ said Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ began the cuts at the cuffs of the gunshot victim's pants and went up both legs of the pants to the "belt region, pelvic region."

██████ said the gunshot victim's pants were opened after being cut. A search began to determine if the gunshot victim had more gunshot wounds on his lower body and none were found. ██████ said at that point the gunshot victim was about to be moved from the ground to a backboard. He added that it was during that time that he saw the gun. ██████ said the gun was on top of the gunshot victim's pants in the area of the gunshot victim's "genital area." He said the barrel of the gun was pointed toward the gunshot victim's left leg.

I asked ██████ to describe the gun. He indicated he could not describe it. I showed ██████ my department issued semiautomatic gun. He said the gun was a "good sized handgun." ██████ said the gun was "very" similar to my department issued semiautomatic gun. He said the gun was black in color and was in a position that it could be fired (the slide of the gun was not locked back). ██████ continued that the gun was pointed toward the gunshot victim's left thigh. He said he remembered that because Paramedic ██████ was on the gunshot victim's left side.

██████ said he let "everyone" know that a gun was present. He said the same Deputy Sheriff who cut the gunshot victim's sweatshirt and layer of shirts noticed the gun. ██████ said, "And for some reason I -- I don't know if it was shot right away, but my intention was to get that patient on the backboard." I asked him what he meant when he said "shot right away." He explained that he was referring to a photograph being taken of the gun were it was found on the gunshot victim's person. ██████ explained that he was confused because he believed someone was going to retrieve a camera to photograph the gun.

██████ continued that he moved the gunshot victim's pants because the gunshot victim had to have his clothing removed in order to be rolled over to check for additional gunshot wounds or injuries. He said the gunshot victim was rolled onto his right side. No additional wounds were found on the gunshot victim's back or other parts of his body.

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█████ said the gun had not been retrieved at the point the gunshot victim was rolled onto his side to check for additional gunshot wounds or injuries. He continued that he had to pull the gunshot victim's pants out from underneath the gunshot victim, and the gun came out with the pants. █████ explained that he did not touch the gun and that he moved the gun on the gunshot victim's pants in order to transport the gunshot victim for medical treatment. He continued that he moved the gunshot victim's pants toward the gunshot victim's feet and the gun came with the pants. █████ reiterated that he did not touch the gun. He said he folded the gunshot victim's pants over the top of the gun. █████ said "someone" said the gun should be seen, so he opened the pants to expose the gun. He confirmed that he never touched the gun, but it was possible that he might have "scraped" against it.

█████ said the gunshot victim was then placed onto a backboard and explained how that was completed. Once the gunshot victim was secured to the backboard he was then secured onto a gurney. █████ confirmed that the gunshot victim was then moved to the ambulance.

█████ said he went in the ambulance to transport the gunshot victim to the Emergency Room at Los Robles Regional Medical Center. Firefighter / Paramedic █████ and Paramedic █████ were with him in the back of the ambulance treating the gunshot victim while the ambulance was driven by an unknown person from the ambulance company. █████ estimated that it took approximately 7 to 8 minutes to get from the scene to the Emergency Room. He said the ambulance was driven to the Emergency Room with the use of the ambulance's emergency lights and siren (Code 3).

█████ said the gunshot victim never regained consciousness or made any statements at the scene or in the ambulance. At no time during the drive to the Emergency Room did the gunshot victim stop having a heart rate or pulse.

█████ explained that upon arrival to the Emergency Room the gunshot victim was placed inside Room 6 of the Emergency Room. He continued that the gunshot victim then began to

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receive medical treatment from the medical staff at the Emergency Room. [REDACTED] said he remained in the area to assist the medical staff with the gunshot victim's medical treatment.

I asked [REDACTED] if he had any additional information to add to this interview. He explained that on the drive to the Emergency Room he attempt to establish another "IV" into the gunshot victim without success.

[REDACTED] had no additional information to add to this interview.

On 11/14/06, at approximately 1840 hours, I arrived at [REDACTED], Thousand Oaks, Ca. I had information that this was the scene of a shooting between Detective Matthews and (S) Adrian Canley. I was asked by Sergeant Powers to interview the firefighters that were still on scene.

I directed the Fire personnel to move their engine out of the crime scene and across Los Feliz Drive to an adjacent driveway. I then interviewed each of the Fire personnel separately. I spoke to Fire Cadet [REDACTED] [REDACTED], and digitally recorded our interview. [REDACTED] said he is currently assigned to Station # 31, located at 151 Duesenberg Drive, Thousand Oaks, Ca. Refer to the CD, and my Supplemental reports for further details.

[REDACTED] said they were dispatched to a gunshot victim (S – Canley) at a location on Los Feliz Drive. Once on scene, he helped get a backboard from the engine and brought it to the paramedics. He then helped with retrieving other items needed to assist with treating (S) Canley. [REDACTED] said Canley was on the ground next to a white truck.

I then asked [REDACTED] if he could see any injuries on Canley's body. [REDACTED] said he could see a wound in the upper right portion of Canley's chest, near his shoulder. He also commented that

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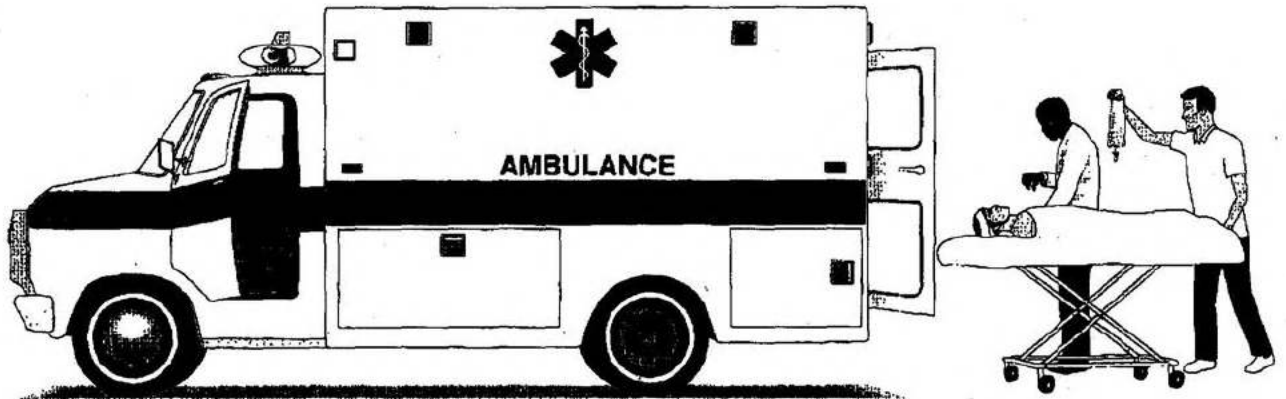
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Canley had a lot of tattoos on his torso. [REDACTED] said as the paramedics were cutting open Canley's pants, a gun was discovered inside the right side of Canley's pants. I asked [REDACTED] if he could describe Canley's condition, and he said Canley was unresponsive. [REDACTED] said he remained on scene after the paramedics transported Canley.

I asked [REDACTED] if he noticed anything unusual about the white truck next to Canley. At first, [REDACTED] said he did not notice anything. A few seconds later, [REDACTED] said the truck was leaking what he believed to be coolant.

On Nov. 14, 2006, I responded to an officer involved shooting at [REDACTED]. When I arrived, I saw Ventura County Fire personnel on scene and attending to a gunshot victim, who was lying on the pavement next to a full-size white Ford pickup.

I had been informed that the shooting involved Detective Shane Matthews, who is one of my partners in the Investigations Bureau. Several deputies had arrived on scene, and were closing off the area to preserve evidence at the scene.

I saw Detective Matthews, who appeared calm and composed. I asked him if he was injured or if he was okay. Detective Matthews told me that he was okay. He was wearing the same professional clothing, which I had seen him wearing earlier that day (blue dress shirt, tie, dress slacks and black shoes). His badge was clearly displayed on his trouser belt next to his sidearm. He also wore his department identification card on a lanyard hanging around his neck.

As I walked under the yellow crime scene tape, one of the deputies pointed to a man wearing a red shirt. The deputy told me that the man in the red shirt had been present and witnessed the shooting.

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I approached [REDACTED] [REDACTED], who was visibly shaking at the time. [REDACTED] gestured toward the man who had been shot and asked, "Is he gonna be okay?"

I told him that I didn't know. I asked [REDACTED] to tell me what had happened at the scene. He told me that Detective Matthews had been interviewing him about an incident involving his previous employer, General Nutrition Center.

While Matthews interviewed [REDACTED], an unidentified man approached them from the parking area of the apartment complex. As the man neared Matthews and [REDACTED], he shouted at Matthews, "Are you a cop? Are you a cop? You're not gonna get me cop! You're not gonna get me cop!"

[REDACTED] said that Matthews looked at [REDACTED] and asked if he knew the man. [REDACTED] said he told Matthews he had never seen the man before. The subject was later identified as Adran Canley (DOB 4-1-81).

Matthews called for Canley to stop, but the man walked away toward the parking lot. [REDACTED] said Matthews told Canley to stop several times. [REDACTED] told me, "Matthews kept saying 15 million times, 'Stop! Stop!'"

At first Canley walked, but then began running down the concrete walkway along the west side of the parking area. Detective Matthews ran after Canley.

Canley entered a white Ford pickup, which was parked facing west on the west side of the parking lot. Canley began to back out of the parking space. Detective Matthews was still shouting at the man to stop.

The pickup backed out of the parking space with the rear of the truck turning south. The pickup then accelerated forward (northbound) toward Detective Matthews and toward the only exit of the parking lot, which goes toward Los Feliz Drive. By that point, [REDACTED] said that Detective Matthews was in a position where he was in front of the pickup directly in its path. Matthews had drawn his sidearm, and continued shouting at the man to stop. The pickup accelerated forward, at which time Detective Matthews fired a single shot in the left front tire of the pickup.

The pickup continued to advance, and Detective Matthews continued shouting at Canley to stop. When the pickup did not stop, Matthews fired additional shots into the pickup as he jumped away from the path of the oncoming pickup. The truck came to rest against the curb at the north end of the parking lot facing the clubhouse. [REDACTED] said he thought he heard three gunshots being fired by Matthews, including the first one into the left front tire.

While we stood there discussing the incident, I noticed a notebook in the grass adjacent to the walkway that extends from the apartments to the parking lot. I asked [REDACTED] if the notebook was

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Matthews'. ██████ told me that it belonged to Matthews, and that the detective threw the notebook on the grass as he ran after Canley.

██████ told me several times that he couldn't understand why Canley acted the way he did, and why he didn't stop for Detective Matthews. ██████ told me that Detective Matthews helped Canley out of the pickup and rendered first aid to the man. ██████ said he heard Matthews say to Canley that he was going to be okay.

Matthews instructed ██████ to call 9-1-1, which he said he did from his cellular telephone. I asked ██████ if anyone else was present during the shooting. He said he was not aware of any other witnesses in the area at the time. I had a brief discussion with Deputy Axelrod, who said he thought there was another witness in the parking lot at the time. When Axelrod described the person to ██████, ██████ said that the man in question did not show up at the scene until after the shooting occurred.

I asked ██████ if he was afraid during the incident. At first he told me that he wasn't. Then he told me that he was afraid when he heard the first shot being fired.

██████ told me, "If somebody fires a gun at you, especially a police officer pulls out a gun...and if you're gonna push him that far to fire, then I was kind of afraid he would have done something to Matthews or me. If someone pulls a gun, you don't try to get away or anything like that. Do you know what I mean? That's why I thought maybe...I'm not saying Matthews is a bad shooter, but if...I was afraid if he fired, the guy was going to turn around and fire or something like that. For a person to resist an officer who is holding a gun and shoots the tire. One shot...that shouldn't even be that... taking it that far. If he goes to that extent, who knows how far it's going to go? You know what I mean? After the shots, I was worried the guy was going to do something to Matthews."

After the shots, Detective Matthews ordered Canley out of the pickup. Canley said, "I'm hit! I'm hit!"

Matthews then told Canley that he was going to be okay. ██████ said that as Matthews helped Canley out of the pickup, Matthews told Canley, "Just hang on with me buddy! After that they were like friends, you know?"

"He [Matthews] was trying to calm him down," ██████ said. "He was trying to help him. That's all he wanted to do."

██████ told me, "I feel really bad for Matthews. I really do. He did not want to fire."

██████ said he didn't understand why Canley confronted Detective Matthews. He said, "I'm thinking to myself...Buddy, whatever you did...you see him talking to me. I'm not saying to get away with it. You see the cop there, not bothering you. What are you trying to do? Why are you standing there? He totally instigated it. You see a cop talking to me...leave us alone. If you're a criminal, then get the hell

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out. That was pure stupidity. You don't push it to that level. He [Matthews] wouldn't have even seen the guy if the guy didn't open his mouth. What does that tell you?"

██████ was cooperative and remained at the scene at my request. A short while later, Detective Sgt. Rhods interviewed ██████ a second time. Refer to Rhods' report for further details.

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During a neighborhood canvass, I contacted, or attempted to make contact with residents at the following locations:



When I entered apartment [REDACTED] I noticed that the rear sliding door was open, and afforded the occupants a partial elevated view of the police activity at the crime scene. However, the actual shooting scene and location of the pickup were obscured by the clubhouse, which is located between apartment [REDACTED] and the crime scene.

[REDACTED] said he and his family were watching television in the front room of their apartment, which is next to the open sliding door that leads to the balcony facing to the south toward the crime scene.

[REDACTED] said he heard three gunshots and then two additional gunshots approximately three or four seconds later. He said he and his family heard screaming after the gunshots, but couldn't make out any words. He said that he and his family heard nothing before the incident.

[REDACTED] said he looked outside and saw a man in a red t-shirt holding what appeared to be a phone to his ear. [REDACTED] said he saw no other activity until emergency personnel arrived on scene.

At home with [REDACTED] at the time were the following family members:



All of the occupants of apartment [REDACTED] gave consistent statements. I asked [REDACTED] if he or any family members looked outside after hearing the shots. He said he did not look outside, nor did he let his family look or go outside. He said he told everybody present that they couldn't go outside until after the police were there.

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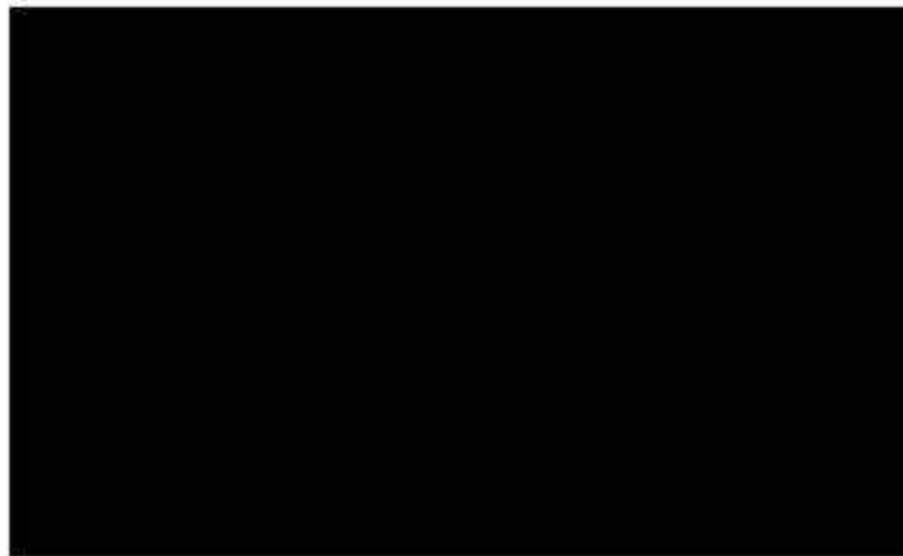
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After a few minutes, I asked again if they saw or heard anything after the gunshots. [REDACTED] said he was going to call 9-1-1. He looked out the sliding door and saw a man wearing a red shirt and brown shorts making a phone call. [REDACTED] said he thought the man was calling 9-1-1.



Both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] live in apartment [REDACTED]. They were home when the shooting occurred, and the rear sliding door of the apartment was open. The small balcony has a view directly across to the clubhouse to the south. The shooting took place on the opposite side of the clubhouse from their apartment. The residents of apartment [REDACTED] did not have a view of the crime scene at all. The television was on at the time of the incident.

[REDACTED] told me that he heard nothing prior to hearing what he thought were six gunshots. He described the sounds as two in close sequence, a brief pause, and then four shots in close sequence.

[REDACTED] said she heard two shots, then heard someone yelling "Stop, Stop!" She then heard the additional shots. [REDACTED] concurred with what [REDACTED] said she heard.



I encountered [REDACTED] [REDACTED] in the parking lot in front of the apartments near #107. He was walking toward his apartment, where there had been no answer earlier. I began to question him about what he had seen or heard that evening. He was extremely uncooperative, but said spontaneously about the shooting, "I wonder if it was that guy that just got out of CYA."

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I asked him whom he was talking about. He said he did not want to get involved or give any information. [REDACTED] seemed nervous, and appeared to be under the influence of a controlled substance. His pupils were approximately 8.5 mm in the well-illuminated area where we were standing. I asked [REDACTED] if he was on probation or parole. He told me that he is on probation for drugs. I told him that he appeared to be "high." He said, "Well, I have a letter for medical marijuana."

I asked him why he would be allowed to use illegal drugs if he is on probation for drugs. He said he uses marijuana to treat his sleep apnea.

[REDACTED] claimed he had no additional information and continued to be uncooperative. I asked [REDACTED] when he got home. He said he had just walked up toward his apartment when I began to question him. He said he works at Ben & Jerry's ice cream shop on Thousand Oaks Boulevard and Conejo School Road, and had just come home from work. Since [REDACTED] was not present when the shooting occurred, I ended the interview.



I went to apartment 105 at approximately 2008 hours. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] told me that he had heard three or four shots approximately one hour earlier. He said that he and his family had been home for approximately ten minutes prior to hearing the shots. The rear sliding door was closed, and they did not see anything related to the incident.

[REDACTED] said he heard the sirens a short time later. He said he didn't want to go outside to see what was going on, because of the gunshots.

Neither [REDACTED], his wife, nor his daughter had any additional information about the incident.

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I contacted [REDACTED] in her apartment. She told me that she was home at the time of the incident, but didn't hear anything until she heard the sirens of emergency vehicles responding after the shooting had taken place.

[REDACTED] had a guest at her apartment on the evening of Nov. 14, 2006. [REDACTED] was in the apartment when she heard three gunshots. She said she knew they were gunshots, because she lives in Los Angeles and has heard shots many times before.

[REDACTED] said she was working on the computer between 1800 and 1900 hours when the shooting occurred. Neither she nor [REDACTED] saw nor heard anything else until emergency equipment began arriving at the apartment complex.

[REDACTED]'s apartment has a view to the east out the back, and the front door faces west. There is no view of the area where the shooting took place from inside the apartment.



There is a retirement home just west of the scene where the shooting took place. It is a three-story structure with apartments that face east toward the area of the shooting. I went with a team of detectives to contact all of the residents whose apartments faced the crime scene.



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I spoke to the [REDACTED] at 2050 hours. The [REDACTED] told me they were home at the time of the incident, but neither of them saw or heard anything related to the shooting. Their balcony actually faces south toward the Civic Arts Plaza, and they have no view of the area where the shooting occurred.

[REDACTED]

I spoke with [REDACTED], who told me that she was downstairs having dinner in the dining room earlier in the evening until approximately 1800 hours. Immediately after dinner, she remained downstairs and used one of the computers in the computer room. She said she didn't see or hear anything related to the shooting.

[REDACTED]

[REDACTED] said she ate dinner downstairs between 1700 and 1800 hours. She said she returned to her apartment at approximately 1815 hours. She said she didn't know there was another apartment complex behind the retirement home. She said she didn't see or hear anything related to the shooting.

[REDACTED] suffers dementia, and had me confused with the UPS delivery man. She had no information related to the shooting.

On November 14, 2006, at approximately 1845 hrs. I received a telephone call at my home from Captain Kelley. He informed me that there had been an officer involved shooting and asked me to respond and assist with the investigation. Captain Kelley further instructed me to respond to [REDACTED] Dr. in the City of Thousand Oaks.

I arrived at the scene at approximately 1905 hrs, where I met with Sergeant Powers. Sergeant Powers briefed me on the circumstances surrounding the shooting. Sergeant Powers told me that Detective Shane Matthews was at the location conducting an investigation when he was forced to shoot a subject in a white pickup truck that was now parked nearby. Sergeant Powers then asked me to contact and interview the subject Detective Matthews was meeting with. I was directed to a subject who was standing nearby. At 1915 Hrs, I introduced myself and he identified himself as [REDACTED]. I confirmed with Mr. [REDACTED] that he was talking to Detective Matthews before the shooting. [REDACTED] told me he was and that he saw the whole thing. The following is a synopsis of my interview with Mr. [REDACTED], which was digitally recorded.

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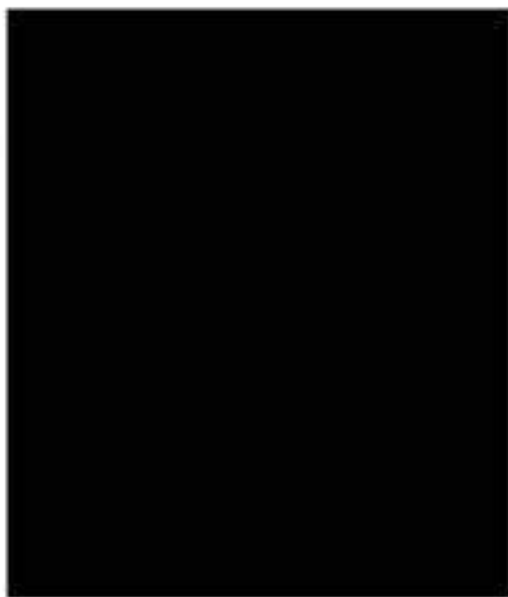
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██████████ and I started our conversation in the front seat of my car. As we were walking to my car, I confirmed with him that he was not hurt. After obtaining ██████████'s personal information, I asked him to tell me what had happened.

██████████ told me that Detective Matthews came to his apartment to speak to him about a place he once worked at called GNC. ██████████ said he and Matthew's talked about a theft at work and if he (██████████) had ever seen another employee take anything. I confirmed Detective Matthews was there to talk to ██████████ about some employee thefts. I confirmed with ██████████ that Detective Matthews was speaking to him as a witness to this employee theft. ██████████ said, "Right."

██████████ told me that as they are talking the suspect approached them and demanded to know, "Are you Sheriff?" ██████████ said he and Matthews looked at each other. ██████████ said neither of them responded to the suspect and the suspect continues to say, "You'll never catch me." ██████████ said he was trying to ignore the suspect and it seemed to him like Matthews was trying to ignore him.

██████████ said he and Matthews continued to talk a little longer. ██████████ said it appeared to him that Matthews was ignoring the subject. ██████████ said he watched the suspect as he started

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walking back to his truck. [REDACTED] said as the suspect walked back to his truck he stopped and just stood on the sidewalk. [REDACTED] said he and Matthews continued to talk and as they concluded their conversation, they started walking together along the west sidewalk towards the parking lot. [REDACTED] said the suspect was still standing on the sidewalk as they walked towards him.

[REDACTED] said as they approached the suspect he started running towards his truck. [REDACTED] told me that at the same time Matthews was yelling, "Stop, stop, stop." [REDACTED] said Matthews was pounding on the window of the truck with his fist. [REDACTED] said the suspect was inside his truck and suddenly started up the truck and started backing out. [REDACTED] said as the suspect was backing the truck up, Matthews pulled out his gun, and at the same time is yelling, "Stop, stop, stop." [REDACTED] told me the suspect backed out and then a started pulling forward and that is when Matthews shoots the tire. [REDACTED] said after shooting the tire, Matthews yelled, "Stop." [REDACTED] stated that after he shot the tire, Matthews moved to the side and fired twice more at the driver's side of the truck. [REDACTED] said after that the truck slowed and drifted to the right where it rolled to a stop against a curb.

[REDACTED] told me after the truck came to a stop he heard Matthews yell at the suspect, "Get out of the car." [REDACTED] told me that he heard the subject say something like, "I'm hit." [REDACTED] stated that the suspect opened the door and then he heard Matthews say, "Call 911." [REDACTED] said he called 911 and told dispatch that Detective Matthews had been involved in a shooting. [REDACTED] told me Matthews was telling the suspect, "Hold on buddy I'm going to get you some help." [REDACTED] said Matthews was "Kind of appeasing the guy." [REDACTED] told me that soon after police and fire arrived on the scene.

I asked [REDACTED] where he and Detective Matthews were standing when they were talking. [REDACTED] told me they were in front of the stairs. I asked [REDACTED] where the stairs were in relation to where I met him in the parking lot near the crime scene. [REDACTED] suggested he be allowed to walk through the sequence of events. I told him I thought that would be a good idea.

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█████ escorted me to the Southeast corner of the complex and a set of stairs to a two-story building directly south of the parking lot where the shooting occurred. There was also a sidewalk along the west edge of this parking lot.


█████ and I stopped on this sidewalk near the entrance of a courtyard that separates two apartment buildings. I asked █████ where he and Matthews were talking. █████ pointed to a set of stairs off to our left that were about thirty yards away. █████ told me this was where he and Matthews were talking. █████ explained he was sitting on the second or third step facing the parking lot. █████ said Matthews was facing him and had his back to the parking lot.

█████ then indicated that the suspect was walking south on the sidewalk from the parking lot towards the apartment buildings and was headed towards the building on the right side of the courtyard. █████ said he thought the suspect saw a badge or something and said to Matthews, "you a cop, you'll never catch me, or I won't go that easy or something like that." █████ said Matthews did not say anything to the suspect.

█████ said he and Matthews continued to talk. Matthews said he had to go and they started walking North on the sidewalk towards the parking lot. █████ said the suspect had remained on the sidewalk about thirty yards from where they were standing. █████ said as he and Matthews were walking back to their cars when all of a sudden, the suspect started running and Matthews started running after him and was yelling over and over, "Stop."

█████ said the suspect got into his car which was parked in the third parking stall from the entrance of the parking lot and on the west side of the parking lot. █████ also stated the suspects car was parked nose in.

█████ said after the suspect got into his truck and Matthews ran up to the driver's door he began beating on the door with his fist. █████ said the suspect ignored Matthews and started backing his truck out of the parking spot. █████ said Matthews was now standing in front of the suspect's truck near the left front corner. █████ said Matthews pulled out his gun and

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yelled at the suspect, "Stop, stop, stop" while pointing his gun at the suspect. [REDACTED] confirmed Matthews was standing at the corner of the truck not in front of it. [REDACTED] said as the truck pulled forward, Matthews fired a shot at the tire. [REDACTED] said the suspect continued to drive forward at the same time; Matthews stepped to the side and shoots two more shoots as the truck rolled past him. I asked [REDACTED] if it looked to him like the truck was driving at Matthews. [REDACTED] said, "The first time, yes and maybe even the second time." I asked [REDACTED] if Matthews had not stepped to the side after he fired that first shot, did he think the truck would have hit Matthews. [REDACTED] said, "Maybe not, because Matthews was on the corner." I asked [REDACTED] if he could estimate how fast the truck was going. [REDACTED] said, "He was trying to speed up. He was trying to get the hell out." I asked [REDACTED] if he could hear the engine revving. [REDACTED] said, "Oh yeah, yeah." I asked [REDACTED] if he heard the tires squealing. [REDACTED] said yes for a brief second.

I confirmed with [REDACTED] that the truck backed out of the parking stall. [REDACTED] said Matthew's pulled out his gun, runs and stands in front of the truck. Then yells Stop, stop. [REDACTED] said the guy put the truck in gear and started heading towards Matthews so he shoots the tires while yelling, "Stop, stop."

I asked [REDACTED] what happened next. [REDACTED] said the truck rolled across the parking lot entrance and stopped at the north curb of the parking lot. [REDACTED] said Matthews ducked down and moved up to the driver's side. I asked [REDACTED] if Matthews was yelling at the driver. [REDACTED] said Matthews was yelling at the driver, "Get out of the car. Get out of the car." [REDACTED] said he heard the suspect say, "I'm hit. I'm hit." [REDACTED] said Matthews opened the driver's door and asked the suspect where are you hit. [REDACTED] said Matthews then started talking to the suspect telling him they were getting him help and that he was going to be okay.

I asked [REDACTED] where he was while all this was happening. [REDACTED] pointed at the sidewalk on the west edge of the parking lot and said, "Right there in the middle of the street." [REDACTED] said as Matthews opened the driver's door he moved to the end of the sidewalk.

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I asked [REDACTED] if he saw anybody else outside when all this was going on. [REDACTED] said he did not see anybody else. [REDACTED] told me he called 911 from his cell phone while he was standing on the sidewalk and after Matthews opened the driver's door.


I asked [REDACTED] if he the suspect was being real aggressive or was he just acting like a knucklehead. [REDACTED] said the suspect was trying to instigate something. [REDACTED] said he and Matthews did not pay any attention to the suspect.



[REDACTED] said he has never seen the suspect before and does not know him. I asked [REDACTED] if he had ever seen the truck before. [REDACTED] said, "No."

[REDACTED] again said, "The guy wanted to instigate something." I asked [REDACTED] how long he and Matthews talked after the suspect first approached them. [REDACTED] said it was about thirty more seconds.

I asked [REDACTED] if he saw a weapon in the suspect's hands when Matthews started chasing the suspect. [REDACTED] said no.

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

On 11-14-06 at about 2100 hours, I assisted several other deputies with contacting the residents of [REDACTED] is located at [REDACTED], [REDACTED] in Thousand Oaks. We were attempting to locate any witnesses to an officer involved shooting incident in which Detective Shane Matthews #3127 shot S-Adrian Canley who was attempting to drive over Detective Matthews with his (Canley's) vehicle.

At about 2100 hours, I rang the doorbell to apartment # [REDACTED] in the [REDACTED] apartment complex. An elderly lady, who identified herself as [REDACTED] answered the door. [REDACTED] lives in the apartment alone and her telephone number is [REDACTED].

I identified myself to [REDACTED] and asked if I could speak to her regarding the shooting incident that occurred in the parking lot behind (east of) her apartment. [REDACTED] seemed to know why I was there, agreed to speak with me and then invited me into her apartment. My conversation with [REDACTED] was tape-recorded.

I asked [REDACTED] to tell me what she knew about the incident. [REDACTED] said she was sitting in her apartment and heard what she thought was a gunshot. [REDACTED] said she then heard three or four more noises that she "knew were shots".

[REDACTED] said after hearing the gunshots, she walked out onto her balcony. From her balcony, [REDACTED] said she saw a guy standing behind a pickup truck and holding what she thought was a rifle. [REDACTED] said she does not know much about guns.

[REDACTED] went on to say that the guy standing behind the truck kept peeking around the side of the bed of the pickup, looking at another guy who was about "halfway into the truck". [REDACTED] explained that the second male subject appeared to be sitting partially in the cab of the pickup, but kept looking back toward the guy standing behind the pickup.

[REDACTED] said that eventually the guy who had been standing behind the pickup moved up toward the cab of the pickup. [REDACTED] then told me, "By that time, apparently the guy (in the cab of the pickup) had already been shot, because he had slumped over into the truck."

[REDACTED] said the guy from behind the pickup moved up to the cab and opened the door. [REDACTED] then changed her statement and said that he didn't open the door. [REDACTED] told me she did

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not want to say anything that wasn't correct. She then said that the guy who had been behind the pickup, moved up to the cab, looked into the window and "saw that the guy (in the cab) was shot." [REDACTED] then told me, "At that point I came in and called 911, because I knew it was something serious."

[REDACTED] told me she thought the incident occurred at about 1830 hours. I went back over [REDACTED]'s statement with her. She showed me that her balcony faces and looks out over the area where the shooting occurred.

[REDACTED] thought she heard four gunshots, but the last three were so close together that there may have been more shots fired. [REDACTED] did not see who did the shooting, but she "presumed" that the guy standing behind the pickup had fired the shots. [REDACTED] said she thought that the guy who had been behind the truck was the person who did the shooting, because it was the guy in the truck who had been shot.

I asked [REDACTED] if she was sure that the guy behind the pickup truck had a rifle. [REDACTED] again told me that she did not know much about guns, however she did go hunting once with her brothers in South Dakota and they used rifles. [REDACTED] said, "It looked like their guns." I asked if the gun was "long". [REDACTED] said, "No, not a long one. No, it wasn't long, so that's why I don't know if it was a rifle or not." I asked [REDACTED] if she could describe the gun. [REDACTED] said, "Well, it was awfully dark and the guy's clothing was dark." [REDACTED] then said, "I would say it was a short rifle." [REDACTED] reached out her hands and gestured that the length of the rifle was about 18 inches long. I asked [REDACTED] if what she saw could have been the guy's arm out-stretched with a handgun in his hand. [REDACTED] said, "It could have been." [REDACTED] then said, "I presumed it was a gun because I heard the shots."

[REDACTED] told me she did not see anyone else in the area. [REDACTED] explained that she was out on her balcony within about 15 seconds after hearing the gunshots and it was approximately a minute later before she saw two other male subjects walk out from the apartment complex to the south of the incident. [REDACTED] said she could not describe any of the subjects, only to say that they were wearing dark clothing. 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

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apartment. I motioned for the two adult females to follow me into the kitchen. I then spoke to (P) [REDACTED] and (P) [REDACTED] who told me the following.

Both (P) [REDACTED] and (P) [REDACTED] said they were friends of the family. They said they knew the [REDACTED] family from when they lived in Canoga Park. They said they lived in the adjacent apartment complex on the same street in Canoga Park. They said they were friends of [REDACTED].

(P) [REDACTED] and (P) [REDACTED] said they drove together to the apartment and arrived at approximately 2000 hours. (P) [REDACTED] said they parked at the intersection of Conejo School Road and Los Feliz Drive, and walked to the apartment (# [REDACTED]). I asked both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] if they saw or heard what happened that night near the apartment. Both (P) [REDACTED] and (P) [REDACTED] said they did not see or hear what happened that night near the apartment. They both alleged that they arrived at the apartment complex after the shooting had occurred. They had no other information for me. I asked both (P) [REDACTED] and (P) [REDACTED] if they knew the name of (S) Adrian Canley. They both denied knowing (S) Adrian Canley. After some non-pertinent conversation, I ended my conversation.

It is my opinion that both (P) [REDACTED] and (P) [REDACTED] were less than truthful about when they arrived at the apartment complex. I know that the driveway I parked in is the only access into the complex for both vehicles and pedestrians. The driveway was blocked as part of a secondary perimeter when I arrived on scene, and all non-emergency personnel were not allowed to pass through. Since they were both at the apartment, I believe they arrived prior to the shooting and at the very least heard the shooting take place.

A couple of minutes went by when [REDACTED] was approached by (W) [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] if she had heard gunshots. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] decided to walk to the property line and see what was happening. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were on the north west side of the property, looking north, when they saw a male subject by the fence of 71 N. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said the subject appeared to be crouching down near a building at 71 N. [REDACTED] and walking away from [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] went to her trailer and called the police regarding the suspicious person. [REDACTED] said from the time of the gunshots to the time she saw the subject near the building was about five minutes. [REDACTED] was informed by [REDACTED] that the subject had got into a "white Bronco style truck" and quickly left southbound on [REDACTED] and then drove east bound on Thousand Oaks Boulevard.

[REDACTED] could not clearly see the subject but said the subject was definitely male, not black, with short dark hair. The subject was only described as wearing a white shirt.

I then spoke with [REDACTED] and the following is a summary of her tape-recorded statement: On 11-14-06, at about 1825 hours, [REDACTED] was outside her trailer when she heard five gunshots coming from the area of Los Feliz. [REDACTED] said she heard two gunshots, a pause, and then three rapid gunshots. [REDACTED] went to [REDACTED]'s trailer and asked if she had heard the gunshots as well. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] went to the west side of the property and looked north. [REDACTED] saw a figure crouching down near the

block wall and a building on the property of 71 N. [REDACTED]. The figure ran toward the parking lot. [REDACTED] went to the front of the property, near [REDACTED], and saw the subject in the driver seat of a "white Bronco type truck." The subject drove south on [REDACTED], ran the red light at [REDACTED] and Thousand Oaks Boulevard, and continued east on Thousand Oaks Boulevard.

[REDACTED] did not get a good look at the subject, but said he was definitely not black, with short dark hair, wearing a white shirt. [REDACTED] said she is positive the subject in the white car was the same subject she saw near the block wall.

I secured a possible second crime scene at [REDACTED], near the entrance to 71 N. [REDACTED]. I was eventually allowed to move the possible second crime scene into the parking lot of 71 N. [REDACTED]. As I was sitting in the parking lot, a white Chevy Tahoe drove into the parking lot. The driver, (W) Keith [REDACTED], matched the description of the subject seen leaving the area.

I spoke with [REDACTED] and the following is a summary of his tape-recorded statement: [REDACTED] is visiting his friend (P) [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] rents a studio apartment at 71 N. [REDACTED]. On 11-14-06, at about 1820 hours, [REDACTED] was sitting in [REDACTED]'s apartment when [REDACTED] heard five gunshots. [REDACTED] believed the gunshots were being fired in the parking lot directly in front of him, so [REDACTED] "ducked for cover."

After [REDACTED] realized the gunfire was over, he and [REDACTED] cautiously went out into the parking lot. They did not see anybody in the parking lot and went back inside [REDACTED]'s apartment. About 1830 hours, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] began hearing several sirens in the area and became curious. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] went outside and saw several emergency lights coming from [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stood in the parking lot of [REDACTED]'s apartment complex while [REDACTED] walked over to the block wall to see what was happening.

[REDACTED] watched [REDACTED] look over the wall, quickly turn around and began running back toward [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] the police were in the apartments and that something must have happened. [REDACTED] was late for a hockey game, so [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] left to go to [REDACTED]'s hockey game. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] left in a Chevy Tahoe that was almost identical to his.

I then spoke with (P) [REDACTED] and the following is a summary of his tape-recorded statement: [REDACTED] lives at 71 N. [REDACTED]. On 11-14-06, at about 1820, [REDACTED] heard several gunshots and believed they were coming from his parking lot. [REDACTED] went to the parking lot to see if anybody was hurt and did not see anything.

At about 1830 hours, [REDACTED] was on his way to a roller hockey game, when he heard several sirens in the area. [REDACTED] said he saw several flashing lights in the parking lot of [REDACTED] and became "morbidly curious." [REDACTED] walked over to the block wall separating his complex from [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] is 6'4" tall and was the only person tall enough to see over the wall.

[REDACTED] said he looked over the wall, saw several police officers standing around with police tape up. The police officers were looking in his direction and pointing to the block wall. [REDACTED] "got scared" and quickly ducked down. [REDACTED] ran back to the parking lot, got into his friends car and drove away. [REDACTED] did not see the shooting and did not know it was an officer involved shooting until he got back home.

It was apparent to me that [REDACTED] was indeed the subject seen by [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and that he was not involved in the shooting.

I advised Sergeant Peterson, the incident commander, of the situation. Sergeant Peterson conferred with Major Crimes

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Between thirty seconds and one minute later, he walked out of his apartment and towards the staircase. From that location, he could see the parking lot. He noticed a person with a flashlight bending over, near the driver's side of a white truck. He was unable to see well enough from his location. [REDACTED] was unsure if it was a female or a male. He watched for about five minutes from the staircase. He noticed the person with the flashlight was "working" on the person that belonged to the truck. 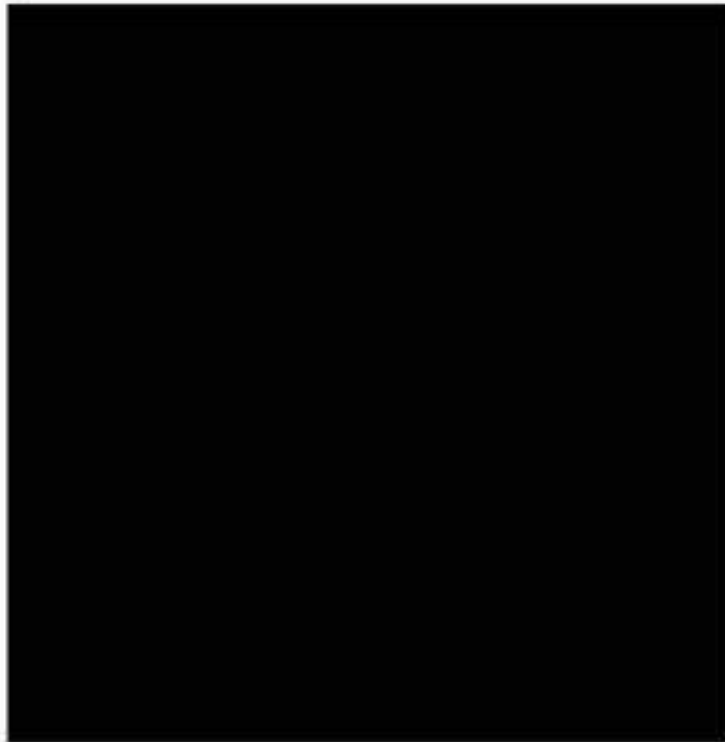

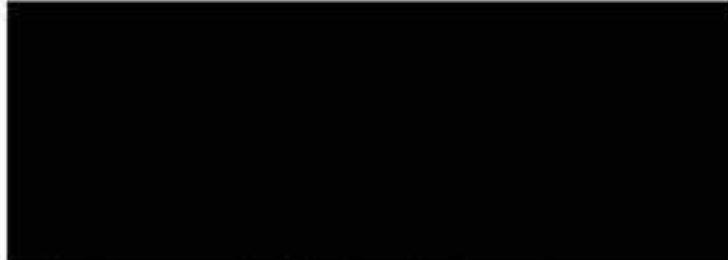

We were instructed to attempt to contact all residents who have windows facing east, toward the parking lot where the shooting occurred.

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described it for the tape. Matthews was wearing a blue button front shirt, tie, slacks and a belt. Attached to his belt was Matthew's badge, gun/holster and handcuffs (in back). Also, around Matthew's neck on a lanyard was his department issued identification card. Matthews commented that except for a jacket, which I had given him to wear (it was after midnight and cold), he was dressed the same as when the incident took place. I asked Detective Matthews if he noticed anything on Canley's person when he was confronting him at the driver's door and/or look for anything on him after pulling him from the vehicle. Matthews said he saw a lighter hanging out of Canley's right pocket, which he pulled out and put on the ground. Matthews then said, "I felt his sweatshirt pockets and in there I found a cell phone. I reached into his left pocket and found 2 black gloves, one of which I believe had a crank pipe in it. I never saw the crank pipe, but I could feel it. I set it aside. I reached under his back as far as I could, but I didn't get all the way. But I couldn't feel anything under his - in the belt line under his back. And his arms, the sleeves of the sweatshirt, but that's about all I - that's all I patted down, just those general areas real quick. And, quite honestly, I wasn't concerned that he was faking, 'cause he had that-his color was fading, his eyes were starting to roll back and I could see his hands clearly; there was nothing in his hands." I interjected, "At that point he wasn't a threat to you." Matthews agreed and added, "Right, I wasn't thinkin' you know - continue searching. It was more to provide some help."

I confirmed there was no one else with Canley at any time during the incident. Matthews said there was not and the only people he

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side step. But I was back peddling and I fired two rounds at the truck. I remember staring at the grill and seeing the grill break apart and then the screeching of tires and thinking that he was gonna run me over and that I needed to shoot him in the head, where I could see. I remember saying to myself, shoot what you could see, and all I could see was his head barely over the dash. So I remember I was right on his, where his head was and I fired. I thought it was two rounds, but after counting the rounds at the station it turned out to be three."

I then said, "Tell me, as you're hearing screeches and he's starting to come forward, what - what are you feeling at that point?" Detective Matthews answered, "I'm thinking, I'm gonna get run over. This guys gonna run me over, he's in a big truck and he's gonna do anything he can to get away. And uhm, I, I still remember being in disbelief that I was in front of the truck, cause I couldn't figure out how I got there. But all I knew was that I was there and I was back peddling; and I fired the first two rounds I saw them hit the grill and I told myself that didn't do anything. And I came up to where his head was when he was still coming forward - I remember saying 'stop' really loud a couple of times after the first two rounds, and then, and then he - I remember tires screeching and him coming at me. I fired the three rounds and peeled off and side stepped and then at that point, his foot was definitely off the gas and he just coasted to where the truck is now. He wasn't going at any speed."

I then asked Detective Matthews about the clothing he was wearing when the incident took place. I looked at Matthew's apparel and

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remember that he was yelling at me and he was hitting at the window; like trying to keep me from grabbing onto the truck or from grabbing onto him."

I then prompted Matthews to continue by saying, "O.k., he then starts the car." Matthews kept talking saying, "He starts the car, I tried to break the window when he started the car. In my mind, I told myself there's no way he's driving away. Not in his condition. I mean he's - something - I mean he was high. For him to be driving that car around there's no way. So I just remember telling myself, don't let him leave in the truck - don't let him leave in the truck."

Matthews continued, "When I hit the window and it didn't break, I reached for the door and I tried to open the door and that's when he backed out. And I went with the truck - I can't remember if I held on or I just instinctively just followed it out, but when the truck came out, all of a sudden I'm standing in front of it. And I remember saying to myself, 'How did I end up in front of the truck.' I was at the side before and so I started - the whole time I'm yelling, 'Stop, Stop! Sheriff's Department. Stop what you're doing.' You know, and I started walking back, or I started back peddling." Later in the interview, Matthews said that during this time Canley was yelling something unintelligible at him.

I interjected, "Why are you back peddling? Let me ask you that." Matthews said, "Cause he's, he's got the truck started and coming after me. That's what I believe. He's starting to roll forward and he's revving the engine and so I, I don't know why I didn't

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I then asked Detective Matthews to describe in more detail the portion of his statement where he is now chasing Canley and he (Canley) is fumbling with something in his waistband. I further asked Matthews to, "Tell me what you're thinking and what feeling as that is going on. What is your perception of what he's doing?"

Detective Matthews said, "As he's running, he's crouched over and he's reaching with both hands to his front, which I can't see. And he's already told me that I'm not going to take him, that I'm not going to take him alive, so I'm - I assume that he's going for a weapon. That's why I threw my notebook and pulled my gun out as soon as I started running; so that if he were to turn and have a weapon, I would already be up and on target to address that threat. But he never turned towards me and when his hands came out at the truck, I didn't see anything in them. I didn't remember seeing any keys."

Chronologically, we were at the point that Canley was getting into the truck. I asked Detective Matthews how far away he was from Canley as he was getting into the truck. Matthews estimated that he was about 15 feet away. Matthews added that he had not gained any ground on Canley as he chased after him. I then asked Matthews to tell me more about what took place when he arrived at the door and he had his gun pointed at Canley. Matthews said, "I'm yelling at him, Stop! Sheriff's Department, get out of the truck. Let me see your hands. Get out of the truck. Stop. Stop what you're doing." Matthews continued, "And he's yelling back at me, I can't remember specific words, but [pause] I want to say he - I, I can't remember what he was saying. I just

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I told Matthews that if I got anything wrong he was to correct me. I also told him I would now ask some probing questions about what he was experiencing as he went through the incident. Detective Matthews told me he understood.

I paraphrased Matthew's statement and as I reached portions of the incident, which I wanted to talk more about, I would stop and ask questions of Matthews.

The first question I asked Matthews was concerning the initial statements Canley made to him while he was talking to [REDACTED]. Matthews answered, "I remember that he thought [REDACTED] was a cop too, because he said, 'I know you - I know you guys are Sheriffs and you're not going to get me - or - you're not going to take me.' You know as I think back on it, it was almost challenging, like - 'cause he stood there for a few moments as if he wanted me to respond. And I didn't. I tur-I turned my back on him and went back to talking to [REDACTED], like I didn't want to address it right at that moment."

Matthews continued, "But when he returned then in my mind said, 'something - obviously something's not right this guy needs to be talked to and something - I mean to me - I mean I've had drug training, to me the guy was, was high on meth or coke or some kind of stimulant. Couldn't - you know he was pacing back and forth - he couldn't hold still. Honestly, he had that meth paranoia almost going. You know how they get, like everybody's after him. That's how it seemed like, he thought I was after him and yet, I didn't even know who the guy was."

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with him at the Air Unit, so I know he is capable of doing it. And I said, 'It's probably a good idea.'"

Detective Matthews said he walked with Deputy Hall to the west where the entrance to the parking area begins. Deputy Hall asked Matthews how big the Crime Scene needed to be. Detective Matthews said he helped place the crime scene tape around the area. Additional, patrol units began to arrive. Detective Matthews told the arriving deputies that [REDACTED] had seen the entire incident and he also mentioned the Hispanic man he had contacted earlier.

About ten minutes later, Detective Matthews was standing with Deputy Ferruzza, who had been assigned to stay with him, when he (Matthews) looked down and saw that his digital audio recorder was on and had been on during the entire incident. Detective Matthews looked at the recorder and saw that it had been running for, "50 something minutes." Matthews said he knew that this would include [REDACTED]'s interview and the shooting. Detective Matthews then said, "So I turned it off in front of Paul [Ferruzza], or I stopped the recording - I turned it off and I gave it to him and I told him, 'You better hold onto this, its got the whole shooting on the tape.'"

Detective Matthews said he then sat in the car and waited. Up until this point in the walk-through, I had asked very few questions. It was my intention to obtain Detective Matthews initial statement unfettered. I told Detective Matthews that I now wanted to walk him back through what he had said to ensure that I had a clear and accurate picture of what he had told us.

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the right side. At this point, Deputy Berg arrived and used a pair of medical scissors to cut the sweatshirt and underlying T-shirt off of Canley.

Detective Matthews said that once the clothing was off, he was able to see the bullet hole in the upper right portion of Canley's chest. Matthews continued, "By this time, he was -- eyes were starting to roll back, there was no response, his breathing was shallow; although he still had a carotid pulse but he had no radial pulse (Wrist)." I stopped Det. Matthews and pointed out that his description of Canley's condition seemed beyond basic first aid. I also stated for the tape and others, that I knew that he (Matthews) had more advanced medical training than first aid and I asked him to review his background for us. Detective Matthews stated that he was an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) and worked at the Sheriff's Air Unit. He has responded on numerous medical flights. Prior to his employment with the Sheriff's Department, Matthews said he worked for Community Memorial Hospital in both the Surgery Unit and the Emergency Room as an Emergency Medical Technician.

Detective Matthews then continued telling us what took place after the shooting. Matthews said he checked for a radial pulse and found none; he checked Canley's carotid pulse on both sides of his neck and found that he had a pulse. Detective Matthews then said, "I got out the pocket mask. I gave him 2 or 3 breaths to assist his breathing, 'cause it was pretty shallow." At this point, Deputy Berg suggested that he be allowed to handle Canley's medical care. Matthews said, "Berg is an EMT and I work

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Detective Matthews holstered his weapon and pulled Canley out of the truck and onto the ground. Detective Matthews said he then opened Canley's airway. During this time he could hear the sirens of a couple patrol cars going by the entrance to the apartment complex. Matthews told Canley to keep breathing and not to move. Matthews described Canley's breathing and said, "He was moaning on his exhales but nothing else."

At this point, Detective Matthews said two things happened and he was unsure which happened first; he ran over to the driveway and flashed his light at the patrol cars to get their attention and a, "smaller Hispanic male" ran over and asked what was going on. Det. Matthews asked the man if he knew Canley; the man said he did not. Det. Matthews directed the man to stand with [REDACTED] (the person he was interviewing earlier). Det. Matthews then said he thought he talked to the man first and then flashed his light at the patrol cars.

Deputies Natoli and Hall arrived. They asked Matthews if he was alright and if there were any outstanding suspects; Matthews told them he was fine and there were no other suspects. They then asked Detective Matthews what he needed. He told them he needed a first aid kit, gloves and for someone to put up crime scene tape to protect the scene.

Detective Matthews put on the gloves and retrieved some pressure dressings. He asked Deputy Natoli to cut Canley's sweatshirt off of him. Detective Matthews was specific in telling Deputy Natoli to cut the left side of the sweatshirt, because the blood was on

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you do this? Or, what were you doing? Or something to that effect."

Det. Matthews said he yelled to [REDACTED], the person he had just interviewed, to call 911 because he did not have a radio with him. Matthews said he was crouched down behind the tailgate of the truck on the driver's side of the truck. He was going through his Nextel phone trying to find someone who could respond to help him. Det. Matthews said he was eventually able to reach Deputy Paul Ferruzza, who was working patrol shift 9041. Matthews told Ferruzza his location, shots had been fired and requested code three (lights and siren) assistance immediately. Deputy Ferruzza acknowledged Matthews and hung up. At about the same time, [REDACTED] asked Matthews for his last name so he could provide it to the dispatcher.

During this time, Canley was yelling, "You shot me. I'm hit." He was also moaning. Deputy Matthews worked his way over to his vehicle and retrieved a flashlight and went back to the tailgate. He shone his flashlight into the interior of the truck. The driver's door was open as Canley had opened the door. Matthews said he could see a portion of Canley's shoulder and head. Detective Matthews said that by this time, Canley had stopped talking and was now moaning. Matthews continued to tell Canley to show his hands and he began to approach Canley. When Matthews arrived at the driver's door he could see that Canley's body was slouched down. Detective Matthews said he could see some blood on the front of Canley's sweatshirt. Matthews commented that Canley had the "I'm dying look and he was moaning. I've seen it before."

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Det. Matthews continued to explain what was taking place saying, "So, I'm in front of the truck. I started back pedaling to get away from the truck. He (Canley) started coming forward. I fired two rounds at the truck - at the truck that was coming at me. I don't remember hearing the-I don't remember hearing the gunshots, but I remember star - I was staring at the grill of the truck as it was coming; and that's exactly where the shots went. And I knew my gun had fired because of the recoil and the pieces of the grill kind of went flying, or you know, broke apart. I yelled stop again. I was still - as this is going on, I'm still walking backwards."

Det. Matthews showed us how he moved backwards and at this time he indicated that he had moved north to an area in front of the second parking stall from the planter area referred to above. Matthews continued, "He revved the engine. I heard the tires squeal and - I mean it happened - it felt like it was in slow motion but I know it was, it was super quick. It was boom, boom, 'Stop! Stop!' and then [squealing noise] and then boom, boom, boom. I remember specifically looking right as his head that was in the windshield and aiming at his head when I fired.

Matthews described how he saw the rounds strike the area where the windshield meets the dashboard. Matthews again continued saying, "As he's coming at me, I fired the rounds and peeled off and he was yelling, 'You shot me. I'm hit.' And then the truck just slowly rolled forward and it stopped where you see it now."

Det. Matthews ran up to the back of the truck and yelled for Canley not to move. Matthews also instructed Canley to show his hands. Matthews then yelled to Canley, "Who are you? Why did

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and shouted, "Sheriff's Department, stop. Get out of the truck. Get out of the truck." The window was half down and Det. Matthews remembered trying to grab the window but said that Canley kept hitting the window, trying to keep his hands off. Matthews tried to break the window twice by hitting it with the "nose" of his gun. The window did not break.

By this time, Canley had the pickup's engine started. Matthews told us, "I grabbed the driver handle [sic] and he backed out quickly. So when he backed out, I kinda went with, I went with the truck; not on purpose but kinda just - it kinda pulled me out." Matthews motioned and showed us that the tail end of the truck was now nearest the apartment building and the front of the truck was to the north. Matthews continued, "So the-I'm on the-I'm in front of the truck but more toward the driver's side. I said to myself, 'How did you end -- I'm thinking how did I end up in front of the truck, 'cause I didn't intentionally end up in front of the truck. Just the way the truck came out and me holding on, I just ended up here."

Det. Matthews said he continued to yell at Canley to stop the "whole time." Matthews started backing up. Matthews then made the observation that Canley was yelling at him (Matthews) the whole time through the window. Canley was yelling, "Fuck you" and other things that Matthews could not specifically recall, but Matthews had the impression that "he was pretty pissed off." I asked Matthews if it was the tone of Canley's voice that told him he was pissed off. Matthews said it was.

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for him and he knew I was the Sheriff. He's sayin, 'Fuckin' Sheriff ain't going to take me alive.' So, I was going to contact him and he immediately bolted."

With that said I suggested that we move to the area Det. Matthews was now referring to in his explanation of what took place. We ended up at the base of the stairs of [REDACTED] Det. Matthews told us that as soon as he stepped off the raised cement landing he was on and took a couple of steps, Canley took off running northbound on the sidewalk along the west edge of the parking lot. Det. Matthews said he chased after Canley. When Det. Matthews reached the intersection of the walkways that crossed the area, he noticed Canley started fumbling with something and reaching into the front of his waistband or sweatshirt area. Det. Matthews pointed out that Canley had already made a statement about not being taken alive, and he indicated that Canley was running away from him and therefore had his back to him. Det. Matthews said that as he was running, he threw his notebook to the ground.

We then walked along the path in the direction Det. Matthews chased Canley. Matthews told us he saw Canley reaching toward his waistband and when he (Matthews) reached the intersection of the walkways he drew his firearm with his left hand (he is left handed) and threw his notebook to the ground. Matthews was telling Canley to stop saying, "Sheriff's Department stop." Canley's vehicle, a white pickup, was parked in the 3rd parking space south of a planter which created a portion of the entrance to the parking lot. The pickup was parked "nose in." Canley got into the car. Det. Matthews ran up to the door with his gun out

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[For ease of reading, I will refer to Canley by name. However, it should be noted that Detective Matthews did not know Canley's name during this incident.]

Det. Matthews turned around and saw Canley; Matthews described Canley and his clothing in a manner consistent with Canley's physical description and clothing. Canley was pacing back and forth and moving his hands in an animated manner. According to Matthews, Canley was "mad dogging" him. Matthews said his initial impression of Canley was that he was under the influence of drugs and a gang member. Matthews said this was based on his appearance and behavior.

Det. Matthews did not believe he said anything to Canley at that time. Matthews turned back to [REDACTED] who shrugged his shoulders as if to say he did not know who Canley was either. Canley then walked west down the sidewalk out of Matthews' view. Det. Matthews began to wrap up his conversation with [REDACTED]. At this point, Canley walked back over and made another comment to the effect, "Fucking Sheriff ain't gonna take me. I'm not - you're not going to take me alive." Det. Matthews then added, "[sic] words to those effect."

Det. Matthews thanked [REDACTED] for his time and turned to walk toward Canley, who was about 15 feet in front of him. Det. Matthews said he was unsure what was going on because he was being confronted by a subject who said he would not be taken alive; and it appeared to Matthews that the Canley had just been chased. Matthews continued saying, "He had that adrenaline rush going, he's high, he's just been chased, like somebody's lookin'

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attempting to contact a person named [REDACTED] [REDACTED] in connection with the theft. Matthews believed [REDACTED] lived in apartment 210. Det. Matthews was able to talk with [REDACTED]'s mother [REDACTED] and brother [REDACTED] at the apartment. They told Matthews that [REDACTED] was not home. Matthews left his name and phone number and asked that they have [REDACTED] call him.

As Matthews began to walk toward the parking lot to leave, he passed [REDACTED]. Det. Matthews said he knew what [REDACTED] looked like, as he had viewed a DMV photograph of him as part of his investigation. Matthews called to [REDACTED] and introduced himself to [REDACTED]. Matthews asked [REDACTED] if they could talk, and turned on his digital recorder and began the interview. They stood near a white minivan, which was the first vehicle in the southwest most corner of the parking lot and spoke for about 10 minutes.

After about 10 minutes, Det. Matthews asked [REDACTED] if he wanted to go inside to continue the interview. [REDACTED] declined but suggested they sit on the stairs that lead up to his apartment. [REDACTED] sat on the stairs and Matthews stood next to him while they continued to talk. Det. Matthews said they talked for about 30 minutes. Toward the end of the conversation a male (Canley) appeared behind Matthews. Det. Matthews said he was unsure where Canley came from, but he was about 10 feet away. Canley then said something to the effect, "I know you're the fucking Sheriff and you're not going to take me."

WALK THROUGH INTERVIEW - DET. SHANE MATTHEWS

The walk through took place at the scene of the shooting, [REDACTED]

The crime scene had already being processed and evidence had been collected. Matthews to tell us what lead him to be at this particular location. Det. Matthews said he arrived at the apartment complex at a few minutes after 5:00 PM. Matthews told us he was investigating a grand theft from GNC (General Nutrition Center) and was

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On 11-14-06, at about 1820 hours, I was working traffic enforcement in the city of Thousand Oaks. I heard a call broadcast over the police radio of shots fired at [REDACTED]. I then heard over the radio that 5T3 (Detective Matthews) was involved. I responded code 3 from the area of Conejo School Road and Willow Lane.

I arrived at the location within a minute of hearing 5T3 was involved. As I drove down the driveway of the apartment complex of [REDACTED] I saw two people pointing me in the direction of the incident. Deputy Hall was behind me. At the end of the driveway there was a traffic circle and a parking lot that opened to the left. In the parking lot to the far north, I saw a white truck facing north about to enter the sidewalk around the apartment complex. I saw Senior Deputy Matthews kneeling next to a Hispanic male who was lying on the ground. Matthews was about 2 feet away from the driver's door of the white Ford truck. The driver's door was closed. The Hispanic male's head was facing in a west direction with his feet to the east. Matthews was on the south side of the subject administering first aid.

I stopped my patrol car perpendicular and partially behind the white truck. I got out and Matthew's asked for a first aid kit and gloves. I went to my trunk and threw Matthew's my first aid bag. I put on gloves and went to the subject. Deputies Hall and Berg were around the subject as well. Matthew's stated he was still breathing and had a carotid pulse. Matthew's then stated, "just so you guys know, I fired four rounds, and there is a round right here." I then saw a round next to the subject's right leg. Berg and I cut the sweatshirts and shirts off the subject and exposed his chest. I saw one bullet wound to the right upper chest just below the clavicle.

I observed the subject had his eyes opened and he attempted to talk a few times. He was breathing on his own and Matthews and Berg continued to monitor the carotid pulse. Matthews opened the mask from my first aid kit and began to assist the subject with his breaths. As he began to do that, AMR and the fire department arrived on scene and took over the emergency care.

I then helped Deputy Hall look for shell casings. As we found them, he marked them with folded FI cards. Deputy Berg then asked me to take preliminary photographs of the crime scene. I took digital photographs.

I ran the license plate on the white Ford F-150. It returned to an Adrian D. Canley with an address of [REDACTED]. It was a 1999 Ford F-150. I cleared the subject and he returned with a valid [REDACTED] with the same address and a [REDACTED].

Sergeant Peterson arrived on scene and the crime scene was taped off. Deputy Berg and I alternated guarding the south side of the scene at twenty-minute intervals. At about midnight, Berg was released from the scene and I remained to keep the integrity of the

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On 11-14-06, at approximately 1820 hours, I was working traffic enforcement on a marked black and white police motorcycle in the city of Thousand Oaks. I heard a call over the radio of a report of shots fired at [REDACTED]. The call was then updated over the radio that Senior Deputy Matthews was involved.

I responded code three (lights and siren) to the location following Deputy Natoli. When we arrived at the apartment complex, we drove south through the driveway. I saw bystanders pointing south farther into the complex.

There was a parking lot to the east side of the driveway as we reached the south end of it. I saw a white truck stopped on a curb facing northbound. There was a Hispanic male lying face up on the ground just outside the driver's side of the truck. Senior Deputy Matthews was kneeling on the south side of the man. Natoli stopped her police car, and I stopped behind her.

Matthews asked for a first aid kit. Someone provided one to him. He and Natoli began first aid. Deputy Berg also arrived on scene. The man's clothes were cut off of him. I saw a gunshot wound in the man's front right upper chest. The man had his eyes open and his breathing seemed labored. Matthew's gave the man several rescue breathes with a CPR mask. AMR and the Ventura County Fire Department arrived on scene and took over medical treatment of the man.

While Matthews had been providing first aid, he said he fired his weapon four times. I asked if there were any outstanding suspects. Matthews said there was not.

Matthews walked with me to show the extent of the scene so I could secure the scene with crime scene tape. While showing the area to me, Matthews spontaneously stated that the man had told Matthew's that he (the man) would not be taken alive.

Other units and supervisors arrived on scene. I checked the scene for evidence. I found four shell casings to the southwest of where the truck had stopped. I also found the copper jacket of a round to the east of where I found the casing. I marked the items I found with folded FI cards.

I was released from the scene at approximately 1900 hours to respond to a traffic accident.

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On 11/14/2006, I was working patrol in the City of Thousand Oaks driving a marked black & white patrol car and in full uniform.

At approximately 1841 hours, I was dispatched to a call of shots heard in the area of [REDACTED] Initial information was that 5 – 6 shots were heard in front of that apartment. As I responded to the address, I heard Deputy Ferruzza broadcast over the radio that Detective Matthews was involved in the shooting. Myself, along with several other Deputies responded Code-3 to the scene.

When I arrived, Deputies Natoli and Hall were already on scene. Both Natoli and Hall, along with Detective Matthews, were leaning over and rendering first aid to a male subject that was lying on the ground adjacent to a white Ford F150 pick-up. After retrieving my first aid kit, I also went to assist in rendering first aid.

The male subject was lying on his back and unconscious, and appeared to have trouble breathing. I could also see blood on the front his shirt. Deputy Natoli said that she was unable to feel a pulse on the subject's wrist. I was able to feel a weak pulse at the subject's carotid artery. Using trauma shears, I began to cut away the subjects shirt and jacket, exposing his chest area. Once the subject's upper torso was uncovered I could clearly see one bullet entrance wound above the subject's right breast / pectoral area, which was slightly bleeding. I was unable to see any other obvious injuries on the front of the subject's torso. Because of his labored breathing, Detective Matthews used a manual ventilating mask to assist the subject with getting air into his lungs.

Senior Deputy Grambling arrived during this time, and advised Sheriff's dispatch to have EMS personnel come into the scene once they arrived. Once Ventura County Fire Department Paramedics arrived on scene and took medical control of the scene, I asked Grambling to escort Detective Matthews away from the immediate

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scene. Because of his involvement in the shooting, I believed it would be less mental stress on Detective Matthews if he didn't watch as paramedics examine and provide medical care to the subject.

Fire Paramedics [redacted] and [redacted] continued to provide medical care to the male subject, who remained unconscious with labored breathing. I was asked to completely cut-off the subject's upper clothing, which I did with my trauma shears. Ventura County Fire Engine Captain [redacted], along with Engineer [redacted] and Fire Fighter [redacted] arrived a short time later and assisted with administering aid to the subject. At one point, as Paramedic [redacted] was cutting-off the subject's pants he yelled "there's a gun here!" I immediately went to [redacted]'s side and could see a black semi-automatic handgun lying next to the subject's right leg. The handgun apparently was inside the subject's pant leg, and was exposed after the pant leg was cut open. Because the paramedics were preparing to move the subject onto a backboard in order to transport him to the hospital, the weapon was left where it was discovered. I alerted all medical personnel of the presence of the weapon, then instructed them to leave the gun and all other items untouched (other than their medical equipment) at the scene.

As other Sheriff personnel arrived on scene, an inner perimeter as well as an extended perimeter was established. Sgt Peterson arrived and began assigning tasks - I continued my visual control of the handgun, subject's clothing and other items located where medical aid was initially given until I was relieved of my position.

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On the evening of 11-14-2006 I was working uniformed patrol in the city of Thousand Oaks. Deputy Berg and I were dispatched to a call of shots fired at [REDACTED] at 1820 hours. Shortly after the initial call we were advised to respond code 3. While we were enroute to the call it was advised on the radio that the shots fired call involved Sr Deputy Matthews.

While I was still enroute to the call I heard Deputy Natoli (9T3) and Deputy Hall (9M6) report that they were on scene. A short time later Deputy Berg reported that he was on scene. I arrived shortly after Deputy Berg. I drove up the driveway of [REDACTED] and parked near the turn-around. I saw a white pick-up truck stopped at an angle in the N/E corner of the rear parking lot. Deputy Berg and Sr Deputy Matthews were administering first aid to a male subject laying on the asphalt near the truck.

Sr Deputy Matthews was questioned quickly, and it was determined that there were no outstanding suspects. Dispatch was advised to have emergency medical personnel respond the scene. Paramedics arrived very shortly thereafter, and Sr Deputy Matthews was removed from the first aid efforts. Sr Deputy Matthews pointed towards a male subject standing close by and told me that he had been interviewing him when the incident occurred on an unrelated crime, and that he was a witness.

Sr Deputy Matthews described the boundaries of the crime scene, and crime scene tape was placed around area. The witness was detained, and when Sr Deputy Buschow (detective) arrived on scene, he was directed towards the witness. Sgt Peterson arrived during this, and he set up a command post on the west side of the parking lot.

When I heard that the fire department's light and air truck was enroute, I advised Sgt Peterson that I was going to back my patrol car out of the immediate area to make room for the fire truck. I then backed my patrol car out behind the outer perimeter and parked it behind another patrol car. I then assumed a post at the tape marking the outer perimeter to control access. I remained at this post until I was relieved by Deputy Jones at approximately 0030 hours.

On 11/14/06 at approximately 1820 hours, I was working uniformed patrol in the City of Thousand Oaks as a Patrol Sergeant. While conducting Shift II briefing at Station 10, I heard Dispatch broadcast a call of "shots fired, man down" at [REDACTED] I immediately left the station and responded to the scene.

Upon arriving at the scene, I saw that patrol units had begun setting up a perimeter with crime scene tape. I entered the crime scene and saw paramedics administering first aid to a male adult subject [later identified as (S) Adrian Canley], who appeared to be suffering from a gunshot wound to the upper left side of his chest. I also saw what appeared to be a .45 caliber semi-automatic handgun lying on the ground near Canley's feet. I directed a patrol deputy to standby with the weapon until it could be made safe and collected as evidence.

Soon thereafter, I was made aware that the shooting was officer-involved and that Senior Deputy S. Matthews had fired the shots that wounded (S) Canley. Sgt. M. Powers of Major Crimes and I made sure that Senior Deputy Matthews was not injured and was appropriately sequestered from other personnel.

Sergeant J. Weaver of ECPS Investigations also arrived on-scene, so I assigned him as head of Operations and asked him to coordinate the canvassing of the area for possible witnesses.

Upon my arrival the interior crime scene had been taped off and I saw fire and ambulance personnel working on the suspect in the parking lot near the recreation building for the complex. Deputies Berg, Natoli, Hall, Harris, and Axelrod were in the crime scene marking and looking for evidence.

Detective Matthews was outside the interior crime scene. I located Matthews to check on his well-being. I also spoke to him to determine if anyone else was involved. Matthews told me the person fire and ambulance personnel was the only suspect involved. He said the person he was there to interview was a witness and another person wearing white may have seen what happened but that person ran off and his whereabouts were unknown.

Detective Buschow arrived and interviewed the witness Matthews was interviewing when the incident occurred. Deputy Ferruzza stayed with Matthews. Sgt. Peterson arrived and directed me to scribe for the incident.

I then started to scribe the personnel in the crime scene and maintained a position at the command post with Sgt. Peterson until relieved by Sr. Deputy Morris at approximately 2400 hours.

Notification and Response

On 11/14/06, at approximately 1830 hours, I received a call from Detective Harris. Harris informed me that he just heard via the dispatch radio that a shooting had occurred in Thousand Oaks on Los Feliz Drive. He further informed me that Detective Matthews may be involved, and that he was responding to the above location. I told Harris that I would advise Detective Miller, who was also at the Thousand Oaks Police / Sheriff Station with me.

I immediately notified Det. Miller of the above incident. Miller accessed the incident from our Computer Aided Dispatch (C.A.D.) system and printed copies of the call slip. We also notified Sergeant Weaver of the incident, who was still in the station. Sgt. Weaver, Det. Miller, and I responded to the scene.

I arrived at the above location at approximately 1840 hours. I saw several patrol units, an AMR ambulance, and a Ventura County Fire Engine from station # 31 already on scene. I saw fire and paramedic personnel loading a male adult subject into the ambulance, and then drive away from the scene.

I then located Detective Matthews and Deputy Ferruzza in the circular portion of the driveway just east of the Fire Engine. I approached both Det. Matthews and Dep. Ferruzza and asked what happened. Det. Matthews said he was involved in a shooting. I asked him if he was injured, and he said he was not injured. Det. Matthews also informed me that he recorded the

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incident on his digital recorder, and gave his digital recorder to Dep. Ferruzza. I asked Dep. Ferruzza to give me Det. Matthews' digital recorder, since it is now evidence. Dep. Ferruzza took the recorder from his right shirt pocket and handed it to me. I noticed the recorder was turned off before I secured it into my briefcase.

I then directed Det. Matthews to sit in Det. Harris' vehicle, which was parked nearby. I instructed Det. Harris to open his vehicle for Det. Matthews, but to remain outside of his vehicle. I further instructed Det. Harris to remain nearby to watch Det. Matthews, and he complied.

I then instructed Deputy Hawthorne to follow the ambulance to Los Robles Hospital and to remain with the male suspect from this incident. Dep. Hawthorne immediately complied and left the scene.

I then walked to my vehicle and secured my briefcase with Det. Matthews' recorder in the locked trunk of my vehicle.

Soon, Sergeant Powers arrived on the scene. After a few minutes, Sgt. Powers told me to interview the firefighters that were still on scene. Refer to my other interviews for further details.

On 11-14-06, I responded to a report of an officer involved shooting at [REDACTED] in Thousand Oaks. While at the scene, Captain R. Pentis asked me to escort Senior Deputy Matthews to the East County Sheriff's Station to await investigators and his legal representation. At about 1905 hours, Senior Deputy Matthews and I left the scene in my department vehicle. We drove directly to the station and arrived at about 1917 hours.

I remained with Senior Deputy Matthews until attorney Rick Shimmel arrived at the station at about 1955 hours. Shimmel then spoke with Senior Deputy Matthews privately in the detective conference room. During my time with Senior Deputy Matthews, he did not discuss the details of the incident with anyone.

Major Crimes Detectives Davidson and Powers, Internal Affairs Captain O'Hanlon, Internal Affairs Detectives Murray and Inglis, and Doctor Katz arrived at the station while Senior Deputy Matthews was speaking with Shimmel. At about 2345 hours, Captain O'Hanlon informed me that Senior Deputy Matthews was going to be transported back to the scene. Captain O'Hanlon informed me that transportation arrangements had already been made and I would no longer be needed.

I am the supervisor in charge of the city of Thousand Oaks, East County, Special Enforcement / Gang Unit. I received a cell phone call from unit member Senior Deputy Gus Macias. Macias advised me that an officer involved shooting had occurred at [REDACTED] in Thousand Oaks.

I arrived at the Los Feliz scene and checked in with the command post at 1915 hrs. I cell phoned Special Enforcement Senior Deputy Dan Hawes and requested he respond to Los Robles Hospital to assist in identifying the injured suspect. I cell phoned Special Enforcement Deputy Brian Baker to have him respond to the Los Feliz scene and assist with interviews.

While I was on scene I was in phone contact with Special Enforcement Administrative Aide [REDACTED]. At my request she provided me with information on the suspect, Adrian Canley, that she obtained through law enforcement electronic media. I provided this information to various on scene investigators.

I never entered the shooting scene perimeter nor did I collect any evidence from the area. I did notice a black Ford Mustang ([REDACTED]) parked inside the shooting perimeter. This car belongs to Richard Escobar a former Thousand Oaks gang associate. I checked out from the command post at 2145 hrs.

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supplemental second interview with [REDACTED] regarding the incident. The following is summary of his statements.

He is an EMT assigned to unit #452. He arrived on scene and saw a subject lying on the ground near a white pick-up truck. The subject was unresponsive and being treated by the Fire Department (Squad 31) who had intubated him.

[REDACTED] did not treat the subject and only assisted with placing him onto a backboard. He said he saw a gun lying on the ground on the outside of his right leg. He said the gun was a black "Glock" and was lying inside his cut open pants. [REDACTED] then transported the subject by ambulance to the hospital.

I returned to the treatment room and stood by while medical staff treated Canley.

Major Crimes Detective Peterson arrived at the hospital. He obtained complete statements from the Fire Department and AMR personnel.

At 2013 hours, Doctor [REDACTED] pronounced Canley dead. At about 2052 hours, Medical Examiner Craig Stevens arrived at the hospital. A short time later, Crime Scene Technicians [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] arrived.

I stood by with Canley until his body was removed from the hospital by the Coroner's office.

My cassette-tape was booked as evidence at the East County Property Room.

I telephoned and spoke with Detective Smith and advised him of the incident. Smith stated that he and Detective Miller would respond to the scene from the Thousand Oaks police station.

I immediately began driving from the city of Moorpark to the location of the incident at [REDACTED]

I arrived at the above location at approximately 1835 hours. I saw several patrol units, an AMR ambulance, and a Ventura County Fire Engine from station # 31 already on scene. I saw fire and paramedic personnel administering first aid to a male on the ground outside of a white Ford pickup truck.

I located Detective Matthews in the circular portion of the driveway just east of the Fire Engine; he was standing behind some yellow police tape watching the fire and paramedic personnel. I approached Det. Matthews and asked him if he was "Ok" and needed anything. Det. Matthews stated that he was "Ok" and did not need anything.

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Deputy Berg then approached me and stated that fire personnel had located a gun on the subject beside the Ford truck. Deputy Berg asked that I come witness the location of the handgun before he secured the gun. I walked with Deputy Berg to the front of the Ford pickup truck. I saw a male lying on his back with his feet towards the front of the truck and his head towards the rear of the truck. I saw a pair of blue jeans hand been cut the entire length of the legs and laid open. Beside the subject's right leg, mid thigh area, I saw a black handgun. The handle of the handgun was towards the waistband of the pants and the barrel was pointed down towards the right leg. Deputy Berg began to step towards the subject and secure the weapon, since Fire personnel were still administering first aid to the subject. I asked Deputy Berg if he had a camera to photograph the location of the gun prior to it being secured. Deputy Berg stated that he did not have a camera and asked Deputy Natoli to bring her camera.

As we were preparing to take photographs of the location, Sergeant Peterson arrived and took over scene control. I believe photographs were taken but they did not occur prior to my leaving the area.

I walked back over to Det. Matthews, who was speaking with Det. Smith. I again asked Det. Matthews if he needed anything or needed me to contact anyone for him. Det. Matthews stated that he was fine. Det. Smith advised Det. Matthews to have a seat away from the incident. I told Det. Matthews that he could have a seat in my vehicle, which was parked nearby. Det. Matthews agreed to have a seat in the front seat of my vehicle. Det. Smith told me to open my vehicle for Det. Matthews and then to remain outside. I complied with Det. Smith's request.

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Upon arrival to the medical center I found Adrian receiving medical treatment in Room 6 of the Emergency Room. He was lying on a backboard on top of a hospital bed. Multiple physicians, nurses, firefighters, paramedics, and other medical staff were conducting the medical treatment. I also saw Deputy Hawthorne #3384, a uniformed Patrol Deputy, monitoring the activities taking place. Another uniformed Patrol Deputy, Deputy Bugarin #3651, was interviewing a paramedic, later identified to be [REDACTED], outside the Emergency Room in the sallyport area.

I contacted an unknown paramedic in the emergency room and he advised me he was not associated with this incident. However, he said he heard Adrian was "fading fast," had a "life threatening gunshot wound," and cardiopulmonary resuscitation had been preformed on him at least one time.

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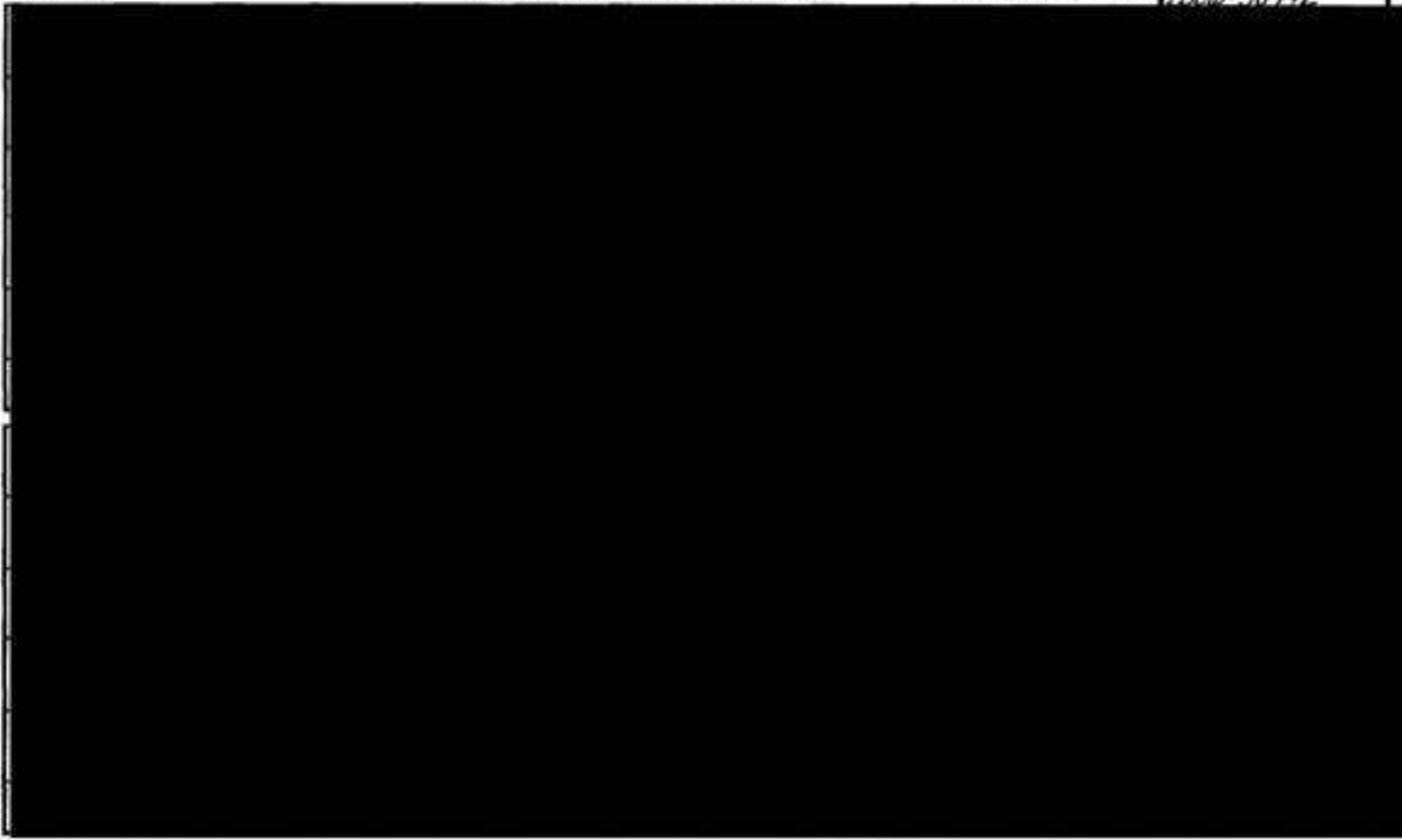

On 11-14-06 at about 1830 hours, Watch Commander, Captain Tom Convery, contacted me. Captain Convery told me that there had just been an officer involved shooting at [REDACTED] and requested I respond. I responded from the North Thousand Oaks area, arriving on scene at 1844 hours.

After arriving at the scene, I located Patrol Sergeant Carey Peterson, who was the field supervisor on scene. Sergeant Peterson briefed me on the evolving situation. Sergeant Peterson told me Canley had tried to run over Detective Matthews with a white pick-up that was still located in the parking lot of [REDACTED]. Sergeant Peterson told me Matthews fired his gun multiple times at Canley and his vehicle, striking Canley in the chest area. Sergeant Peterson told me Canley was transported to Los Robles Hospital. Sergeant Peterson told me that a .45 caliber pistol was recovered from Canley's person.

I asked Sergeant Peterson if, to his knowledge, anyone had asked Detective Matthews the public safety questions. Sergeant Peterson told me, to his knowledge nobody had asked those questions yet.

I contacted Detective Matthews and had him brought near the crime scene tape barrier, outside the taped crime scene. I asked Detective Matthews how many shots he fired. Detective Matthews said he fired four shots. I asked him to generally show me where he was standing when he fired the shots and which direction he was shooting. Matthews showed me that he was standing near the entrance/exit of the parking lot, generally near the right front fender of where

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Deputy Natoli's patrol vehicle was then parked. Detective Matthews showed me that generally he fired in a southerly direction toward the rear of the parking lot. Detective Matthews said as Canley's pick-up drove toward him, his direction of fire changed slightly from southerly to southeasterly, stopping near the small yellow and white house trailer on the east side of the parking lot. Detective Matthews said all of the rounds he fired hit Canley or the pick-up he was driving.

Detective Matthews did not speak about Canley firing a gun or seeing a gun displayed by Canley. As I knew that a pistol was found on Canley's person, I asked Detective Matthews if Canley had fired a gun at him. Detective Matthews told me Canley did not fire a gun at him, nor did he ever see Canley display a gun.

I asked Detective Matthews if there were any other (possibly injured) persons in the vehicle besides Canley that he saw. Detective Matthews said there weren't; Canley was the only occupant of the pick-up that he saw.

Pursuant to Department Policy, I directed (a supervisor) Senior Deputy Jeff Miller to take Detective Matthews to the nearest (East County) sub-station. Senior Deputy Miller took Detective Matthews to the East County Sheriff's Station.

I saw seven independent bullet holes in Canley's pick-up, five that appeared to have been fired from in front of his vehicle and two that appeared to have been fired at his vehicle from the rear. None of the bullet holes I saw in Canley's pick-up appeared to have exited the vehicle, other than a few fragments on the ground and one bullet that was on the driver's side of the vehicle on the ground.

I next checked the surrounding backdrop buildings of the shooting for victims and bullet holes, not finding victims or bullet holes in the buildings or vehicles to the backdrop of the shooting.

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I entered the emergency room where medical staff was monitoring the suspect's vitals. Dep. Hawthorne #3384 removed a blanket exposing the suspect's chest and abdomen. I confirmed that the above listed tattoos matched that of the suspect.

While at the hospital I was allowed access to one of their computers. I was able to access my department e-mail. [REDACTED] sent, via e-mail, Canley's DMV photo and latest Ventura County booking photo. I printed these photos and compared them with the suspect. Using the photos and the descriptions of the tattoos I positively identified the suspect as Adrian Canley.

I telephoned Sgt. O'Donnell and updated him regarding the positive ID. I also talked with Det. S. Peterson who was at the hospital conducting interviews with ambulance, fire and medical personnel. With Peterson's approval I gave the above suspect information to the hospital staff.

[REDACTED] also provided me with a criminal history for Canley. [REDACTED] told me Canley was currently on probation for 11550(a) H&S. [REDACTED] obtained all this information for department and state databases.

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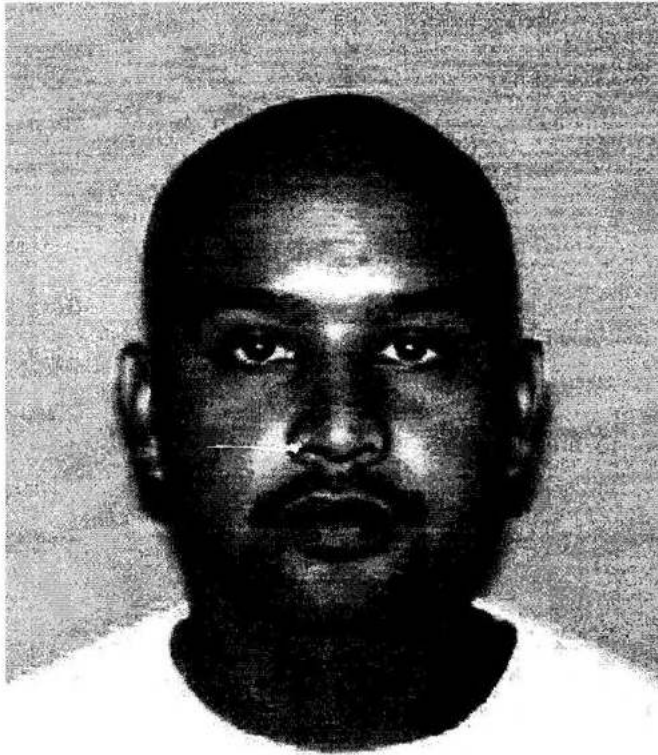

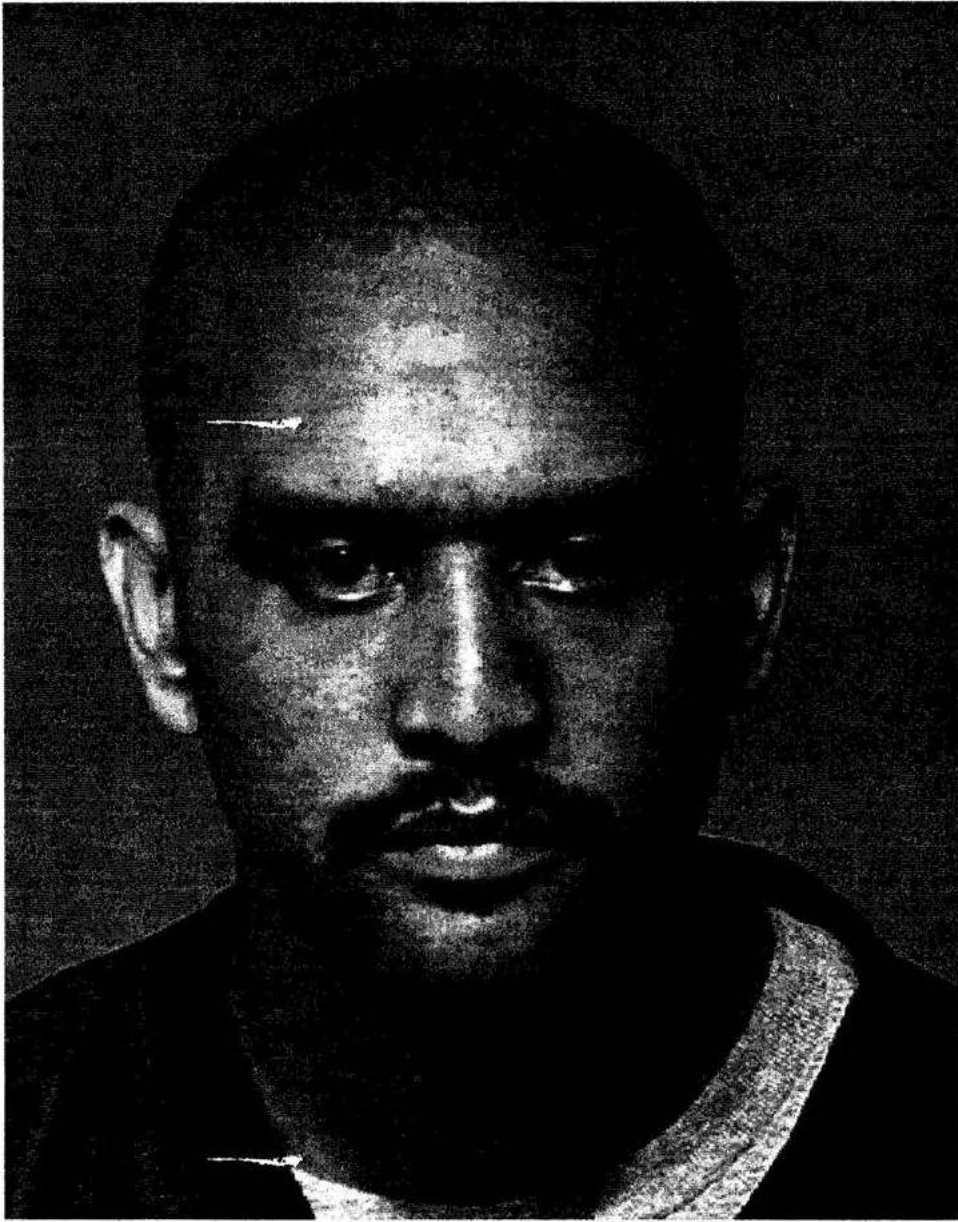

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BACKGROUND:

I was off duty at my residence when I received a call from Captain Convery. The Captain told me that there had been an officer involved shooting at [REDACTED] in Thousand Oaks. My presence was requested by the Major Crime Detectives to respond to the scene. I responded directly from my residence to the scene. Once at the scene I talked to Detective Ayub who briefed me on my assignment. My primary assignment was to measure and develop a crime scene map of the location including the vehicles at the location and the physical evidence pointed out by the detectives and lab personnel.

SCENE:

The incident occurred in the rear parking lot area of the residential complex at [REDACTED]. This parking lot has a single entry-exit driveway on its northwest corner. On the north side of the lot is a complex community room with a swimming pool. To the east side of the parking lot is a block wall that separates the parking lot and complex from adjoining property. On the south side of the parking lot is a two story living complex that contains units [REDACTED]. To the west side of parking lot there is a sidewalk and grass area next to the rear side of a carport building. The entry for these carports is on the west side of that building.

The measurements depicted on the attached diagram and in the below listed legend are based on a Cartesian plane. Deputy Shane Detective Matthews' Digital Audio Recorder

On 11-14-06 at about 1830 hours, Watch Commander, Captain Tom Convery, contacted me. Captain Convery told me that there had just been an officer involved shooting at [REDACTED] and requested I respond. I responded from the North Thousand Oaks area, arriving on scene at 1844 hours.

After arriving on scene and dealing with other issues, I took possession of Detective Shane Matthews' digital recorder from Detective Jon Smith. Detective Smith told me Deputy Paul Feruzza gave him Detective Matthews' digital recorder. On 11-15-06, I spoke to Deputy Feruzza in a telephone call. Deputy Feruzza told me that Detective Matthews handed him his (Detective Matthews') digital recorder after the shooting.

Recorder Description and Settings

Detective Matthews recorder was an Olympus, Puma Police Special model, digital recorder, serial number 202770GLP. The microphone sensitivity switch has two settings, "Conf" (conference – more sensitive) and "Dict" (dictation – less sensitivity). Detective Matthews' microphone sensitivity switch was positioned to the "Dict" (less sensitive) setting. The recorder also has a "VCVA" (voice activation) button with "On" and "Off" positions. Detective Matthews' recorder switch was positioned to the "Off" position. There is a "Hold" switch that was also in the off position. The recorder contained a 32-megabyte Olympus M-32P smart card.

There are three folders labeled alphabetically from A to C. There was one recording totaling 50 minutes and 45 seconds in folder "A." Upon listening to this recording, it is the recording that

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contains an interview of [REDACTED] by Detective Matthews and the shooting. Folders "B" and "C" did not contain any files. I found there was 4 hours, 22 minutes and 32 seconds of (available – unrecorded) time remaining. The battery power meter showed three of three bars.

Time Clock

Detective Matthews' digital recorder has a date and time clock. On 11-15-06, at 1401 hours, I went to Sheriff's Dispatch to check the time differential between the dispatch system and Detective Matthews' digital recorder. The Dispatch Supervisor told me the dispatch time stamping system is synchronized with the atomic clock. I noted the following differential between Detective Matthew's digital recorder and the dispatch time clock:

Dispatch: November 15, 2006 – 1401 hours

According to the recording time stamps in Deputy Matthew's digital recorder, his interview with [REDACTED] began on November 14, 2006 at 1750 hours and that recording concluded on November 14, 2006 at 1841 hours, for a total of 50 minutes and 45 seconds.

Summary of Recording

The following is a summary of the contents of Detective Matthew's 50 minute and 45 second recording that are pertinent to the officer involved shooting. I have placed timestamp markings preceding events. The timestamp markings are in Minutes and Seconds, which correspond to their position in the recording.

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The digital recording begins with Detective Matthews interviewing [REDACTED] [REDACTED] about an embezzlement. This interview lasts for 31 minutes and 8 seconds, which is when Detective Matthews ended the interview, telling [REDACTED], "See ya." Canley can first be heard speaking to Detective Matthews while Detective Matthews is in the process of ending his interview with [REDACTED].

30.17 Detective Matthews told [REDACTED] not to tell [REDACTED], don't even tell [REDACTED] that they talked. [REDACTED] told Detective Matthews he wouldn't. Detective Matthews said that would be ideal for him. Detective Matthews thanked [REDACTED].

30.28 Canley: You fuckers are Sheriff's huh. You guys are Sheriff's.

Matthews: Huh?

Canley: (INAUDIBLE) going to arrest me, or what?

Matthews: Well, what are you talking about?

Canley: (INAUDIBLE) --

[REDACTED]: -- Whose he? --

Canley: -- (INAUDIBLE)

[REDACTED]: I don't know. I don't know. I just stopped by to see my father. That was it. Anyway, um. But I promise you I, (INAUDIBLE).

Matthews: All right, see ya.

31.10 Rustling of the recorder begins and footsteps are heard as though Detective Matthews is running.

31.16 Detective Matthews begins repeating the command "Stop" 6 times. His voice gets louder and more affirmative as the commands continue.

31.20 A sound is heard that appears to sound like a car door slamming shut, immediately followed by a screeching sound that appears to sound like tire(s) breaking traction on a hard surface such as pavement or concrete. Detective Matthews yells "Stop" 8 more times, his voice growing more emphatic and louder with each command.

35.19			A voice can be heard saying "Hey, hey..." Detective Matthews asked, "What's your name?" The voice responds, "I'm just out here now." Detective Matthews asked, "Are you his friend?" The voice responds (INAUDIBLE - sounds like "Naw" or "Yeah"). Detective Matthews asked the person to stand by [REDACTED] next to a white car. Detective Matthews says, "Thank you." The recorder is rustling again as though Detective Matthews is moving.

More rustling of the recorder (Detective Matthews' movement) is heard and Detective Matthews repeats, "Stay here" and says "You got medical assistance on it's way", followed by a groan and Detective Matthews stating medical assistance is on it's way and then repeatedly asking "What's your name," (as though he is talking to Canley).

Another voice can be heard saying, "I'm the Manager." Detective Matthews continues, "He's still breathing." A male voice asked if he was needed for "CPR" (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation). Detective Matthews said he didn't (need CPR), "He's still breathing. We got a pulse." The male voice asked if he needed pressure dressing. Detective Matthews said he needed pressure dressing and some gloves. Detective Matthews asked if anyone had scissors or a knife. Deputy Natoli said she had a knife.

Moans can be heard in the background and Detective Matthews repeatedly told Canley, "Stay here." Detective Matthews told someone he didn't know whom "this guy is." A male voice is heard saying Canley still has a pulse. It sounds as though they are trying to find where the bullet struck Canley, and then stated, "a single."

Detective Matthews called his wife (on his cell phone) and notified her he had been involved in a shooting and he was all right, but was not going to come home for a while; "only the suspect was shot, by me."

43.23 A male voice asked Detective Matthews, "You haven't tach loaded or anything." Detective Matthews replied, "Nothing. I de-cocked and holstered and I pulled him out of the van, or the truck; that's all I've done." Detective Matthews and another male speak about Detective Matthews not having a radio, but told dispatch he was at the location. Detective Matthews said he told the person he was interviewing to call 911. Detective Matthews said unit "Ocean forty-one" (patrol unit (9O41) was the only person who responded to his Nextel call(s). Detective Matthews said he told Deputy Feruzza he was just in a shooting, needed code three back up, his location and then hung up.

44.11 A male voice told Detective Matthews to move away from the scene until supervisors arrived. Detective Matthews speculated "she" (Deputy Natoli's car) was probably on his shell casings. A male voiced asked Detective Matthews other than [REDACTED], was there any other persons that needed to be interviewed. Detective Matthews said there was a "little Hispanic guy" that walked up to him and tried to help, who he told to go stand with [REDACTED]. Detective Matthews said he tried to call (patrol units) 9G, 9D, 9J and Feruzza (9O) was the only one that answered (the cell phone). Detective Matthews said he only saw two people, the person he was interviewing ([REDACTED])

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██████████) and the other Hispanic guy that walked up on him. Detective Matthews described the Hispanic male as 5-6, real thin, 140, long hair, no shirt, white shorts, barefoot, no facial hair, around 20 years old. Detective Matthews said he didn't know if the Hispanic male saw the shooting. Detective Matthews explained that he pulled Canley out of the pick-up and the Hispanic male came over to him. Detective Matthews said he asked the Hispanic male if he knew "this guy" (Canley). The Hispanic male said he didn't know him. Detective Matthews said he directed the Hispanic male to go stand with ██████████.

Deputy Natoli said she found an Adrian Doyle Canley who lived in Port Hueneme, that was not on probation or anything like that and his driver's license was valid. A male voice told Detective Matthews that he could go to his car and sit down. Detective Matthews declined and said, "I just hope he doesn't die." The male asked, "Huh?" Detective Matthews replied, "I said, I hope he doesn't die. As much as I (either "did" or "didn't") like what happened, I hope he doesn't die." In the background a male voice can be heard stating that all the proper notifications are being made and other details relating to securing the scene. A male said he was going to stay with Detective Matthews and Detective Matthews asked a Sergeant if it was all right if "Paul" (Feruzza) stayed with him. They discussed the personnel on scene. Detective Matthews said, "You know how you always second guess sometimes, second guess yourself." A male voice told Detective Matthews not to do that. The male directed Detective Matthews to his car. A car door is opened. Detective Matthews said he wanted to watch to see what was going on with (Canley), it was probably better to "keep my brain occupied for a little bit." Detective Matthews remarked, "It's amazing how you don't even hear those gunshots though." I heard rustling as though Detective Matthews was reaching for his recorder and then he said "Paul" and the recording ends.

Recording Disposition

I transferred the recording to a compact disk on 11-15-06 at 1030 hours. I booked the smart card containing the original recording and the compact disk containing the transferred version of

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the recording into evidence at the Ventura Property Room on 11-16-06. Detective Matthews' digital recorder was returned to him, less the smart card.

7 GC: Wasn't -- July 29th her benefits got cut off. We left,
8 when, August? It wasn't -- I don't think it was three
9 months. I don't know exact dates so, but it wasn't that
10 long. I think the most -- longest would have been two
11 months.
12 SM: Why -- why --
13 GC: I mean, eleven thousand dollars in two months. That's --
14 SM: Well, let me clarify this. I asked -- I forget who the
15 district manager is now, but I --
16 GC: [REDACTED].
17 SM: I -- no. Somebody else I talked to.
18 GC: [REDACTED]?
19 SM: And I said -- [REDACTED], that's his name.
20 GC: Right. He's not district manager, he's loss prevention.
21 SM: Okay. And I said, you know, when I think of eleven
22 thousand dollars, I think of like tons and tons of stuff.
23 And he said actually some of the stuff at GNC is pretty
24 pricey so if you steal one jug of like a protein powder,
25 that could be a hundred and fifty bucks by itself right
26 there. Is that true? So --
27 GC: No protein in the world is --
28 SM: -- so think --

1 GC: -- a hundred fifty dollars.

2 SM: So -- so he's saying well, you know, if you take -- if you
3 take, you know, ten items of this that would be a thousand
4 dollars so people don't realize how fast it adds up.

5 GC: No. I -- I --

6 SM: Is that possible?

7 GC: No.

8 SM: You don't think so?

9 GC: No. Eleven thousand dollars? You -- you -- you --

10 SM: You -- you would know. I don't work at GNC. I never had.

11 GC: Eleven -- no, no. I understand. Eleven thousand dollars
12 -- any -- any place eleven thousand dollars is not. It's
13 -- I mean, there's no way that that store has eleven
14 thousand dollars.

15 SM: You say --

16 GC: I mean -- I mean -- I mean, the whole store might have
17 eleven thousand dollars but no -- but I mean, you're
18 telling me within two months or three months --

19 SM: Yeah.

20 GC: -- eleven thousand is missing.

21 SM: That's what they're saying.

22 GC: That -- that's a huge difference.

23 SM: Uh-huh.

24 GC: Now, if it is missing, I could tell you a lot of stuff from
25 that is when that day when Shane and a few other people
26 came in and took everything. To clean up.

27 SM: And that --

28 GC: 'Cause it was too messy. But --

1 SM: And then after that day is when they started keeping track
2 of items using a scanning device? You're saying they put
3 the stickers on them and they would scan them and then log
4 them in? Is that how it worked?

5 GC: Not -- I -- that I never saw.

6 SM: Okay.

7 GC: That -- that never happened.

8 SM: What about -- did you ever do any cash transactions over
9 the counter not using the register?

10 GC: No.

11 SM: So if I have a witness that says they -- they bought a --
12 some merchandise from you for cash and that you never used
13 a register and just -- and never gave them a receipt,
14 they're not telling the truth?

15 GC: That's right. I never did any cash transactions.

16 SM: Did [REDACTED] ever do any cash transactions?

17 GC: I never saw that, no.

18 SM: Did he ever talk to you about it?

19 GC: No. And I don't know who would say that about [REDACTED] at
20 all.

21 SM: People that don't even know you, don't even him, don't even
22 know me. They're just random people that came in and said
23 these guys sold me merchandise --

24 GC: There was a ru- -- there was a rumor --

25 SM: -- for half price.

26 GC: There was a rumor too. That -- that Ito --

27 SM: Uh-huh.

28 GC: -- was supposed to get a lot -- a promotion if, for some

1 reason, if he gets me or [REDACTED] or somebody.
2 SM: That's not true at all. I talked to Ito.
3 GC: Or a letter of recommendation.
4 SM: No. Not at all.
5 GC: I heard it from somebody who worked at the mall when I was
6 walking by to go to work up there.
7 SM: I'm -- like I told you, I'm not here to arrest you.
8 GC: No, no. I'm not --
9 SM: I'm here --
10 GC: I --
11 SM: -- to -- just to ask you questions.
12 GC: No, I understand that.
13 SM: I -- I told your brother, I said --
14 GC: But I'll -- I'll put it --
15 SM: -- I'm not going to jump to conclusions.
16 GC: -- I'll put it to you this way though. I'm not the only
17 one who had a key. Now, [REDACTED], I don't -- I never saw him
18 take anything or sell anything without the register.
19 SM: But you two were the only people in the store.
20 GC: Right, right.
21 SM: For many, many shifts.
22 GC: Right. Actually I was a lot of times too. I mean, I had
23 sixty hours a week on.
24 SM: That's a lot.
25 GC: No, that is a lot. And I had to quit my other jobs for it
26 too.
27 SM: I want to -- I want to believe you but the -- the pieces
28 aren't adding up and I'm -- I want you to be completely

1 honest with me.

2 GC: I am.

3 SM: Because the problem is --

4 GC: Because --

5 SM: -- listen, if the problem is, if I talk to these other
6 people and I talk to [REDACTED] and I talk to [REDACTED] and I find
7 out that what's going on -- if somebody spills the beans
8 and -- and then I find out what's really going on, and
9 everything you say after that's not going to hold water.

10 GC: No, I understand.

11 SM: Okay.

12 GC: But if you want that money, go look at that morning.
13 'Cause right they left I called [REDACTED]. I mean, I called
14 [REDACTED] at JC Penney.

15 SM: Uh-huh.

16 GC: I said, hey, listen, this is what happened. And he came in
17 and nothing was scanned. I mean, for example we have like
18 three bottles of water.

19 SM: When you say -- when you say scanned, what do you mean?

20 GC: Well, okay, if I walk in --

21 SM: I'm thinking inventory, like someone goes around and --

22 GC: Right. That's what I'm talking about.

23 SM: Okay. So they scan --

24 GC: Okay? Let -- let's --

25 SM: -- in the morning, everything.

26 GC: Let's say -- right, right. Let's say you -- you want a
27 (INAUDIBLE) right here.

28 SM: Okay.

1 GC: You take this one. Okay? Well, you throw it in a box with
2 other stuff but you didn't scan on the register. So in my
3 register it shows that we have it. You -- do you
4 understand?

5 SM: Right. So, but if the -- if the item was never scanned in
6 the first place how would they know it's missing?

7 GC: Be --

8 SM: You know what I mean? Like --

9 GC: Right, right.

10 SM: Because they didn't -- they didn't keep track of inventory
11 in the beginning.

12 GC: No, no, no, no. Because it's not there. Let's say you --
13 let's say you had a -- a bottle.

14 SM: Okay.

15 GC: Okay? Let's say you had a bottle. And let's say you were
16 the manager and you decide you want to do an inventory.

17 SM: Okay.

18 GC: So you take the bottle and you scan it and shows that you
19 have five, but you know what, you seen it yourself you only
20 have two.

21 SM: So you guys didn't keep track? The -- the system didn't
22 keep track of individual bottles? It just kept track of --
23 of general quantities?

24 GC: Right.

25 SM: So --

26 GC: That's what they were basing it off of.

27 SM: Okay.

28 GC: Now remember too, a lot of stuff expires.

1 SM: Uh-huh.

2 GC: Okay? And we had a lot of stuff that had expired.

3 SM: So what do you do with the expired?

4 GC: Throw it out as far -- is what I saw when the manager did
5 it. And then right when my manager left I never touched
6 anything or did anything like that about scanning it or
7 throwing it out 'cause I didn't know how to.

8 SM: Were there video cameras inside GNC?

9 GC: No, unfortunately.

10 SM: Do you know if video cameras were placed in there secretly
11 to watch you guys?

12 GC: Not that I know of.

13 SM: Would you be surprised if I told you there was?

14 GC: Probably.

15 SM: I have not seen any video but I --

16 GC: I --

17 SM: -- I'm just giving you a fair -- a fair shot --

18 GC: That's fine.

19 SM: -- to say --

20 GC: That's fine.

21 SM: -- come clean now.

22 GC: Did I, no. Did I see anybody do anything including me, no.
23 And I don't know who said that about [REDACTED].

24 SM: Well, [REDACTED]'s no angel, you know that. I mean, look at,
25 you have to know that. Come on, [REDACTED], you know [REDACTED]'s
26 no angel. You -- you of all -- I mean, you have no record,
27 you've never been in trouble before, nothing serious that I
28 can find, right?

1 GC: Except for the tickets.
2 SM: Ah --
3 GC: Speeding ticket (INAUDIBLE).
4 SM: Tickets. Yeah, that's nothing. [REDACTED] s been in a lot of
5 trouble before.
6 GC: (INAUDIBLE).
7 SM: He has -- I'm positive about that.
8 GC: Yeah, yeah, yeah.
9 SM: He's no angel. I'm just saying the reason I came to talk
10 to you first is because --
11 GC: I'll put it to you --
12 SM: -- is because you have a lot to lose. He -- he's already
13 lost a lot of stuff already. So it's no big deal to him.
14 GC: I'll -- I'll put it to you also. Like a said, I also --
15 and I told [REDACTED], I'm not the only one who had a key.
16 SM: Who -- who all? Shane and [REDACTED]. That's it, right?
17 GC: From a certain time. Do you understand? A --
18 SM: No. Just tell me what you're thinking. Please. I'm not
19 -- it's going to come out in the end anyway.
20 GC: I'll put it to you, anytime somebody leaves they have to
21 turn in their key.
22 SM: So if they're -- so if -- I'll use myself as an example.
23 If I'm an employee at GNC and I leave to use the restroom,
24 I give my key?
25 GC: No, no, no, no.
26 SM: No?
27 GC: Not like that.
28 SM: Okay.

1 GC: If you're sick --
2 SM: Okay.
3 GC: -- and let's say you're going to be on leave --
4 SM: Uh-huh.
5 GC: -- for some time, you got to leave your key.
6 SM: Okay.
7 GC: (INAUDIBLE).
8 SM: Okay. Who do you leave it with, though?
9 GC: Anybody. Manager, anybody.
10 SM: So you could leave yours with [REDACTED]?
11 GC: (INAUDIBLE).
12 SM: He could leave you -- his with you? You --
13 GC: Well, as far as I know, we're supposed to give it -- I
14 mean, I assumed when -- when I turned in my key I gave it
15 to [REDACTED].
16 SM: Uh-huh.
17 GC: Who was my manager.
18 SM: Okay.
19 GC: But I assume when you turn in the key you would have to
20 give it to -- let's say you're a manager?
21 SM: Uh-huh.
22 GC: You wouldn't give it to me necessarily. Wouldn't you give
23 it to a district manager?
24 SM: Depends on the policy.
25 GC: Well, come on. You have an employee and no -- working at a
26 store.
27 SM: Uh-huh.
28 GC: Who is only an employee. And no manager at the store.

1 SM: Then the employee would probably get the key.
2 GC: You think so, or a district manager would get the key.
3 (INAUDIBLE).
4 SM: The district manager's not there every day, right?
5 GC: Right. But -- but why would you leave it with a -- so
6 you're going to let an employee doesn't know how to do
7 anything, give it to a key? (INAUDIBLE).
8 SM: Don't you guys open and close and open the registers?
9 GC: Right, right.
10 SM: And all that kind of stuff?
11 GC: Right, right, right. We do all that.
12 SM: That's the key you're talking about?
13 GC: But -- but we --
14 SM: You're talking about a key to open and close the business
15 and --
16 GC: Right, right.
17 SM: -- open the register and --
18 GC: Well, there's one key.
19 SM: -- access merchandise?
20 GC: There's only one key to open up the register. I mean, open
21 up the store. There's another key for register.
22 SM: Okay. Okay.
23 GC: Did you -- do you --
24 SM: I'm -- I'm not quite following. If somebody -- just tell
25 me what you're thinking.
26 GC: No. Okay, let's say your my manager.
27 SM: Straight -- okay.
28 GC: Okay. You're sick, you leave. Okay?

1 SM: Okay.

2 GC: Now, right -- the day you leave, you're supposed to give me
3 your key. Or not -- or give -- I would assume --

4 SM: You're supposed to give your key to somebody.

5 GC: Kind of higher than you like a district manager. 'Cause
6 you don't leave -- without a man- -- if you weren't a
7 manager --

8 SM: Uh-huh.

9 GC: -- and you worked at a store and there's no manager for a
10 store --

11 SM: Uh-huh.

12 GC: -- I mean, what does that tell you? Do you know what I
13 mean?

14 SM: You're saying if I'm the manager and you're the employee --

15 GC: Uh-huh.

16 SM: -- and I go home sick, wouldn't I leave my key with a
17 higher authority --

18 GC: Right.

19 SM: -- versus an employee?

20 GC: Right.

21 SM: And what you're telling me is that --

22 GC: Because here is an employ- -- because especially with one
23 employee who has no man- -- who -- who has no supervision
24 for a store.

25 SM: Which is [REDACTED]?

26 GC: Or [REDACTED]. I have no supervision for a store. Do you
27 understand? I mean --

28 SM: Right.

1 GC: -- I'm there opening, you know, and I'm working there all
2 day but I have no supervision.

3 SM: But there were several -- several months where you guys
4 worked there without a manager.

5 GC: Right.

6 SM: Or not several but two months, right?

7 GC: Two months. Right. That's what I'm trying to tell you.
8 When -- I'll put it to you this way (INAUDIBLE) find out
9 when -- I mean, when was the key turned in by my manager?

10 SM: Okay. So what does that have to do with the theft though?
11 I'm trying to -- I'm trying to re- -- I'm trying to
12 understand what you're telling me.

13 GC: 'Cause you're -- you're talking about products that's
14 missing.

15 SM: Yeah. So if the employee had the key that the manager is
16 supposed to have then you're saying the employee had access
17 to all the merchandise?

18 GC: No.

19 SM: See, I'm not understanding. Just tell -- tell -- is there
20 -- is there some secret that I'm trying -- I'm missing?

21 GC: Kind of. I mean, it --

22 SM: Just tell me straight up. You want to go inside and talk?
23 No one's inside. Your mom and brother are gone.

24 GC: (INAUDIBLE) just left.

25 SM: I know. You want to go inside and talk where it's quiet?

26 GC: I'll -- I'll sit with you here. If I tell you it's -- it's
27 between us two.

28 SM: Okay. Fair enough.

1 GC: I mean, I'm not going to -- I'll put it to you this way: I
2 do not want to be under a lamp inside a courtroom or
3 anything.

4 SM: Okay. Fair enough.

5 GC: [REDACTED], my boss, she was very pissed at GNC and the key
6 wasn't turned in 'til later. If I tell you, it's between
7 us two.

8 SM: Uh-huh.

9 GC: Right?

10 SM: Uh-huh.

11 GC: Yes? I mean --

12 SM: Yes.

13 GC: Did I know anything about her still having a key and what
14 she could do with it, yes.

15 SM: Do you have specific knowledge that she took anything?

16 GC: She still had the key.

17 SM: You're shaking your head yes. And then --

18 GC: (INAUDIBLE) and she still had the key.

19 SM: [REDACTED], what -- what your body language is telling me is
20 that you know, you just don't want to say it. How am I
21 supposed to -- how am I supposed to catch her or whoever
22 did it unless you tell me how I can catch her? How --
23 where --

24 GC: She left. I mean, afterwards. I mean, what's --

25 SM: But was she able to come back?

26 GC: She had the key.

27 SM: So what happened? Tell me. What -- what day? I mean,
28 help me -- I can look at the video or something.

1 GC: She had the key for -- for a while. I mean, you know.
2 SM: Do you know if she came back and took anything? The
3 answer's yes or no, [REDACTED].
4 GC: I -- I think she came back.
5 SM: How -- okay. GN- -- how is she going to move any product
6 from the store? I mean eleven thousand, that's a -- that's
7 a lot of stuff.
8 GC: That is a lot of stuff. That's why I'm saying not even,
9 there wasn't eleven thousand taken. Nobody took eleven
10 thousand dollars worth of product. There's no way.
11 SM: So how much did she take?
12 GC: I don't know.
13 SM: Do you even know if she came back?
14 GC: Yes.
15 SM: How many times?
16 GC: As far as I knew once.
17 SM: Were you there or was it alone, like she came when no one
18 else was there?
19 GC: Am I going to get arrested?
20 SM: No.
21 GC: Was I there, yes.
22 SM: Did you see what she took? What did she take? Come on, I
23 have the list.
24 GC: She -- she -- no. She took. Maybe the suitcase was half
25 full, you know (INAUDIBLE).
26 SM: I -- we're good.
27 GC: She took a suitcase (INAUDIBLE) but it wasn't one thousand
28 that day.

1 SM: Do you think it was stuff that she's just going to use or
2 do you think it's stuff that she was giving to people or
3 what do you think?
4 GC: I don't know. Probably she was going to use.
5 SM: She had never done it before?
6 GC: She was pissed at GNC. Pardon?
7 SM: She'd never done it before?
8 GC: You know, did she ever do it before? That I don't know.
9 It's --
10 SM: Yeah. But, 'cause I'm talking about what you know. I'm
11 not trying --
12 GC: No, no. When I know she (INAUDIBLE). But before, I mean,
13 before I started there, when they did the whole inventory
14 they were five thousand dollars --
15 SM: Short?
16 GC: -- short and before.
17 SM: -- or missing, missing.
18 GC: Of missing.
19 SM: And one suitcase isn't five thousand bucks.
20 GC: No. No. And let me tell you something. There was not
21 eleven thousand dollars that -- there's no way. You're
22 telling me -- you're telling me it adds up when a protein
23 shake's a hundred and fifty dollars? No.
24 SM: Well, I didn't make the list.
25 GC: No, no, no, no.
26 SM: I'm just saying.
27 GC: I know, I know.
28 SM: That's what they're saying.

1 GC: There's no way. But I could tell you this much, there was
2 probably the other half or more was probably done by the
3 inventory by [REDACTED].

4 SM: Hmm.

5 GC: Do you understand?

6 SM: Yeah.

7 GC: There -- there's --

8 SM: See, what about -- here -- here's what I'm -- what I'm
9 getting at. What about -- see, one of the persons
10 specifically identified [REDACTED] as doing cash transactions.

11 GC: I never -- I never --

12 SM: I mean, a suitcase full of stuff, big deal. Right? That's
13 maybe what, a hundred, two hundred bucks?

14 GC: We -- but the -- the -- we're missing the -- we're miss --
15 maybe more than that.

16 SM: How much more?

17 GC: More. I -- I can't give you specifics.

18 SM: From mul- --

19 GC: I'll put it to you this way:

20 SM: -- from multiple --

21 GC: I turn -- I turned my head a lot. When [REDACTED] came in
22 because, A, she was still my manager.

23 SM: Uh-huh.

24 GC: Okay? She was still working for --

25 SM: Still the boss?

26 GC: She was still the boss. She never got fired. So that
27 part's, I mean, I'm in the clear on. I can't tell you. I
28 mean --

1 SM: Yeah.

2 GC: -- whatever. Do you understand?

3 SM: Yeah. But -- but as far as you know [REDACTED] didn't do
4 anything in front of you?

5 GC: As far as I know.

6 SM: Never did get -- 'cause some -- I have some people telling
7 me, some customers that said they would come in and [REDACTED]
8 would be working the register. They would get protein or
9 pills or, you know, whatever they were going to get. And
10 then he would tell them, hey, it's a special deal today.
11 If you pay with cash they would give him a -- like --like
12 they would present a credit card. He would say, if you pay
13 cash I'll give it to you for half off. Or I'll give it to
14 you for twenty-five percent off. So, or he would say if --
15 like, let's say the -- the jug is thirty bucks, he'd say,
16 if you give me a twenty dollar bill, you can have it for
17 twenty dollars and -- today only. So then they would pay
18 -- they would pay him cash, he would take the money and
19 never ring it up in the -- in the register.

20 GC: I -- that I never saw. On that, on [REDACTED].

21 SM: Does that surprise you though if someone -- if I was to say
22 somebody, well, two witnesses in particular said that?

23 GC: It would kind of surprise me. (INAUDIBLE). I --

24 SM: (INAUDIBLE) think that was my phone (INAUDIBLE).

25 GC: I -- well, that thing I didn't know about his record. But
26 I think most of it had to do with the lady and had to do
27 with that -- that morning. 'Cause I called [REDACTED] right
28 there, right after they left. I said look, everything's

1 being thrown down into the box, nothing was scanned. Well,
2 there was a few things that were scanned, yes. Yes, there
3 were things that were being scanned but then there were
4 other things --

5 SM: Do you -- do you know if things thrown into the box were
6 expired items?

7 GC: No. Because we didn't need to have like three things of
8 water. That didn't expire. Did -- do -- do you know what
9 I mean?

10 SM: Yeah. So -- so, no, they weren't --

11 GC: That they were taken in the back.

12 SM: -- expired? Right.

13 GC: They were some, yes. 'Cause we -- we -- I'll put to you
14 this way: We -- they'd have crap load of expired product.
15 I mean, we had a lot of expired product.

16 SM: How often did you guys get rid of expired product?

17 GC: Not at --

18 SM: I mean, it's like a monthly thing?

19 GC: (INAUDIBLE) it would be expired. Pretty much but the time
20 it was being expired, like when her -- when she left,
21 [REDACTED] and I didn't do anything. Didn't do any work. We
22 just did what we usually do. That's it. We didn't go the
23 extra mile. Do -- do you know what I mean?

24 SM: Uh-huh. Yeah.

25 GC: On that.

26 SM: Sure. So -- so give me a time frame. You guys, or Shane
27 did his inventory when? You know what --

28 GC: That's what (INAUDIBLE).

1 SM: -- what month?
2 GC: August maybe. It was way before Ito came and it was after
3 [REDACTED] left.
4 SM: Well, when did [REDACTED] leave?
5 GC: Her -- she called me up and was pissed on July 29th.
6 SM: Okay and then --
7 GC: That -- that the things (INAUDIBLE). So --
8 SM: Is that the day she quit?
9 GC: No.
10 SM: Had she been fired? Or how --
11 GC: No, her -- her -- no, she never got fired.
12 SM: Oh, that was the day her medical ran out?
13 GC: Right. Her medical.
14 SM: And so she left after that?
15 GC: No. No. She left --
16 SM: When did she --
17 GC: (INAUDIBLE) so she can get the medical. Do, do you
18 understand?
19 SM: Yeah. I'm trying. Yeah, I'm trying.
20 GC: You know what I mean? Like from here, let's say, I, you
21 know, I don't know the specific dates. I'm not trying to
22 hint around.
23 SM: Uh-huh.
24 GC: But if she left July 4th and let's say July 6th was her
25 medical, or her operation, then let's say July 29th she
26 gets a letter saying that she owes money because her
27 medical got cut on July 29th.
28 SM: Right. So then she's pissed off.

1 GC: Right. But -- but -- but that's the time frame. Do you
2 know what I mean? But Shane I think did that before that
3 happened.

4 SM: He did his inventory before that happened?

5 GC: Before that happened. I believe -- I think so if I could
6 remember.

7 SM: All right. All right.

8 GC: Do -- do you understand what I'm getting at?

9 SM: I'm trying. I'm trying really hard. But the --

10 GC: I never saw (INAUDIBLE).

11 SM: -- the problem I'm having is I understand what you're
12 saying, but none of it adds up to eleven thousand bucks.

13 GC: Right. That's what I'm saying. Dude, that's why I'm --

14 SM: Even if -- if even you were to add what the witnesses told
15 me what --

16 GC: Okay. Before -- before you get -- before you get -- before
17 -- if something expires, I -- now I've never dealt with
18 this. But this is what I'm pretty sure of, okay? When
19 something expires you're supposed to scan it and expire it.
20 You don't throw it away. A lot of things got thrown away.

21 SM: What, before being scanned?

22 GC: Yeah. We had a -- we (INAUDIBLE) I'll put it to you this
23 way: Probably forty percent of our stuff had expired.

24 SM: Wow.

25 GC: Yeah. Because of the -- [REDACTED] and I --

26 SM: So -- so how many times --

27 GC: (INAUDIBLE).

28 SM: -- do you think that you guys got rid of expired stuff over

1 the course of your entire employment?

2 GC: Him -- him and I never did.

3 SM: Oh.

4 GC: Our managers did. That's what I'm getting at.

5 SM: Okay.

6 GC: We never knew how to and we didn't want to --

7 SM: All right.

8 GC: -- know how.

9 SM: So your -- you and [REDACTED], your job was just to come in --

10 GC: Come in.

11 SM: -- man the cash register, help the customers.

12 GC: Sell the customers -- right, exactly.

13 SM: And that's it?

14 GC: Sell the product.

15 SM: And that's it?

16 GC: And then that was it.

17 SM: All right. All right. All right.

18 GC: But I don't -- that's the -- that's why the eleven thousand

19 dollars are gone. Most of it I think was because of that

20 day that [REDACTED] came in. And I'm not saying he stole

21 anything. I mean, I don't like the guy. I'll be honest

22 with you, you know.

23 SM: Uh-huh.

24 GC: Because he never helped me at all. Because he put me by

25 myself for two months.

11 need to tell these guys exactly what you saw.

12 KH: Hey, how far back (INAUDIBLE).

13 SM: [REDACTED], the guy in the red shirt?

14 MV: Did you get his name and ID? I'm going to throw it over to
15 you.

16 SM: Yeah. Well, that's the one he was --

17 LN: Adrian Canley.

18 SM: Okay.

19 LN: (INAUDIBLE).

20 SM: Can you -- can you run him?

21 LN: Yeah.

22 SM: He said wasn't going to -- he wasn't going to be taken
23 alive.

24 KH: Wait 'til -- wait 'til --

25 SM: I know, I know, I know.

26 MV: Don't make any more statements.

27 SM: I just don't want you guys to --

28 MV: I know. Dude, I don't doubt you at all. I know you, okay?

1 Just don't make any more (INAUDIBLE) you know. Nobody has
2 any lack of confidence in you, Shane, okay?

3 SM: I know.

4 MV: Where do you think that we need to end this (INAUDIBLE)
5 thing.

6 SM: It can start -- stop here and then we'll run it across to
7 --

8 MV: Okay. I'm going to need another roll.

9 GC: (INAUDIBLE)

10 SM: I'll go get it. Just talk with this officer and then --
11 and then they'll re-contact you later.

12 GC: Oh, no. That's fine. My car's right there.

13 SM: And you saw everything that happened?

14 GC: Yeah.

15 SM: Okay. You saw everything that happened.

16 MV: You want to sit down?

17 SM: No. I'm -- I'll stay --

18 MV: You need to stay moving?

19 goes, no, I don't know him. And I told him -- go stand
20 over there with that guy.

21 LN: This is all the info that I got on him. He doesn't --
22 doesn't come back on probation or anything. Adrian Doyle
23 Canley out of Port Hueneme. License valid (INAUDIBLE).

24 SM: I don't even know if that's the right guy.

25 FV: Yeah, it may not be.

26 PF: I'll go looking for this guy. I'm going to call the watch
27 commander right now.

28 MV: Okay (INAUDIBLE).

1 MV: You okay, Shane?
2 SM: Yeah, totally fine.



Incident Scene Report

On 11/14/06, at about 1835 hours, I received a telephone call from Captain Kelley, who requested that I respond to assist with the investigation of an officer-involved shooting at [REDACTED] Thousand Oaks. I responded to the incident scene from the Ventura Major Crimes' Office, and I arrived at the scene at about 1920 hours.

When I arrived on scene, I noted numerous emergency services resources already deployed, including numerous sheriff's personnel and Ventura County Fire Department personnel. I also noted that crime scene tape marked off an outer perimeter, and that an inner perimeter surrounding the incident scene had also been cordoned off with crime scene tape. There were no personnel inside the inner perimeter scene when I arrived.

I met with my partner, Detective Rob Davidson, who had arrived before me. Detective Davidson briefed me on the circumstances surrounding the shooting, and, in summary, told me the following. Senior Deputy Shane Matthews was working as a plain-clothes property crimes detective, and he went to the apartments at [REDACTED] to interview a witness in a grand theft investigation. During his interview with the witness, a man, who was later identified as Adrian Canley, approached Matthews and initiated a confrontation. As the confrontation unfolded, Canley got into a white Ford pickup and drove toward Matthews. Matthews then reportedly fired several shots from his service pistol at Canley, striking Canley at least once in the upper chest. Canley was administered first aid at the scene, and he was transported to the

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Los Robles Regional Medical Center where he died from his wounds. As we spoke, Detective Davidson pointed out various features inside the inner perimeter scene, including a white Ford F-150 pickup, several expended pistol cartridges, clothing, and first aid supplies.

I noted the property at [REDACTED] consists of (2) two-story apartment buildings, a community center building, and numerous covered carports with an open parking area. The property to the west of [REDACTED] which has an address of [REDACTED] [REDACTED] has a three story senior citizen complex that overlooks the parking area where this incident occurred. The property east of [REDACTED] is mostly undeveloped with some low-lying residential structures.

The complex at [REDACTED] is known as [REDACTED] and it is accessed off of Los Feliz Drive. As one enters the complex, there is a long asphalt driveway that extends approximately 350 feet toward the south end of the property. On the east side of the driveway, just past the property entrance, is a two-story apartment building containing apartments [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and there are covered carports along the west side of the driveway. There is a community center building with an outdoor pool on the east side of the property, just south of the aforementioned apartment building.

In the center of the driveway, past the first apartment building and the community center building, is a large circular planter containing a tree. This planter and tree serve as a traffic round, and the driveway continues around and past the planter. There are two opposing sets of covered carports just south of the planter, and there is a U-shaped two-story apartment building just south of the covered carports. The U-shaped apartment building contains apartments [REDACTED] [REDACTED] To the east of the opposing carports is a small parking lot, which is where this incident unfolded.

The parking lot is paved with asphalt and it is accessed off of the traffic round (just east of the large circular planter with the tree). The access way into the parking lot is at the northwest corner of the parking lot. The parking lot is rectangular in shape and measures approximately 100 feet in length (north to south) and approximately 66 feet in width (east to west). The north side of the parking lot is enclosed with a concrete curb, planter, sidewalk, and the community center building. The east side of the parking lot is enclosed with a concrete

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curb, planter, and a 6-foot cinder block wall, which is capped with wrought iron fencing. The south side of the parking lot is enclosed with a concrete curb, a grassy standoff, and the north exterior wall of apartments [REDACTED]. The west side of the parking lot is enclosed with a cement curb, a grassy standoff, and the east wall of the covered carports. There are 9 parking stalls perpendicular to the west curb line and there are 11 parking stalls perpendicular to the east curb line. There is a raised cement planter on the north side of the parking stalls against the west curb line. That planter contained several thick rose bushes and a tree.

I examined the inner perimeter of the incident scene, which included the entire parking lot area described above. There were 14 vehicles parked within the parking area. All of the vehicles were within marked parking stalls with the exception of a marked black and white Thousand Oaks Police Ford Crown Victoria patrol vehicle (unit #3263) and a white Ford F-150 pickup truck, CA license [REDACTED]. The patrol unit was parked facing in an easterly direction just inside the driveway entrance to the parking lot, and the white Ford F-150 was parked facing in a northerly direction against the north curb line of the parking area. The black and white patrol unit was parked partially behind and perpendicular to the Ford F-150. Also of note was Detective Matthews' unmarked police vehicle, which was a maroon colored Chevrolet Astro van, CA license [REDACTED]. It was parked against the east curb line in the third stall south of the north curb line and, its right rear cargo door was standing open.

I examined each of the vehicles located within the incident scene and I saw no evidence that led me to believe any of the other vehicles within the parking area contained any evidence, sustained any damage, or were involved in this incident in any manner. For specific details of the other vehicles parked within the scene, refer to Senior Deputy Godfrey's supplemental report and/or the incident scene images.

As I walked around the perimeter of the incident scene, I saw a small notebook and a compact disc with a Sheriff's Department label lying on the grassy area on the west side of the parking area between the sidewalk and the east wall of the carports. I later learned that the notebook and disc belonged to Detective Matthews and he dropped them on the grass as the confrontation between he and Canley unfolded.

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I continued examining the incident scene, and I found a pair of acceleration scuffmarks in the third parking stall south of the parking area entrance, on the west side of the parking lot. Each of the scuffmarks were approximately 3 feet in length and appeared to have been freshly created based on the black powdery rubber residue I could see on the surface of the scuffmarks. The scuffmarks were in such a position within the stall that they appeared to have been made by the rapid acceleration of the rear wheels of a vehicle that was parked nose in (or the front wheels of a vehicle that was backed into the stall). Senior Deputy Godfrey, who responded to the scene to prepare a factual diagram, measured the scuffmarks and found them to be approximately the same size as the exterior wheelbase of the rear tires on the Ford F-150 pickup. I found no other fresh acceleration or deceleration scuffmarks on the parking lot.


I noted four expended silver colored .40 caliber Speer cartridge casings lying on the asphalt near the southern most portion of the entrance to the parking area. A fifth casing was found lying in the raised flowerbed that borders the southern most portion of the entrance to the parking area. All of the casings were within approximately 7 feet of each other.

In the driveway of the parking area immediately adjacent to the first parking stall south of the entrance to the parking area was a field of automotive fluid. The fluid field began at the first parking stall south of the parking area entrance and led to the underside of the engine compartment area of the Ford F-150 pickup where it pooled at the north curb line of the parking area. I could smell the distinct odor of radiator coolant emanating from the fluid field. Near the beginning of the fluid field, I noted a piece of copper bullet jacketing and a fragment of lead. I noted another piece of copper bullet jacketing under the marked police vehicle, which was parked across the fluid field. Refer to Senior Deputy Godfrey's diagram and the crime scene images for additional information.

I examined the white Ford F-150 pickup, and I noted that each of its four tires appeared to be properly inflated. I saw minor collision damage on the driver's side and front bumper of the vehicle, and miscellaneous scratches and dings on the truck body. I could see that the truck's driver's side window and passenger side window were partially rolled down. I looked into the truck from the exterior and noted the gear selector was in "D" or "drive." I could see that the ignition was in an "off" position, and I noted the vehicle keys were still in the ignition. I could

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also see a small folding knife wedged into the space between the driver's seat cushion and the seat back. The blade on the folding knife was open; however, it appeared to have been wedged in the seat for some time based on the amount of debris that was accumulated on top of the knife. I also noted a pair of binoculars sitting on the seat cushion of the front passenger's seat.

As I examined the Ford F-150, I noted two apparent bullet strikes on the front grill area of the truck. The first impact I noted was on the front bumper. I could see the bullet imbedded in the metal of the bumper without penetrating the metal. The second impact penetrated the truck's plastic grill and traveled through the radiator and into the engine compartment. I believe the fragments from this particular bullet were the ones I noted at the beginning of the fluid field the truck left behind. I also noted three bullet holes in the truck's windshield, directly in front of the driver's seat. I could see corresponding damage to the truck's dashboard from the bullets that passed through the windshield.

I observed several items of clothing, various emergency medical supplies, a cellular telephone, a butane lighter, knit gloves, white tennis shoes, an expended bullet, and a large caliber black handgun lying on the ground, next to the left front tire of the truck. Based on statements of witnesses I obtained, the clothing was removed from Canley during attempted life saving procedures. I also learned that the personal property was removed from Canley's person, including the black handgun, which had been found tucked in the right side waistband of Canley's pants by attending paramedics/firefighters. Much of the clothing and the handgun were soaked in radiator fluid.

Field Evidence Technician [REDACTED] responded to the incident scene and took overall digital images. He then placed photo markers on each item of evidence and took more overall digital images of the scene and of each item of evidence.

I examined the firearm that had been found on Canley's person by emergency medical personnel. I found the pistol to be manufactured by Hi-Point Firearms with a model number of JHP45ACP and a serial number of [REDACTED]. The pistol was black in color and manufactured in .45 ACP caliber. I noted that the weapon's safety was "on," meaning the thumb safety lever would have to be depressed before the weapon could be fired. I removed the magazine from

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
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the pistol and I found it to be loaded with seven .45 ACP rounds. I then opened the pistol's action and found a single .45 ACP round in the firing chamber. After clearing the weapon, I gave it to F.E.T. [REDACTED]

After taking digital images of the scene, FET Farrell collected and packaged each item of evidence. He later booked the evidence into a secure storage locker at the East County Sheriff's Station. Refer to FET [REDACTED] property report for additional information.

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████████ said the man was trying to show him some sort of card in his wallet, and he specifically said the he knew what an officer's badge looks like and he did not see one.

I asked ██████████ why he believed the motorist he had the altercation with was the same individual involved in the shooting. ██████████ said the motorists' behavior was similar to what he read about the behavior of the man who was shot, and he described the man as a "nut". I asked ██████████ if he could describe the race of the man he had the altercation with, and he told me he was "American". Upon further questioning, ██████████ told me the man was "White", in his twenties, with a medium build, a slight mustache, and wearing a baseball style cap. He could not provide any further description of the man, and he did not get the license number of the man's truck. ██████████ thought he would be able to recognize the man if he saw him again.

████████ said the altercation continued while he drove west on Thousand Oaks Blvd., north on Hodencamp Rd., west on Hillcrest Dr., south on Boardwalk Ave., west on Thousand Oaks Blvd, and then north on Moorpark Rd. Once on Moorpark Rd., ██████████ accelerated and evaded the other motorist. After the altercation, ██████████ drove over to ██████████ apartments on Los Feliz Drive to visit a friend. He later learned of the shooting incident that occurred up the block on Los Feliz Drive, and he guessed it involved the same man he had the altercation with.

I concluded my conversation by thanking him for his time, and I provided him with my contact telephone number for future reference.

I recorded my conversation with ██████████ with a digital audio recording device, and I later preserved a copy of the recording on a compact disc. For additional details, refer to the digital audio recording.

On 11/17/06, at about 1040 hours, I telephoned [REDACTED] [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] regarding a telephone message he left with Sheriff's Dispatch concerning some information he had, which possibly related to the officer involved shooting of Adrian Canley, on 11/14/06.

I identified myself to [REDACTED] and confirmed that he telephoned the Sheriff's Department and reported an encounter with the man he believed had been shot by a deputy in Thousand Oaks. [REDACTED] confirmed that he and his wife got into a confrontation with the "same guy" earlier that day, at about 5:00 p.m. [REDACTED] continued and told me that he was driving his vehicle on "Auburn Street" near the Chevrolet dealership (Auburn Court at Thousand Oaks Boulevard, Thousand Oaks) when his vehicle was almost struck by another motorist in a black or dark gray truck. [REDACTED] said he honked and the other driver "just snapped" and stopped his truck. The other driver stopped his truck in the street and got out. As [REDACTED] drove around the stopped truck, the other motorist got back into his truck, drove in front of [REDACTED] vehicle, and began braking. During this time, the other motorist displayed a wallet and claimed to be a "cop" while telling [REDACTED] that he had a gun and was going to kill him.

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█████ stated, "Oh shit. It might be." The male then ran down and looked at the body and then ran back up to his apartment.

I asked █████ the name or a description of the male. █████ stated that he did not know the males name because only the male's parents live in the apartment and the male only comes to visit. █████ described the male as Hispanic wearing long baggy shorts and no shirt, with a ponytail. █████ also said the male stated he was sleeping.

I asked █████ further details about the male that ran down to the location of the incident. █████ said the male ran down and looked at the body and then ran back upstairs. He said the male only stayed "down there" for less than a minute. I asked █████ how close the male got to Det. Matthews. He said that he got close, probably within arms reach. █████ said he could not tell if there was any conversation between the male and Det. Matthews.

█████ further stated that his tenants have told him that they do not like the type of people that are brought around by the tenants in #█████. He stated the people "look like gang bangers."

Prior to concluding my interview with █████, he stated that Det. Matthews had come to the apartment complex about a month prior, asking for Mr. █████. █████ assumed that he was asking for █████ █████, who lives upstairs and is "the witness's" brother. On that date █████ told Det. Matthews that █████ was not home but would be home between 4:00 and 5:00 pm. █████ said that was the last time he saw Det. Matthews until "now" because █████ █████ told him that Det. Matthews was the same guy. █████ also stated that Det. Matthews came in the same van then as he did this evening.

I concluded my interview with █████.

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He was inside his apartment with his son having dinner, when heard about five or six gunshots. [REDACTED] said he did not hear any screaming or yelling prior to the gunshots. After the gunshots, [REDACTED] heard some voices but could not make out what was being said. He also could not determine if the voices were male or female. [REDACTED] then heard someone say, "Call 911" in a male voice.

I asked [REDACTED] if he ever left his apartment to see what had happened outside. He stated he ([REDACTED]) walked outside and down to the parking lot area. He saw a male, wearing a red shirt, and approached him. [REDACTED] asked the male who he was and the male responded he was [REDACTED]'s son. I then asked [REDACTED] what he saw in the parking lot area. He pointed in the area of the white truck and stated that he saw a male lying on the ground. He also said that he saw another male giving first-aid to the male on the ground.

I asked [REDACTED] for a description of the male on the ground. [REDACTED] said the male on the ground appeared Hispanic with a baldhead, wearing a dark jacket.

I asked [REDACTED] for a description of the male giving first aid. [REDACTED] stated, "He was dressed like a detective." I asked [REDACTED] what he meant. He stated, "Like you, without the jacket."

I inquired of [REDACTED] if he would be able to recognize either male if seen again or shown photographs of each. [REDACTED] said he would not be able to recognize either person.

I asked [REDACTED] if he knew the male on the ground or had seen him recently around the apartment complex. [REDACTED] said he did not know the male. I asked about the pickup truck. [REDACTED] said, "That's something, the people who live right next to me, here. # [REDACTED]. I know they had a couple of friends that came by that have a truck like that."

[REDACTED] then stated, "I asked him. When it all happened. I came out to this here and he came out. I told him, isn't that your friend's truck. Looks exactly like it." The male that exited from

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On 11-14-06, I was working uniformed patrol in the city of Thousand Oaks. At approximately 1821 hours, I assisted units, reference an officer involved shooting that occurred at [REDACTED].

At about 1902 hours, I responded to Los Robles Hospital to assist Deputy Hawthorne with witness interviews.

I spoke to (W) [REDACTED], who is a paramedic with American Medical Response unit 452. The following is a summary of her tape-recorded statement: At about 1823 hours, [REDACTED] and her partner, (W) [REDACTED], were dispatched to [REDACTED], reference a gunshot victim.

Ventura County Fire Engine 31, and deputies were already on scene when they arrived at 1830 hours.

[REDACTED] said she saw a Hispanic male, (later identified as Adrian Canley), lying in the parking lot at the location. Canley was lying on his back shirtless, and was being treated by Ventura County Fire. She noticed Firefighter Nick [REDACTED] was preparing to intubate Canley. When she approached, she saw Canley had a gunshot wound above his right clavicle. Canley was unconscious and unresponsive.

[REDACTED] said she began treating Canley and inserted an IV into his left arm. After inserting the IV, [REDACTED] cut off Canley's pants and underwear in order to check for other wounds. After cutting his clothing, [REDACTED] pulled his pants out from under him as they prepared to move him onto the backboard. As she pulled Canley's pants to his right side, she saw a black handgun lying on his pants at the rear waistline area.

[REDACTED] said she yelled out that there was a gun. She heard somebody tell her not to touch the gun and a male deputy immediately walked over and stood next to the gun. They loaded Canley onto the gurney and transported him to Los Robles ER.

[REDACTED] described the gun as a large black semi-automatic handgun, possibly a 9mm, with about a 5in. barrel.

I terminated the interview. Refer to the cassette-tape for complete details.

Refer to Deputy Hawthorne's report for details reference [REDACTED]'s statement.

I booked the cassette-tape as evidence into the East County Property Room.

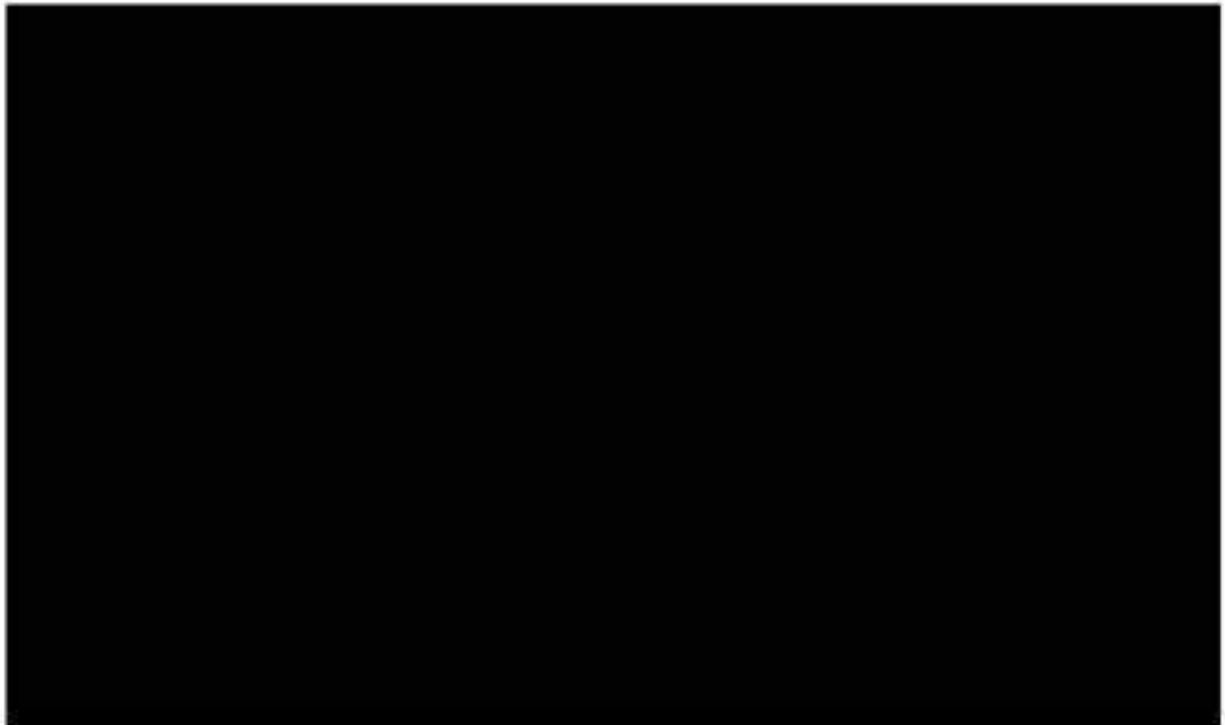

On November 14, 2006, at approximately 2028 hours, I interviewed Firefighter / Emergency Medical Technician [REDACTED], employed by the Ventura County Fire Department, in the Nurses Lounge at Los Robles Regional Medical Center in the City of Thousand Oaks. This interview was digitally recorded. The following is a summary of the interview. Refer to the CD ROM containing the recording for additional information:

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██████ is normally assigned to Station 41 in the City of Simi Valley, however on the evening of November 14, 2006, he was working at Station 31 in the City of Thousand Oaks. He confirmed that on the evening of November 14, 2006, he responded to call of a gunshot victim at ██████ ██████ in the City of Thousand Oaks. ██████ said he was assigned to Engine 31 and was working a shift trade.

██████ could not recall the time he and the other fire personnel from Station 31 received the call of the gunshot victim. He explained that the fire personnel from Station 31 were at the scene of a traffic collision on the northbound 101 Freeway when the call of the gunshot victim was received. ██████ recalled that the dispatcher stated the call concerned a gunshot victim and the fire personnel were to stage for the arrival of the Sheriff's Department. He estimated it took approximately 3 minutes to get from the traffic collision scene to the scene of the gunshot victim. Other than Engine 31 and Squad 31, no additional fire personnel responded to the call.

██████ said he was a passenger in Engine 31. Engine 31 was parked heading into the driveway of the scene. He said the scene was located at an apartment complex. ██████ explained where the Sheriff's Department's vehicles were parked in relation to Engine 31. He said the gunshot victim was lying approximately 20 to 25 feet to the left (driver's side) of Engine 31.

Upon arrival, ██████ went to the two Firefighter / Paramedics who were treating the gunshot victim. He was told to supply oxygen to the gunshot victim because the gunshot victim was not breathing on his own.

██████ said the gunshot victim was lying "prone" with his head toward the direction of Engine 31. He clarified that the gunshot victim was lying on his back. ██████ said the gunshot victim's white T-shirt was in the process of being cut off. He continued that the gunshot victim was also wearing black "Levi type pants," a black leather belt with a chrome buckle, white "tennis shoes," and white socks.

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As [REDACTED] was supplying oxygen to the gunshot victim the Firefighter / Paramedics were preparing to insert "IV's" into the gunshot victim. He continued that "people" were cutting off the gunshot victim's clothing to expose any gunshot wounds. [REDACTED] explained how he continued to supply oxygen to the gunshot victim.

After the gunshot victim's chest was exposed and his shirt was removed, [REDACTED] saw a gunshot wound to the upper right "quadrant" of the gunshot victim's chest below his clavicle. He also saw that the gunshot victim's left thumb had a "nick" on it, but he could not tell if a bullet caused it. [REDACTED] described the injury to the gunshot victim's left thumb as an avulsion. He described that a "little flap" of skin was hanging off the gunshot victim's left thumb and there was a "little" blood.

[REDACTED] explained that the remainder of the time he was at the scene he was responsible for supplying oxygen to the gunshot victim. He noticed that the gunshot victim had "a lot" of tattoos on his upper chest area and arms. [REDACTED] said the gunshot victim's pants were cut off his body. He described the cuts as being along the sides of the gunshot victim's legs. [REDACTED] said as the emergency personnel tried to pull the gunshot victim's pants out from underneath him, a "gun appeared in the pants."

[REDACTED] described the gun as "black, probably composites." He continued that the gun appeared to be a "Glock," and confirmed that it was a semiautomatic gun. [REDACTED] said the gun was possibly a 40 caliber and appeared to be a caliber larger than a 9 millimeter (gun). He said the gun was in a firing position (the slide was not locked back). [REDACTED] did not know if the hammer on the gun was cocked. He said as the gunshot victim's pants were pulled out, the barrel of the gun was pointed toward the gunshot victim's right thigh area. [REDACTED] said the gun's grip was pointed "upwards" toward the gunshot victim's head. He did not know where the gun would have been placed in relation to the gunshot victim's body (before the pants were pulled away and the gun was exposed). When he saw the gun he believed it was above the gunshot victim's knee level near the gunshot victim's thigh level. [REDACTED] said the gun was lying on the ground as the gunshot victim's pants were being pulled away from the gunshot victim.

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████ said when he saw the gun a Firefighter / Paramedic alerted everyone that a gun was found and stated that the gun needed to be removed from the area. He said "everybody" said not to touch or move the gun and leave it where it was located. █████ said the gunshot victim's pants and gun were slid away from the gunshot victim so he could be placed onto a backboard. He said the gunshot victim's pants and gun were "laterally" slid away from the gunshot victim approximately 5 to 8 inches. █████ reiterated that no one touched the gun.

████ said a Deputy Sheriff was standing at the gunshot victim's feet. He clarified that after the Deputy Sheriff was told about the gun, the Deputy Sheriff came over and stood by the gunshot victim's feet. █████ said the Deputy Sheriff saw the gun and said not to move it until he could come back and secure the gun.

████ explained that the gunshot victim was placed onto a backboard and a gurney before being placed into the ambulance. He explained that he drove Squad 31 to the Emergency Room at Los Robles Regional Medical Center.

████ said the gunshot victim was never conscious at the scene and never made any statements.

████ had no additional information to add to this interview.

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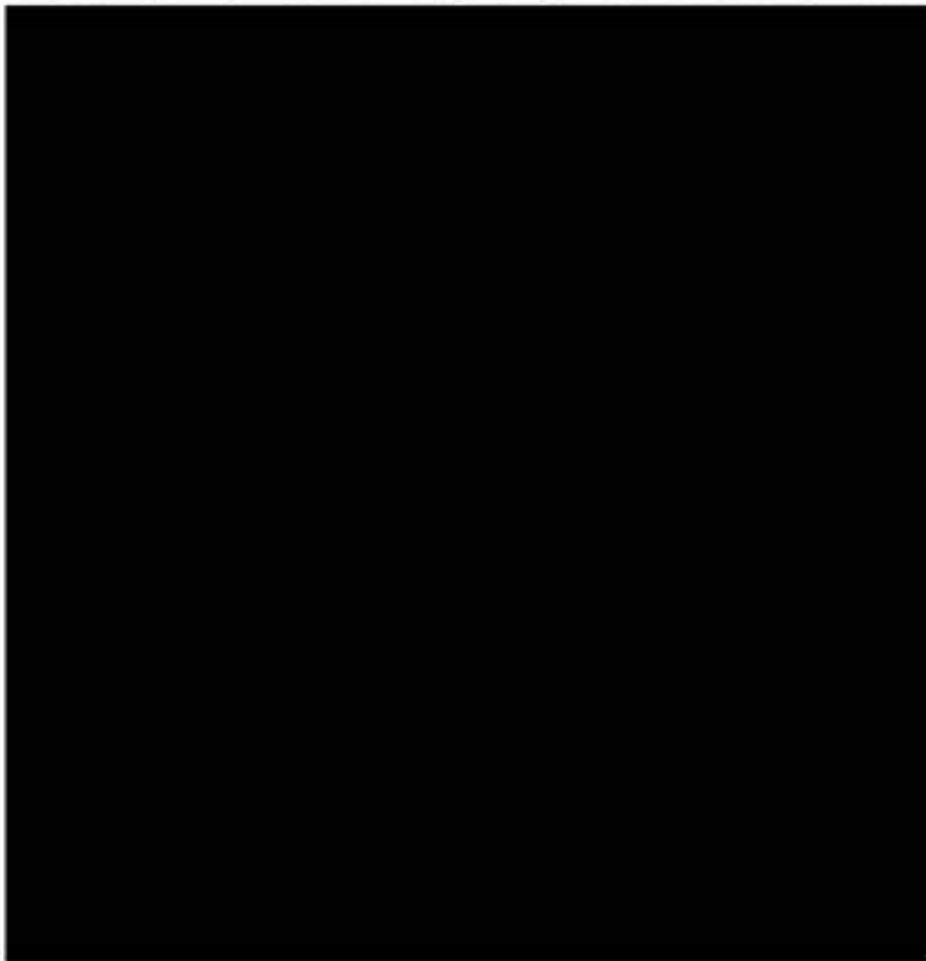

On November 14, 2006, at approximately 2043 hours, I interviewed Fire Cadet [REDACTED], employed by the Ventura County Fire Department, in the Nurses Lounge at Los Robles Regional Medical Center in the City of Thousand Oaks. This interview was digitally recorded.

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The following is a summary of the interview. Refer to the CD ROM containing the recording for additional information:

█████ confirmed that on the evening of November 14, 2006, he was working at Station 31 as a Fire Cadet. He confirmed that on the evening of November 14, 2006, he responded to a call of a gunshot victim at ██████ in the City of Thousand Oaks.

█████ did not know what time the call for the gunshot victim was received. He explained that at the time the call was received, he and the fire personnel from Station 31 were at the scene of a traffic collision on the southbound 101 Freeway near Hampshire Road. ██████ said the dispatcher advised there was a gunshot victim at the aforementioned address. He responded to the scene in Squad 31 with Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ and Firefighter / Paramedic ██████. ██████ estimated it took approximately 10 minutes to get from the scene of the traffic collision to the scene of the gunshot victim.

█████ said the scene was located within an apartment complex. He said Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ drove Squad 31 to the call of the gunshot victim. Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ parked Squad 31 in front of the crime scene tape.

█████ said he exited Squad 31 and walked over to the gunshot victim. Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ told him to prepare an "IV" bag and he complied. ██████ said he held onto the "IV" bag for Firefighter / Paramedic ██████.

█████ said the gunshot victim was lying on his back. The gunshot victim was wearing unknown colored pants and no shirt. He did not know if the gunshot victim was wearing footwear.

After preparing the "IV" bag, ██████ held it until Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ retrieved it from him. ██████ saw a gunshot wound on the gunshot victim's right shoulder near his "collar bone." He explained that he held onto the "IV" bag during the entire time he was at the scene. ██████

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said the gunshot victim's eyes were open, but he did not know if he was conscious. He said the gunshot victim never made any statements.

█████ said he saw a gun at the scene after the gunshot victim's pants were cut off. He explained that he was holding the "IV" bag and the emergency personnel were preparing the gunshot victim to be moved. ██████ said he "stepped back" and saw the gun. He said Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ told a Deputy Sheriff that a gun was present. ██████ commented that Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ did not want to touch the gun. He said the gun was on the gunshot victim's pants that had been "cut up." ██████ said the gunshot victim's pants were "cut up" and off the gunshot victim's body when he saw the gun. He said the gun was by the gunshot victim's feet. ██████ then stated the gun was by the gunshot victim's calves. He clarified that the gun was near the gunshot victim's right calf. I asked ██████ to describe the gun. He said, "Silver top, black handle. It's all I can remember."

I showed ██████ my department issued semiautomatic gun. He confirmed that the gunshot victim's gun resembled my semiautomatic gun. ██████ said the gun's grip was on "the side" and the gun's barrel was "facing up." He could not remember which direction the gunshot victim's gun barrel was pointed or where the gun's grip was pointed. ██████ said he did not see a Deputy Sheriff at the scene secure the gun.

█████ said the gunshot victim was then placed onto a backboard and was placed inside the ambulance. He explained that he drove to the Emergency Room at Los Robles Regional Medical Center in Squad 31 with Firefighter / Emergency Medical Technician ██████.

█████ said the gunshot victim never regained consciousness or made any statements.

█████ had no additional information to add to this interview.

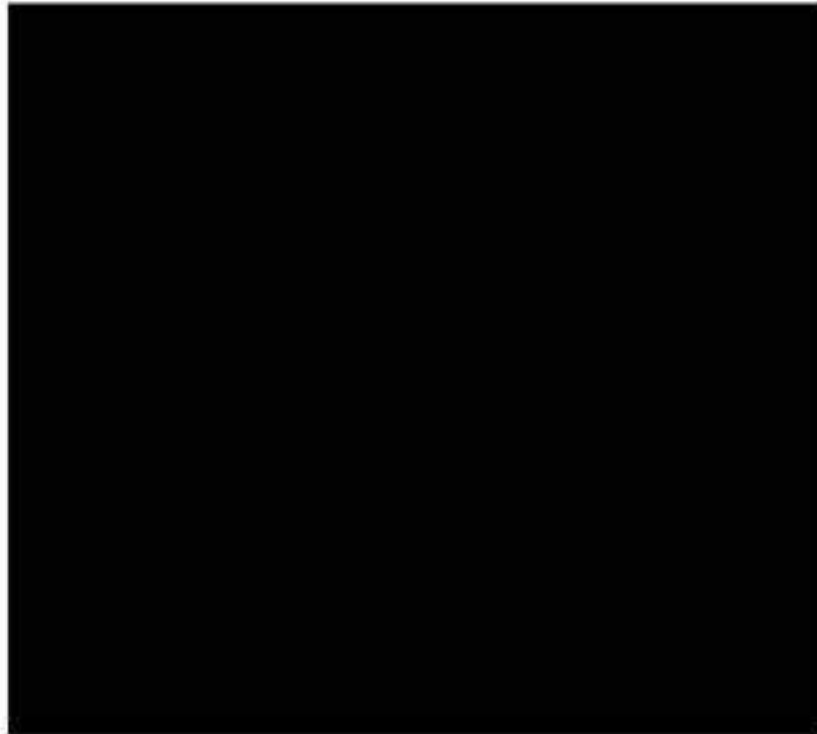

On November 14, 2006, at approximately 1940 hours, I interviewed Paramedic [REDACTED], employed by American Medical Response (ambulance company), in the Nurses Lounge at Los Robles Regional Medical Center in the City of Thousand Oaks. This interview was digitally recorded. The following is a summary of the interview. Refer to the CD ROM containing the recording for additional information:

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████████ confirmed that on the evening of November 14, 2006, she responded to a call of a gunshot victim at ██████████ in the City of Thousand Oaks. She was working with Emergency Medical Technician ██████████. They were assigned as "Medic 452."

At approximately 1823 hours, ██████████ and ██████████ received the call concerning the gunshot victim while they were inside "Borcer's" bookstore in the City of Thousand Oaks. The call was received on their handheld radio and was "a little broken." As they walked out of the establishment, ██████████ heard the dispatcher advise the call concerned a gunshot victim at 2222 Los Feliz Drive. The dispatcher also advised to standby for the arrival of the Sheriff's Department. ██████████ explained that she and ██████████ were initially dispatched with Engine 34 from the Ventura County Fire Department. She continued that Engine 31, from the Ventura County Fire Department, was at the scene of a nearby call and responded to the gunshot victim call along with Squad 31 from the Ventura County Fire Department.

████████ explained that she and ██████████ were cleared to enter the scene prior to their arrival at the scene at approximately 1830 hours. She was driving the ambulance. ██████████ parked the ambulance on the driveway of the apartment complex where the scene was located. She also explained where the vehicles from the Ventura County Fire Department were parked at the scene.

After parking, ██████████ told ██████████ to retrieve the gurney because they would not need their medical equipment since Paramedics from the Ventura County Fire Department were on scene. She walked toward the location where the gunshot victim was being treated and saw a Firefighter walking toward the scene with medical equipment. ██████████ said it appeared that Firefighter / Paramedic ██████████ was preparing to intubate the gunshot victim who was "unconscious and unresponsive."

████████ asked the Firefighter / Paramedics what they wanted her to do as they were in control of the scene. Firefighter / Paramedic ██████████ was attempting to insert an intravenous needle into the gunshot victim's right arm and asked her to begin an "IV" in the gunshot victim's

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left arm. Based on the first name of the Firefighter / Paramedic being [REDACTED], I believe [REDACTED] was actually referring to Firefighter / Paramedic [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. For the remainder of this report I shall refer to the Firefighter / Paramedic as [REDACTED] [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] as that was the name told to me by [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] said the gunshot victim was lying on his back with his head pointed toward where she had parked the ambulance. She was told that four shots had been fired and the gunshot victim had been struck by one bullet. [REDACTED] explained that the information concerning the gunshots was provided to her by an unknown Firefighter at the scene.

[REDACTED] said the gunshot victim was not wearing a shirt. He was wearing black jeans, a belt, and white "sneaker type tennis shoes." [REDACTED] saw that the gunshot victim had one gunshot wound above his right clavicle, but she could not see any other "obvious" wounds.

[REDACTED] went to the left side of the gunshot victim's body and began trying to start an "IV" on the gunshot victim's left arm. She did not notice any weapons lying around the area where the gunshot victim was located. [REDACTED] completed the "IV" in the gunshot victim's left arm. She said "somebody" had asked that the remaining clothing on the gunshot victim be cut off.

[REDACTED] explained that as she completed the "IV" an unknown person had cut the legs of the gunshot victim's pants up the front from the cuff to just below the waist. She believed that a Firefighter had completed the cuts. [REDACTED] did not notice anything when she initially saw the legs of the gunshot victim after his pants had been cut.

[REDACTED] said the "other" Firefighter / Paramedic was still attempting to establish an "IV" on the gunshot victim as medical treatment continued. She removed the gunshot victim's shoes and socks and checked his legs for injury. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] was standing by the gurney and she asked him for scissors to complete the cutting of the legs of the gunshot victim's pants. She continued that she cut the legs of the gunshot victim's pants up to and through the waist, and also cut through his multi-colored striped boxer shorts. [REDACTED] then checked for additional injuries. She confirmed that she completed the cuts on the gunshot victim's pants where the

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Firefighter had ended his cuts. ██████ explained that she was able to open the gunshot victim's pants and boxer shorts in a "butterfly" fashion exposing his groin area and legs. She did not notice anything when she initially cut and opened the gunshot victim's pants and boxer shorts. ██████ explained that she and the other emergency personnel at the scene then prepared to place the gunshot victim onto a backboard. She lifted the gunshot victim's left leg as Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ pulled the gunshot victim's pants toward the right side of the gunshot victim's body. ██████ explained that Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ was on the right side of the gunshot victim.

██████ explained that as Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ was pulling the gunshot victim's pants away they both saw a gun. She explained that the gun was on top of the gunshot victim's pants near the area of his waistband on the back of his body. ██████ said it was correct for me to say that based on the placement of the gun, the gunshot victim might have placed the gun behind his back inside the waistband of his pants. She clarified that she felt the gun would have been fully concealed inside the back of the gunshot victim's pants. ██████ said the gun was a "large automatic, black -- solid black handle (grip)."

I showed ██████ my department issued semiautomatic gun and she confirmed that the gunshot victim's gun resembled my gun. She said the gunshot victim's gun was as large as my gun. ██████ did not know if the gunshot victim's gun had been fired and noticed nothing unusual about it. She confirmed that the gunshot victim's gun appeared to be ready to be fired (the slide was not locked back). ██████ said that both she and Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ both verbalized to everyone near them that they saw the gun. An unknown person told her and Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ not to touch the gun.

██████ said a Deputy Sheriff walked over to her and "stood by" the gun. She explained that when she and Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ initially saw the gun, Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ stopped pulling the gunshot victim's pants. ██████ repeated that she was told not to touch "anything." She and Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ continued to move the gunshot victim and left the gun on the top of the gunshot victim's clothing.

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████████ confirmed that a Deputy Sheriff retrieved the gun. She explained that the Deputy Sheriff initially stood by as she heard someone say "something" about "pictures." ██████ said she did not observe the Deputy Sheriff retrieve the gun, but there were two Deputy Sheriff's by the gun. The last time she saw the gun it was on the gunshot victim's clothing after the clothing had been removed from the gunshot victim's body and left on the ground.

████████ said the gunshot victim was rolled onto his right side to check for any gunshot wounds on his back. No gunshot wounds were found. The gunshot victim was rolled back onto his back and slid onto a backboard. ██████ continued to explain how the gunshot victim was secured on the backboard and gurney before being moved to the ambulance.

████████ confirmed that the gunshot victim was transported directly from the scene to the Emergency Room at the Los Robles Regional Medical Center in the City of Thousand Oaks with the use of emergency lights and siren (Code 3). ██████ drove the ambulance while ██████ Firefighter / Paramedic ██████ and Firefighter / Paramedic Winter remained in the back of the ambulance providing medical treatment to the gunshot victim. ██████ explained what type of medical treatment she and the Firefighter / Paramedics provided the gunshot victim. She said no Deputy Sheriff's were riding in the ambulance and she did not know if a Deputy Sheriff followed the ambulance in a marked patrol vehicle to the medical center.

████████ said while the gunshot victim was being transported to the medical center he did not experience any medical problems where cardiopulmonary resuscitation had to be performed. She explained that the gunshot victim's breathing was being controlled and he had a heartbeat and a "rhythm" during the transport to the medical center. ██████ estimated it took approximately seven to eight minutes to get to the medical center from the scene.

████████ said the gunshot victim did not regain consciousness during the transport from the scene to the medical center, or while at the scene. She confirmed that the gunshot victim never made any statements.

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
Engineer [REDACTED] then went back to help the paramedics. As they were putting the male subject (later identified as (S) Canley) onto a backboard, one of the paramedics noticed a handgun inside the pants of (S) Canley. They notified the deputies of the handgun and were careful not to touch the handgun as they placed (S) Canley onto a gurney. As the paramedics placed (S) Canley into the ambulance, [REDACTED] said he picked up unused medical supplies that were left at the scene.

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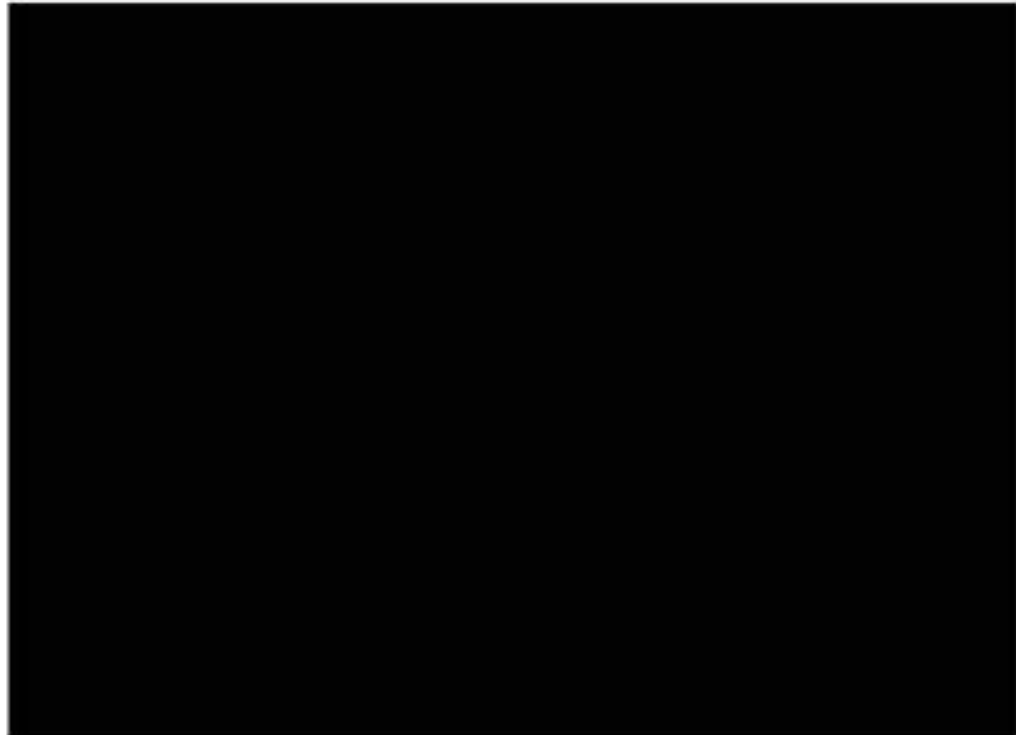

Autopsy

On November 15, 2006 at 0830, I attended the autopsy of Adrian Canley. Dr. Janice Frank the Assistant Chief Medical Examiner for the County of Ventura performed the autopsy. Field Evidence Technician [REDACTED] was also present at the autopsy. She photographed the procedure and collected any evidence that was discovered.

The body was brought into the autopsy room and was contained in a sealed blue vinyl bag. The seal number was 49262. When the bag was opened, I saw Canley's body, which was naked. He had evidence of medical treatment on his body, which included an indo tracheal tube, I.V. lines in his left arm and right upper leg as well as a chest tube in his right side. There was a bloody patch of gauze covering a wound in his upper right shoulder. FET [REDACTED] photographed Canley's body.

FET [REDACTED] brought Canley's clothing to the autopsy. They were collected at the scene by B.I. after they were cut off the victim's body while EMS was treating him. The clothing consisted of the following:

Shoes

- White Nike sport shoes
- White socks

Pants

- Black Levis jeans size 40 waist.

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The pants had been cut up both legs and there was soil on the seat and lower left leg.

A black leather belt was in the evidence bag but not attached to the pants.

Shirts

Black hooded pullover sweatshirt.

The "Kangaroo" pocket was empty. The sweatshirt had been cut off the victim. There was a ragged hole in the right shoulder area that measured approximately 1 centimeter in diameter.

A bullet "jacket" was embedded in the fabric of the sweatshirt approximately 1^{1/2} inch above the neck seam of the sweatshirt. (FET ██████ collected this item as evidence).

Gray long-sleeved Tee shirt

The gray long-sleeved Tee shirt had been cut from the victim's body. There was a ragged hole in the right shoulder approximately 3 inches below the top of the shoulder. This hole was surrounded by blood.


White Tee shirt

The white Tee shirt had a ragged hole in the upper right shoulder that was approximately 3 inches below the neckline. This hole was surrounded by blood.

White Tank Top

The white tank top was cut from the body. In the right shoulder loop was a ragged hole that measured 1.5 centimeter.

Canley is an adult male of about █████ years of age. His head was shaved clean. There were numerous tattoos on his chest that primarily illustrated ██████ Some profanities are

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inscribed at the bottom. On the upper abdomen is another tattoo that depicts praying hands and the names Francisco Escobar and Gustavo. On the back of his neck is the tattoo [REDACTED]

Injuries

A small red abrasion is present on the victim's forehead. It is dried and its age is undetermined.

No other injuries are evident on the body except the gunshot wounds that are described below.


Gunshot Wound

The entry wound is to the right front shoulder. It is 11 – 12 inches below the top of the head. It is also 3 inches below the top of the right shoulder and 3 inches to the right of the midline of the body.

There is a gray deposit on the exposed soft tissue of the skin. The wound is slightly elongated. Refer to Dr. Franks report for dimensions of this wound.

The victim was rolled over onto his face and the bullet could be palpated through the skin under the right shoulder. Dr. Frank excised the skin of the upper back and removed a large and intact bullet that measured 1 centimeter across its base. There was soft tissue and bone imbedded in the bullet. (FET [REDACTED] took this bullet as evidence.)

Dr. Frank determined that the path of the bullet was front to back "Very" slightly upward and "Very" slightly left to right. After entering the upper right, shoulder Dr. Frank concluded the bullet struck just below the clavicle, grazed some blood

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
vessels in the rib cage, grazed the upper lobe of the right lung, and lodged in the upper right back.

Gunshot Wound to Hand

There were two wounds on Canley's left hand. He had a laceration across the left index finger at the first knuckle that measured 1.5 centimeters. He also had a laceration to the tip of his right thumb that tore the thumbnail free. This injury measured 1 centimeter in length.

Dr. Frank completed the rest of her examination of Canley and determined the cause of death to be "Gunshot wound to the chest." The manner of death is "Homicide."

GENERAL DESCRIPTION:

The body is received in a blue vinyl pouch, with a medical examiner's tag attached to the zipper and inscribed with the decedent's name. The pouch is locked with seal #49262. A small bloodstained towel is under the head.

CLOTHING:

The following items are received in sheriff evidence bags:

1. In the first bag is a pair of white "Nike" sports shoes, two white socks with black toes and heels, and an intact black belt, with a white metal buckle.
2. A second bag contains a very heavy black hooded pull over sweatshirt. The kangaroo pocket in the front is empty. It has been cut from the body and the fabric feels slightly damp. A ragged hole is in the right upper front of the shirt and is located approximately 2 ½" below the seam where the hood is attached on the right front, and measures approximately 1 cm. in diameter. On the front of the hood, located approximately 1 ½" above the attachment seam and 1 ¼" from the front edge of the hood, is a 0.6 cm. fragment of copper metal, consistent with bullet jacketing. The edge of the jacketing has penetrated the fabric for a short distance.
3. The third bag contains black jeans that are partially wrapped in white butcher paper. The jeans have been cut from the body up the front of the legs and across the waistband. There is a small amount of soil on the seat and on the left lower back leg of the jeans. The jeans are "Levi" brand, 40 waist and 32 length.
4. The fourth bag contains three shirts. The first is a gray long sleeve knit shirt, which has been cut from the body. There is heavy bloodstaining on the right upper front that surrounds a ragged defect, which measures approximately 1.5 cm. in diameter. The defect is located approximately 3" below the neckband. The second shirt is a white "Hanes" brand tee shirt, which is discolored light yellow in many areas. There is some brown soil on the back and right lower side of the shirt. An area of heavy bloodstaining is on the right upper front, surrounding a ragged defect in the fabric, which measures approximately 1.2 cm. in diameter. The defect is located approximately 3" below the top of the neckband. A third shirt consists of a white rib-knit tanktop-style undershirt, which is discolored light yellow. There is bloodstaining on the front. The shirt has been cut across the shoulder straps. On the right shoulder strap, approximately ¾" above the cut is a roughly round defect, which measures approximately 1.5 cm. in maximum diameter.

EVIDENCE OF MEDICAL THERAPY:

1. An endotracheal tube is strapped in the mouth. A surgical glove is attached to the end of the tube.
2. A dressing is on the right upper anterior chest, covering a gunshot wound to be described below.
3. A right chest tube is in place.
4. A vascular line is in the right groin.
5. A hospital identification band about the left wrist is imprinted with the name "John Doe"
6. A vascular line is in the left antecubital fossa.
7. A bandaid is over the left deltoid area.

EXTERNAL EXAMINATION:

The body is that of a well-developed, well-nourished male, whose appearance is consistent with the recorded age of 25 years. The length is 68 ¼" and the weight is 153 pounds. The body has not been embalmed and is well preserved. Rigidity is well developed in the extremities, and lividity is posterior and blanches slightly with firm finger pressure. The body has been refrigerated and is cool to the touch.

The scalp is shaved. The corneas are clear, and the irides are brown. The conjunctivae are pale and without petechial hemorrhage. There is mild drying artifact across the corneas. The nose is intact, without secretions. The lips are intact and the teeth are natural and in a good state of repair. There is no blood in the mouth. A 0.5 cm. black moustache and 1 cm. soul patch are on the face. The remainder of the beard area is covered by very short stubble. The ears are normally formed, with a pierce hole in each earlobe. The neck is straight and symmetrical and the trachea is midline.

The chest is symmetrical and the breasts are those of a normal adult male. A complex tattoo involves the chest, extending to the top of the shoulders and below the nipples. The tattoo is composed of the words [REDACTED] and the words [REDACTED]. The abdomen is flat, without palpable organomegaly. On the abdomen, extending from above the ribs and costal margin, down to the umbilicus is another complex tattoo which contains praying hands, crosses and the words [REDACTED] and two names on banners over each cross that read [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. There are also spiders and webs in this tattoo. The genitals are those of a normal circumcised adult male, with the testicles bilaterally descended into the scrotum.

The arms and hands are normally formed. The nailbeds are cyanotic and the fingernails do not extend to the fingertips. There is soil beneath the fingernails. Scattered round hyperpigmented scars are on the arms, involving the upper and lower arms and dorsal surfaces of the wrist and hands. Most of these scars measure approximately 1 cm. in diameter. There are no definite needle tracks or needle marks, aside from therapeutic needle marks. There are no tattoos. The legs are normally formed, without angularity or edema. Scattered hyperpigmented round scars are on the thighs; the largest of these measures 1.5 cm. in diameter. A healing abrasion is on the right anterior tibial area and measures 1.5 cm. The feet and toenails are unremarkable, with some soil beneath the toenails.

The back is straight and symmetrical and the anus is without injury. Some acne scars are on the back. A tattoo is on the upper back, just below the neck that reads [REDACTED]

EVIDENCE OF INJURY:

GUNSHOT WOUND OF CHEST:

Entrance – On the right upper anterior chest, centered approximately 13" from the top of the head, 3 ½" from the top of the right shoulder, and 3 ½" to the right of anterior midline, is a gunshot entrance wound which measures approximately 1.2 cm. in diameter. There is asymmetric marginal abrasion around the wound, which is widest from the 1 o'clock around to the 7 o'clock position, and in these areas measures up to 0.5 cm. in width. From the 7 o'clock to the 12 o'clock position the abrasion is narrow, measuring no more than 0.1 cm. in width. There is some gray deposit at the superior side of the wound on the exposed soft tissue.

Path – After perforating skin and subcutaneous soft tissue of the right upper anterior chest, the bullet passes through muscle of the chest wall beneath the clavicle, and enters the right thoracic cavity through the anterolateral first rib, producing fragmentation of the rib and laceration of vessels adjacent to the rib. The subclavian vessels are intact to probe. The bullet then grazes the upper lobe of the right lung and exits the right thoracic cavity through the third rib, producing fragmentation of the bone and laceration of vessels adjacent to these ribs. The bullet then lodges in the right upper back as described below.

Accompanying this gunshot wound is approximately 1800 cc. of liquid and clotted blood in the right thoracic cavity, along with extensive subpleural hemorrhage in the area of both the thoracic entrance and exit.

Exit – None.

Bullet – On the right upper back, just medial to the scapula, centered approximately 11" to 12" below the top of the head, 3" below the top of the right shoulder, and 3" to the right of

posterior midline, a bullet is palpable underneath the skin. Incision in the area reveals a hematoma and a large caliber partially jacketed deformed projectile is recovered from soft tissue. The projectile measures approximately 1 cm. across the diameter of the base.

Direction-of-fire – The bullet passes from front-to-back, very slightly upward and very slightly right-to-left.

GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT HAND:

Two adjacent wounds on the left hand were likely produced by the same bullet. There is a superficial linear laceration on the middle phalanx of the left index finger, which measures approximately 1.5 cm. With the hand in the anatomic position this aligns with a laceration in the tip of the left thumb. The main portion of the laceration is 1 cm. in length. The nail of the thumb has been partially torn free. The bones of these fingers are intact.

OTHER INJURIES:

A dry red abrasion on the mid-forehead, below the hairline, measuring 0.3 cm. in maximum size.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION:

The body is opened through an abdominal fat layer of 1-2 cm. and a muscle layer of 1 cm. The internal organs are found in their normal positions and are covered by glistening serosal surfaces. 1800 cc. of liquid and clotted blood are in the right thoracic cavity. There is no abnormal accumulation left chest cavity, pericardial sac, or abdominal cavity fluid or blood. The right chest tube enters the thoracic cavity through the seventh intercostal space and is lying free within the chest cavity. Internal injury has been described.

SYSTEMS REVIEW:

CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM: The heart weighs 360 grams and is covered by glistening epicardium, with a moderate amount of epicardial fat. The coronary arteries arise normally and follow a right-dominant course, without atherosclerosis. Sections of the myocardium are firm, red-brown and finely fibrillar, without evidence of recent or old ischemic injury. The heart is lined by glistening endocardium. The cardiac valves have their normal structure and the leaflets are thin and translucent, without calcification or vegetations. The coronary ostia are patent. The aorta follows a normal course through the chest and into the abdomen, and exhibits no atherosclerosis or injuries. Blood vessels contain small quantities of liquid blood.

RESPIRATORY SYSTEM: The right and left lungs together weigh 480 grams. Both are covered by glistening tan to purple pleural surfaces, with moderate quantities of subpleural anthracotic pigment deposition. The bronchi are patent and are lined by tan mucosa. The bronchi of the right lung are coated with blood and injury to the right lung has been described. There are no pulmonary thromboemboli. Cut surfaces of the lungs are atelectatic and congested in dependent areas. There is hemorrhage in the area of the graze wound of the upper lobe of the right lung. There are no areas of consolidation or other focal lesions.

HEPATOBIILIARY SYSTEM: The liver weighs 1250 grams and is covered by a glistening red-brown capsule. Cut surfaces are firm and red-brown, without lesions. The bile ducts are patent and the gallbladder contains approximately 3 cc. of bile and no stones.

GASTROINTESTINAL SYSTEM: The intact esophagus is lined by tan mucosa. The stomach contains approximately 100 cc. of thick partially digested food. Medication particles are not identified. The gastric mucosa is unremarkable. The pylorus is patent and the duodenal contents are bile-stained. The remainder of the small intestine and large intestine are normal to inspection and palpation. The appendix is normal.

The pancreas is of normal size and shape, and cut surfaces are tan and lobulated, without lesions.

HEMATOPOIETIC SYSTEM: The spleen weighs 130 grams and is covered by a glistening purple capsule. Cut surfaces are firm, with well-maintained white pulp areas. Lymph nodes within the neck, chest and abdomen are unremarkable. The thymus is minimally replaced by fat.

GENITOURINARY SYSTEM: The right and left kidneys together weigh 220 grams. The capsules strip with ease from both, revealing glistening light purple cortical surfaces. Cut surfaces show clear demarcation between cortical and medullary areas. The renal calyces and pelves are not dilated and drain into ureters of normal caliber, which follow a normal course to the urinary bladder. The bladder contains approximately 100 cc. of clear yellow urine, and is lined by unremarkable tan mucosa. The prostate is normal to sectioning. The testicles are normal to palpation within the scrotum.

ENDOCRINE SYSTEM: The thyroid is of normal size and shape, and cut surfaces are light maroon and finely lobulated, without lesions. The adrenal glands are of normal size and shape, and cut surfaces show unremarkable golden cortical and maroon medullary areas. The pituitary is normal.

NECK: There is no hemorrhage within the strap muscles, thyroid or posterior pharyngeal constrictors. The bony and cartilaginous structures of the larynx, and the hyoid bone, are intact.

The larynx and trachea are patent and are lined by tan mucosa, which is coated with a small amount of tan foam and blood. There is no abnormal mobility or crepitation of the cervical vertebrae.

MUSCULOSKELETAL SYSTEM: The muscles are normally developed and consistent with those of an adult male. The skeleton is normally developed and consistent with that of an adult male. Rib fractures have been described.

HEAD: Reflection of the scalp reveals no subgaleal hemorrhage. The calvarium is intact. There is no epidural or subdural hemorrhage. Removal of the dura from the base of the skull reveals no hemorrhage or fractures. The pituitary and proximal spinal cord are intact.

CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM: The fresh brain weighs 1530 grams and is covered by glistening transparent leptomeninges. The gyri are normally oriented and exhibit no significant flattening. Examination of the base of the brain reveals an intact circle of Willis, without atherosclerosis or aneurysms. The cranial nerves are intact. There is no uncus or cerebellar tonsillar herniation. There is no subarachnoid hemorrhage. The brainstem and cerebellum have their normal external appearance.

Sections of the cerebral hemispheres reveal an intact cortical ribbon and underlying white matter. The basal ganglia and thalami have their normal appearance. The ventricles are not dilated and are lined by glistening ependyma, without intraventricular hemorrhage. Sections of the brainstem and cerebellum reveal an intact internal structure. The spinal cord is not removed.

TOXICOLOGY: Specimens of right chest cavity blood, urine, and gastric content are retained. Admitting blood is also retained. Spots of blood are placed on two FTA cards.

HISTOLOGY: Representative tissues are retained.

PHOTOGRAPHS: 35 mm. photographs are obtained.

X-RAYS: Multiple hospital x-rays are available for examination.

EVIDENCE: All clothing, the recovered projectile, an FTA card and multiple photographs are obtained by sheriff's B.I.

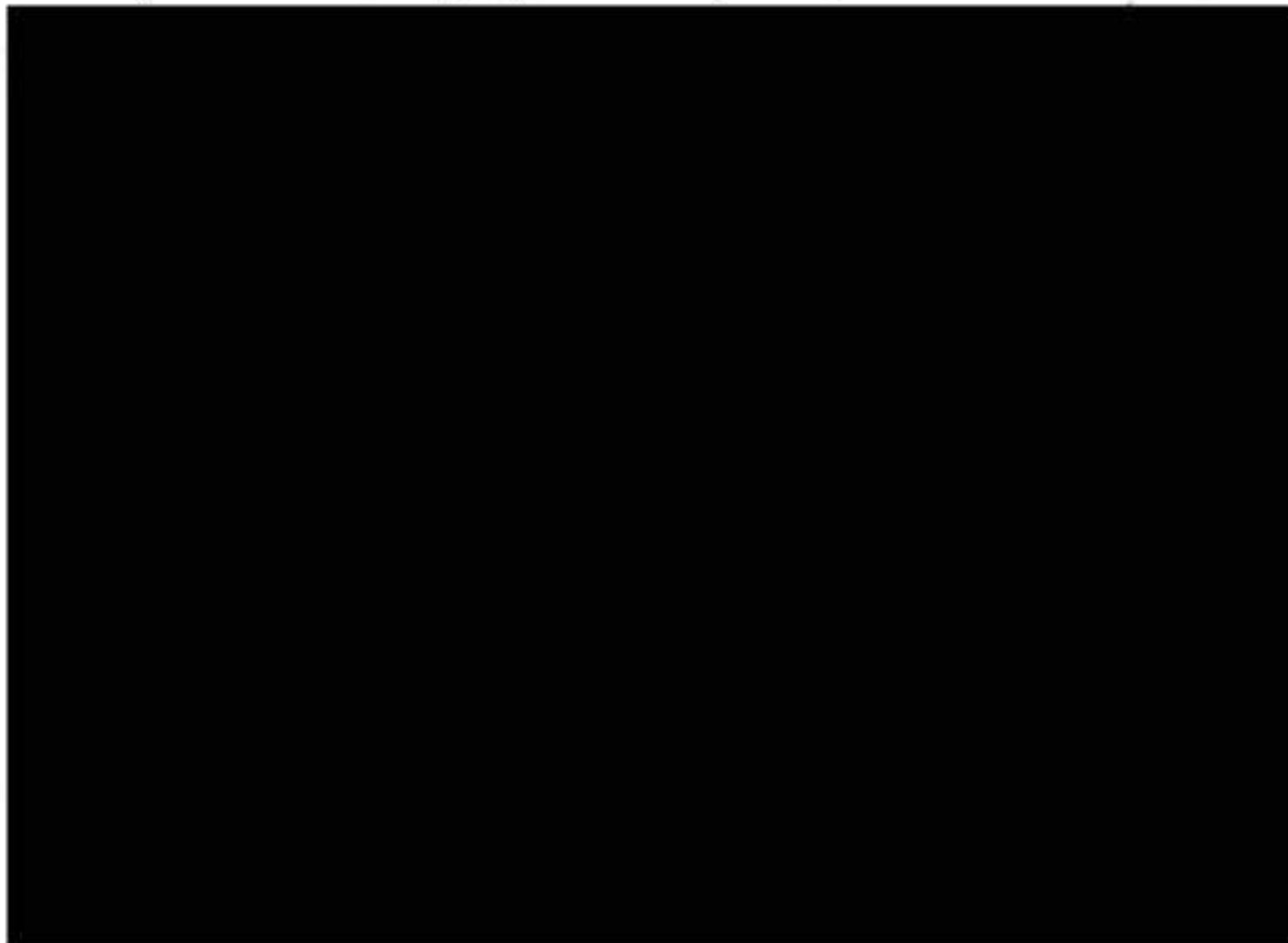

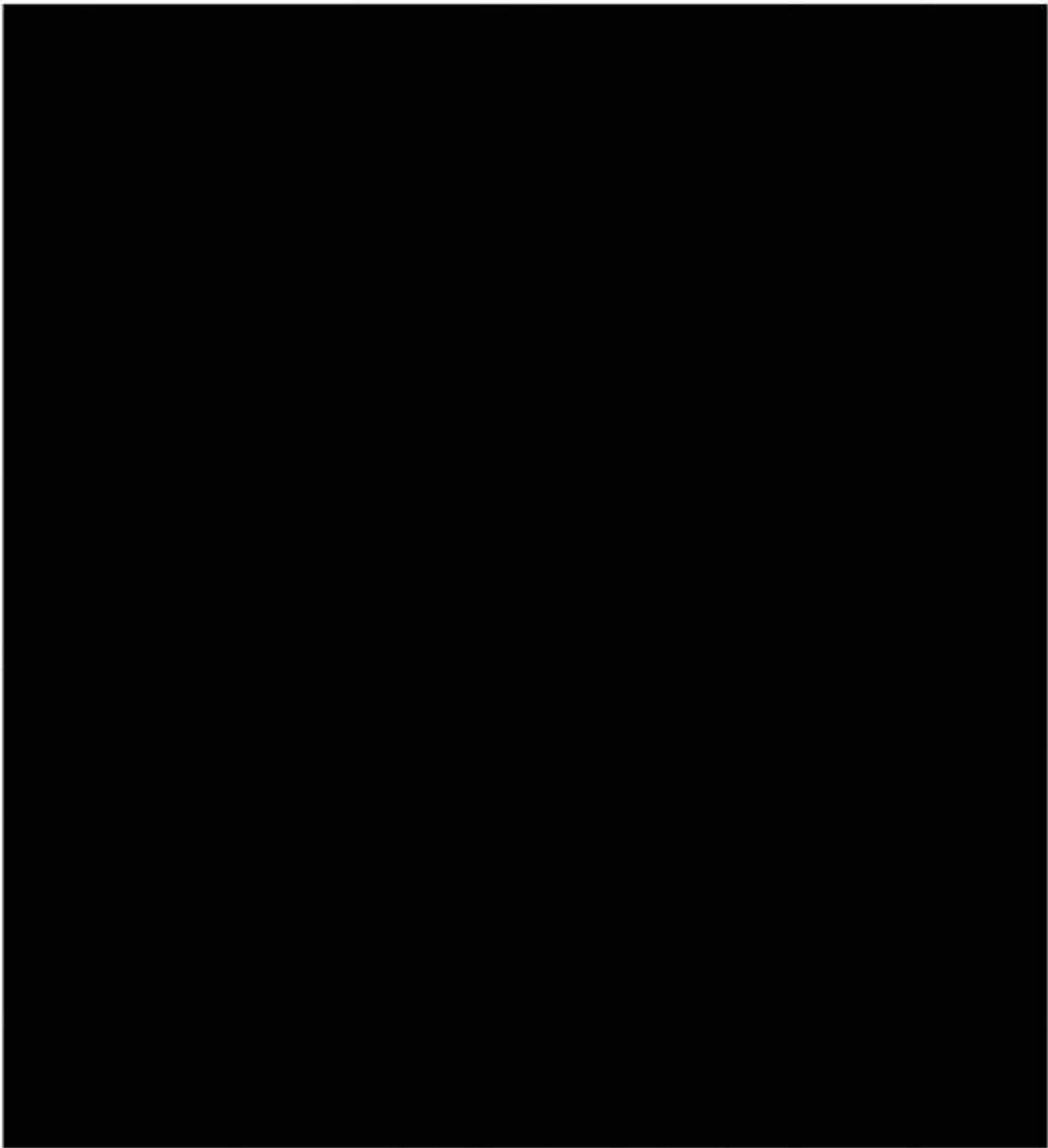

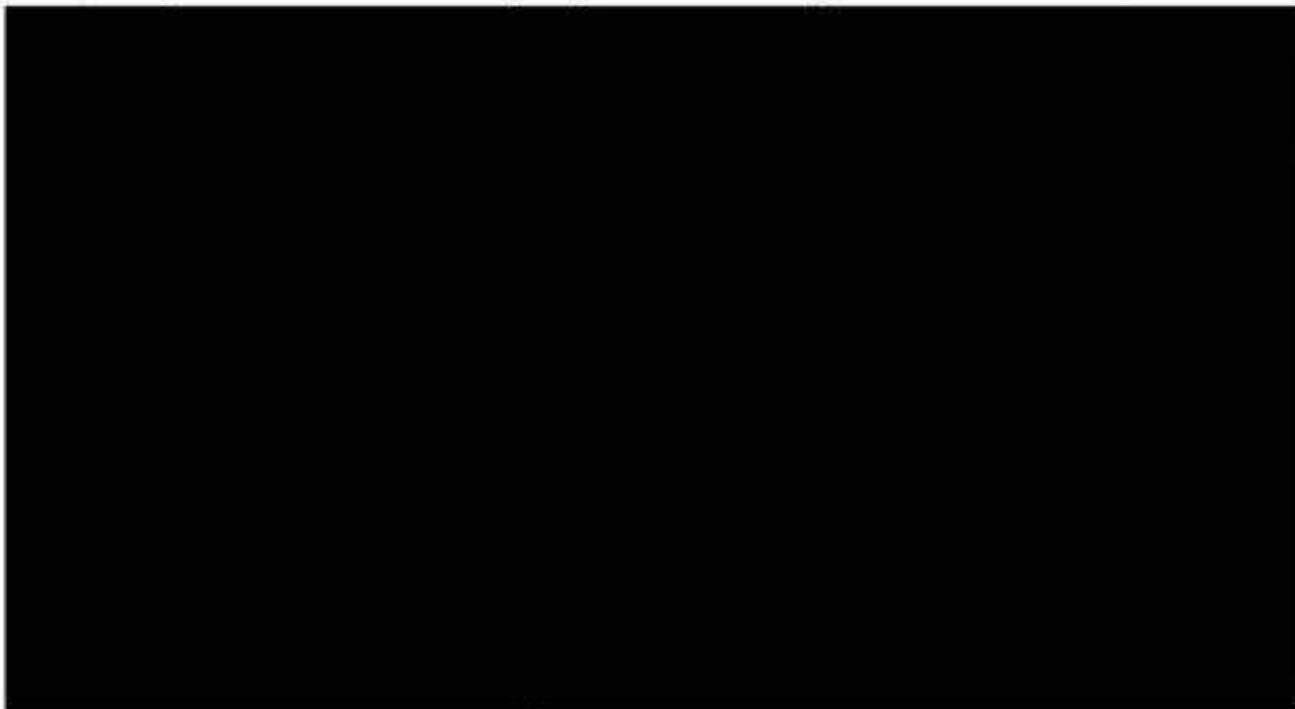

SUMMARY OF INVESTIGATION

On 11/14/2006, at about 2021 hours, Sgt. M. Powers from the Ventura County Sheriff's Department Major Crimes Unit contacted me. He reported the death of Adrian Doyle Canley. He advised that the death was the result of an officer-involved shooting incident in the City of Thousand Oaks.

Sgt. Powers related the following information based on the preliminary investigation. At about 1815 hours this date, a plain clothes detective was conducting a follow-up investigation into a non-violent crime completely unrelated to the decedent. While the detective was interviewing a male subject in the small parking lot of an apartment complex, the decedent approached the detective on foot. The decedent appeared to be in an agitated state and asked the detective if he was a police officer. The detective acknowledged that he was, and the decedent walked away and got into a white Ford pick-up truck that was parked near-by. For unknown reasons, the decedent started to drive the pick-up truck towards the detective. The detective shouted at the decedent to stop numerous times and then fired his service pistol at the decedent. The decedent was shot in the right shoulder and the truck came to a stop in the parking lot.

The detective called for assistance and emergency medical personnel and started first aid. The decedent was found to be carrying a loaded handgun in the waistband of his pants. The decedent was transported to the Los Robles Regional Medical Center Emergency Room in Thousand Oaks by paramedic ambulance from the American Medical Response Ambulance Service. Sgt. Powers advised that the decedent had been pronounced at the ER at about 2013 hours. Sgt. Powers requested that I meet Detective S. Peterson at the hospital. I responded at about 2030 hours and arrived at about 2052 hours.

At the hospital, I spoke to Detective Peterson. He related the same basic information as received from Sgt. Powers. After photographing the body, I examined the decedent. The body was that of a Hispanic male adult whose appearance was consistent with the stated age of. The body was supine on a backboard on the gurney. The body was warm to the touch and was absent of rigor.

Mild blanching lividity was present and consistent with the position of the body. The visible trauma consisted of an entry wound to the right shoulder area and minor injuries to the left thumb and forefinger. There was no exit wound. Also visible on the arms and legs were numerous scars. The decedent's chest was covered in elaborate gang-related tattoos.

Evidence of medical treatment included an endotracheal tube, chest tube on the right side of the chest, an IV line in the left antecubital fossa and a triple lumen IV line in the right groin area.

The temperature of the trauma room was about 75° at about 2114 hours. The decedent's core body temperature was 97° at about 2124 hours.

Members of the Ventura County Sheriff's Department Crime Scene Investigation team arrived and photographed the decedent and performed gunshot residue tests of the decedent's hands.

The body was placed into a blue body bag and seal number 29262 was placed at about 2222 hours. The body was transported to the Ventura County Medical Examiner's Office by Cathedral Mortuary Associates pending notification of the next-of-kin and a review of the case with the Medical Examiner.

I responded to the scene with Detective Peterson. I spoke to Sgt. M. De Los Santos of the Ventura County Sheriff's Department. He stated that deputies had responded to an address in Oxnard that had been provided by the decedent's probation officer. He advised that the address was no longer valid as the decedent did not live there. No other information was available on the decedent's place of residence.

On 11/15/2006, I was advised by Sgt. S. Rhods that he had been contacted by the Santa Paula Police Department and had been told that the decedent's mother was staying at a residence on East [REDACTED] in the City of Santa Paula. He advised that the family had filed a report on the decedent on 11/14/2006. The report stated that the decedent had left the Santa Paula home at about 1725 hours and that the decedent had been seen carrying what appeared to be handgun in the waistband of his pants. The decedent was seen driving a white 1999 Ford F-150 pick-up truck, California license [REDACTED]. This was the same vehicle that the decedent attempted to run over the detective with.

I contacted Lt. M. Saviers of the Santa Paula Police Department. He confirmed that the decedent's mother, Mrs. [REDACTED] Canley was at the [REDACTED] address. He stated that she had been visiting from New York for the past several weeks. I responded to the Santa Paula Police Department and Lt. Saviers and I went to the residence. At about 0838 hours, I informed Mrs. Canley of the death and the known circumstances surrounding the incident. Mrs. Canley stated that the decedent had been experiencing increasing paranoia since August of 2005. She stated that the decedent had made statements that people were watching him and after him. She stated that the

decedent's paranoia had reached a point that even school children walking past the house upset the decedent if they looked his direction. I asked her if she knew a reason for the decedent going to the Thousand Oaks area, and she stated that the decedent had friends there. She also confirmed that the decedent had a known history of drug abuse. I explained the procedures that would follow.

On 11/15/2006, I reviewed the case with Janice G. Frank, M.D., Assistant Chief Medical Examiner for the County of Ventura. She advised that an autopsy would be conducted. At the conclusion of the procedure, Dr. Frank advised that the cause of death was a gunshot wound of the chest. The manner of death was ruled a homicide.

The body was released to the Skillin Mortuary in Santa Paula at the request of the family.

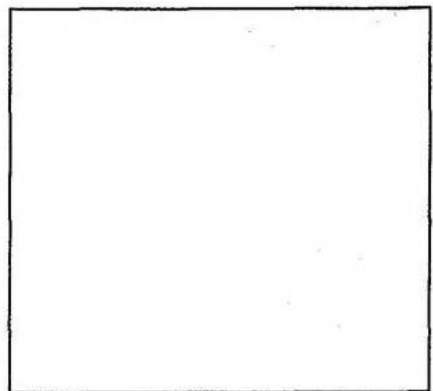

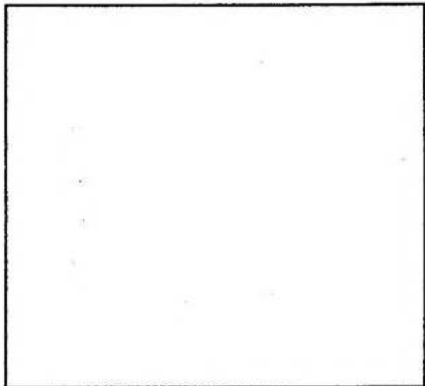

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1 (Affiant's Information)

2 AFFIDAVIT IN SUPPORT OF SEARCH WARRANT

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The facts establishing the foregoing grounds for issuance of a search warrant are as follows. I am your affiant, and I am currently employed as a Sergeant by the Ventura County Sheriff's Department. I have been a full-time Peace Officer in the State of California for over twelve (12) years and was a Peace Officer in the State of Nevada for four (4) years. I also served as a Reserve Peace Officer in the State of California for three (3) years. I am currently assigned to the Ventura County Sheriff's Major Crimes Investigations Bureau as a Detective Sergeant, and I have been so assigned for four (4) years.

I graduated from the Ventura County Criminal Justice Training Center and have attained basic, intermediate, and advanced P.O.S.T. certifications. In addition to receiving over eight hundred (800) hours of training in the basic police academy, I have received over five hundred (500) hours of formal training in criminal investigations and law enforcement tactics from the Drug Enforcement Administration (D.E.A.); the California Department of Justice; the Federal Bureau of Investigation (F.B.I.); the Las Vegas, Nevada, Metropolitan Police Department; the Henderson, Nevada, Police Department; the Nevada Division of Investigation (N.D.I.); the National Law Enforcement Institute; the Kern County Sheriff's Department; the Santa Barbara County Sheriff's Department; the San Jose State University; and the Ventura County Sheriff's Department.

1 I have investigated and been involved in the investigation of no
2 less than four hundred (400) crimes of violence, and I have
3 interviewed more than five hundred (500) victims and
4 perpetrators of violent crimes. I am familiar with the many
5 ways in which violent crimes occur, and I have spoken with and
6 exchanged information with many experienced peace officers from
7 a wide variety of law enforcement agencies who have investigated
8 incidents of violent crime, including criminal homicide.

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1 (Statement of Probable Cause)

2 On October 13, 2006, at about 1845 hours, I responded to a
3 report of an officer-involved shooting in the parking lot of the
4 apartments located at [REDACTED], Thousand Oaks.

5
6 I arrived at [REDACTED] at approximately 1920 hours
7 and found numerous law enforcement resources already deployed at
8 the scene. I entered the apartment complex and found yellow
9 crime scene tape cordoning off the southeast parking lot.

10
11 At the scene, I spoke with Detective Sergeant Mike Powers, who
12 is known to me as a fellow peace officer. Sergeant Powers
13 arrived prior to me, and he had already surveyed the incident
14 scene and spoken with several deputies, including Detective
15 Shane Matthews.

16
17 Sergeant Powers told me, in summary, he learned that Detective
18 Shane Matthews had been standing outside of a nearby apartment,
19 conducting an investigative interview with a witness, when an
20 unidentified Hispanic male, who was unrelated to his
21 investigation, approached him and made a comment similar to,
22 "Are you the cops? You're never going to take me alive."
23 Detective Matthews ignored the unidentified male and continued
24 interviewing the witness.

25
26 After completing his interview, Detective Matthews began to
27 leave when the Hispanic male, who was still in the area, made
28 another comment similar to, "You're never going to take me

1 alive." Detective Matthews attempted to contact the
2 unidentified male when a confrontation unfolded, which resulted
3 in the Hispanic male driving a white Ford pickup truck toward
4 Detective Matthews. Detective Matthews told Sergeant Powers he
5 fired four shots from his service pistol at the Hispanic male
6 and the truck he was driving, which resulted in the Hispanic
7 male sustaining a single gunshot wound to the chest. The truck
8 rolled to a stop in the parking lot and did not strike any
9 vehicles or objects.

10

11 According to Sergeant Powers, Detective Matthews called for
12 assistance and began rendering first aid to the injured male.
13 Ventura County Fire Department personnel and paramedics
14 responded to the scene and continued life saving efforts.
15 During the paramedics' assessment of the male's injuries, a
16 black semi-automatic handgun was found inside the waistband area
17 of the male's pants.

18

19 I examined the incident scene, which had been preserved by
20 sheriff's patrol personnel who responded to the initial
21 incident. I noted five expended silver-colored .40 caliber
22 Speer pistol casings laying on the parking lot within
23 approximately three feet of each other near the entrance/exit to
24 the parking area. I saw several vehicles parked in stalls
25 within the parking area, and I saw a white Ford F-150 pickup
26 truck, California license [REDACTED] resting against the north
27 curb of the parking area. It appeared as though the truck had
28 been traveling from south to north through the parking lot

1 before it came to rest.

2

3 I looked at the Ford pickup truck closer and saw seven impact
4 locations where bullets appeared to have struck the vehicle.
5 There were two bullet holes in the tailgate of the truck; three
6 bullet holes in the windshield, just in front of the driver's
7 seat; one bullet hole in the radiator; and one bullet impact
8 area on the front bumper.

9

10 I looked inside the truck through the windows, and I saw a
11 suitcase and folded clothes on the seat behind the front seats.
12 I saw a small knife wedged between the driver's seat cushion and
13 the backrest, and I saw a pair of binoculars sitting on the seat
14 cushion of the front passenger's seat. I saw a droplet of blood
15 on the inside of the driver's side window, and I saw smears of
16 blood on the steering wheel and driver's seat.

17

18 Looking at the pavement near the driver's side of the truck, I
19 saw two red nylon sheriff's Emergency Medical Kits, and a
20 variety of expended first aid materials. I also saw a cellular
21 telephone, a butane lighter, two black cloth gloves, and a pile
22 of various clothing, some of which was bloody. Additionally, I
23 saw a black colored semi-automatic pistol lying on top of a
24 black pair of pants. I later checked the pistol and confirmed
25 it was loaded with seven .45 caliber cartridges in the magazine
26 with one .45 caliber cartridge in the chamber.

27

28 I directed the collection of the various items of evidence at

1 the scene, and I ordered the towing of the Ford pickup to the
2 sheriff's crime laboratory for further inspection and forensic
3 examination.

4
5 I checked the truck's license number with the Department of
6 Motor Vehicles and learned it was a 1999 model with a Vehicle
7 Identification Number (VIN) of [REDACTED] I compared
8 the VIN with the truck's and found that it matched. The
9 registered owner of the vehicle was listed as Adrian D Canley,

10 [REDACTED]

11

12 I spoke with Detective Scott Peterson, who is known to me as a
13 fellow peace officer. Detective Peterson told me he went to the
14 Los Robles Medical Center and was able to confirm the identity
15 of unidentified Hispanic male who Detective Matthews shot as
16 Adrian Doyle Canley, date of birth [REDACTED] Detective
17 Peterson also confirmed that Canley did not survive his wounds,
18 and had been pronounced dead by a hospital physician.

19

20 I conducted a criminal history check on Adrian Canley and
21 learned he was a convicted felon, having received a felony
22 conviction by the Los Angeles Superior Court in 2002 for
23 violating Penal Code Section 12031(a), Carrying a Loaded Firearm
24 in Public.

25

26 I believe a search of Adrian Canley's vehicle, the white Ford F-
27 150 pickup truck, California license [REDACTED] will reveal
28 additional evidence of Canley's criminal behavior, which may

1 help to explain why this incident occurred. I also believe a
2 search of the vehicle, including the employment of scientific
3 instruments by forensic examiners, will enable investigators to
4 reconstruct the incident more precisely and accurately.

5

6 Based on the aforementioned information, which is set forth to
7 the best belief and ability of your affiant, your affiant
8 respectfully requests that a search warrant be issued for
9 Canley's vehicle, including all contents and containers.

10

11 I also request the court issue an order sealing the contents of
12 the affidavit. Disclosing the contents of the affiant's
13 information to the public and press could result in potential
14 witnesses being tipped off concerning our investigation. Such
15 information could result in the destruction of important
16 evidence, such as crucial witness statements. It is therefore
17 necessary for law enforcement to withhold the information
18 contained within the affiant's information from the public.

On 12/07/06, at about 1345 hours, I met with Sergeant Ismael Cordero at the Santa Paula Police Department. Sergeant Cordero furnished me with a computer printout of the call for service placed to the Santa Paula Police Department by [REDACTED] Canley on 11/14/06. He also provided me with a cassette tape containing a recording of that telephone call. Sergeant Cordero noted that the Santa Paula Police Department's recording system attached the incorrect time of 1837 hours to the telephone call, when in actuality the telephone call was received at 1737 hours.

I examined the call for service report, which identified the call taker as [REDACTED] and the dispatcher as "[REDACTED]". I noticed the report identified the caller as [REDACTED] Canley, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] with a telephone number of [REDACTED]. The "suspect" on the report was listed as Adrian Canley, [REDACTED] driving a white 1999 Ford F-150, Ca license [REDACTED].

I reviewed the audio recording and wrote the following transcript based on the contents of the recording of the telephone conversation between the call taker and [REDACTED] Canley:

Witness Interview



On November 16, 2006, Detective Albert Mesa (ID# 2616) and I drove to ██████████, Ventura, California, to interview ██████████ ██████████. I spoke with ██████████ on the telephone and arranged to speak with her that morning at her residence. Detective Mesa and I arrived at ██████████ residence at about 1020 hours. After greeting ██████████ at the front door of her residence, she invited us inside and we all sat down at the dining room table to talk.

██████████ told us she is Adrian ██████████'s aunt. ██████████ ██████████, Adrian's mother, is ██████████ sister. ██████████ told us that up until three weeks ago she had not spoken with her sister for about two years. ██████████ told us that for the last three weeks ██████████ and Adrian Canley had been living in her apartment with her.

On Sunday, November 12, 2006, Adrian got into a fistfight with another male subject at the apartment complex. After the fight, ██████████ told ██████████ that Adrian could no longer stay in her apartment, and ██████████ has not seen Adrian since that day. ██████████ explained what she knew about the fight for us.

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At about 2045 hours on Sunday, November 12, 2006, [REDACTED] woke up after hearing a door slam. [REDACTED] said she was sleeping in her bedroom. [REDACTED] explained, "I remember I heard a slam of a door and that woke me up, but I thought that was upstairs. So I was trying to go back to sleep, and then I heard some screaming. 'No Adrian, No!' Then somebody else was screaming something else and I got up. My nephew (Adrian) was at the door and he was mad. And there was another boy with blood on his mouth." I asked [REDACTED] if the other boy was also in her apartment. [REDACTED] explained that Adrian was standing in the threshold of the front doorway and the other subject, whose mouth was bleeding, was standing just outside her apartment. [REDACTED] did not know the subject Adrian fought with.

[REDACTED] continued, "My sister ([REDACTED]) couldn't get him to come in, so I yelled at him real firm, and I go, 'Get in right now!' He got in and he sat right there where that little stuffed animal is." As [REDACTED] spoke she pointed toward the living room. [REDACTED] went on, "He was shaking and he couldn't catch his breath, and I go, 'Relax.' I go, 'What happened?' He just kept going like this, 'I don't know, I don't know,' and shaking. I guess my sister was talking to his dad (Adrian's father) at that time, and he really didn't want to talk to his dad on the phone because he couldn't catch his breath. He was all like - he had a lot of anxiety."

Apparently, [REDACTED] telephoned Adrian's father to tell him about the scuffle. Eventually, Adrian briefly spoke to his father on the telephone. [REDACTED] explained, "I told him, I go, 'Mijo, talk to your dad 'cause he's on the phone...He wants to hear that you're okay.' So he talked to his dad and he told him he would call him back later. And then he said he had to leave. He kept saying, 'I don't want to go to county.' He goes, 'Yeah, they're gonna call the cops, and all the cops are gonna be here. I go, 'What makes you think that?' I go, 'You stay here so that we could know that you're okay.'" [REDACTED] told us Adrian replied, "No, I just gotta go, I just gotta go." [REDACTED] went on, "He just kept saying that...and he left."

I asked [REDACTED] if she knew what started the incident between Canley and the other youth. [REDACTED] replied, "No, I was asleep." [REDACTED] told me she was told the disturbance occurred because of a disagreement over parking. [REDACTED] explained, "My sister said it was something about parking, that

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they had to move a car or something. And my nephew said that the other kid was giving him dirty looks. And then I guess they were both giving each other dirty looks. And I don't know if that time he was upset already or whatever. That's all I know, that they confronted – then I came out, that's all I saw, the kid with..." [REDACTED] words trailed off.

[REDACTED] said the police arrived a short time after the altercation between Adrian and the other male. However, Adrian left the area before the police arrived. I asked [REDACTED] if she knew the identity of the person Adrian fought with, and she told me she did not know his name or where he lived. [REDACTED] said the subject's relatives live somewhere in the apartment complex, and the police talked with the other boy when they arrived at the apartment complex.

Later, [REDACTED] told us that after the fight she told [REDACTED] that Adrian could no longer stay at her residence. [REDACTED] said she was afraid of being evicted because of Adrian's behavior. [REDACTED] said Adrian never returned to her apartment.

I asked [REDACTED] about her relationship with Adrian. [REDACTED] initially stated, "We're very close," but then she added, "I mean, I hadn't seen him for awhile, because – my sister, I haven't even talked to her for like almost two years. But I knew that she was gonna be coming from New York, but I didn't..." [REDACTED] words trailed off. I asked [REDACTED] if Adrian had been in New York with his mother, and she told me, "No, he lived here (in Ventura County). I don't know where he lived, but he lived here." I asked [REDACTED] how often she saw Adrian, and she replied, "We see each other when we have family gatherings."

I asked [REDACTED] if Adrian has had any emotional problems she was aware of. [REDACTED] replied, "He was like a loner...He was a good kid. He was just probably depressed or had problems – I don't know, but he was a really good person. He comes from a good family. I can't say he had problems, because we didn't have that kind of relationship..."

[REDACTED] went on, "When he was here," referring to the period of time Canley recently spent staying at her apartment along with his mother, "I noticed that he was nervous, anxious. I don't know if it was

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cause he wasn't working." Detective Mesa asked if Adrian was behaving nervously before or after the fight. [REDACTED] answered, "After the fight, I thought even more, you know like – he was just anxious."

I asked [REDACTED] again if Adrian had "any mental health issues or problems." [REDACTED] replied, "Did I know? Nuh huh...He was a nice kid. I think he just – you know how some kids think that parents or people are out there to help them?...he was always by himself I think. That's why he felt kind of – like he didn't have older person's support. That's the only problem..." [REDACTED] words trailed off.

I asked [REDACTED] who Adrian was living with after his mother moved to New York. [REDACTED] replied, "I don't know. When I started seeing him like everyday was when they moved here and lived with me." [REDACTED] was referring to when Adrian and his mother moved into her apartment. [REDACTED] added, "That was like two or three weeks ago." I asked [REDACTED] where Adrian's father lives, and she told me he was also living in New York, however, at the time I was talking to her, he was in California.

I asked [REDACTED] why Adrian's mother and father were living in New York. [REDACTED] explained, "They have their own business over there. Their kids were all settled here so – you know they all have their own little life, so they went and they did their own thing with a business in New York." [REDACTED] told me Adrian had been living on his own "for a while" before his parents moved to New York. She said Adrian had an apartment in Oxnard.

[REDACTED] briefly spoke to us about Adrian's daughter ([REDACTED]) and then began talking about her sister, [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] explained, "See, me and my sister – we didn't communicate for two years. And I knew that she was going to be coming from New York because – I don't know if Adrian was in trouble or what, but she was gonna come to help him...I don't know what the issue was or what. I knew through my daughter – because she's real close with her ([REDACTED]) daughter – they're cousins – they're really, really close – so I knew through them – through my daughter that she ([REDACTED]) was gonna be coming. But I didn't think that she was gonna be coming here, because she didn't talk me. When she would come other times she wouldn't acknowledge me in any way."

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I asked [REDACTED] if she had a "falling out" with [REDACTED] before she moved to New York. [REDACTED] responded, "No, we were living together one time, and it just happened, and it didn't workout, so at that time, she left, I left, and then we didn't – our relationship wasn't the same as before. I mean it's like a family thing, but – " [REDACTED] words trailed off.

[REDACTED] was not very forthcoming with information about her dispute with [REDACTED], so I asked again if she had a "squabble" with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] replied, "Yeah, and then---I mean, I didn't feel I was mad, she didn't feel she was mad, but you know, we just didn't communicate. She didn't communicate with me, and I have my own life that I have to keep going, so I just kept going."

[REDACTED] then returned to talking about when her sister arrived from New York. [REDACTED] said, "The only reason they got a hold of me was because my sister ([REDACTED]) called my son." [REDACTED] said that after she came back into contact with her sister they began communicating again. I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] talked with her about the reason she returned from New York to take care of Canley. [REDACTED] told me, "No, she wasn't very open. All I was doing was giving him room and board and that's it. The only time I would cross words with her (is) when I would get up and go to work, 'cause I was hardly here."

I asked [REDACTED] if she talked with Adrian at all. [REDACTED] replied, "Yeah, I did, because he would be here." Later however, after [REDACTED] had been talking for several moments, I asked [REDACTED] if she talked with Adrian about what had been going on in his life. [REDACTED] responded, "No, I didn't talk to him that much. I just would say 'hi', and just the basic – you know, 'what are you doing,' or – but that's about it, because I'm hardly here."

[REDACTED] then told us about an incident that occurred in her apartment early in the morning on Sunday, November 12, 2006. [REDACTED] explained, "But Sunday morning like about 5 (am) – it was about 4:30 (am) – I was by myself and then I – I leave the door open in my room so I could hear noises. So I heard, and I heard somebody say, 'Shhh, be quiet. Be quiet.' And...I heard his (Adrian's) voice, but I thought he was talking to his little girl or my sister because...that...from the

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door you could see I was asleep. And then I heard all the doors open and close, open and close and then I heard somebody over here," referring to the kitchen area.

████████ continued, "I woke up and I go (thought), 'What's going on?' So then I put my head up and I go (thought), 'Maybe he brought a girl.' But then I saw him in my door, and he called me 'Tia'. Tia is aunt in Spanish. And he goes, 'Tia'. And I go, 'What Mijo?' And he says, 'There's somebody in the house. I know there's somebody in the house.' And I go, 'What? What are you talking about?' (And he said), 'Yeah, somebody's here. Somebody keeps following me. Somebody's here.' And I go, 'No Adrian.' I go, 'Nobody's here.' And he was like shifting his eyes and he was like - " ██████████ words trailed off.

I asked ██████████ if she meant Adrian was looking for someone when she said he was "shifting his eyes," and she responded, "Un huh! And real nervous." ██████████ told us she got up and checked the door to the residence to ensure it was locked and looked around the apartment to reassure Adrian. ██████████ explained she also checked the closet, bathroom, and other rooms and made sure all the windows were locked to show Adrian no one was in the residence but the two of them. ██████████ said Magdalena had not stayed at the residence that night.

████████ then told Adrian to go to sleep. ██████████ told us that after she checked the entire residence she said to Adrian, "See, nobody's here...and I go, 'Nobody's here.' He goes, 'Yes, I could sense that somebody's here. Somebody's here.' And I go, 'No, go to sleep.' He goes, 'I can't, I can't go to sleep.' He was like real anxious."

████████ explained that Adrian sat on the couch in the living room behaving as if he was looking for someone or waiting for someone to enter the residence. ██████████ went on, "...I got kind of scared because I work with people like that, like schizophrenics and like that at the hospital. And they snap...you don't know what could happen." ██████████ continued urging Adrian to go to sleep. She said, "And I go, 'Well, go to sleep and I'm gonna go to sleep,' and I went to my room and I locked my door."

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██████ told us when she got up later that morning she got ready to go to church. Before leaving the residence she spoke with Adrian again. ██████ said Adrian kept asking for his mother. ██████ told Adrian she thought ██████ was at another sister's (██████) residence. ██████ again told Adrian to go to sleep. She said Adrian responded, "I can't, I'm afraid. I can't, I'm afraid."

I asked ██████ if Adrian told her why he was afraid. ██████ replied, "He just said that somebody was here and he was afraid. He didn't say why, but he said that he was afraid. He was trying to protect himself from something." Detective Mesa asked ██████ if Adrian's daughter was at the residence during this time, and ██████ replied, "No, my sister had her."

██████ said sometime later that day she returned home from church. ██████ continued, "When I came (home) that door right there in the hallway was closed the bathroom door was closed and his room door was open, but he had blankets all over, like real dark." ██████ explained that Adrian had covered the window in this room with blankets. ██████ said Adrian was wearing a hooded sweatshirt and gloves. ██████ asked Adrian if he had been able to sleep. ██████ said he told her, "I can't. I'm gonna try to go to sleep right now."

I asked ██████ if she ever saw Adrian with a gun, and she told me, "No, uh huh. And it's scary 'cause I don't know where he kept it or what."

The next involvement ██████ had related to Adrian was on Tuesday, November 14, 2006. ██████ told us officers from the Ventura Police Department arrived at her residence and warned her that Adrian left her sister's house in Santa Paula in a fit of anger armed with a handgun. ██████ said, "I guess he was like angry when he left my sister's (house) in Santa Paula, and saying that everybody was against him, and that we (his family) knew people were following him. (They said) he was kind of mad and he left. That's when he took off. And I guess he had a threat that he was going to come here. I don't know the story, because the police just came and knocked on my door and asked me if I was okay...That's when she (the police officer) told me that there's a threat that he was gonna come and shoot here and some people upstairs or something."

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██████ told us after the police came to her residence she left and stayed at her daughter's house until it was time for her to go to work. ██████ said when she arrived at work she turned on the television. As she watched the television she heard about a shooting in Thousand Oaks. Later, ██████ learned that Adrian was involved in the shooting.

As we continued to talk ██████ told us, "I told my sister – I go, 'He has – something's wrong with him.' I go, 'He's schizophrenic.' I go, 'Maybe he has a problem,' because I've never seen him – that's not Adrian. I go, 'It's not Adrian.' Because he was like real quiet and real polite and...hug and kisses...but I've never seen him the way I've seen him these few days, the last few days before – like nervous, like anxious...and he wouldn't look out the window. And then I would hear stories – that umm – and see my sister believed him...She'd only see one thing," meaning that ██████ would believe whatever Adrian told her.

I asked ██████, "In other words, whatever he tells her, she believes that?" ██████ replied, "Uh huh. And the cop – when he came and told her...he goes, 'Ma'am, your son's on drugs. She goes, 'No, he's never done drugs. He's on antibiotics because he's sick.' And then he (the police officer) goes, 'Ma'am, wake up! You've got to stop being in denial.' And when he told her...(I realized) 'Yeah, you know what? Something's going on with Adrian. He needs help.' So that's when she told the cop she needed (phone) numbers to try to help him." ██████ did not specify if this exchange with the police occurred during contacts with the police on Sunday or Tuesday.

I asked ██████ if she noticed whether or not Adrian has lost a lot of weight recently. ██████ replied, "Yeah, he was skinny. He looked thinner than other times – the last time I'd seen him. On his face, you know, his skin." I asked ██████ if she thought, based on his behavior, that Adrian had a drug problem. ██████ replied, "Yeah, I think so...I was telling my sister, 'You know, I see this in the hospital all the time...he kept saying there was people out there and that there's people following him. He had my sister believing that they were following the truck and stuff.'"

I clarified that Adrian was also telling ██████ people were following him, and she replied, "Uh huh...my sister told me some story that one time he went to somewhere on Thompson (in Ventura)

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and that there was this lady that kept lasering him." [REDACTED] said she tried to talk to [REDACTED] and explain to her that she should not believe everything Adrian told her when his behavior was so paranoid. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] was unreasonable when it came to convincing her that Adrian's stories were made up or paranoid. [REDACTED] went on, "I think it's just make up stories, but I could be wrong, 'cause my sister still believes that there were people undercover following him but I don't know why...I don't know why he would be followed."

[REDACTED] also explained that she lost one of her sons. She alluded to the possibility that he may have been a drug user, but she was somewhat evasive about discussing the matter.

[REDACTED] told us she was concerned about who was going to find out she spoke with us. [REDACTED] told us, "When my sister finds out, that's it.. what I think is that my sister – yesterday, she was saying that he (Adrian) left angry. And if he left the way he was here when I found – when he came that day in the morning – he was seeing things. Everybody was against him, everybody."

To clarify, I asked [REDACTED], "The morning that you said he was saying there was people in here, was he telling you that people had been following him and the police were after him?" [REDACTED] replied, "Un huh, he said that they're watching and they were after him, but he said that somebody was in here," referring to her apartment. I asked [REDACTED] if Adrian told her who was watching him and was after him. [REDACTED] responded, "No, one time he did something – he was cooking and I go, 'What are you cooking?' And he goes, 'I'm sorry Tia, I don't want to bring problems to you.' And I go, 'What do you mean?' And then he said, '...If you see people – there was a SWAT car over there and in the mall (referring to the Pacific View Mall) there's a bunch of cops and then right here there's cops.' And I go, 'How do you know they're cops? How do you know they're after you if they're way in the mall?' He goes, 'I don't know, I just know, I just know.' And then he goes, 'if you see people in their cars, I don't know why they're following me.' They were undercover cops to him. I go, 'Mijo, what did you do?' He goes, 'Nothing, I don't know, nothing, they're just following me.'" [REDACTED] went on telling Detective Mesa and me that Adrian was convinced police officers were following him.

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Detective Mesa asked [REDACTED] if it was typical for Adrian to get into a physical fight like the fight he was engaged in on Sunday. [REDACTED] replied, "No..." Mesa asked her if Adrian had an anger management problem. [REDACTED] said it was out of character for Adrian to get into a fight. She said, "Yeah, it wasn't him."

In response to Detective Mesa's questions, [REDACTED] began to talk about the fallout from the fight on Sunday at her apartment complex. [REDACTED] explained, "That day he took off...and then the cops came and they were talking to the boy, but my nephew wasn't here anymore." Mesa asked if Adrian left after the fight so he would not get arrested. [REDACTED] replied, "He said he refused to go to county (jail), he didn't want to go to county, he didn't like county and he was gonna go, and he left."

As we were getting ready to leave the residence, [REDACTED] told us some of Adrian's possessions were still in one of the bedrooms of her apartment. We asked if we could take a look in the room, and [REDACTED] escorted us back to the bedroom. Detective Mesa and I briefly looked around the room but found nothing noteworthy. After thanking [REDACTED] for her time, Detective Mesa and I left the residence.

Detective Mesa's and my interview with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was recorded on a digital recorder. The recording was saved as evidence and placed with the case file. The quotes in this report are a transcript of the conversation between Mesa, [REDACTED] and me; however, I have made some minor alterations for clarity and ease of reading and omitted some of the extraneous dialog. The content of the statements has not been altered. Refer to the original recording for exact quotes.

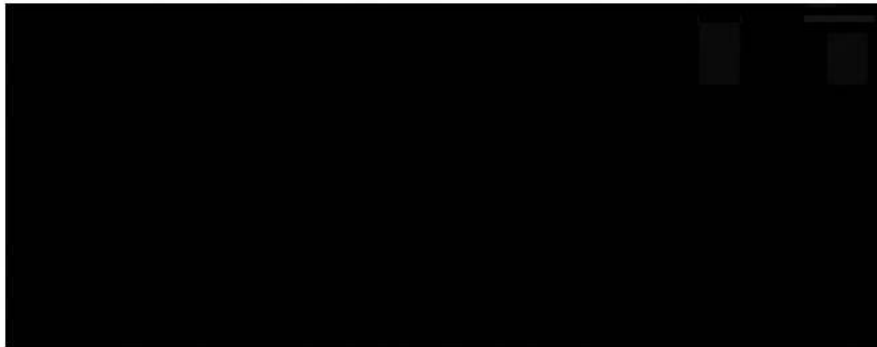

On November 15th 2006, Sergeant Ayub assigned me to contact and interview a subject named [REDACTED]. Sergeant Ayub told me he received information that [REDACTED] had recently been involved in an altercation with (S) Adrian Canley, at an apartment complex in the city of Ventura. This incident took place on November 12th 2006 at approximately 2044 hours.

Sergeant Ayub told me that [REDACTED] called the Ventura Police Department to report this incident. Officers from the Ventura Police Department responded to the scene of the altercation and interviewed [REDACTED]. Canley fled the scene prior to the arrival of the police. [REDACTED] told the police he did not want to file battery charges against Canley. Due to [REDACTED]' decision not to press charges against Canley, this incident was not documented in a written report.

On November 15th 2006 at approximately 1630 hours, I made a telephone call to [REDACTED] at his residence in Oxnard. [REDACTED] was not home at this time, but I spoke with his mother ([REDACTED]) and asked her to have [REDACTED] call me at my office.

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On November █th 2006 at approximately 1410 hours, I received a phone call from █. The following is a summary of my tape-recorded conversation with █.

I told █ I wanted to speak with him about his fight with Adrian Canley. I asked █ if he knew Canley by name. █ said he did not know Canley's name and never met him before this incident. █ confirmed that his altercation with Canley took place on Sunday (11-12-06). I asked █ for his account of the events leading up to the fight. █ said he left work around 9:00 (p.m.) and drove to his aunt's house in Ventura to pick up his sister. █ aunt, █, resides in an apartment at █.

█ said he pulled up in front of his aunt's apartment complex and honked for his sister, █ (█ years), to come outside. █ said he was double-parked in the street with his hazard lights on as he waited for his sister to come out. As █ waited in his vehicle, he observed a subject walking down the street in his direction. *This subject was later identified by VPD as Adrian Canley.* █ said Canley stared at him and started "throwing gang signs" at him. Canley looked at █ and repeatedly asked, "What the fuck are you looking at?"

█ took out his cell phone and dialed his aunt's phone number to tell his sister he was there. █ said Canley started "nodding his head at him" as if to get his attention. █ said he tried to ignore Canley as he continued to wait for his sister. █ said Canley eventually left and disappeared into the apartment complex. █ waited in his truck for approximately 10 more minutes and then decided to go up to his aunt's apartment to get his sister.

As █ was about to climb the stairs to his aunt's apartment, Canley came out of a nearby downstairs apartment and confronted █. Canley asked █, "What's your problem?" █ asked Canley what he wanted. Canley started cursing at █ and told him to move his "fucken piece of shit car", or else he "would run it over." █ told Canley he would move his car after he got his sister. █ said Canley became even more upset because he did not move his vehicle right away.

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I asked [REDACTED] if he recalled exactly what Canley told him when he confronted him near the stairs. [REDACTED] said Canley told him, "I guess you noticed me. What the fucks' your problem? What were you looking at?" [REDACTED] told Canley he was not looking at anything and was just calling his sister, who was in their aunt's apartment. [REDACTED] said Canley called him a "little bitch" and continued to "go off on him." [REDACTED] said Canley looked "pretty hyper" and thought he was "on something." I asked [REDACTED] if he recalled what Canley was wearing. [REDACTED] said Canley was wearing a light-khaki windbreaker, black pants, white shoes, and black gloves.

Canley quickly retrieved something from his apartment that looked like a zip-up "trapper-keeper" (notebook) or a small briefcase. Canley dropped the notebook on the ground and swung at [REDACTED]. Canley missed and did not initially hit [REDACTED], but [REDACTED] fell back towards the stairs. [REDACTED] said he stood to his feet and Canley swung at him again. [REDACTED] started swinging back at Canley and they fell to the ground where they continued to fight. [REDACTED] said his sister came downstairs after the fight began and screamed when she saw them. [REDACTED] said he exchanged punches with Canley and thought he hit Canley. [REDACTED] said his aunt and uncle ([REDACTED] [REDACTED]) came downstairs and broke up the fight. Canley said he sustained a bloody nose and an injury to his mouth as a result of Canley punching him. [REDACTED] estimated that the fight lasted for approximately five minutes.

I asked [REDACTED] if Canley's aunt or mother came outside after the fight. [REDACTED] said a female subject who appeared to be Canley's mother, came out of her apartment after the fight was over. I asked [REDACTED] where Canley went after the fight was over. [REDACTED] said Canley stood next to his apartment door. [REDACTED] said Canley stormed back into the apartment when his mother confronted him about his behavior. [REDACTED] said his aunt told him she had called the police and [REDACTED] decided to wait for them. I asked [REDACTED] if he saw Canley leave the apartment complex. [REDACTED] said he was washing up when he learned that Canley was leaving the scene. [REDACTED] said he heard a car "peel out" and assumed it was Canley that left. I asked [REDACTED] if he moved his car at some point. [REDACTED] said he gave his uncle his car keys after the fight and his uncle parked his car down the block.

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I asked [REDACTED] if he recalled what type of vehicles he was parked next to when he initially arrived at his aunt's apartment. [REDACTED] recalled parking next to a white Nissan Sentra and a pickup truck. [REDACTED] thought the truck was possibly grey. [REDACTED] could not provide any further details about the truck.

I asked [REDACTED] if the police asked him if he wanted to press charges against Canley. [REDACTED] said he told the police he did not want to press charges against Canley. I asked [REDACTED] if the police spoke with Canley's mother or aunt. [REDACTED] said he was not sure if the police spoke with Canley's family members.

I asked [REDACTED] about the extent of his injuries. Canley said he felt okay and went to work on the day after the altercation. However, [REDACTED]' employer sent him home because he had a black eye and his face was still a little swollen. I asked [REDACTED] if anyone had photographed his injuries. [REDACTED] said his mother took a picture of his facial injuries with her camera phone, the day after the altercation. [REDACTED] said his mother still had the photograph stored on her camera phone. I asked [REDACTED] to tell his mother not to delete this picture.

I concluded my interview with [REDACTED] and retained the audiocassette as evidence.

On 11/15/06, at about 1328 hours, Detective Rob Davidson #2775 and I drove to [REDACTED] to speak with [REDACTED] Canley concerning the death of her son, Adrian Canley. Adrian was involved in an altercation, on the evening of 11/14/06, with Ventura County Sheriff's Detective Shane Matthews, which resulted in Adrian being shot by Detective Matthews. Adrian later died of the injuries he sustained from the shooting.

I spoke with Senior Deputy Medical Examiner Investigator Craig Stevens earlier in the day, and he told me he spoke with [REDACTED] on the morning of 11/15/06, and already informed her that Adrian was deceased. Investigator Stevens told me that [REDACTED] did not seem surprised at the news of Adrian's death, and she related to him that she was fearful of Adrian's recently increasing paranoia. Stevens also told me that [REDACTED] called the Santa Paula Police Department, on the early evening of 11/14/06, and reported that Adrian left her home armed with a handgun and was possibly en route to a residence in Ventura to shoot someone. According to Investigator Stevens, both Santa Paula PD and Ventura PD filed

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respective reports on [REDACTED]'s complaint. Refer to Investigator Stevens' report for additional information.

When we arrived at [REDACTED]'s residence, I noted several vehicles parked on the street in front of the residence and on the driveway of the residence. Detective Davidson approached the front door of the residence and was greeted by an unidentified Hispanic female. Detective Davidson asked the woman if she was [REDACTED], and she said she was not. However, the woman opened the door of the residence and invited us inside. As we entered the residence, I saw approximately ten individuals sitting in the living room area. [REDACTED] was one of the people seated in the living room, and she spoke up and identified herself to us. She also indicated that most of the people in the residence were her relatives, and that Adrian's former girlfriend, [REDACTED], was also present.

Detective Davidson asked [REDACTED] if we could speak with her privately and she agreed that we could. Detective Davidson, [REDACTED], and I then walked into a back bedroom of the residence, where we stood and talked. Detective Davidson conducted the bulk of the interview and, in summary, [REDACTED] told us the following.

[REDACTED] told us that she and her husband, [REDACTED] Canley, raised Adrian in San Jose, California. Adrian was a good student and excelled in school. At the time, [REDACTED] was employed by the Phillip Morris Company. On an unknown date, Phillip Morris transferred [REDACTED] to the Southern California area. The transfer prompted the Canleys to move to West Hills, California. Adrian subsequently attended El Camino High School where he received good grades and had many friends. Detective Davidson asked [REDACTED] if Adrian had any discipline problems in high school, and [REDACTED] vaguely referred to "a few" incidents which caused Adrian to be transferred to a high school in Canoga Park. [REDACTED] did not elaborate on the incidents that caused Adrian to transfer high schools.

After high school, Adrian worked for a telemarketing firm in Calabasas. He later went on to work in the construction trade. [REDACTED] said Adrian was a hard worker who was successful and well liked by his employers.

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About one year ago, Adrian was living with [REDACTED] in Port Hueneme, along with [REDACTED] and Adrian's 2-year-old daughter, [REDACTED]. At this time, [REDACTED] moved away to New York, New York, where she joined [REDACTED], who had moved there about one year earlier.

In August of 2006, after [REDACTED] moved away, Adrian lost his job in the construction field. Detective Davidson asked [REDACTED] why Adrian lost his job, and she told us Adrian was "laid off" by the Union. After losing his job, [REDACTED] helped Adrian financially, and Adrian reluctantly accepted her help. She commented that she has another son who is in college who also requires her financial support, insinuating that Adrian reluctantly accepted her help because he knew it was difficult for [REDACTED] to help him and his brother with their finances. Ultimately, Adrian became financially unable to pay for his apartment, and he was forced to move at the end of September of 2006.

[REDACTED] told us that Adrian complained to her about people following him. She suggested to Adrian that he tell the police about being followed, which he eventually did. [REDACTED] later found out from her sister-in-law that Adrian had been arrested when he went to the police to complain about being followed. [REDACTED] said she did not know why Adrian had been arrested, and she did not tell us when this incident occurred.

[REDACTED] said she decided to return to Ventura County in October of 2006, to help Adrian by watching his daughter while he went and looked for work. Detective Davidson asked [REDACTED] about Adrian's mental condition when she returned to Ventura County. [REDACTED] replied, "To me, he was fine" and she told us that Adrian mostly stayed at home or took his daughter to Chuck E Cheese's to occupy his time.

Detective Davidson asked [REDACTED] if Adrian's concern that people were following him seemed to increase as time went on. [REDACTED] replied, "Well yesterday...yesterday it did." [REDACTED] went on to tell us she called Mental Health, on 11/14/06, in an attempt to seek advice on how to deal with Adrian. According to [REDACTED], whomever she spoke with at Mental Health told her to call 911 and ask for a "CIT" officer. [REDACTED] said she dialed 911 and asked for a CIT officer but she was told that she had to call the Santa Paula Police Department instead.

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██████████ told Detective Davidson and I that she telephoned the Santa Paula Police Department and asked for help. An officer from the Santa Paula Police Department later met with ██████████ and obtained her statement for a formal report. In that report, ██████████ referred to a fight Adrian became involved in on Rexford St. in Ventura, and she expressed concern that Adrian might return to Rexford St. and cause a problem.

Before calling the police on 11/14/06, ██████████ and Adrian were having a discussion about his belief that he was being followed. During that conversation, Adrian told ██████████ that he had to drive almost all the way to Bakersfield to evade the people who were following him. ██████████ said she suggested to Adrian that he seek some professional help regarding his belief that he was being followed. Detective Davidson asked ██████████ if she thought Adrian was really being followed. ██████████ replied, "In a way it was". I asked ██████████ if she meant Adrian really believed that he was being followed, and she confirmed that was correct.

Detective Davidson asked ██████████ if she saw Adrian with a gun before he left home on 11/14/06. ██████████ said she did not see a gun but she knew that he had one. Upon further questioning, ██████████ said she saw the outline of what she believed was a handgun tucked in Adrian's pants' waistband, above his right rear hip. She also admitted that she has seen him with a brownish-gray colored handgun in the recent past.

Detective Davidson asked ██████████ to describe Adrian's mental condition when he left home on 11/14/06. ██████████ replied, "Mentally, I had never seen him like that." She elaborated and told us that Adrian was calm but he was continuously looking out the windows, believing that someone was following him. It was during this time, ██████████ suggested to Adrian that he seek some professional help (for his paranoia), which prompted the argument that preceded Adrian leaving the house.

Next, Detective Davidson asked ██████████ if she thought Adrian had been using drugs. ██████████ said she knew that Adrian used marijuana in the distant past, but she did not believe he had used any drugs lately. She said she has spoken with Adrian about whether or not he had used drugs, and he has always denied to her that he has used drugs in the past.

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██████████ said she became especially concerned about Adrian's behavior when they argued on the afternoon of 11/14/06. During that argument, Adrian used profanity in her presence, which she said he had never done in the past. Detective Davidson asked ██████████ if Adrian cursed at her, and she said he did not – he cursed at the situation. ██████████ said that Adrian also accused her of knowing what was going on, insinuating that ██████████ knew why he was being followed. Shortly thereafter, Adrian left the residence and ██████████ telephoned the police.

Detective Davidson asked ██████████ what Adrian told her when he left the house. ██████████ said, "He said that he was tired of it." She said that she tried to counsel Adrian, but he insisted she did not believe that he was being followed. Detective Davidson asked ██████████ if Adrian said "I know how to end this" or "I'm gonna end this." ██████████ said Adrian did make a similar statement before he left the house. Detective Davidson asked ██████████ what she thought Adrian meant by that statement, and she said, "He always says that but, you know, that he was gonna get to the root of the problem." ██████████ confirmed her belief that Adrian felt his problem was that people were following him.

Detective Davidson asked ██████████ if she truly believed that Adrian was being followed or if she simply believed that Adrian believed that he was being followed. ██████████ said, "No, I truly believe it because...because sometimes I would drive his truck and then there was some cars – familiar cars, and also one day I was with my sister...she took me back 'cause...'cause sometimes, you know, since I don't have transportation, she would go and pick me up, and I saw somebody on the corner and they didn't see me 'cause I was in a different car." Detective Davidson asked ██████████ who she thought the people were, and she said she did not know. She commented that Adrian thought the people were police or citizens hired by the police to follow him.

Detective Davidson told ██████████ that he heard there was an incident where Adrian believed that school children were watching and/or following him, and he asked ██████████ if that was true. ██████████ said that was not true, and she had not heard Adrian allege that school children were following him.

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Detective Davidson asked [REDACTED] if she knew about any gang affiliation that Adrian had, and he mentioned that Adrian had a number of tattoos on his body. [REDACTED] confirmed that Adrian had many tattoos, but she denied that he had any gang affiliation whatsoever. She claimed that she had never gotten a close look at Adrian's tattoos and she therefore could not describe any of his tattoos.

[REDACTED] described the incident that occurred on Rexford Street in Ventura by explaining that she and Adrian were staying with a relative there. She and Adrian were inside the residence when Adrian started feeling "edgy". [REDACTED] said she suggested to Adrian that he relax, and, in turn, Adrian went to the refrigerator and obtained a beer. Adrian opened the beer but did not drink any. Adrian then announced that he needed to go drive around to calm down, and he left the residence. As he left the residence, Adrian encountered someone who was double-parked in front of their residence. [REDACTED] said Adrian asked the driver of the double-parked vehicle to "please move", and the driver responded with a profane remark.

[REDACTED] said Adrian returned to the residence briefly to get some compact discs, and when he returned to his vehicle the other motorist was still double-parked. At that time, the driver of the vehicle got out and made a remark to Adrian, which caused Adrian to approach him. Adrian and the driver then became involved in a physical fight, which [REDACTED] had to break up. After breaking up the fight, [REDACTED] said the man Adrian fought with approached her and made a comment similar to "It ends with you" to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said she felt threatened by the man's comment, and she then decided to go stay with her sister on Virginia Terrace in Santa Paula. A short while later, the Ventura Police arrived at the residence and filled out a report on the incident.

Detective Davidson asked [REDACTED] how many times Adrian had been arrested. [REDACTED] said she knew that Adrian had been arrested on the occasion when he went to the police to complain about being followed, and on one other occasion when he hit a pole with his truck and left the scene. She said she did not know of any other arrests.

Detective Davidson explained to [REDACTED] the circumstances surrounding Adrian's shooting. While we were speaking, an unidentified male knocked on the door and told [REDACTED] her husband was on the telephone and wanted to speak with her immediately.

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██████████ accepted the telephone call and spoke with ██████████ briefly, and she then handed the telephone to Detective Davidson. Detective Davidson explained the circumstances surrounding Adrian's shooting to ██████████, and he returned the telephone to ██████████ when he was done. ██████████ spoke to ██████████ briefly again, and she then ended the telephone call.

I asked ██████████ if she believed that Adrian might have been suicidal. ██████████ said, "He didn't seem suicidal, he just looked paranoid." She said that Adrian had never threatened suicide in the past. ██████████ said Adrian was usually fine when he was around the house but whenever he would go outside, he would return in an agitated stated. Detective Davidson asked ██████████ if Adrian could have been using drugs when he left the house, and she said she did not think that was possible. ██████████ denied there was any history of mental illness in her family.

I asked ██████████ about two bullet holes I noticed in the tailgate of Adrian's pickup truck, which did not appear to be related to the shooting incident with Detective Matthews. ██████████ said she recalled seeing a hole in the "back" of Adrian's truck, but she did not realize it was a bullet hole. She said the hole was in Adrian's truck when she returned from New York in October of 2006. ██████████ did not know why or how the bullet hole came to be in Adrian's truck, and she confirmed that Adrian did not tell her that anyone shot at him.

Detective Davidson asked ██████████ if there were periods of time where Adrian would disappear or not reveal to her where he had been. ██████████ recalled a recent occasion when Adrian left for a weekend, but he told her ahead of time that he would be gone. She thought that he went to stay with a friend in Thousand Oaks during that time, but she was unsure who that person was or where he lived.

Detective Davidson asked ██████████ if Adrian's behavior had created problems within the family, and she denied that it had. ██████████ identified her immediate family as her husband, ██████████ Canley; and her surviving son, ██████████ Canley. ██████████ also told us that Adrian has a two-year-old daughter, whom she identified as ██████████ ██████████ Canley. ██████████ mother is ██████████ ██████████ who was Adrian's long-time girlfriend.

We concluded the interview with ██████████ by providing her with our business cards and contact information.

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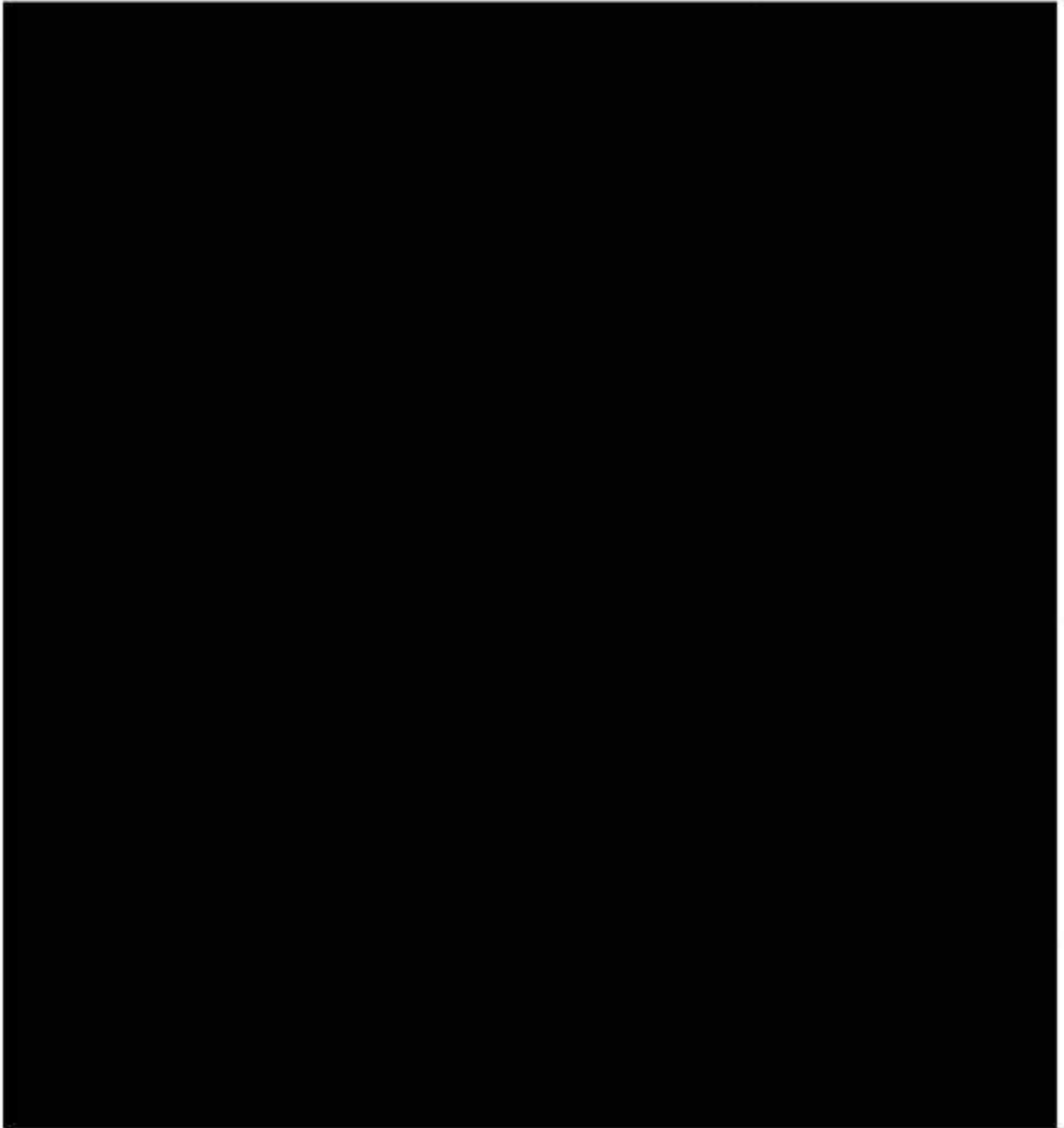

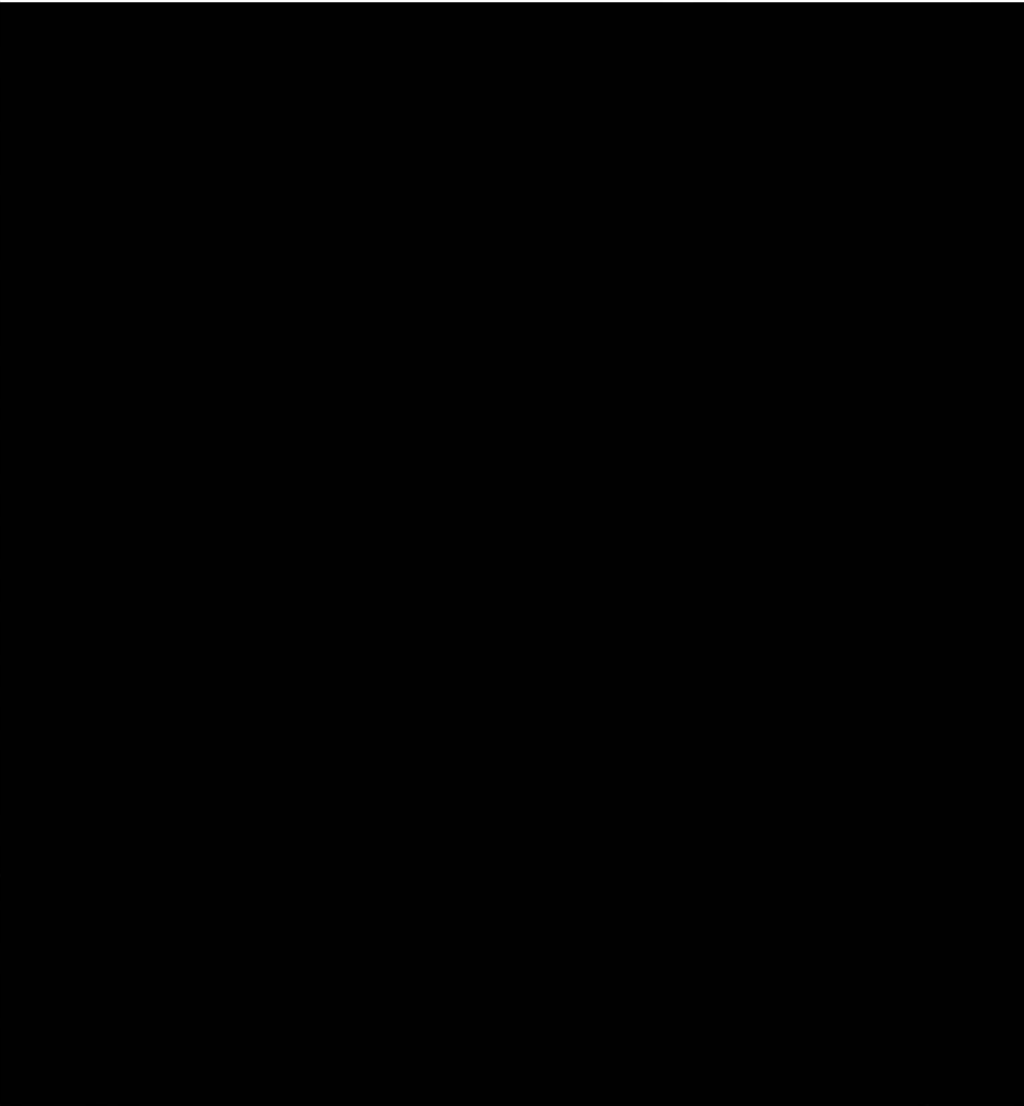

On 12/20/06, at about 1740 hours, I spoke over the telephone with Ventura County Sheriff's Deputy Sam Dominguez. I had earlier received information that Deputy Dominguez was a [REDACTED] to Adrian Canley. Canley was involved in an altercation, on the evening of 11/14/06, with Ventura County Sheriff's Detective Shane Matthews, which resulted in Adrian being shot by Detective Matthews. Adrian later died of the injuries he sustained from the shooting.

I asked Deputy Dominguez if he was, in fact, [REDACTED] Adrian Canley. Deputy Dominguez told me that he was, and he explained that Adrian was [REDACTED]. Specifically, Adrian's mother, [REDACTED] Canley, is Deputy Dominguez' [REDACTED]. Deputy Dominguez identified his [REDACTED] as [REDACTED] [REDACTED], and he confirmed that [REDACTED] lives on [REDACTED].

Deputy Dominguez told me he has known Adrian's family for approximately 13 years. He did not know Adrian well, but he knew Adrian grew up in the West Hills area of Los Angeles. He described Adrian as having a good upbringing, and he recalled visiting Adrian's immediate family when Adrian was a young child.

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Deputy Dominguez told me he had not seen Adrian in approximately 1 year. However, he spoke with [REDACTED] about Adrian, and she told him that Adrian and [REDACTED] had been living with her for a short period of time prior to the shooting. According to [REDACTED] Adrian had been acting very paranoid, during the time they lived together. Based on [REDACTED]'s description of Adrian's behavior, Deputy Dominguez suspected that Adrian might have been abusing illicit drugs.

Deputy Dominguez told me that [REDACTED] came to stay at [REDACTED] out of fear that Adrain was going to harm her. He elaborated and explained that Adrian became involved in a physical fight with a neighbor while he and [REDACTED] lived with her on Rexford Street. After the fight, [REDACTED] and Adrian moved to another relative's residence in Santa Paula. On the day [REDACTED] came to [REDACTED] Deputy Dominguez, [REDACTED] spoke to [REDACTED] who told [REDACTED] that Adrian was possibly on his way to [REDACTED]'s residence in Ventura to cause trouble, and Adrian was armed with a handgun. Out of concern for her safety, [REDACTED] came to Deputy Dominguez' [REDACTED] for shelter.

Deputy Dominguez said he did not know any of the specific details of the shooting, and he confirmed he has spoken with other members of the Sheriff's Department and his family about it. He also confirmed that he attended Adrian's funeral services.

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she did not immediately recognize him. [REDACTED] said she then realized who Canley was, and that he had previously resided in apartment [REDACTED] but had moved out approximately 6 months prior.

[REDACTED] said the encounter involving Canley lasted approximately 1 hour, and that Canley did not get violent..."just mouthy". [REDACTED] said once the police arrived Canley started to calm down. [REDACTED] said she did feel threatened during the incident and several of her friends and residents came outside during the incident. [REDACTED] said the incident took place sometime in the afternoon. [REDACTED] said other than being loud, she could not tell if Canley appeared to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs, nor could she tell if he appeared to be suffering from any type of mental problem. Cellular Telephone Analysis

On 01/17/2007, I examined the electronic memory of the cellular telephone, which was found on Adrian Canley's person after he was shot during an altercation with Senior Deputy Shane Matthews. Canley's telephone was collected from the incident scene and placed into secure storage at the sheriff's east county property room.

Upon examining the telephone, I noted it was a flip-style Sanyo SCP-3100 cellular telephone with a color LCD display and an integrated camera. The telephone's assigned telephone number was [REDACTED] and service was provided by Sprint Spectrum PCS. There was an assigned e-mail address, which read [REDACTED]

I noted four images contained within the telephone's electronic memory. Two of the images appeared to be different views of the street from the front porch on [REDACTED]. Another image was the face of an approximately 3-year-old black female juvenile. The fourth image was completely blacked-out with no recognizable image.

Deputy shoots, kills man. [REDACTED]

Authorities have identified a Santa Paula man as the victim of the Ventura County Sheriff's Department's first officer-involved shooting of the year.

Adrian Canley, [REDACTED] was shot and killed during a confrontation with a plain-clothed detective Tuesday night. The incident occurred at an apartment complex in the [REDACTED] around 6:20 p.m.

The detective, whom department officials were refusing to identify Wednesday, had been at the complex investigating an unrelated non-violent crime at the time of the deadly confrontation, Capt. Ron Nelson said.

Canley confronted the detective in an "agitated state," and verbally acknowledged the detective was a law enforcement officer with the Sheriff's Department, Nelson said.

Canley then got into a pickup truck and attempted to run over the detective.

The detective repeatedly warned Canley to stop and, believing his life was in danger, fired several shots at the advancing truck, Nelson said.

While the detective and additional responding patrol deputies were administering first aid to Canley, they discovered that he had a loaded handgun in his waistband.

Canley was taken to Los Robles Hospital & Medical Center where he died shortly after arrival, Nelson said.

All officer-involved shootings dictate separate investigations by the department's Major Crimes Unit, the department's Internal Affairs Unit and the District Attorney's Office. The investigations are expected to take several months, Nelson said.

Deputy involved in shooting identified; cousin describes man killed

More details emerged Thursday about the Ventura County Sheriff's Department detective and the Santa Paula man he fatally shot during a confrontation in Thousand Oaks this week.

Senior Deputy Shane Matthews, an 11-year veteran, fired the shots that killed Adrian Canley, [REDACTED] in an apartment complex parking lot Tuesday night, sheriff's Capt. Ron Nelson said.

The Thousand Oaks-based detective, who was not in uniform, was investigating an unrelated crime at the [REDACTED] apartments in the [REDACTED] when the 6:20 p.m. altercation occurred.

Matthews was interviewing a man in connection with a nonviolent crime when Canley approached in an "agitated state," authorities said. After identifying the plainclothes detective as a law enforcement officer, Canley got into a pickup truck and allegedly tried to run over the detective.

Matthews repeatedly warned Canley and, feeling threatened, fired his .40-caliber gun several times, fatally striking Canley in the chest. While administering first aid, deputies found a loaded handgun in Canley's waistband, Nelson said.

But details of the violent confrontation seemed out of character for a man described by a family member as humble, quiet and "always smiling."

A troubled man who would seek to inflict harm on someone else is not how [REDACTED] Canley remembered his shy cousin.

"I really didn't see nothing like that in his character," the Lompoc man said.

[REDACTED] Canley last saw his cousin about nine months ago and recalled his enduring elation about becoming a new father to a girl, who is now going on 3 years old, he said.

"It seems like his spirits were high the last time I seen him," he said.

Adrian Canley was not married, said [REDACTED] Canley, who was unfamiliar with his cousin's occupation or interests.

He did recall, however, the year he lived with Canley's family in San Jose in the late 1980s while attending San Jose State University. He spent the time trying to serve as a good role model to his younger cousin, even treating Adrian and his two siblings to pizza every Tuesday if they kept up their grades and did their chores.

He'd never seen his cousin act violently or "out of the ordinary," [REDACTED] Canley said.

"He was always smiling and very kinda quiet — shy in a sense," he said.

Officials will piece together details of Tuesday night over the next several months, including looking into why

the Santa Paula man was at the Thousand Oaks complex, Nelson said.

All officer-involved shootings dictate separate investigations by the department's Major Crimes Unit, the department's Internal Affairs Unit and the District Attorney's Office. The investigations are expected to take several months, Nelson said.

Because of the investigations, it's unclear how much detail the department will share with the public, he said.

Officials say there is no relationship between Canley and the man the detective was interviewing immediately before the altercation. That person has cooperated as a witness and isn't necessarily the only witness to the confrontation, Nelson said.

Several residents reported hearing the shots and at least one heard someone saying "stop, stop" before the shots were fired.

Residents, shocked about the events, characterized the complex as quiet. Predominantly families fill the two- and three-bedroom units at the [REDACTED], they said.

The Sheriff's Department declined to release any additional details Thursday. The department delayed releasing Matthews' name until Thursday because it wanted to ensure that the detective knew that his identity would be made public, Nelson said.

The incident was the department's first officer-involved shooting this year. From 2004, only one other person has died as a result of a shot fired by a deputy. The department, however, logged five fatal officer-involved shootings in 2003, including two in Thousand Oaks.

The department provides police services in the cities of Camarillo, Moorpark, Thousand Oaks, Fillmore and Ojai as well as unincorporated areas of the county.
